

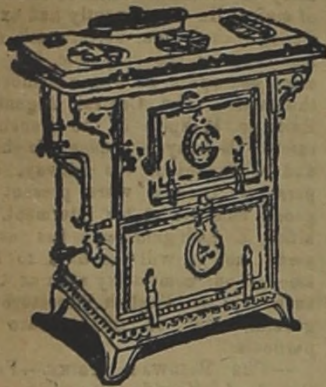

LONDON NOTES

THURSDAY, FEB. 11.

Princess Alice of Albany was married yesterday at St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, to Prince Alexander of Teck, in the presence of the King and Queen and a distinguished group of English and foreign Royalties.

Further interest was added in the House of Commons yesterday to the debate on Mr. J. Morley's fiscal amendment to the Address by Mr. Ritchie, who expressed dissatisfaction with the two voices of the Government—Protection and Free Trade—and who made further disclosures of what happened in the Cabinet before he left it. Mr. Walter Long sought to justify speeches he had made in the country. Unionist Free Traders like Mr. Winston Churchill and Sir John Dickson Poynder exposed the unstable position of the Government regarding fiscal policy. The debate will be resumed to-day.

Earl Carrington presided last night over a large meeting in the Queen's Hall, called to protest against the introduction of indentured Chinese labour into the Rand mines against the wishes of the people of the Colony. Among the letters read was a long and important one from Sir Wm. Harcourt, strongly condemning the proposal. Resolutions to that effect were carried unanimously.

Before the Manchester Statistical Society last night Mr. J. Arthur Hutton gave an address upon the position of the cotton trade of Lancashire. He showed that Protection was not needed, our manufacturers being able to compete with all comers in the open markets of the world provided they had ample raw material at a reasonable price.

In the presence of a large gathering of people at Birmingham Old Cemetery yesterday the remains of the late Mr. Powell Williams, M. P., were interred. Simultaneously a memorial service was held at St. Margaret's, Westminster, Mr. Chamberlain being among the many members of the House of Commons present.

Comments upon the conditions of life in the Potteries, and complaint that the great manufacturers of the district stand entirely aloof from the local municipal life, were made by the Hanley Coroner yesterday.

Mr. J. Hirst Hollowell has been adopted as Liberal candidate for South Birmingham. He accepted the position last night, and has received many assurances of support. At present he is the only candidate before the electors of the division.

"The watch that strikes against Obchurates" was written on a box which, containing an historic gold watch, was handed to the bailiff when he called at the house of Colonel Carrington, V. D., of Stockport, a Passive Resister. The same watch was once seized in default of the payment of a Church rate, and afterwards redeemed, as the gallant Colonel puts it, from the "ecclesiastical pawnshop."

Mr. Lawson Walton, in the King's Bench Division, opened the case for the defence in the action for damages for alleged libel brought by E. Underwood and Son against E. Lloyd, Ltd., in regard to comment upon a forage contract for the War Office during the South African War.

John Colman was at the Central Criminal Court sentenced to twenty years' penal servitude for the manslaughter of Hilda Poppie at a house in St. George's-in-the-East.

For the public performance of "The Moon Spell," a stage play, without authority from the Lord Chamberlain, fines of £50 were imposed by the magistrate at Bow-street on the New Tivoli, Limited. It was stated that a conference on the question would
