THE ANGLO - FRENCH SUGGESTION

Paris, December 9th

The following official communique has been issued by the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs in connection with the reports circulating abroad concerning the recent peace proposals made to the Italian Government by France and Great Britain: "The Foreign Ministry of France, Mr. Pierre Laval, have abstained from making public the proposals adopted jointly by them to serve as a base for the friendly solution of the Italo-Ethiopian conflict, which have already been communicated to the interested Governments. Therefore, all the reports published concerning these suggestions may be considered as pure imagination".

Geneva, December 9th

The Secretary General of the League of Nations has adopted the measures necessary in case Italy accepts the proposals established by the agreement between Laval and Hoare. The Committee of Eighteen will postpone its session, and the Committee of Five will be convoked as soon as possible Italy being officially invited to take part in this session. Beginning in the early morning, various conversations were initiated between Paris, London, and this city for the purpose of resolving various questions dependent upon the acceptance in principle of the suggestions by Mussolini. It is believed in well informed circles that the possibilities of peace are being taken seriously in London and Paris.

London, December 9th

The Prime Minister, Mr. Stanley Baldwin, after a lengthy conference with Mr. Peterson and Captain Eden, convoked an extraordinary session of the Cabinet for the afternoon. It is known that during this meeting Baldwin will advise his colleagues of the proposals made to Italy by Sir Samuel Hoare and Mr. Laval and the conversations held in Paris for the purpose of solving the Italo-Ethiopian dispute.

THE CAMPAIGN IN AFRICA

Addis Ababa, December 9th

Rumours are circulating here to the effect that the Italian air forces have bombarded Ankober, situated one hundred fifty kilometres north west of the capital. These reports have not been confirmed and the Government maintains upon the matter. A further message from Jijiga states that an Italian plane has flown over the city without making hostile demonstrations. It is officially informed, that an Italian squadron bombed the troops of Ras Desta Demtu on Thursday last, causing the death of hundreds of Ethiopians. The Italians are believed to have suffered one death when an observer was struck by the shell from an anti-aircraft cannon. The inhabitants of the Capital continue to excavate cellars of refuge against aerial bombardments. No definite information has been received concerning the military operations on the various fronts, it being certain that no major clashes have occurred.

THE NAVAL CONFERENCE

London, December 9th

The representatives of Great Britain, the United States, Japan, France and Italy, as well as the High Commissioners of Ireland, Australia, Canada India, New Zealand, and South Africa met at 10.30 a. m. in Clarence House for the inauguration of the Naval Conference convoked by the British Government. The arrival of the Delegates was witnessed by an immense crowd of spectators. The Prime Minister, Mr. Stanley Baldwin, inaugurated the session. In his speech he declared that it is the duty of the Delegates to carry out the labours initiated in previous Conferences in order to prevent a disaster which would involve the entire world in case there is unrestrained naval competition between the nations. He reiterated that Great Britain is disposed to prolong the principles and agreements contained in the Washington and London Treaties, and also the introduction of further necessary naval limitations, such as the use of submarines. He added: "Fourteen years have passed since the beginning of the limitation of naval armaments, made as a result of the Washington Treaty, and, although certain nations represented here may be considered as exceptions to the limits provided by the Washington and London Treaties, it cannot be denied that during these fourteen years none of the signatory nations have demonstrated a spirit of rivalry which would frustrate the objectives of the Agreements". After Mr. Baldwin's speech, the American Delegate, Mr. Norman Davis, emphatically declared that the United States will not enter any naval race and added: "We do not need to increase our naval armaments. We desire naval limitation and reduction and our present naval construction programme is essentially only to replace obsolete equipment". He added that President Roosevelt desires that the present Naval Treaties remain in effect, and predicted that their abandonment will signify the loss of the principles of security and parity, and will result in an armament race, the consequences of which cannot



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that Italy will demand an increase in her naval forces. The Conference will meet in Plenary session tomorrow to 10.30 a. m.

SPANISH CABINET FALLS

Madrid, December 9th

The Cabinet presented its collective resignation this afternoon, the President of the Republic, Mr. Alcalá Zamora, immediately beginning the usual conversations preliminary to the formation of a new Cabinet. According to tradition, the first person called upon was the President of the Courts, Mr. Santiago Alba. Questioned by the press after his interview, Alba declared that he believes that it is "necessary to prevent further ministerial crisis and to also avoid the moment the dissolution of the Courts".

ERUPTIONS IN NEW ZEALAND

Wellington, December 9th

The volcanoes on the Tonga Islands in the Pacific have entered into an unexpected period of activity, violent eruptions occurring which have caused great panic among the inhabitants. The outbreaks were preceded by subterranean noises and over twenty earthquakes shook the surrounding districts, accompanied by torrential rains. Flames and gas are issuing from the crater and lava is overflowing down the sides of the mountains, having covered an area of over three kilometres. The villages of Betani and Togomamao have been evacuated as a precautionary measure.

RESUMPTION OF RIOTING

Cairo, December 8th

Renewed rioting broke out to-day with medical students in which a British police officer was hurt. The student burned four trams in the vicinity of the main Government hospital on which they hoisted the revolutionary flag. The police fired intermittently throughout the morning.

The students turned the hospital into a fortress and held the police at bay until they had set several trams on fire, they also frustrated the police in their attempts to lower the revolutionary flag. The students are caring for their own wounded in the hospital.

Two thousand students this morning also barricaded themselves in the school of commerce and perched themselves on the walls from where they stoned the police in the streets while the latter prevented students from the medical school in the near-by hospital from joining their mates in the commerce building.

The police formed a cordon around the hospital where the streets were littered with stones and fragments of glass.

Some students with street crowds also paraded near the British Turf club where the British Chief of Police, Russell Pasha, and his assistant commissioner, Baker, Pasha, ordered the crowds to disperse.

When they refused the pair plunged into the crowd with bare fists and knocked out half a dozen persons before reserves arrived and scattered the rioters.

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be predicted. The Japanese Delegate, Admiral Osami Nagano, stated that Japan desires a just and honourable disarmament which will insure an adequate defence for all, while reducing the burdens of the people. He stated that he believes that the new Treaty should be based upon the fundamental idea of establishing among the major naval powers a common limit of armaments, fixed at the lowest possible point which could not possibly be exceeded. The head of the Italian Delegation affirmed that Italy is convinced that it is necessary to prevent a naval armaments race, but cautiously added that it is difficult to establish rigid restrictions over any considerable period, and that it may be necessary to proceed in a gradual manner through a study of the problems which may arise. Suggesting that the sanctions against Italy may prevent that Government from making any concessions, he said: "You Gentlemen will appreciate that my Government finds itself obliged to carefully consider the attitude adopted by many states belonging to the League of Nations as regards the present situation". 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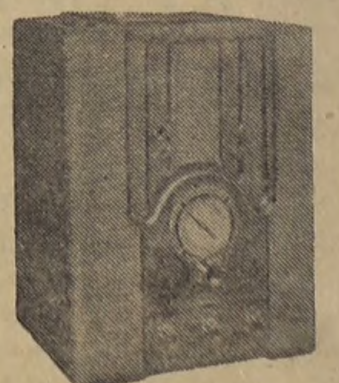
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THE NAVAL CONFERENCE

The indications for arriving at an agreement which will satisfy the principal Powers to be represented at the Naval Conference do not appear to be very promising.

The Japanese appear to be somewhat perturbed by the announcement that the question of the fortification of the Pacific will be raised by the Delegates of Great Britain and the United States and believe this to be with the sole object of convincing Japan of the necessity of coming to an arrangement with these powers. Closely connected with this problem is of course the proportion of capital ships which are allotted to each Nation, and which at present stand on a five, five, three, basis. That is under the

existing agreement Great Britain and the United States are allowed the proportion of five Capital ships each, to Japan three. Japan has never disguised the fact that she is anything but satisfied with this arrangement, and although officially denied by the Japanese Government, it is well known that she has been steadfastly fortifying some of the Islands which were passed over to her under a Mandate by the League of Nations. The United States has naturally had her eye on the doings of Tokio and has not been too easy in her mind. Now the Japanese have declared that if the States takes it into her head to construct new fortifications in the Pacific, or forms new Naval Bases, Japan will consider herself

free to reject that proportion and build her Naval strength up to a margin which will ensure her security in the far East. We fear that the chances of arriving at an arrangement which will be acceptable to the Asiatic Nation are extremely remote, and the chances are that we shall soon see all three engaged in ambitious programmes for the safeguarding of the interests of each country. Fortunately Great Britain has gone ahead with the Singapore Base in spite of the opposition at home, and we trust the pacific policy of the last few years has not been allowed to interfere with the proper measures being taken for the defense of the Eastern part of the Empire. It is our hope that whatever the result of the Conference may be, steps will be taken to bring the British Navy up to the full strength allowed, by the construction of modern ships to replace some of the older units which may have been the finest of their type at the time they were built, but are now clearly due

is the Nation which is in possession of the most modern equipment and men who have been trained to handle it who stand the best chance in a modern battle; the question of physical courage is of relative unimportance to-day. The war in Abyssinia is an example of this. For it is generally recognised that the Abyssinian soldier is a courageous fighter who does not know the meaning of the word defeat, and man to man can beat the Italian every time, but by the use of aeroplanes, tanks, etc., the Italians have been able to occupy a good slice of their country, and in spite of the known valour of the native, it has all been done with very little real fighting in the general sense of the word. To get back to Navy matters, the Italian navy is smaller than ours. It has never been tried. It is an unknown quantity. But it is at home in the Mediterranean, and we are not. It would have the support of an efficient Air-force which would be operating near home, and although we do not know what the Italian Navy can do in action, we know sufficiently well that the Italian Air-men are splendid pilots.

We also know that they have the machines, a proof of this was the massed flight to the States some time ago, and the splendid speed record they have won during the last few years. From this we assume that Mussolini has calculated that what he lacks in Naval Tonnage against the British fleet would be counterbalanced by the fact that he would be operating more or less in Italian waters and possess a superior Air force which would more than make up for the numerical superiority of the enemy. He has no doubt carefully considered that the British boats are far less modern than his, and that with his superior speed will be able to offset the disadvantage in tonnage. His somewhat bombastic speech of Saturday may be taken for what it is worth. But it is only reasonable to assume that he and his advisors have carefully weighed up the possible consequence of a war with England, and have decided that Italy has at least a chance of winning. To this level has the British Naval supremacy been allowed to sink. It therefore behoves Great Britain to be careful as to her commitments at the present Naval Conference, and to remember that she has her own problems to consider, and that they lie nearer home than the distant Far East at present. It has become obvious during the last few months that her hitherto undisputed supremacy in the Mediterranean is in danger, and that it is not sufficient to hold the keys to the entrance at each end unless it is backed by undisputed Naval strength in the sea itself. The time has passed when Italy as a Power could be ignored, and whatever happens in the future, the events of to-day have plainly shown that Great Britain is in no condition to meet the concentrated attacks of the Italian Navy without leaving other possible marauding Powers, who may not hesitate to snatch the opportunity to demonstrate their real feelings of friendship by the easy acquirement of some coveted part of her possessions.

The Italian Commercial Mission to Uruguay arrived in Montevideo on Sunday by the Italian Liner "Conte Verde" and was received by a large representative gathering of the Italian and Uruguayan businessmen.

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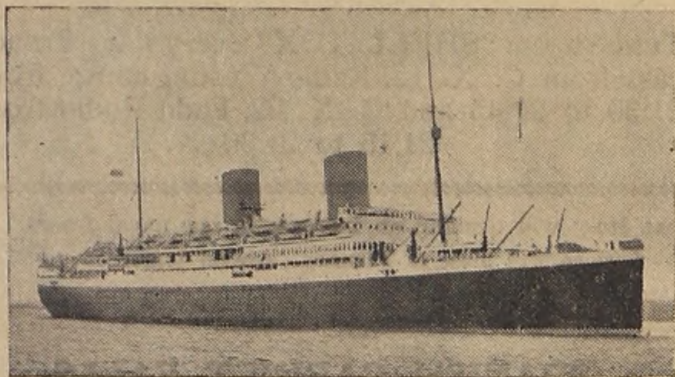

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for replacement. Quite apart from the possibility of trouble in the Far East in the future, we have the nearer possibility of serious trouble in the Mediterranean, and if the opinion of the Italians can be taken as a general opinion as to the efficiency of the present British Navy, it is safe to say that no time should be lost. It becomes increasingly more apparent that Mussolini is not afraid of it, and has sufficient confidence in the modern Italian Navy and Air force to have almost gone to the extent of defying it, and is ready if necessary to fight Great Britain. All of which seems to show that his opinion of the Invincible British Navy is to say the least of it, not what it was. The belief in Italy to-day seems to be that England is a decaying nation. That the end of the British Empire is in sight; and all his talk of finding an outlet for the surplus Italian in Abyssinia is just so much twaddle; what he really is out for is a good slice of the Empire, and he believes he is strong enough to get it by fighting if necessary, and not only does he believe it, but he has managed to convince a great part of the Italian Nation. We of course do not agree with him, and believe that if he feels like risking war with England the end of Italy is a foregone conclusion; we believe that he could make things very uncomfortable for us, and would no doubt be a dangerous customer to tackle, but we cannot imagine Italy defeating England. The fact remains however, that our Fighting Forces have been allowed to slide into the inglorious position of a Second-rate Power which Mussolini feels he can safely challenge. While England has been scrapping her ships and discharging her trained men, he has been rapidly building modern Battle-ships and conscripting the whole nation and turning it into an efficient fighting machine. We may not have a very high opinion of the Italian as a soldier; his physical courage has not a very wonderful reputation; but in a war to-day it

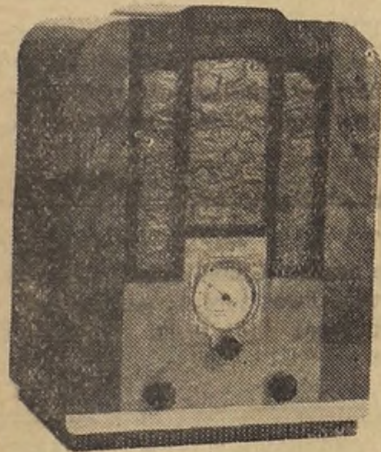

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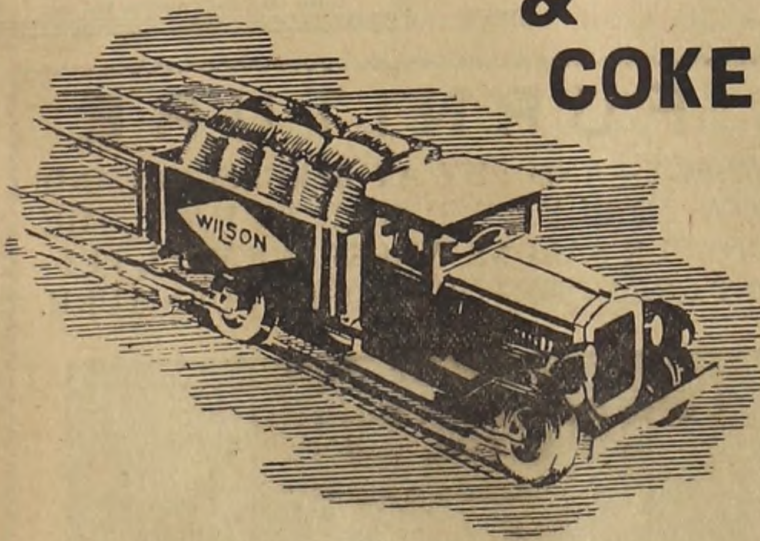

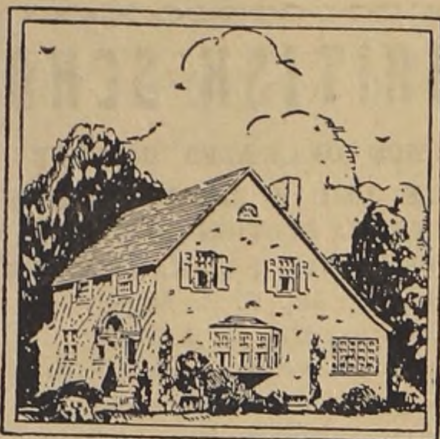
