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NOTICES FROM LONDON

London, October 31st

It is known that it is very probable that while the British and French naval experts discuss the preliminary details of the coming Naval Conference, they will also study the practical realization of the recent promise made by Mr. Laval concerning the assistance of France to Great Britain in case the latter is attacked in the Mediterranean. It is also declared that Great Britain is still not satisfied with the attitude of Italy as regards the anti-British propaganda, in spite of the fact that the violence of the Italian press has decreased. It is assured that the motives inspiring the British actions in Geneva continue to be attacked in Italy, especially in radio broadcasts, and also that the Italian concentration of troops in Libya is much greater than it should be. Although the contents of the conversation held between Sir Eric Drummond and Mr. Mussolini have not been revealed, it is believed that the major subjects of discussion were as to why Great Britain has not responded to the Italian retreat of military forces in Libya by a corresponding retreat of naval forces in the Mediterranean, and as to the British resentment at the campaign being made for the purpose of dis-associating Great Britain from the League and making it appear that she is taking actions on her own account.

London, October 31st

A study of the situation in the major European countries which manufacture arms and ammunition shows that although the embargo imposed by the League of Nations against Italy will certainly improve the situation of Ethiopia to a certain extent, it will not greatly injure the Italian Government. The different countries of Europe, with the exception of Great Britain, have acted in a discreet manner and it is noted the large armaments factories have not revealed any important details concerning the movement of their industry. It is also noted that a short time ago an official statement was made in Rome to the effect that "Italy does not need to buy arms". Further stress is placed upon the fact that some time ago the two greatest munitions works in Italy were combined by the Government in order to create a greater industry which will provide employment.

IRISH SWEEPSTAKE

Dublin, October 30th

Six subscribers to the Irish Free State Hospital Sweepstakes drew Commander III; five tickets were held by European subscribers, and two by Irish Free States holders, all of whom win £ 30,000.

Six tickets on Man's Pal were held in the United States; six in Europe, and six in Canada, all of whom receive £ 15,000.

The third horse was held by six subscribers in Europe; two each in Canada, South America, and the U.S.A., and one in South Africa, all of whom receive £ 10,000.

One of the South American prizes was won by Carolina Hermanos, Mollendo, Per., and the other by Vicot, of Medellin, Colombia.

OPERATIONS IN AFRICA

Addis Ababa, October 31st

The Ethiopian forces have adopted guerrilla warfare tactics in resisting the advance of the Italian invaders, numerous clashes occurring every night. The best native marksmen are employed in incessantly molesting the Italian forces, especially those passing along the road to Addis. An attack has been made upon the Italian engineers who had constructed pontoon bridges along this road and their constructions destroyed. It is announced from Tigrat that caravans arriving from the interior of Ethiopia state that great preparations are being made by the Ethiopian forces for an attack upon the Italian troops near Makalle, and that large groups are camped upon the Seianghi and other nearby rivers. It is believed that this attack will be made simultaneously upon the Italian flank and centre. Ras Kassa will attack the left wing and Ras Seyum the centre. It is considered by observers that an intense struggle on a large scale will be initiated shortly, inasmuch as the concentration of Ethiopian forces will make any further major Italian advance difficult.

RAILWAY SITUATION

London, October 30th

Presiding to-day at the annual general meeting of the Buenos Aires Great Southern Railway, Sir Follett Holt described the reduction in the dividend on the preference shares as a calamity.

"I do not", he declared "think that the present situation will endure long when its far-reaching effects are realised, but meanwhile the situation has engendered a profound dissatisfaction in this country.

"I look forward impatiently for a return of those happier days when the nationals of both countries, proud of their close and friendly association in trade and finance, enjoyed the mutual benefits which were the result"



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SPEECH OF MUSSOLINI

Rome, October 31st

In a speech made to the students congregated for the inauguration of the new University in Rome, Mussolini declared that Italy will definitely oppose the application of any sanctions by the League. He added: "In view of the economic siege they desire to impose upon us, which must make all the civilized people of the world feel shame, and in view of the experiment that the League desire to make for the first time today against the Italian people, I must say to you that we shall oppose with impacable resistance and our iron will, these measures which only merit our greatest disgust. You, University Students, form the front line of battle. You will make of this, as well as all the other Universities of Italy, a spiritual bulwark, an armed fortress in which you will all protect your lives". Several thousand students took part in the ceremony, as well as professors, members of the Fascist forces from all the Provinces, and Cardinal Fumasoni, who blessed the gathering. Mussolini stated that the termination of the University coincides with the victorious advance in East Africa of the Italian troops which carry the light of civilization to Africa.

WORLD WHEAT CROPS

Washington, October 30th

The Department of Agriculture estimates the world wheat production at 4,360 million bushels, representing a decrease of 240 millions as compared with the 1934-35 season, the stocks being smaller in all the leading countries with the exception of Canada.

Should the supplies in the Southern Hemisphere remain as estimated, the total may drop by 125 million bushels by the end of the 1935-36 season, and it is therefore predicted that Canada will dominate the export market.

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EVENTS IN GENEVA

Geneva, October 31st

In accordance with statistics published today by the General Secretary of the League of Nations concerning the answers received by the various Members nations concerning the proposals made by the Committee of Coordination, forty five nations have adhered to the proposed embargo upon armaments for Italy, forty three nations have approved the adoption of financial sanctions fifty two have decided upon economic sanctions, and thirty have agreed to mutually support the League. The Committee of Eighteen met in the announced session this morning under the presidency of the Representative of Portugal, Doctor Vasconcellos. During this session a preliminary examination was made of the answers received from the various Governments to the proposals made concerning sanctions against Italy. Among the points brought up was the problem of contracts now in effect with Italy and especially those contracts in which partial payment has already been made or received. This question particularly affects Norway and Poland. It was finally decided that the contracts made before October 19th are not included in the sanctions. The Committee entered into recess, holding a further session in the afternoon.

London, October 31st

The "Financial Times", disputing the belief expressed to the effect that Italy, having ceased for some time to request financial aid in England, will not suffer as a result of the economic sanctions, declares: "The financial sanctions will paralyse especially all those business deals with Italian firms in South America, even though these business interests do not concern Italy". It is added that the credits which previously have been open to Italian clients who offered foreign guarantees will be prohibited in the future.

JAPAN AND NAVAL CONFERENCE

London, October 30th

The reply of the Japanese Government to the invitation issued by the British Government to attend a Naval Conference in London on December 2 has now been received the invitation being accepted.

Two French Naval experts have arrived in London for preliminary discussions with the Admiralty regarding the Conference. Advantage may be taken of the presence of views on the technical details arising from the recent agreement between the French and British Governments on their interpretation of Article XVI (Par. 3) of the League Covenant.



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COAL MINERS

It is the usual thing to consider the coal-miner as being the hardest man in the world to please; he is popularly supposed to be a man who is never satisfied no matter what may have been done for him. Has he not got the seven hour day? Has he not been guaranteed a minimum wage? What more does he want? The people who are the miners great critics, are the people who least know the life he has to live in order to earn sufficient to maintain his family and himself in even the dingy surroundings where he is compelled to live. A Mining Village is anything but a thing of beauty in the more modern coal-fields of England and Wales, but in the older coal-mining districts, they are only very mildly described as depressing. A Mining Village is usually a dirty collection of cottages built in long rows, where only the most primitive sanitary arrangements are provided. Such things as bath-rooms are absolutely unknown, and the miner's wife is compelled to clear out the rest of the family when her husband comes home from his grimy toil, so that he can strip himself of his working clothes and get into a tub or something of hot water which she has had to heat over the fire in readiness for him. The miner himself, is far from being the lazy, agitating individual he is supposed to be: it is true he has put up some valiant fights in the past which may have caused inconvenience to other people in more congenial surroundings, but he has been fighting for the right to live. When people talk about the miner having a guarantee of a minimum wage, they very often don't know in the least what this means. The writer of this has had personal contact with many men who have been penalised to the extent of losing their job be-

cause they have demanded the minimum wage provided by the law. It should be remembered that only a small proportion of the workers at a coal-mine are actually miners. The miner is the man who actually hews or gets the coal from the coal-face; but it can be safely stated that for every miner in the mine, there are at least five men employed in the other necessary work to be done in the roads, or loading the coal which the miner has got into the small waggons, or tubs as they are called; besides the army of experienced men who are responsible for the safe timbering of the roof and sides of the roads, and the skilled men who look after the complicated system of bringing the coal from the coal-face to the pit-bottom. Of the dangerous nature of the work in coal mines, much has been said, not by any means too much. The so-called miner,—that is, all men who work actually down the mine are so accustomed to the dangers, that they themselves do not realise the fact that they take their lives in their hands every time they go down the pit, but a glance at the weekly paper published in any mining district will show that no week passes without some accident in which one or more men have lost their lives. These men have no time for all the talk about heroes; they don't

they can have a short rest before beginning the real work of the day. Once the man starts to work, there is no stopping for lunch, he carries his food in a small cloth bag which he calls his 'snap-bag', and he eats the food he has taken with him as the opportunity comes along, it may be that he has to wait a few minutes for the boy to come along with the empty waggons before he can get any more coal, in those few minutes he will eat part of his food, and as soon as the pony can be heard approaching he must be ready to put them into a suitable place for loading. There are a hundred and one things which are likely to arise during the day to prevent him from getting a mouthful of anything to eat until he gets home again. Then at the end of the shift he must start back on the two or three mile trudge to the pit bottom which will take him at least another hour, so that the miner's seven hour day really means that he is away from home for at least ten or eleven hours. When people talk about the wages of the miners, they quite ignore that the miner may only work two or three days in a week. It is very unusual for a miner to work regularly during the summer months when the demand for coal has been reduced. He never knows from one day to another when he will be sacked for some reason or other. His life is drab. His pleasures are drab too; what can he do living in such surroundings? When he gets home, he is usually too tired to want to do much, and even if he does, there is nothing for him to do, the only thing he can do is to wander down to the village pub, or workmen's club, where he will attempt to solve the political problems of the day, and where sometimes, some very shrewd opinions are often expressed in very concise terms which would not be considered flattering if overheard by the persons who control the destinies of these humble toilers in the bowels of the earth.

Choir practice is held on Friday Evenings at 9.00.

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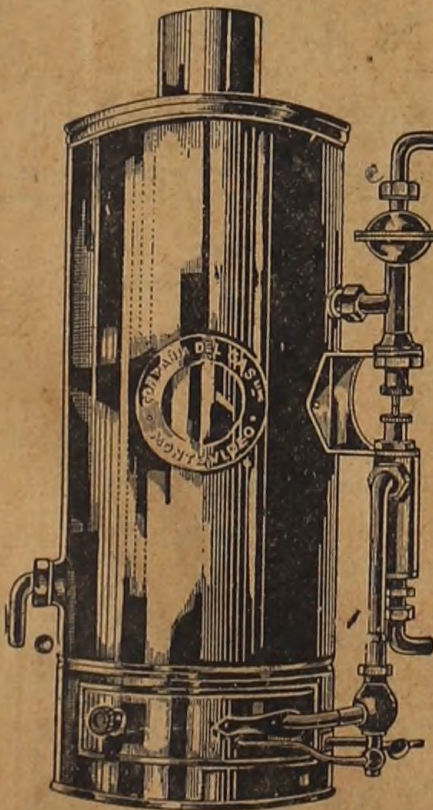

WHAT THE GREAT PYRAMID HAS TO TELL US?

PYRAMID GEOMETRY AND METROLOGY.

By C. B. Evans

(Continued)

It has already been stated that the unit of measurement used in the construction of the G. P. This unit is known as the Primitive, Polar or Pyramid inch, as the Earth's Polar Diameter measures exactly 500 million of such units according to the best surveys. This fact may be examined by anyone who cares to satisfy himself by taking the mean of the two determinations by the U. S. Geodetic Survey (1906 and 1906) of the Polar Radius, i.e., 6,356,888.5 meters which when doubled is equal to the Polar Diameter of 12,713,777 meters. Multiply by 39.37079 inches to the meter which gives us 50,551,444.36 inches, and one 500 millionth of this is equal to 1.0011028887 British inches to the Pyramid or Primitive inch.

Sir Charles Crawford says "The origin, at least for the British Inch, is confirmed by the connection between the Sacred half-cubit and the decimal division of the unit of 10 acres in ancient Cornwall, where the side of the 10 acres square occurred as a fur long of 8,000 inches".

The following may be of interest here: Up to the year 1824, about 200 Acts of Parliament had been enacted at various times to promote uniformity in our measures, but all failed owing to the difficulty of maintaining a standard not effected by climatic and temperature changes. Standards until the present ones were made, a set of which is preserved in the House of Commons, and the other replicas in the Standards Office. Yet here, in the very heart of the Great Pyramid, imperishably fixed for all time, and secure from all possible outside influences have reposed our standards of length and capacity.

for over 4,000 years ("The Witness of the Great Pyramid", p. 121).

EXTERIOR FEATURES

The Great Pyramid is the only one that is built on four corner or foundation stones. No stone is sunk into the solid rock on the same level owing to the variations in the levels of the rock, the difference being as much as seventeen inches between the highest and lowest. Each stone has been sunk into the solid rock which had to be cut out to receive each stone. From this it will be seen that there are three different levels from which the height of the Pyramid may be computed, but generally it is taken from the "Platform level" that is the one on which the Casing Stones rest.

Now the ceremony of "Laying the Foundation Stone" as we know it has been handed down to us from the ancient Egyptians by whom it was known as "the stretching of the cord" (or line), and as we are told, in the time of the XIIth. Dynasty was even then one of some considerable antiquity. Reference to this may be found in the Book of Job which would hardly be the case if it were an heathen monument. This is no less than might be expected when we take into consideration the fact that the Great Pyramid being earth commensurable, all the dimensions in it, externally and internally are based upon those of the earth itself, while at the same time incorporating its different motions as a member of the solar system.

In other words THE GREAT PYRAMID IS A STRUCTURAL OR GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF THE LAWS GOVERNING THE UNIVERSE EXPRESSED IN GEOMETRICAL LANGUAGE. ("The Witness of the G.P.", pp. 104-5).

Many details of exceeding interest to engineers and surveyors might be given here, but the impossibility of supplying diagrams with the text, on account of expense, it would simply be confusing to put them down. But when one sees the enormous amount of labour it cost the greatest Pyramid expert, Sir Flinders Petrie, for many years in charge of the Egyptian section of the British Museum, one wonders how the original foundations were surveyed over 4500 years ago, and how the excavations in the solid rock were made as well as at the quarries from which the stones came, some of which were over 80 tons

in weight. The question with the original designer or engineer was to set out a base platform whose four sides faced exactly N. S. S. and W. so that the Latitude and Longitude already mentioned would cut the horizontal planes of the Pyramid through the point of the apex, a base the sum of whose four base sides equalled 36,524.2 Pyramid inches, i.e., each side being 9131.05 P. inches, so that the sum of the diagonals should equal the length of the Perfection of the Equinox cycle of 25,826.52 years, as well as that the angle of slope of the four sides should give a vertical height the radius of a circle whose curved circumference would be equal to the sum of the four base sides, and at the same time be able to express the three astronomical years already mentioned. The question of the angle of the bottom Casing Stones would have to be the Pi angle for the Pyramid, to meet these conditions. Who knew have to be the Pi angle for the Pyramid, to meet these conditions. Who knew these things at the period of which we are speaking? they were all cosmic in nature.

The following are a few details of the exterior measurements of the Great Pyramid: Each base side equal to 9131.05 P. inches; from base angle to apex 7391.55 P. inches; vertical height 5813.01 inches; the Pi angle Casing Stones 51° 51' 14" 3; each base dia-

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gonal 12913.26 P. inches; a circle of twice the vertical height of the Pyramid is equal in area to the area of the space enclosed within the four base sides of the Pyramid; the difference between the recessed square base and the square less 36 P. inches on each side (the amount of the recess) is equal to 286.1 P. inches, this figure is now known to be "the Mathematical Constant of the Creative Law of Relativity". We shall come across this figure on many other occasions in our inquiry. It is also defined by Mr Davidson as the Great Pyramid's "Displacement Factor", for reasons which will be explained later. Without a diagram it is almost impossible to explain how from a plan of the Pyramid's base circuit, the Major Axis of the Earth's Orbit, as well as both the minimum and maximum Eccentricity of the same are given, it must be taken for granted unless anyone sufficiently interested would care to see for himself from diagrams in my possession, which I shall be pleased to show.

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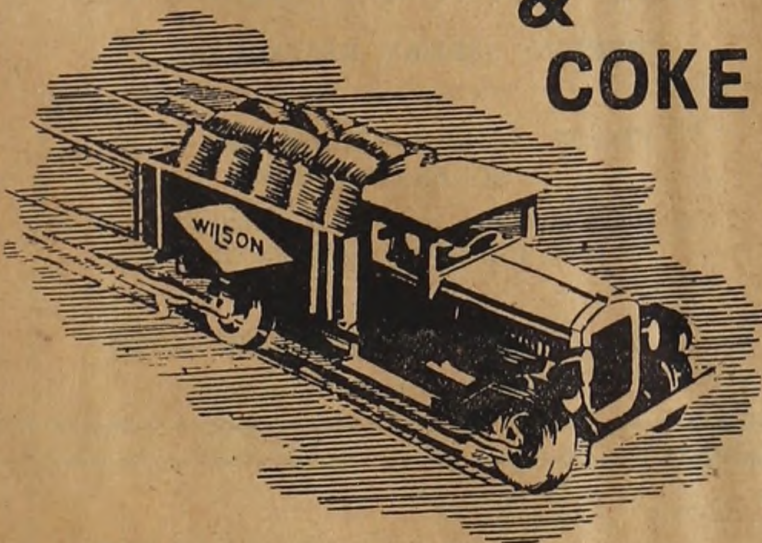
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ANGLO URUGUAYAN COMMERCE ASSOCIATION

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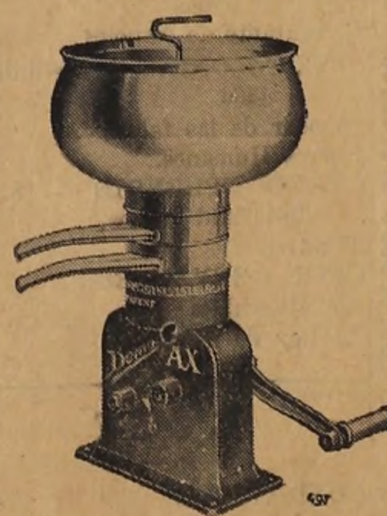
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
