THE ETHIOPIAN CONFLICT

Rome, February 26th

It Italian press, stressing the allusion made yesterday by Captain Eden in the House of Commons concerning the intentions of the Committee of Five, express the unanimous belief that these proposals will furnish no base for the solution of the Italo-Ethiopian conflict. "Lavoro Fascista" says: "Our colonial demands are clear and evident and will not be realized until the sovereignty of Italy is definitely recognized in the lands to be colonized. The proposals of the Committee of Five are even more unacceptable today inasmuch as this land in Africa has been consecrated to us by the blood and labour of our soldiers". The "Giornale d'Italia" declares that the proposals of the Committee of Five do not take into consideration the diplomatic and political positions acquired by Italy in Ethiopia as a result of Ethiopian concessions, nor the necessity of Italian territorial expansion. On the contrary, the "L'Osservatore Romano", official organ of the Vatican, considers the suggestions of the Committee should be seriously considered.

ANGLO - AMERICAN NAVAL AGREEMENT

London, February 26th

From an authorized source it is declared that the British Government, fore-seeing the collapse of the Four Power Naval Conference between Great Britain, France, the United States and Italy, has proposed the celebration of a tri-party Naval Pact between the United States, Great Britain and Germany. It is also affirmed that the British offer to this effect has been the result of the impatience felt at the insistence of the French and Italians that European political disputes be mixed in the naval negotiations. It is believed that the formal negotiations towards the new Pact are to be initiated immediately.

BRITAIN AND AIR RAIDS

London, February 25th

Measures for precautions against air raids are outlined in two Government documents which have just been issued.

One of these gives details of courses for the training of instructors at a civilian anti-gas school to be established in Gloucestershire, and the other describes the organisation recommended for dealing with damaged buildings and roads.

The first course at the new anti-gas school is to begin immediately after Easter.

Members of the Public Services will in the first instance be trained, and arrangements will be made later for the instruction of employees of industrial and commercial undertakings of public importance.

The main course will last two weeks, and special courses for doctors, nurses and chemists are contemplated.

MARTIAL LAW IN JAPAN

Tokio, February 26th

Martial law has been declared throughout the entire nation beginning at 3.00 p. m. today. It is officially announced that Mr. Goto has been entrusted with the Presidency of the Council of Ministers and the Ministry of Interior. The rebel group which assassinated three Ministers was formed of young officers disguised as soldiers and acting under the command of a Captain of the Imperial Guard. The Government is to issue an official statement covering the recent events within a few hours.

Shanghai, February 26th

The Prime Minister, Admiral Okada, was attacked by his assassins while in bed, being brutally assaulted before killed with pistol bullets. General Watanabe is in a grave condition as the result of his injuries. The Ministers Saito and Takashi were also assassinated, and it is reported that over eighty other persons were killed during the revolt. The Imperial Palace has been placed under close guard although it is declared by the rebels themselves that they were attempting to overthrow the Government but remained loyal to the throne. The authorities at Tokio have imposed a strict censorship which has prevented anything more than bare details from being received. It is stated that troops are patrolling the streets of Tokio, although calm has been restored. Among the dead is the Chief of Police. In well informed circles it is affirmed that the head of the military revolt was Captain Nonaka and that the purpose of the military revolt was Captain Nonaka and that the purpose of the movement was the installation of a military dictatorship in Japan. It is believed that the Government completely dominates the situation.

Minister of Marine to sail immediately for Tokio harbour. The second squadron is to leave for Osaka bay where it will unite with the first unit and proceed to Tokio. The Ministry of Marine has declared that both squadrons will be used for the maintenance of order in the Capital, arriving there on Thursday. It is believed, however, that the existence of the plot was not unknown in naval circles, and it is noticeable that the Ministry of Marine was occupied in the first few moments of the revolt by a detachment of Marines which had been called in from Yokotuka. It is rumoured that, although it has been announced that Mr. Goto will assume the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, the Emperor has entrusted Admiral Osumi with the formation of a new Cabinet. Operations on the Stock Exchanges at Tokio and Osaka have been suspended.

The Prime Minister Stated in the House of Commons to-day that the whole question of ensuring that there is neither waste nor undue profit to the contractors responsible for supplying armaments for the Government Departments was under the closest investigation, and would be dealt with in the forth-coming debate on Defence.

London, February 26th

MIGRATIONS WITHIN THE EMPIRE

London, February 25th

The Government proposes to set up an Overseas Settlement Board and a Central Committee of Overseas Settlement.

The Board, which will consist of three official and five unofficial members, under the chairmanship of Mr. Douglas Hacking the parliamentary Under the chairmanship of Mr. Dominions, will consider and advise upon specific proposals for schemes of migration within the Empire.

The Committee, which will be constituted later, will undertake day-to-day administration and co-ordination between the Government and voluntary organisations.

ACCIDENT TO AIRPLANE

A serious accident occurred to a machine of the Military Aviation School yesterday morning at 10.30 when, as the result of a defect, the plane turned completely over while attempting to land. The crash occurred after the pilot, Pedro Curbelo, had been in the air for about an hour and was returning to the base due to the presence of certain faults in the performance of the motor. Being near the Civil airfield, he landed there, and as the machine touched the ground, it turned completely over. The pilot was injured, being taken to the Aviation School, and the plane badly damaged.

CARNIVAL

The usual festivities marked the three "official" days of Carnival, the crowds along 18 de Julio being as dense — or even more so — as in past years, and the traditional tablados made the nights hideous throughout the city. There seems to have been a unusually large number of visitors in the city, but it is noticeable that the great majority of them went out to the various resorts along the coast instead of remaining in town for the holidays. A practice which merits the attention of the authorities.

EXTRAORDINARY FNCTION AT THE CANODROME

A special programme of grey hound races has been planned for tonight at the Canodrome, calle 8 de Octubre 2845, in honour of the officers of the three Uruguayan Coast Guard Cutters, who recently arrived with the new vessels from Europe. The programme has been carefully prepared and the combination of good sport and a large gathering of visitors makes the success of the evening a certainty. The races start at 9.00 p. m.

ACTIVITY ON THE TABLADA

Although the entry of 2,313 cattle on the Tablado yesterday was relatively small, great interest was shown by the buyers and prices maintained the high levels of the last few days. The 1641 sheep offered also brought good prices. Prospects for the next few weeks look good.

TOURISTS RETURN TO BUENOS AIRES

Although what may possibly be considered the great majority of the visitors from Buenos Aires still remain here, seven steamers carried back over three thousand passengers on Tuesday night and a large number also returned last night, five steamers being used. The traffic via Colonia was also intense.

THE NEW COAST GUARD CUTTERS

The newly arrived Coast Guard Cutters, "Rio Negro", "Pay-sandú" and "Salto", are leaving today for the Rio Uruguay up as far as Salto, returning later to Montevideo for the purpose of entering dry dock for a general inspection. The visit of the new vessels is awaited with great interest in the interior, and the officers and crew are to be guests at numerous receptions.

DR. GHIGLIANI RELEASED

The Criminal Judge of the 1st Court, Doctor Gamarra, has decreed that the case of Doctor Ghigliani, who shot Doctor Demichelli in the halls of the Senate some time ago, be archived. As a result Ghigliani will be immediately released from his provisional custody, his guarantees returned, and the case closed. According to the decision of the Court, Doctor Ghigliani shot Doctor Demichelli in "self defence".

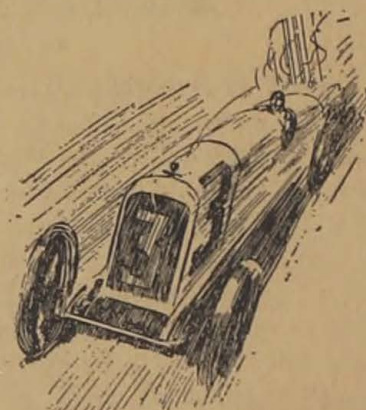

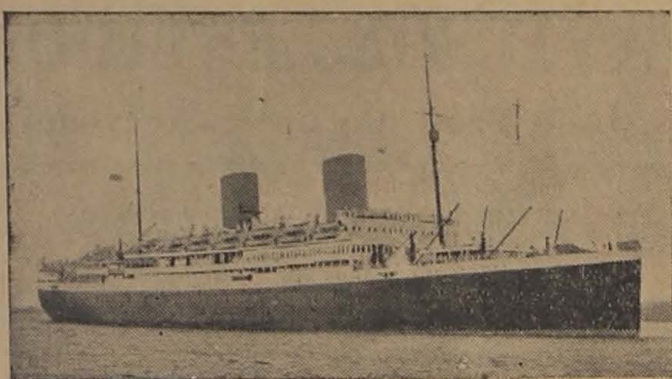

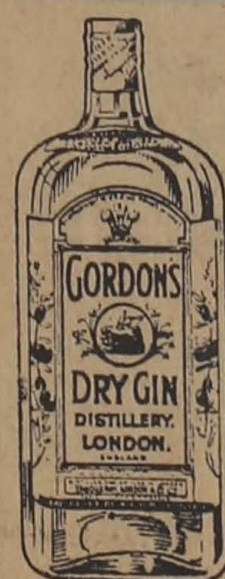

MILK RECIPES

SOUR MILK

Don't ever waste milk because it is sour. A taste may be cultivated for sour milk so that it can be used satisfactorily as a beverage as well as in the making of all kinds of hot breads and cakes.

Sour milk and sour cream are good foods at any time. But sour milk, has all the fine food values the same milk had when sweet, and these values are, for the most part, the kind that are not easily destroyed by cooking. So you get them in biscuits or cookies made with sour milk, or in delicious muffins or waffles, gravies, sauces or pies made with sour cream, as well as in the ice-cold buttermilk that is so refreshing on a hot day. As for the lactic acid bacteria that cause the souring, they merely help along the process of digestion.

CLABBER

Everyone who has ever lived or visited on a farm should remem-

ber "clabber", when the milk is in the early stages of souring it is smooth tender and jelly like. Clabber with a little sugar and cream makes a delicious dish.

Sour cream is more of a luxury than sour milk, and even a few spoonfuls are useful. It takes only a little to whip into horse-radish sauce for meat or fish. Nor does it take much to make a spoonful or two of whipped sour cream to add to a bowl of soup or to give flavor to a sauce or gravy.

For much less than the cost of fresh cream you can buy delicious sour cream, at just the right stage of sourness, to serve as salad dressing — just the thick sour cream, by itself. Try this on salad of chopped raw vegetables — cabbage, cucumbers, radishes and young onions, or what you will. And try it with cottage cheese, pouring it over the cheese to make it richer, smoother and more tasty.

ACIDS AND MILK

Milk curdles if you add acid to it — fruit juices, or tomatoes, for example — unless you do something to prevent it. In making cream of tomato soup you prevent curdling thus: First you add a little flour thickening to the tomatoes. The flour acts as a "bind-der" we say, which means that it holds the molecules of casein whe-

re they are, apart from each other in the liquid. The flour also takes the edge off the acid, so to speak, because the protein in the flour combines with the acid and makes it less likely to affect the casein. Second, you add the hot tomato mixture to the milk, little by little. If you were to do this the other way around, adding the milk to the tomatoes, you would be putting so little milk into the much acid — hot acid, too — that your soup would curdle. Peas and asparagus contain less acid than tomatoes, but they contain tannins and salts which may curdle the milk and require caution.

This lunch helps to solve mother's problem of building up the under-weight child, a lemon egg-nog and a nut bread sandwich. The eggnog is made as follows:

1 egg
2 tablespoons lemon juice
2 tablespoons sugar
Milk
Grated lemon rind
Beat egg yolk with lemon juice and 1 tablespoon sugar. Pour into a tall glass. Beat egg white very stiff with 1 tablespoon sugar. Fold three-fourths of egg white into egg yolk mixture. Add milk to almost fill glass. Stir well with a spoon. Top drink with remaining of beaten egg white. Grader" we say, which means that it holds the molecules of casein whe-

“BACKYARD MINING

The highly complicated and expensive processes usually employed in gold mining, are simple in the extreme. The only equipment necessary is a pick and shovel; a hand-made windlass; a garden hose; a washing and sluice box; muscle and the willingness to use it; and — last but not least — a pot of land containing gold!

The Jacksonville miner first digs a hole about four feet square down to bed-rock, which is usually found twenty-five to thirty feet below the surface. Directly over this shaft he sets up a simple windlass, operated either by hand or machine, and a washing-box. A bucket, made by cutting an old oil-drum in half, is then lowered into the hole by a rope fastened to the windlass. The miner is now ready to start actual operations.

The crew below — usually two or three in number — fill the bucket with gold-bearing gravel, which is found in a layer within eighteen inches of the bed-rock. As this “pay-dirt” is

removed, tunnels six feet in height are driven in various directions in order to provide sufficient room for the workers.

To prevent “cave-ins”, pine or firposts are used as props, with three-inch planks across the tops wedged against the ceiling of the mine. A recent decision of the Oregon State Supreme Court permits tunnelling under all streets within the village, so that the ground beneath the houses may soon resemble a rabbit-warren.

When the bucket is filled, it is hoisted to the washing-box by the windlass, operated by the above-ground crew. Directly from three to five yards of sand and gravel have been accumulated in the washing-box — an average day's work for four or five men — a hose is turned on and the material washed out through the sluice-boxes. These, constructed of wood, are about forty feet long, ten inches wide, and eight inches deep. Riffles, resembling ordinary metal door matting, are placed in the bottom near the lower end.

As the material passes through the boxes, the gold — nineteen times heavier than water, and eight to twelve times heavier than the sand and gravel — is trapped by the riffles. If the water through which too much force the fine or “flakey” gold will be carried away and lost.

The amount of gold recovered at each operation varies from day to day, according to the richness of the strata. Some days produce nothing; others yield from a quarter-ounce to a full ounce; but occasionally the reward will be two or three ounces — not too bad, considering the present price of gold. There are now about twenty-five “outfits” working in Jacksonville, and the total weekly output runs somewhere from \$1,500 to \$3,000. This gold is of an excellent quality, the grains ranging in size from a pin-head to a kernel of corn.

The development of so unusual and profitable a type of mining, which would undoubtedly cause the greatest excitement in any other community, is accepted by the citizens of Jacksonville as a matter of course. It is simple another incident in the series of peculiar happenings, marking the history of a pioneer town which has, from its very beginning, known that inevitably accompany close association with the mining industry.

Jacksonville is to be congratulated on this latest development for more reasons than one. “Back-

PARTY GAMES

I EXPECT you all have a whole list of jolly games to play at your winter parties, so I'm not going to give you a lot of suggestions.

There are one or two games, though, that I and my friends have invented recently, and may amuse you.

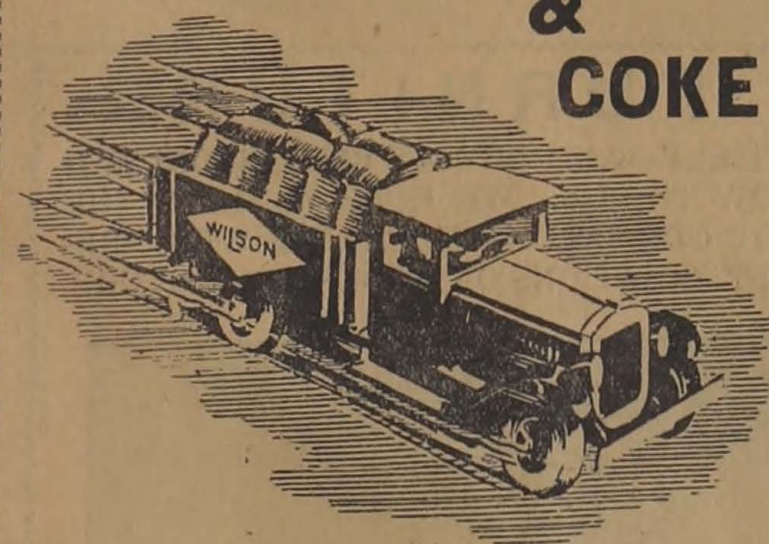

BRITISH TRADE WITH ARGENTINA

London, February 25th
Reply to a question in the House of Commons, the President of the Board of Trade said that the Government was aware that the balance of Anglo-Argentine trade during the past two years was in favour of Argentina to the extent of 28 millions sterling, but referred to the Roca Pact as evidence of the effort to safeguard British interests.

FREE STATE AND BRITAIN

London, February 25th
Asked in the House of Commons whether, following on the recent success of the coal and cattle negotiations with the Irish Free State, he would now set on foot negotiations for settling all the outstanding economic disputes between the two countries, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, Secretary for the Dominions, said that he had that aspect of the matter in mind and his Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom would not fail to take advantage of any opportunity of improving the relations with the Free State.

Mr. EDEN'S SPEECH

London, February 25th
Commenting on Mr. House of Commons, the "Times" observes that without a rearmament by Great Britain there will be no disarmament.
The "Daily Telegraph" says that Mr. Eden came out as a would-be conciliator and peacemaker.

The "Daily Herald" says: "It is fantastic that we should be satisfied with the speed of the existing sanctions."
The "Daily Express" state: "Collective security" is a phrase as full of dynamite and delusion as President Wilson's famous "self-determination".
The "Daily Mail" remarks that Mr. Eden is apparently ready to attempt to enforce an oil embargo if the Committee of Eighteen votes in its favour.

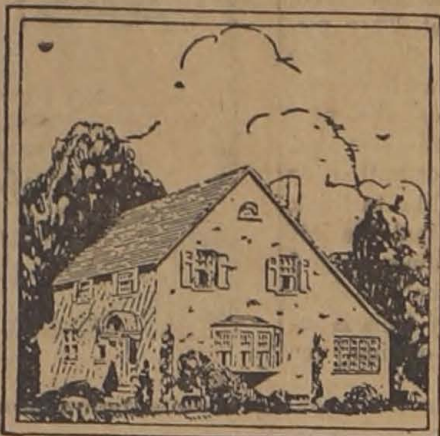

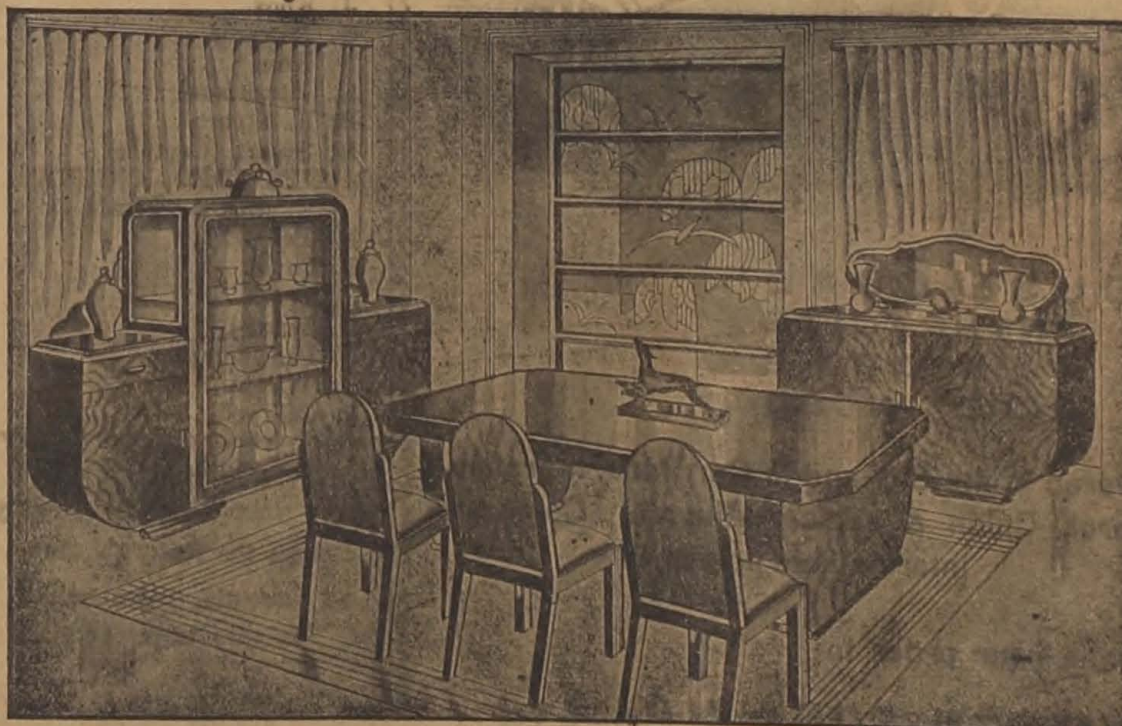
