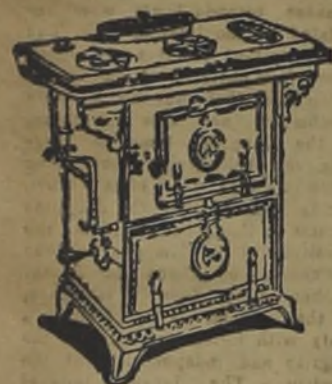

LONDON NOTES

TUESDAY, JAN. 26.

In a cricket match which they
commenced at Hubert yesterday,
against a Tasmanian team, the Eng-
lishmen were all out for the moderate
total of 185 runs. The home side then
scored 116 for four wickets.

A large company witnessed the
football match at Plumstead yester-
day, in which the North defeated
the South by four goals to nil.

In his capacity of President, the
Duke of Connaught took the chair
at the inaugural dinner of the Ireland
Club, which was held last night, at
the Hotel Cecil. He spoke first of
the King's affection for Ireland, and
the kindly reception given to his
Majesty by the Irish people on the
occasion of his visit there. As to the
objects of the club, he said they
wished to bring together all classes
and all creeds of Irishmen, and all
well-wishers of Ireland, to promote
the best interests of that country.
They wished to recognise that Ire-
land was a great nation, and he hoped
that a happy era was opening be-
fore it.

Deputations of the Executive Com-
mittee of the Women's Liberal Fed-
eration yesterday waited on Sir
Henry Campbell-Bannerman and Sir
John Morley, and put before them
the claims of women to the Parlia-
mentary franchise. Both the Liberal
leaders spoke in terms of sympathy
with the objects of the movement,
but were careful to state that they
expressed only their own personal
views and did not speak on behalf
of the party.

A gold prospectors' expedition in
the East African Protectorate and a
British patrolling force in Nigeria
have been cut up by hostile tribes.
In the latter case two British offi-
cers and 37 men were killed.

WEDNESDAY, JAN. 27.

The Prince of Wales, as Treasurer,
presided at the Grand Day dinner of
Hilary Term, at Lincoln's Inn, yester-
day.

Another Cabinet Council was held
at the Foreign Office yesterday. Mr.
Balfour travelled from Windsor Castle
to attend it, and on its conclusion he
returned to Windsor. Contradiction is
given to the statement that three
Ministers have resigned.

Mr. Bryce addressed a public meet-
ing at Enfield last night. He criticised
Mr. Chamberlain's methods, and
asked who was funding the money for
his campaign. He suspected the donors
were the big trusts who would benefit
by Protection. The first duty of a
Liberal Government, he added,
would be to sweep away the unjust
provisions of the Education Act.

It is authoritatively announced that
Mr. Worsley Taylor, Conservative
M.P. for the Blackpool Division, will
resign his seat at the opening of Parlia-
ment.

Nearly the whole of yesterday's
sitting of the London County Council
was occupied with discussion of the
Education Act. In the result, the
scheme formulated by the Committee
was adopted, after a Moderate amend-
ment had been defeated by 78 votes
to 26.

The London Baptist Association
yesterday passed a resolution urging
pastors, officers, and members of the
churches to do all in their power to
secure the return of L.C.C. candidates
who will administer the Education
Act as fairly as possible and in the
interests, not of sectarianism, but of
education.

Yesterday's meeting at the Mansion
House in support of the appeal for
funds to reconstruct St. Bartholomew's
Hospital on its City site was unex-
pectedly harmonious. The work was
