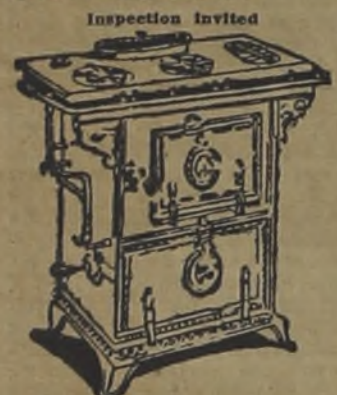

country. Its supporters were animated by no narrow intolerance of other studies, but they believed that there was no better basis for education than the study of the classics. Resolutions constituting the association, and defining its objects and constitution, were spoken to by the Vice-Chancellors of Oxford and Cambridge Universities, Professor Postgate, Professor Butler, Sir F. Pollock, Dr. Sandys, and others, and adopted.

The Admiralty, in circular letters just issued, announce new regulations for the training in gunnery and torpedoes of lieutenants, seamen, and marines.

The Dean of Westminster, in his third and concluding lecture on the Athanasian Creed, delivered at the Abbey on Saturday, suggested that the Creed should no longer be said in place of the Apostles' Creed, but that its unequalled exposition of the truth of the Trinity and the Incarnation should be separated from the rest of the document and sung in place of the anthem. Until the Church could be got to alter her order, dispensation as a temporary measure of relief to troubled consciences was the true method of the Church.

The Court-martial which has been inquiring at Victoria, British Columbia, into the circumstances of the stranding of the Flora has given its decision. Captain Baker and Lieutenant Grant are severely censured for having, by neglect or default, hazarded the safety of the ship.

Mr. John Redmond, M.P., speaking in South Sligo yesterday, said the land question would remain unsettled unless the Land Act were successfully applied to the congested estates in Connaught, and expressed the belief that before this could be done compulsion would have to be applied.

The Works Department of the London County Council, according to the half-yearly return submitted by the Works Committee has carried out 19 works during the past six months at a cost averaging 11 per cent. below the final estimate, and only one at a slight excess over the estimate.

Mr. R. Etheridge, a well known geologist, died on Friday at his residence in London. He was in his 88th year.

Six Ancient Show Guns, made of brass and bronze, have been stolen from outside the Rotunda at Woolwich.

At Melbourne, on Saturday, the English team in Australia began a match with 18 Juniors of Victoria, and scored 349 runs for the loss of seven wickets.

Under Rugby Union rules, a match between Durham and the Rest of England was won on Saturday by the Rest by four goals and a try to a goal. Other matches were won by Gay's Hospital against Richmond, London Scottish against Old Leysians, Oxford University against Northampton, Cambridge University against Edinburgh University, Blackburn against Gloucester, Swansea against Devonport Albion, Lislely against Bristol, and Cardiff against Neath. Under Association rules, matches in the first division of the League were won by Aston Villa against Notts Forest, Derby County against Everton, Manchester City against Small Heath, Stoke against Wolverhampton Wanderers, and Sunderland against Sheffield United. The following matches were drawn: Blackburn Rovers v. Middlesbrough, Bury v. Liverpool, Sheffield Wednesday v. Newcastle United, and West Bromwich Albion v. Notts Country.

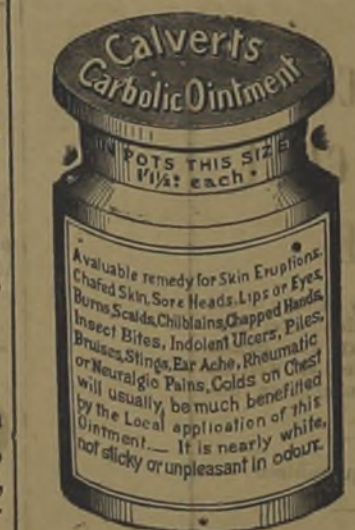
