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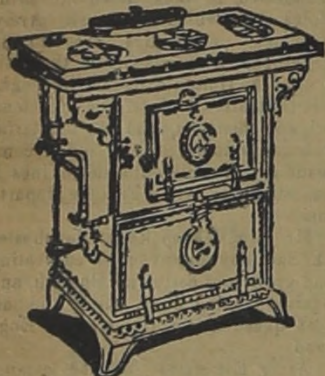

enlarge St. Bartholomew's Hospital. Mr. J. A. Kenist, who was accompanied by three friends, protested yesterday, at St. Paul's Cathedral, against the ordination of four deacons, on account of their Ritualistic practices. The Bishop of London announced that he should take proceedings for bawling, and the ordination, except in one instance, was proceeded with.

Officers of the L. C. C. found nearly 2,000 persons either walking the streets or sleeping in doorways or under arches on the night of January 29. The report will be presented to the L. C. C. to-morrow.

An extraordinary suggestion that the headmaster of a Church school at Hopton Waters should supplement his salary by playing the organ and 'looking after the lamps' has been made to one of the candidates for the post.

Details are published this morning of a new scheme about to be tried in his Majesty's home dockyards for hastening the completion of work and increasing the pay of workmen by way of premium.

On the ground that the risks run by moneylenders in certain cases must be taken into account in deciding whether their usury was 'harsh and unconscionable' under the Act, Mr. Justice Phillimore on Saturday gave judgment in favour of one of the fraternity for the sum he had advanced, with interest at the rate of 110 per cent. per annum.

There was a discredit scene on the Sydney cricket ground on Saturday during an interval in the test match between rain. While play was possible England completed their first innings for 249, and took five Australian wickets for 114.

Scotland gained a runaway victory over Ireland in the Rugby International, at Dublin on Saturday, and the Association inter-league encounter between the same countries, at Paisley also ended in favour of the representatives of the Thistle. The programmes of the English and Southern Leagues were shortened. The most sensational performance of the day was the victory of Aston Villa over Sheffield United by six goals to one.

The annual Southern Counties' Cross Country Championship was decided on Saturday, A. Shrub being first man home for the fourth year in succession.

TUESDAY, MARCH 1
A Bill to amend the law relating to cruelty to children was introduced into the House of Lords yesterday by Lord Alverstone and read first time.

In the Commons, the Navy Estimates were discussed on the motion to go into Committee. The Government opposed, and by a majority of 62 defeated, an amendment by Mr. Herbert Roberts, in favour of communicating with the great naval Powers to ascertain whether they would be prepared to diminish their programme of shipbuilding.

Members of the Liberal League, to the number of over 500, dined together last night at the Hotel Cecil. The Earl of Rosebery, the President, occupied the chair, and amongst others present were Mr. Asquith, Sir Henry Fowler, and Sir Edward Grey. From a report issued yesterday, it appears that the health of the Navy is, on the whole, satisfactory. With an increased personnel, the death-rate in 1902 showed a slight decrease as compared with the last five years.

Mr. J. A. Kenist has been served with a summons returnable at the Mansion House Police Court, charging him with bawling at St. Paul's, under circumstances already made public.

I was evidently on the outlook for someone, and at the psychological moment the policeman had arrested me and my confederate—or had made a gallant attempt to do so. As for me, was not a silver cigar-case of peculiar pattern, which Sir John's butler could swear to, as he had often cleaned and polished it, found in my breast pocket? Were not my very shoes wet with the blood of the murdered man, which had trickled beneath the closet door?
