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THE FALKLANDS AGAIN

London, February 11th

The issued of a new series of Postage stamps by the Argentine Government on which is shown the Falkland Isles was mentioned in the House of Commons to-day. The Foreign Secretary, Mr. Anthony Eden, in reply to questions, stated that the issue of the stamps in question was based on the Argentine claim to the islands: a claim His Majesty's Government could not admit because they were definitely British Territory. The Argentine Government already known the point of view of Great Britain with regard to these islands, but the British Ambassador has received instruction to again draw the attention of the Argentine Government to matter, and to emphasise the fact that such action as the issue of the stamps in question can only result in harmful results to the good relations existing between the two nations.

THE PETROL SANCTIONS

London, February 11th

Considerable interest is being shown in the American attitude to the proposed extension of the Sanctions already in force against Italy to Petroleum. "The Daily Herald" states that the first thing to be done is for the nations at Geneva to take a definite step in the matter, and after demonstrating to the world that the League of Nations is really in earnest and is taking its obligations seriously, the United States will feel morally obliged to reduce their oil exports to Italy to the same level as before the outbreak of hostilities. But so long as the League Members themselves are continuing to supply Italy with oil, and so assist her to conduct a declared illegal campaign against a fellow Member of the League, what right has Geneva to deny the same privilege to the States? The "News Chronicle" states, "so long as the League remains inactive, it is useless to expect that the States will decide not to sell as much oil as they can to Italy, while the league Members themselves are helping her to bomb the civil population of Abyssinia by supplying her themselves with the much discussed petrol, which is in itself a violation of the League Covenant, and adds that Great Britain is unable to avoid her responsibilities in the matter no matter what the other states decide to do, and by decisive action on her part, the example of such action would not be lost on the American people.

RAS DESTA'S SUCCESSOR

London, February 10th

The "Daily Telegraph's" special correspondent at Djibouti, Sir Percival Phillips, states: "Unusual activity is being shown, both by the Italian and Ethiopian armies, behind the Southern front, suggesting preparations for another trial of strength.

"Ethiopian reinforcements in large numbers are moving up rapidly and arriving in the Sidamo region. They are occupying both sides of the Webbe Shebeli.

There has been a complete reorganisation in the Ethiopian forces which were formerly commanded by the Ras Desta, whose successor, General Gabriel Maryam, is considered one of the Emperor's most able commanders.

EGYPT AND BRITAIN

Cairo, February 11th

The High Commissioner, Sir Niles Lampson was in conference this morning with Ali Maher Baja, the Egyptian Prime Minister, who afterwards informed the representatives of the press that during the Meeting a satisfactory basis for negotiating an Agreement between the two countries had been arrived at, and that he entertained high hopes of an early solution to the difficulties of his country. It is however, reported that some little difficulty may be experienced with the Wafdist Party.

London, February 10th

The Foreign Secretary was asked at question time in the House of Commons today for an assurance that, in view of the changed international situation, the complete freedom of action of his Majesty's Government in the negotiations for a treaty with Egypt would not be restricted by the terms of earlier draft treaties.

Mr. Eden said in reply: "The principle that no Government can be bound by the provisions of inclusive previous negotiation is of course, well recognised in international practice. In the present negotiations the application of this principle must necessarily be governed by the mutual interests of the two countries".



A THREAT TO THE U. S. A.

Washington, February 10th

Senator Pittman to-day opened his long-promised attack on the floor of the Senate upon the foreign policy of Japan, which he described as a threat to the United States and contrary to the principle of the Open Door.

He advocated strong Naval and Air forces "until the time arrives when there is a universal respect for obedience to peace treaties".

Asserting that Japan had violated the Nine-Power Treaty in her attitude towards China, he criticised Mr. Saito's comparison of Japanese policy with the Monroe Doctrine "Such doctrines may have a similarity as to the implied threat against foreign conquest, but under the Monroe Doctrine we did not arrogate to ourselves the right of conquest or domination in the Americas".

Senator Hamilton Lewis seconded this denunciation of Japan, and declared: "By abandoning our national defence we shall invite assault".

LIES FROM ROME

London, February 10th

Replying to questions in the House of Commons, the Foreign Secretary said that his Majesty's Government drew the attention of the the Italian Government on January 30 to a statement broadcast from Rome on January 17 that all the Ethiopian battalions engaged in the fighting with Ras Desta were under European officers, most of them British.

"I have been informed", added Mr. Eden, "that the version as published in Rome did not contain the passage complained of, but the Italian Government is making an investigation, and in the meantime our Ambassador will continue to draw its attention to the matter.

"I am confident that no credence would be given to the report in question in any quarter".

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END OF THE R. M. S. P.

London, February 10th

In the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice Crossman to-day ordered the compulsory liquidation of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company on its own petition.

Counsel for the company explained the scheme sanctioned by the Court last year for the transfer of its assets and those of the associated companies to the Royal Realisation Company, and said that the only assets available for unsecured liabilities for 15 millions sterling amounted to \$ 575,000.

SEVENTY MILES AN HOUR

London, February 10th

Winds of gale force swept the country to-day, gusts of seventy miles an hour being reported. Extreme cold prevails, and the weather forecasts predict its continuance for several days.

There were heavy seas in the English Channel, and two seamen lost their lives this morning when a brage in which they were being towed broke loose near Plymouth and sank.

The services between the Isle of Wight and the mainland were interrupted, while the night cross-Channel service from Folkestone and Dunkirk has been cancelled. Several homebound liners have been held up.

The gale also caused damage and many minor accidents over a wide area inland.

WOOLWICH ARSENAL REMOVAL

London, February 10th

According to the Political Correspondent of the "Daily Mail", the removal of the greater part of the organisation of the Woolwich Arsenal to Milford Haven, Pembrokeshire, is part of the Government's new defence policy.

He states that the Ministers have decided in recent discussions that arms factories and stores should be situated parts of the country which are less likely to suffer from surprise air attacks. It is understood that both the Admiralty and that wherever possible aeroplane factories and important munition centres will be placed in the least vulnerable and the War Office are in favour of a transfer of the Arsenal districts in the country.

It is expected that a White Paper dealing with Great Britain's re-armament programme will review the situation in Europe and the Government's attitude towards the League of Nations, giving the reasons for the decision to embark on a defence programme. When the programme has been approved by the Cabinet the representatives of the Dominions in the London will be summoned for the purpose of explaining it to them, in order that a scheme of cooperation for the defence of the Empire can be worked out.

THE "MERCADO AGRICOLA"

"El Diario" calls attention to the difficulties under which purchases and sales have to be made in the "Mercado Agrícola" owing to the almost entire lack of supervision on the part of the police and the market officials, and states that thieving is conducted under the very eyes of the police and in spite of the fact that the purchasers invariably leave a person in charge of their vehicles, the majority of these suffer a considerable loss of their produce during the course of the month, and considers that there is evidence of the existence of gang of "Maffistas" which is terrorising the market gardeners who are compelled to take their produce to this market.

EXCURSION TO FLORESTA

On Saturday next the "Oficina de Propaganda e Informaciones Municipales" has decided to run an other excursion by bus to Floresta. The buses will leave 18 de Julio and Paraguay at 2 p. m. arriving there in time to take tea, which will be provided by the hotel. The price of the trip and tea will be the same as on the previous trips to this popular resort.

MORE STRIKES

The Shoemakers and Carpenters who are already out on strike for better working conditions and increases in wages are to be joined by the electricians on Friday of this week unless the employers accede to their demands for substantial increases and other concessions before that date.

CHEAPER FARES ON THE RAILWAY

In order to enable the many people in the camp to visit the Capital during the days of Carnival which commences on the 22nd of this month, the Central Uruguayan Railway has decided to reduce the fares to and from the city. The special rates will rule from Friday the 21st until Monday the 2nd of March. The reduced fares will not be valid for travel by the Motor Coaches.

THE A. N. C. A. P.

On Monday the question of the recent dismissals of the accountants and other persons of the A. N. C. A. P. was raised in the Chamber of Representatives and after a heated debate in which the use of strong epithets were freely indulged in by both sides, it was apparently decided to refuse to again open the matter. The General Manager of the organization and the Chief of the Fiscal Police are the latest to join the band of the dismissed.

CHILIAN VISITOR

The Chilean Minister of Finance accompanied by his wife and family arrived in Montevideo by the "Cap Arcona" yesterday on their return from a trip to Europe.

SALTO

It is reported from Salto that satisfactory progress has been made on the converting of the old telephone system to the modern underground and it is anticipated that Salto will soon have telephonic connections throughout the country. It is expected that the new Automatic system will be officially inaugurated during the early days of August.

THE CAMP

According to reports which have reached Montevideo from various parts of the country, the frequent and heavy rains of the last few weeks are causing great anxiety to the agriculturists owing to the difficulty of working on the land, and it is feared that disease will shortly become serious, it is stated that considerable injury has already been caused to the grapes through lack of sun.

ISLA DEL TIGRE

Efforts are being made to popularise the Isla del Tigre as a holiday resort on the river Santa Lucia, and a large number of men are already at work on the construction of suitable buildings. The island is a most charming place and is situated at the mouth of the river near the small town of La Barra de Santa Lucia, and is expected to become one of our most popular resorts for those who wish to lead the simple life.

CAMP ROADS

According to information from the various Departments of the Interior, the camp roads are in good condition throughout the country.

RIVAL ROULETTE

In the Chamber of Representatives on Monday, a complaint was made by Deputy Artecona that the gambling tables in the New Hotel on the Rambla at Pocitos were run on similar lines to the Municipal tables at the Parque Hotel and Carrasco to the consequent prejudice of the Departmento de Salud Pública due to the fact that the hotel proprietors were not obliged to contribute a percentage of the winnings to charity in the same manner as the Government Casinos.

SULPHUR

In agricultural circles it is generally believed that the principal cause of the possible failure of the grape crop in many Departments of the Republic may be traced to the restrictions which have been placed on the importation of Sulphur which is known to be an article of the greatest importance to the cultivators. It is mentioned that the exceptionally high duties which have been placed on British and German sulphur which has been proved over a large number of years to be of superior quality, have merely resulted in placing this article beyond the reach of the cultivator who has preferred to use none at all rather than the inferior "Producto Nacional".

WOMAN OF 21 BECOMES MAN

May Now Tave To Be a Soldier

Czechoslovakia's leading woman athlete, Miss Zdenka Koubkova, is to-day a man, legally and physically.

Her lawyer in Prague has just announced that she underwent a successful operation to change her sex just before Christmas, and she has now changed her name to Zdenek Koubek.

So, recovered from the operation, Mr. Zdenek Koubek yesterday returned to work dressed in masculine clothing. He is in excellent spirits after his change of sex.

Now Mr. Koubek, who is 21 years old, faces the question of whether he will have to make up the regular military service which he escaped as a girl. The matter, says the B. U. P. is already being examined by the military authorities.

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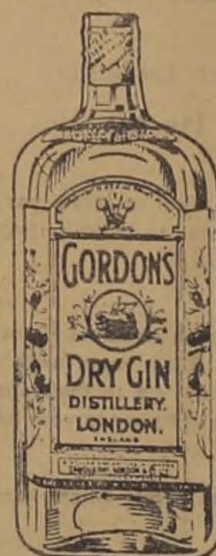
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TELEPATHY AND DREAMING

Ask people if they "believe in" telepathy. The chances are that you will receive a ready answer, one way or the other. The majority of people nowadays will say that they do believe in telepathy, but it is not often that any proof is quoted to support the belief.

The reality of telepathic communication between mind and mind is by no means scientifically established yet, and when we come to look into it we find that our best reasons for believing that such a thing is possible are inferences from phenomena still more puzzling. The extreme view in favour of telepathy is expressed by Deme Edith Lyttelton in "Our Superconscious Mind" when she declares (without any proof whatever) that "telepathy can account for almost every instance of information given through a medium, and so on", in spite of the fact that some of her

most interesting examples of the mind's "super-conscious knowledge" rule out telepathy. RECENT TESTS.

After examining not a little documentary material, I am inclined to think that the study of dreams is as likely to yield information about telepathy as the numerous observations made of waking experiences. Without anything like scientific proof, there have always been people who believed in telepathy, just as people have always believed in prophetic dreams.

Telepathy may not be a scientifically accepted fact, but in our time it has been more thoroughly studied than ever before, and eminent students like Sir Oliver Lodge and Professor Gilbert Murray have conducted practical experiments designed to show whether simple ideas (as of numbers or playing-cards) can be transmitted by one person to another mentally. The results have usually been inconclusive, owing to loop-holes for chance or other misleading factors. The passivity of the recipient's mind can never equal that of one who is asleep and dreams.

About three years ago there was an experiment on a big scale on behalf of the Society for Psychological Research, through the B. B. C., by Sir Oliver Lodge and Dr. V. J. Woolley. At a given moment announced on the wireless large numbers of people had to try to "get" certain objects that were being thought of by, I believe, Dr. Woolley. No useful evidence was gained, but such a failure was not very discouraging to those who accept telepathy as the necessary explanation of certain phenomena.

THE FORGOTTEN TELEGRAM.

The phenomena that lend themselves most readily as evidence in favour of telepathy seem to occur in dreams and in a state of

waking vision that is akin to dreaming or trance, when there is least interference by the conscious attention of the percipient. But even in this domain it seems that we might easily be too credulous. An example given by Yves Delage in his comprehensive study, "Le Réve", affords a warning. He tells a dream experience of his deceased friend, Laurent Chabry, a biologist and a trained observer. Chabry had a distressing nightmare that lasted all night, about being called suddenly to the bedside of his father,

because there is not enough information?

Probably there are many people who know of dream experiences similar to Chabry's, but apparently without so simple an explanation. In literary records of the past there are numerous instances of these experiences lend themselves to another explanation that of so-called "clairvoyance", by which a person is able to envisage an event occurring at a distance; but nearly always telepathy is an equally probable and often a more satisfactory solution.

A VISION OF FIRE.

In Sydney Dobell's "Life and Letters" (1878, Vol. I) he quotes a letter which he wrote to a friend in September, 1855, on the night of the fall of Sevastopol. He tells how he had a vision of the town in flames. Next morning he described what he had seen — long before the news of the actual burning reached England.

Anybody is at liberty to see in this an instance of reasonable anticipation preying upon the dreamer's mind, though in fact the burning of Sevastopol was a highly improbable event. Perhaps those who favour clairvoyance have a stronger case than usual in this large class of visions that may be described as impersonal, though, if the mind can indeed pick up mental messages, there seems no reason why it should not be sensitive to the thoughts of many minds all at high tension.

DONNE'S WIFE APPEARS.

The more personal vision, of some person emotionally in tune with the percipient, seems often to have taken the form of that person's wraith, of "double". A classical example in England literature is that told by Isaac Walton of how the poet Donne saw his wife's double. Donne had gone to Paris with Sir Robert Drury, who accompanied the English ambassador, Lord Haye, to the Court. Mrs. Donne was left in Sir Robert's house, in Drury Lane. She was with child, and Donne was anxious because his wife begged him not to leave her, fearing a disaster. Two days after his arrival, Donne was found alone by Drury, in "an ecstasy". As soon as the poet could answer his patron's questions as to what ailed him, he said: "I have seen my dear wife pass twice by me through this room, with her hair hanging about her shoulders, and a dead child in her arms; this I have seen since I saw you". In spite of Drury's reassurances, Donne was so convinced of the truth of his vision that Drury sent a special messenger to Drury House to ascertain the facts. The

messenger returned in twelve days with complete confirmation of Donne's knowledge. Mrs. Donne's child had been born dead at the time of her husband's vision.

COMMUNICATION FROM A DOG.

Mr. Ralph Durand, the writer of books of adventure, has supplied me with the following, which tallies with an experience that the late Sir Rider Haggard described, of a dream in which he saw his dog lying dead by the side of a railway track. The dog was missing when he awoke, and subsequently its dead body was found at the spot seen by Haggard in his dream. Mr. Durand writes: —

I myself had a similar dream. I know that the exact time of its occurrence was after 7 a. m., for I had been called at that hour and had fallen asleep again. The dream was very vague and lacking in detail, but I awoke for the second time with so acute a feeling that my little dog was in great distress that I mentioned it at the breakfast table. The dog was nowhere about, but this gave me no concern, as it was his habit to leave the house every morning as soon as it was opened at 6.30 and range in neighbouring woods till at midday he returned for his dinner. At midday the dog was still missing; at 3 p. m. I was in my garden and heard him

whine. Looking up I saw him standing in the gravel path. I called him, but he made only one feeble limp towards me. I went up to him and found that his front paw was caught in a rabbit snare. It was obvious that in his struggle he had wrenched out of the ground the peg that held the snare and had painfully dragged home both wire and peg — over what distance it was impossible to say. "I am inclined to believe", adds Mr. Durand, "that the dog was in the snare at 7 a. m., that in his distress he thought of me and, very likely, tried to call me to come and release him; and that my mind, being in a receptive condition owing to my being

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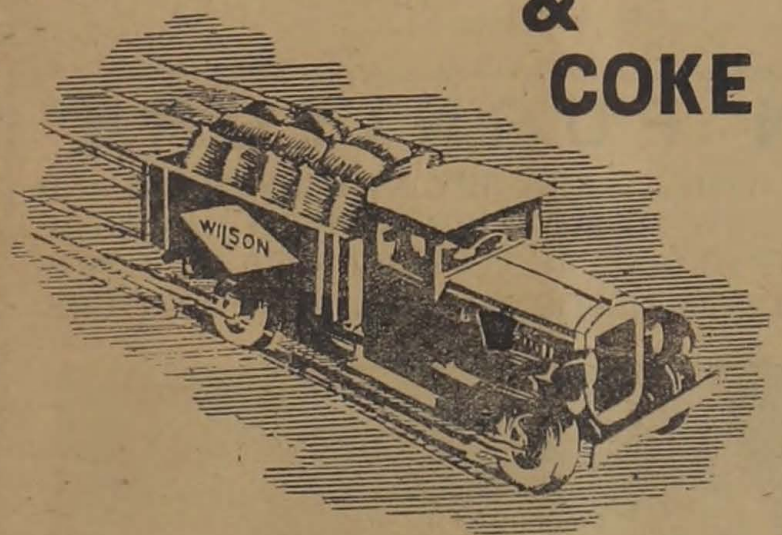
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the nightmare to explain it. True, the explanation was not far from the mark, but it was a reasonable inference, and the exaggeration of the nightmare was no doubt merely the growing anxiety over that unopened telegram. PROBABILITY NO PROOF.

Like many pseudo-scientific French, M. Delage is too ready to treat all unexplained dreams of this kind as wanting only enough data for an equally simple explanation. He ignores the possibility that Chabry might have received a mental message from his father, who wanted him, even though he was able to prove that the telegram had been left overnight. That he really saw the telegram, without paying conscious attention to it, is probable, but is without any proof. According to Delage, the probability becomes the explanation of the dream. But what of dreams where the only probable explanation seems to be some kind of telepathy? Are we to agree with the scientific seep that there is no explanation

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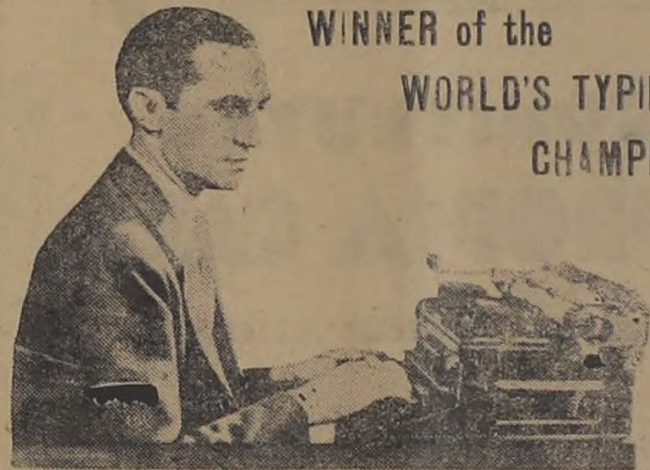
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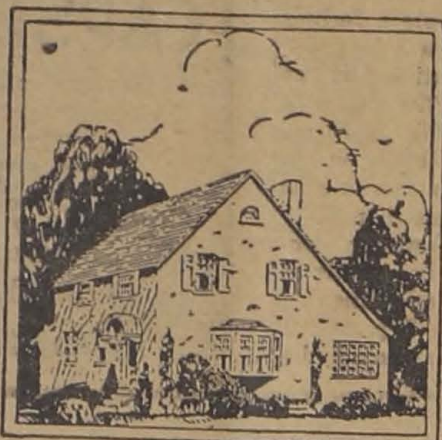
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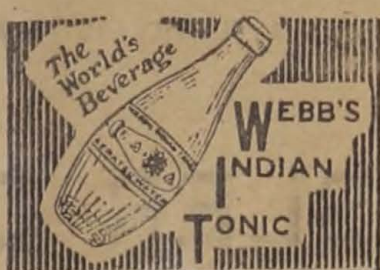
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EX - MINISTER ARRESTED

Santiago, Chile, February 10th

The Government has circularised all the Chilean Embassies and Legations abroad stating that the recent strikes were organised by agitators from abroad, energetic measures, such as declaring a state of siege. It adds that complete order now reigns throughout the country.

The Detective Bureau announces the arrest this evening of seven Communists who were making efforts to renew the railway strike.

RE - SHUFFLING THE CABINET

London, February 10th

Mr. Baldwin is now considering a re-shuffle of Cabinet post, which is expected to accompany the announcement of the Government's rearmament plans for March, according to the Political Correspondent of the "Morning Post", who understands that the primary cause of the impending changes is the necessity which will shortly arise of replacing the First Lord of the Admiralty, Viscount Monsell. It is thought that Mr. Baldwin may decide at the same time to replace the Secretary for the Air, Viscount Swinton, by a Minister with a seat in the House of Commons.

It is anticipated that there will also be a number of significant changes in other Departments.

The correspondent asserts that, in view of the magnitude of the rearmament programme, any change of personnel among the Defence Ministers is regarded in political circles as a matter of the first importance.

When Lord Monsell announced his intention not to seek re-election to the House of Commons it was generally understood that he wished to retire from active political life, and would only continue in office until the conclusion of the Naval Conference.

Viscounts Monsell and Swinton both gave up their seats in the House of Commons at the General Election last November to take Peerages. Well-informed circles believe that Mr. Baldwin intends to restore Sir Samuel Hoare to a prominent place in the Cabinet at the earliest opportunity for which reason it is not unlikely that he will succeed either to the Admiralty or the Air Ministry.

SOME AMERICAN STATISTICS

It would be difficult to find a more reasonable explanation. And if anyone recalls the warning at the beginning of this article that scientifically telepathy is not yet established, it remains like prophetic dreaming, and with less difficulty of rational deduction, a strong probability. Moreover, this probability has been further strengthened by recent experimental work in the United States, notably by Dr. J. D. Rhine, at Duke University, North Carolina. In a long series of experiments, totalling about 100,000, Dr. Rhine attempted to eliminate the misleading results of chance guesses.

His experiments were limited to five diagrams with simple outlines, thus leaving a chance of one in five for a correct guess. He found a slight but fairly consistent preponderance of correct results, sufficient to rule out mere chance. But some of the people experimented on never gave a percentage above one in five, suggesting that they lacked the sensitiveness required to receive a mental message under the conditions of the experiments. Two other interesting conclusions reached were that distance does not affect the telepathic transmission, and that the percentage of correct answers increased when the brain was stimulated.

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
