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NATIONALISING THE BANKS

Adelaide, Aus., July 29th

The Australian Labour Party, at its annual conference to-day, while reiterating its determination ultimately to nationalise the banks of Australia, decided to postpone such action "until such time as they have been years in office".

Meanwhile, the conference adopted an interim programme extending the activities of the Commonwealth Bank to compete with commercial banks especially in financing public works.

Mr. J. Curtin, leader of the Labour Party, declared that the immediate nationalisation of the commercial banks would cost £ 70,000,000.

The conference demanded that the States Government, which is controlled by the Labour Party, should introduce immediately the forty-hour work week.

ARAB AND JEWISH GRIEVANCES TO BE INVESTIGATED

London, July 29th

The membership of the Palestine Royal Commission was announced in the House of Commons to-day by the Colonial Secretary.

The Commission is "to ascertain the underlying causes of the disturbances which broke out in Palestine in the middle of April; to inquire into the manner in which the mandate of Palestine was being implemented in relation to the obligations of the mandatory towards Arabs and Jews respectively; and to ascertain whether — upon proper consideration of the terms of the mandate — either Arabs or Jews had any legitimate grievances on account of the way in which the mandate had been or is being implemented and if the Commission is satisfied that any such grievances were well founded, to make recommendations for their removal and for the prevention of their recurrence".

The chairman of the Commission is Lord Peel, former Secretary of State for India, a member of the India Round Table Conference, and chairman of the Burma Round Table Conference.

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FORCELESS DECISIONS

London, July 29th

In the House of Lords today, Lord Ponsonby urged the Government to suggest that the League Assembly should delete from the Covenant the obligation of member States to use military or economic force.

"There is no shred of argument for force — experience, expediency, and morality are all opposed to it.

"The League would be stronger if decisions were forceless", he said.

In opposing this measure, Lord Allen urged that the League's powers would be strengthened and not weakened, adding: —

"Force cannot be dispensed with: there must be a steady collective resistance to all acts of aggression.

"The nations must be prepared to guarantee the enforcement of whatever pacts they sign".

REMBRANDT ASTRAY IN FRANCE

Chambery, July 29th

A Rembrandt portrait, while being carried from Italy into Spain loosely wrapped in a newspaper disappeared when the train was at the frontier customs station.

The efforts of the French police to locate the treasure have failed so far. It was described as a portrait of an aged man with his shirt wide open and wearing a collar.

The victim of the theft was a Swedish woman, Mme. Bertha Arnauds, who told the police that she was taking the picture to San Sebastian, and that it was not insured.

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DECISIVE BATTLE EXPECTED

Madrid, July 29th

One of the most important battles in the civil war is imminent at Saragossa. It is officially stated that Pérez Barras, leader of the Catalan front, is moving toward Saragossa, while a second column is heading for the north-west from Caspe, a third column is coming under General Villalba.

The principal Loyalist column, under General Barras, is composed of between 3,000 and 4,000 militiamen.

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THE CASA RECORDS OF A PSYCHOLOGIST

Do you know why boys pull the curls of little girls? Or why during the late teens they tease girls? This behavior has a very definite psychological meaning.

CASE B-161: Lois P., a very pretty coed aged 19, came into the office one afternoon to ask about a personal problem.

"When I was a child in grammar school", she opened the conversation, "I had long golden curls. My mother prided herself on them, but they were a source of misery to me, because the boys used to delight in pulling them.

"Boys have always teased me as long as I could remember. That is what I wanted to ask you about. They used to make me cry when I wore the curls. After I was old enough to wear hair up, they used to tease me and pick on me. I got angry and didn't cry, except after unusual provocations.

"Now that I am in the university, they still tease me. It makes me embarrassed, and that seems to increase their delight. If I grow angry and retort, I am in danger of crying. I am growing so I dread men. Dr Crane, what is wrong with me?"

DIAGNOSIS:
There is nothing particularly wrong with Lois, except that she is pretty. A pretty woman is naturally attractive to males. This was proved by the behavior of the little boys who pulled her curls when she entered the public school.

Boys before the high school age may feel attracted to girls but they also sense that boys are not supposed to have any use for girls. Girls are looked upon as a pain in the neck, so to speak, and necessary evil — at least till the boys attain the age of fifteen or thereabouts. In this dilemma of being attracted to girls, of craving to touch them, yet realizing that you are not supposed to be

fond of them, what is more natural than a compromise which enables the boy to satisfy both demands upon him?

WHY BOYS TEASE GIRLS

Boys tease a girl, therefore, because they are attracted to the girl. They like her and are interested in her. But to cover up a show of their real interest or fondness for her, they inflict a mild form of cruelty.

They prove to their boyhood playmates that they aren't in love with the girl, by making her cry. At the same time, however, they satisfy their desire to touch her and be near her a great deal, by their constant teasing.

In grammar school pulling curls is a convenient method of accomplishing both these results. In the later adolescent years, however, they realize that pulling curls is juvenile. Besides, there aren't many curls still cascading over girls' shoulders.

REASONS FOR TEASING

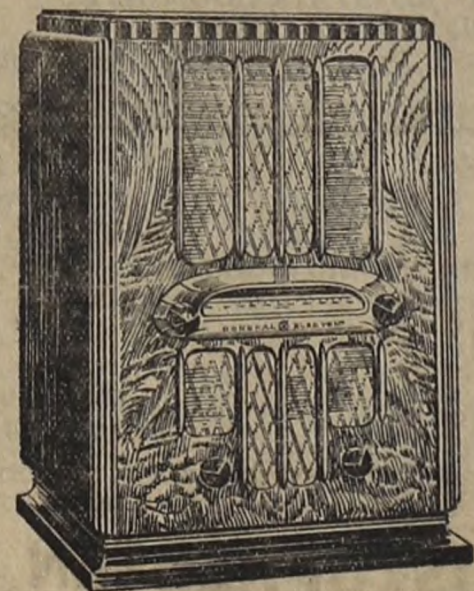
In teasing children, more over, boys also are often trying to inflame their own ego. If they can make another child cry, they feel superior, more grown up. Babies cry. If another boy nearly you size will cry, by contrast you feel older, more like a man, because you are not crying. It is a gratifying sensation.

Youngsters are not desirous of being cruel when they tease other youngsters. They seldom think far enough ahead to appreciate the cruel effects of their teasing. They are concerned chiefly with the pleasurable feeling of being superior to other boys, or of being thrown with girls who are attractive to them.

I told Lois, therefore, not to cry but to feel pleased. The men who are now teasing her are revealing to her that they like her; that they are fond of her. She is gaining some inside psychological information about them which they don't realize that they are revealing to her.

When men really are emotional

THE LAND OF BOOKS

(Continued)

We rode on for six days into the heart of Iceland on these ponies. Through a country that had no life save wild birds. Through sunsets that began in a blaze of light over the pink thirf which made the hills pink, till the light change them — after three hours to lavender and purple.

Six days of riding brought us to a village of nine houses, a church, and a parsonage. We were spent; the ponies were spent. We could go no farther. The parson took us in. He spoke a little English. He gave us a supper of the most wonderful mutton I have ever tasted. I complimented him on it.

He said: "I bred this sheep I killed it in April". "It has been buried in the ground since then. Yes, it is good mutton... Come and see my books."

He took us into another room. All books in most wonderful bindings. I spotted a row of Stevensons, bound in a fashion which would have cost 30s. to £ 2 a volume in London. He discussed with me all our English authors with the knowledge of a London 'literatur'.

"But these bindings I said."

"Yes," he replied. "My shepherd does them."

Returning from my journey into the interior, I spent an evening with Sigurd Nordal, the great novelist of Iceland. He corresponds to Galsworthy in Britain. He spoke English well. He discussed with me not only the English classics, but all our moderns. Wells, Shaw. He was particularly pleased with Sheila Kaye-Smith. He could walk into a London literary party and talk our literature with an understanding which would tax many of the other guests to keep pace with him. The only other foreigner I know who could do that is Stefan Zweig.

Our history books tell us that Christopher Columbus discovered America. We are being deluded; led up the garden path. A shipful of Icelanders discovered America two hundred years before Columbus ever went there. Their ancient barques are preserved now outside Philadelphia. And this city commissioned Einar Jonsson — the Rodin of Iceland — to make the memorial to the Icelanders who discovered America which now stands in Philadelphia.

I spent an evening with Einar Jonsson. He lives in a great castle of a place at Reykjavik which the Icelandic Government pays Jonsson a fixed figure per year to make one or as many sculptures a year as he chooses. In a word, it finances his dreams, his genius. He can do what he likes, and when he likes. But what he creates belongs to Iceland. Can one imagine a better way of nationally encouraging and retaining the work of a great artist?

Having seen these works I was aware that an exhibition of them in London would be the greatest sensation since the discovery of Rodin. I tried recently to arrange such an exhibition in London. But the Icelandic Government would not allow one of Jonsson's sculptures to leave Iceland. I don't blame Iceland. She has these great treasures of Art, and, proud of them, she hugs them to her heart.

Alone and alone in her cold seas — who associates Iceland with Art or Literature? But she keeps her Jonsson to herself. In her capital is the greatest collection of early manu-

scripts in the world, a collection the British Museum would give anything to own.

Does she sleep — this Iceland? She has the oldest Parliament in Europe. It is 1,005 years old now. Go into any of her little farms — farms built of turf — go deep underground into the common rooms of any of these farms, as I have done. There are books. Always books. Always the signs of reading.

And for every voyage an Icelandic fishing boat makes, the Government allows 2 1/2d for books for each man of the crew in order to educate him. To educate a man who is going to spend all his life catching cod and herring!

Does she sleep — this Iceland?

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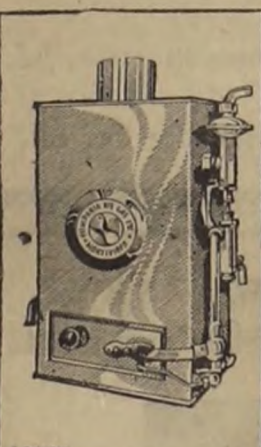
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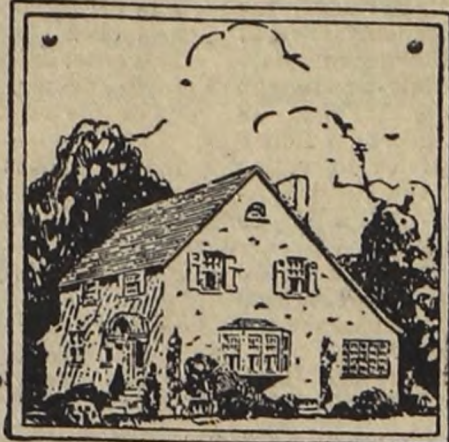
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HINTS

If your parquet floor is out of condition and you want it put right for half an hour fifteen parts of water, one part of soda, and one part of slaked lime.

Mop the floor with this mixture, and when nearly dry scrub the floor with fine sand and water to remove the wax and all impurities, using a hard, stiff brush. Now mix eight parts of water and one part of concentrated oil of vitriol, and apply it to the floor with a suitable brush, after which the floor will come up almost like new.

If the floor is not too bad, but the old wax polish needs removing, rub with fine steel wool and paraffin. This will get the floor clean and ready for polishing.

Never use soap and water on a parquet floor in the ordinary way. Floor rubbers, for removing dust and dirt, should be of old soft woven material, and it should afterwards be treated with a good wax polish. But do not overdo the waxing. Once a month should be sufficient with daily mopping to preserve the polish.

Where a hardwood polished floor is in existence, the ordinary polishing should be discontinued a week or so before the dance. Do not make the floor too slippery.

Bear in mind that parquet floors, highly polished and laid on a solid foundation, are very tiring after an hour dancing. Your aim should be to make your floor satiny-smooth yet not slippery, temperature proof, remaining springy to the right degree, and with the many qualities tending to reduce foot-friction and muscular effort to a minimum.

RECIPES

Corned Beef Pie

Required:

One pound tin of corned beef.
Two pounds of cooked potatoes
Three tablespoonfuls of chopped onion.

Two ounces of dripping.
Three-quarters of a pint of stock or gravy.

Three-quarters of an ounce of flour
A few scraps of ham or bacon.

Salt and pepper.

Mash the potatoes finely, rubbing them through a sieve if you have time. Melt half the dripping, add it to the potatoes season them nicely, and, if necessary, add a little milk. Turn the meat out of the tin, cut it in pieces, also the bacon, after having trimmed off the rind or any rough pieces. Melt the rest of the dripping in a saucepan, add the onion and flour, and fry them a pale brown. Add the stock and stir over the fire until it boils. Season to taste. When the sauce has cooled slightly, stir the pieces of meat and bacon into it, and then arrange them in a fire-proof dish. Put on a covering of potato, heaping it up and marking it with a fork or piping-bag. Brush over with beaten egg. Place the dish in a tin containing a little water, as this helps to prevent the meat from becoming hard. Half an hour or so before it is required, place it in a moderate oven and bake till it is hot through and delicately browned.

Italian Croquettes

Required:

Two and a half ounces of grated cheese.

Two ounces of cooked macaroni

One ounce of butter.

One ounce of flour.

One gill of milk.

One egg and one raw yolk extra.

Salt and pepper. Crumbs.

Chop the macaroni in small rings, melt the butter, stir in the flour, then add the milk and stir until it boils. Now add to this mixture the cheese, macaroni, raw yolk, and a good seasoning of salt and pepper. Mix all thoroughly and stir over the fire for a minute or two then turn on to a plate and let it cool. When cold enough to handle easily, shape it in small cork shapes. Egg-and-crumbs these and fry them a golden brown in hot fat. Drain well on paper and they are then ready for reheating in the oven.

LOCAL NEWS

STREET LIGHTING

A plan for improving street lighting throughout the city has been passed to the Ministry of Finance by the Municipality. This provides for an appeal to the citizens along street which are badly lighted to contribute towards the purchase of light standards to be placed along sidewalks lacking sufficient illumination. At the same time a suggestion has been made concerning an increase in lighting equipment along Garibaldi, Cuareim, and Canelones.

THE RIO NEGRO PROJECT

"El Pueblo" in an article published yesterday, gave the reasons held by the Administration of the U.T.E. for refusing to accept the bids offered by a group of Firms working in conjunction for the construction of the hydro-electric installation on the Rio Negro. The offer in question was made in two forms, the first being in strict accordance with the terms of the tender, and the second containing changes of a fundamental nature. Inasmuch as the first offer was made at an exaggerated price, only the second was considered. This alternative offer amounted to nearly nine and a half million pesos more than the sum provided for the work—forty eight million pesos—and the U. T. E. considered that the changes did not justify this difference in cost. It now remains to be seen what bids will be made at the third call for tenders.

STREET FOOTBALL

In spite of sporadic—and useless—campaigns in the local press against the practice of large groups of boys and youths being allowed to play football in the streets, this nuisance continues unabated. The custom in certain parts of the city, especially in the commercial region around the port, has increased to such an extent that traffic is practically paralysed with the consequent danger to both drivers and passengers. As there is a very definite Municipal law covering the matter it would seem that there should be at least some pretence of having it enforced.

SENSATIONALISM

Several local newspapers have brought up the question of the increasingly frequent use by certain colleagues of the famous "sirens" supposedly for the announcement of sensational and serious "news".
