LABOUR'S DESIGNS ON BANKS

Hull, October 10th
Sir Stafford Cripps, who was Solicitor-General in the last Labour Government, in a speech declared that the Labour Party if returned to power, would take over the Bank of England and the joint stock banks. The Party, however had no intention of reintroducing the gold standard, but would prevent the pound from depreciating to any great extent by making use of all British foreign investments.

INDIAN MINORITIES FAILURE

London, October 10th
At the meeting of the Minorities Committee at St. James' Palace Gandhi announced the failure of the different groups represented at the Indian Round Table to secure a solution of the communal question during the informal consultations which had taken place during the past week. After other delegates who had taken part in these unsuccessful discussions had spoken, the Prime Minister expressed the profound regret of the British Government that no fruitful suggestion had resulted. He said "The Government had continually pressed upon the Indians from the very beginning to reach an agreement among themselves. I do not say that it is the composition of this conference or the way in which you were selected, which is to blame. The blame lies in the fact that difficulties have presented themselves which you have not yet managed to overcome".

Mr. Macdonald added.

"The British Government wants to go in and wants you to go on. It will take action if you cannot go on to success, because we are determined to make such improvements in the Government of India as will make it consistent with our own ideas — something that is capable of greater and greater expansion towards liberty".
Mr. Macdonald suggested that they should leave him to call the next meeting of the committee and in the meantime he would like the representatives of small minorities also to try their hands.

LABOUR CONFERENCE ENDS

Scarborough, Oct. 10th
At the Labour Party Conference resolutions were passed, including

one demanding the speedy abolition of the House of Lords, and another requesting a law repealing the Trades Disputes Trades Union Acts of 1927.

A resolution that the Labour party should refuse to take office unless it obtains a clear majority was, however, defeated.
The Conference has now ended and Mr. Henderson, in a concluding speech, said that the party had accepted the challenge of a general election and was confident of victory.

He said that the country would choose between "broken-down capitalism, injustice and inefficiency, and Socialism, which is now definitely recognized as the only alternative to the present chaos".

HEAVY GOLD EXPORTS FROM U. S. A.

New York, October 10th
An advance in the bank rate of from 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 o/o is one of the first results of Hoover's project to improve domestic finances.

The probable consequences of a higher bank rate include diminished gold exports and an immediate advance of Federal Reserve buying rates on bankers' acceptances. A heavy exportation of gold has continued up to now; the Federal Reserve's daily statement shows that \$28,000,000 is earmarked for foreign account.

PARIS BANK FAILS

Paris, October 10th
The Banque Syndicale de Paris has closed its doors owing to difficulties with the credits granted to industries which have been affected by the crisis. This is the third Paris bank to find itself in difficulties during the past ten days.

HOW TO SUCCEED

(Continued)

What is work but a succession of exercises? Do as the athlete does. Make your work build you up in power and ability. Adopt the right attitude of mind that will ensure your growth in skill and strength. Compel every task to serve you as a means to betterment. When you approach your work in a discordant frame of mind; that is, in an attitude of dislike wherein you expect to be depleted of energy, you will labour in the wrong attitude, and like the athlete, what you expect you will get. Indeed, after a while, you will actually begin to feel weak and inefficient, while the results of your efforts will fall off in value. Transpose this discordant attitude into one of harmony by always entering into your work in a spirit of love and keen interest, viewing it as a series of excellent exercises for the development of strength and efficiency, and in the large sense as a means to greater things. By acting in this attitude you will not only improve in yourself, but also produce better work, which, sooner or later, must command better recompense.

Look back over your past efforts and you will discover that you invariably produced your best work when in a state of harmony. That is why the physical culturist declares that all exercises performed in the proper mental attitude—in rhythm and harmony will conduce to a rapid development of the muscles employed, and that it is worse than useless to do the exercises in a wrong frame of mind. So with your work, no matter what form it may take. When you are in harmony you strengthen and develop the faculties or talents directly employed in the execution of your tasks and in this way grow in power and efficiency.

In brief, therefore, all labour performed in the right attitude of mental harmony will produce superior and larger results, while work executed when the mind is in discord is generally weakening and destructive in tendency and effect. These are facts not theories and should be well pondered and utilised.

You cannot work constructively unless you love your work. To hate it is to act in a state of mind that is highly detrimental. If your present work is uncongenial watch for an opportunity to make a change; mean - while proceed to get into right relations with your present work by changing your point of view. This is something everybody can do. You change your attitude and learn to labour in a state of harmony when you look upon your work as a means of development — as the athlete does his exercises — and a pathway to better things, which it is, in reality, when used rightly.

In this manner you may enter the harmonious attitude and demonstrate your mastery. You will henceforth proceed to use your work to build yourself up into a stronger and more capable person. If you are held down by adversity in uncongenial conditions, know that there is a way out and that you can find it by making the proper effort. First, realise that there is "something" within you that is infinitely greater than all the adversity you can possibly experience, and that this "something"

It is a good idea to plunge the face in a basinful of cold water for a few seconds while holding the breath.

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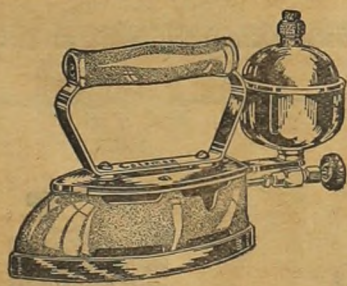


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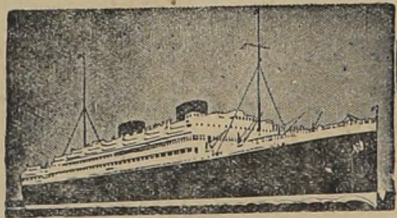
