COMPLETE VICTORY FOR THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT

London, November 15th

The Nacional Government has obtained a complete majority in the General Elections held yesterday, having obtained three hundred and eight seats. In spite of the tendency shewn yesterday towards the Labour Party, the final results have definitely proven that the Conservatives still possess the confidence of the British people. Mr. Ramsay MacDonald was completely defeated in the Seaham District by the Labour Candidate and his son, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, also was defeated in the Nottinghamshire elections by a small majority. Mr. Winston Churchill was re-elected from Appingate by a majority of over twenty thousand votes, and Sir John Simon was also victorious over his Labour opponent. Captain Eden and Mr. David Lloyd George were also re-elected. Miss Ellen Wilkinson, Labour candidate, was victorious in the mining region of Jarrow, where she was defeated in the last elections. The elections were carried out quietly, only a few minor incidents occurring. His Majesty the King evidenced keen interest in the results of the votation, his Secretary keeping in constant telephonic communication from Sandringham with the authorities. The official statistics published at 2.00 p. m. showed the Government with two hundred ninety six seats and a total of 7,601,431 votes. The opposition Parties held one hundred seventeen seats with a total of 6,588,789 votes. The results of the Elections which has shewn that the Government will secure an important majority has caused a great deal of activity upon the Stock Exchange, the Government bonds evidencing a notable increase in value. A great deal of activity was also shewn in industrial stocks.

Rome, November 15th

The General Elections in England have not greatly interested the Italian public, the press, in general, refraining from making any comments upon the results. The only observation made was to the effect that the British citizens showed no great desire to vote. It is generally believed that the results of the Elections will not by any means modify the attitude of the British Government as regards the Ethiopian dispute.

BRIGHTER OUTLOOK IN BRITAIN

London, November 14th

The signs accumulate of a growing business activity which promises well for a continued recovery.

At Monkton, near Jarrow, Durham, there is a proposal to construct new coke ovens and by-products and oil-cleaning plants at cost of a quarter of a million pounds, which will use about 200,000 tons of coal per annum.

An oil works at Meddlesbrough which has just booked a single order for 35,000 tons of oil has increased its earnings by 18 per cent since 1931, and is employing 59 per cent more labour.

DEATH OF GRAND DUCHES ANASTASIA

Nice, November 15th

The death of Grand Duchess Anastasia Nicolasa Irma of Russia, took place early this morning at Cap Antibes after a short illness. The Duchess was a sister of the Queen of Italy, and daughter of King Nicholas of Montenegro. Her husband, Grand Duke Nicholas, was commander of the Russian forces during the world war. Funeral services are to be held at the Russian Church in Cannes on Sunday, Queen Elena of Italy and Princess Mafalda being present.

MINERS VOTE FOR STRIKE

London, November 14th

On the eve of the announcement of the results of the General Election, preliminary figures in connection with the miners' ballot show an overwhelming majority in favour of a national strike to enforce the demand for an increase of 2s. per shift in wages approximately 20,000 votes being for a strike as compared with less than 500 against in twelve collieries.



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THE TENSION IN SHANGHAI

Shanghai, November 15th

Insistent rumours continue to circulate throughout the city to the effect that new hostilities between the Japanese and Chinese are to break out at any moment here and in North China. As a result of these rumours, the residents of the districts of Chapei are panic stricken and are continually evacuating the section. Great anxiety is also shown in the Japanese quarters of the International Zone, many thousands of Japanese having left for the South in spite of the fact that no new incidents have occurred in the diplomatic situation which justifies the existing nervousness of the public. It is reported from Nankin that Mr. Suma has solicited the Chinese that measures be immediately taken to put a stop to the renewed anti-Japanese campaign, the intensity of which has been revealed by the recent incidents in Shanghai. Suma reminded the Chinese authorities of the solemn promises made at the beginning of this year to the effect that such activities would be strictly prohibited.

ANOTHER CLASH IN CAIRO

Cairo, November 14th

Students arriving from Giza for a demonstration clashed with the police this morning on the Assas Bridge, which spans the Nile.

They met and attacked a strong police force, slightly injuring Bimbashi Lees in the head and seriously wounding a constable. The police fired, but the number of those wounded cannot be ascertained with certainty as the retreating students carried off their comrades in taxis.

The city remains calm, but further trouble is expected as the result of a communiqué issued by the Premier which indirectly blames Great Britain for the present unrest.

He recounts at length the history of his Premiership and declares that last year Great Britain opposed the Constitution, and that he protested through the High Commissioner.

The latter then suggested that a Government Committee should be appointed to draw up a new Constitution to be approved by representative of all he parties.

He (The Premier) refused to adopt this course, on the ground that he had already signified his desire that the Constitution of 1923 should be restored.

He adds that he has formally submitted the Egyptian demands to Great Britain but has received no reply other than that contained in Sir Samuel Hoare's speech at the Guildhall on Saturday night, "which I am obliged to consider as Great Britain's reply".

Meanwhile it is emphatically denied that the Wafd Party has ordered an anti-British boycott throughout the nations.



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DEVELOPMENTS IN AFRICA

Addis Ababa, November 15th

It is officially announced that Ras Kassa has received permission from the Emperor to carry out the operations on the northern front as he desires, and it is therefore believed that he will initiate a strong offensive destined to cut the Italian lines of communication between Addis and Makalle. It is also known that Dedjazmatch Hapte Marian, Governor of Uallega, has received orders to leave the capital for his Province at the head of ten thousand men. It is believed that some definite battle will be fought within the near future.

Rome, November 15th

The Ministry of Propaganda has issued the following communiqué: "General de Bono telegraphs: Our troops have occupied Azbi. The column of Dankalis, which have been operating in conjunction with forces from the First Corps, has clashed with troops of Dedjas Kassa Sebat near Azbi. After a violent combat, the Ethiopians were defeated, abandoning fifty five dead and several hundred wounded on the field. Four Italian officers were wounded. Nothing new has occurred in the other sectors. The air forces continue their flights over the Amba Alaghi zone, efficiently bombarding the enemy forces wherever they concentrate". Further messages report that the Italians are consolidating the positions occupied today in the Azbi sector.

Rome, November 15th

The imports of foreign newspapers and magazines is to be submitted to new restrictions after the 18th of this month. Up to the present these publications were considered to be among the articles on the free list, but in the future their entrance into Italy will be fixed upon a basis of proportions equivalent to the imports of the past year, and the amount of foreign exchange available will also be taken into consideration. In the future newspapers and magazines will not be considered as articles of prime necessity.

JOAN BATTEN SAFE

Rio de Janeiro, November 15th

Miss Joan Batten, the New Zealandese aviatrix who has just completed a flight across the south Atlantic, and who aroused a certain amount of anxiety due to her non-arrival in Rio after having left Natal, arrived here at 10.00 a. m. aboard a military airplane piloted by Major Aquino. She announced that she had been forced to land on the beach of Salinas Secas de Araruama due to a defect in her gasoline tank, her plane being slightly damaged. A squadron of military planes left early this morning in search of her machine, as it was feared that she had crashed. It is believed that Miss Batten will have her plane repaired immediately and continue her flight to Buenos Aires.

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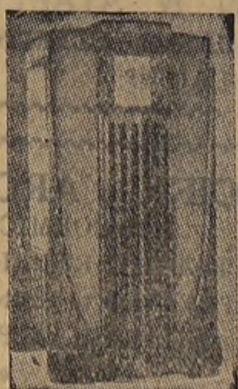
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THE ELECTIONS IN ENGLAND

In spite of the last moment rally of the Labour Party, the elections which took place in Great Britain on Thursday are a further proof-if proof is necessary - that the old country is in no mood to follow the modern craze for Dictatorship. In the first few months after the great "Death Drama" of Europe, no fewer than five of the greatest dynasties went down into irretrievable disaster. Since then, there have likewise been twenty seven new republics set up in that continent, and the most ironical thing about it is the fact that in none of them does the ideal of pure democracy dominate. Traditions, customs, and institutions have been ruthlessly scrapped with an urbanity of mind never known before. Each of these twenty seven new republics is to-day under some form of Dictatorship, and freedom of speech is now a thing of the past. The elections have shown those people who have occasionally made themselves heard by suggesting that what was needed in Great Britain was a good strong Dictator such as Mussolini or Hitler, what the nation really thinks about such forms of government. Fortunately the masses at home are able to see that the rantings of such persons as Mosley are inspired rather by a desire to obtain power than from a real conviction that such quixotic programmes would be of benefit to the nation.

It is possible that the results of the last election will go down in history from the fact that the opposition and the Government are both out for the same thing. Here we have the Government on the one hand wanting to apply the Sanctions against Italy, and on the other, the Opposition censuring the Government for not applying them enough; which just boils down to the fact that the Opposition is crying for more Government. The whole nation is evidently against the Italian Dictator, and demands the Powers

that be to take action to prevent him from disturbing the peace of the world. Great Britain has her faults; she cannot claim perfection in international politics, but we feel at home with one another and we can with pride take our place with other nations of the earth when great issues are at stake or grave decisions have to be made. Whatever the parties may stand for, there is something splendid in the knowledge that all are equally well served by a constitutional monarchy which is crowned by the merits of its own moral power. Great Britain has endured the test of the last few months with commendable confidence, and without arrogance in that confidence. The nation has known the trials and difficulties which have been likely to arise from the attitude of Italy in setting the League of Nations at defiance, and the elections have plainly shown that there can be no question of retreat from the stand adopted. One can not help wondering what opportunity the Italian or the German nations would have of voicing their real opinions at an election while Messrs. Mussolini and Hi-

ANGLO URUGUAYAN COMMERCE ASSOCIATION

An extraordinary session of the Executive Committee of the Asociación de Fomento del Intercambio Comercial Anglo-Uruguayano was held yesterday, H. E. the Minister of Cattle and Agriculture, Doctor C. G. Gutierrez, being present as a specially invited guest. During the session an extensive discussion was held of several phases of the commerce between the two nations and the primary importance of Uruguayan cattle production in this exchange. Impressions were exchanged between Doctor Gutierrez and the Committee which will undoubtedly be of reciprocal value. Attention was drawn during the discussion to the necessity of developing the activities of the Association around a basic objective tending to the development of the meat trade, and that on a par with the various R. Associations the Body should maintain an intimate and permanent contact with the Minister of Cattle and Agriculture, as well as the other branches of the Executive Power. It was also decided that all of these activities should be made public as they are directly affecting every inhabitant of Uruguay. The meeting was closed with a vote to the effect that such sessions should be held very frequently as they will greatly aid in the rapid development of coordinated action which will benefit the commercial exchange between Uruguay and Great Britain.

PUNISHING CUSTOMS FRAUDS

In an interview published in "El Pueblo" yesterday, the sub-Director of the Customs, Mr. Abel Costemalle, declared that this source of national income is the most important of all, and that the Customs also fill a very valuable economic position. He therefore believes that frauds which will affect the Customs should be even more severely punished than any others, even declaring that errors are not admissible and that they should be as harshly punished as open frauds. As regards the present laws, Mr. Costemalle affirmed that they must be coordinated but that efforts to his effect are being made by the Director General of the Customs, Colonel Baldomir, and that an efficient system of penal laws should be effective shortly.

MEAT FOR GERMANY.

In accordance with the Commercial Treaty signed by Uruguay and Germany a few days ago, an important shipment of 3500 tons of meat is to be made to Germany next month, this being a part of the ten thousand tons stipulated in the contract. To this effect the German Bank has made arrangements for exchange with the Bank of the Republic, and by the end of December the shipment, which means the slaughter of fifteen thousand head of cattle, will be ready. It is believed that this demand will have a tendency to increase prices on the Tablada, especially as regards the better classes of cattle, which are to be used in the German shipment.

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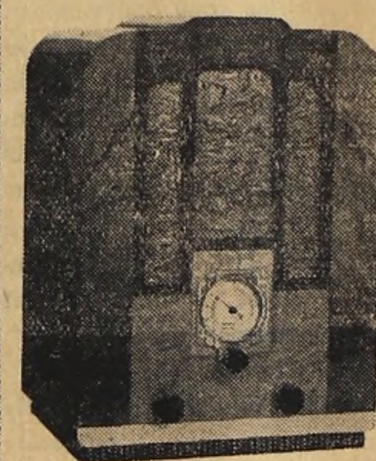

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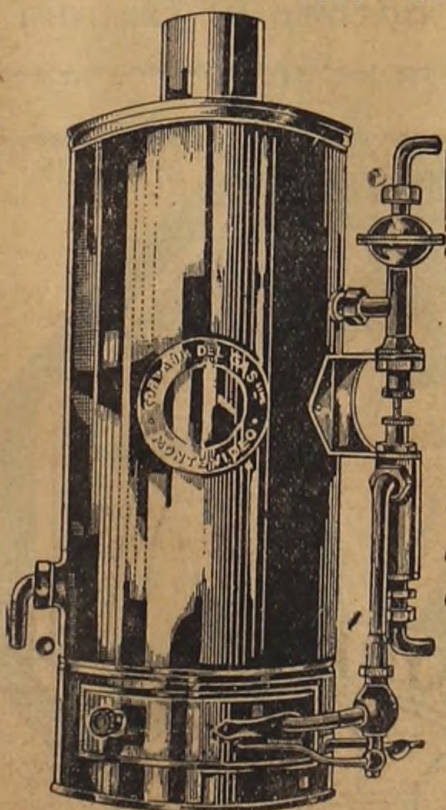

Ask any husband!

For years we have walked the world firmly, believing the myth that men want — above and beyond everything else — domestic well-being.

But we are deplorably out-of-date. Really we are! They don't. Not if it does them out of other happy things.

Naturally, any man wants his socks nicely darned, good meals, and a comfortable room to sit down in — but after those simple wants have been satisfied his interest in the domestic side of life fades out.

He doesn't care a tinker's cuss if the curtains have lost their first youth. He doesn't even realize they've faded until they are thoughtfully pointed out to him by your obliging self.

Don't run off with the quite wrong idea that I'm putting up a plea for a more or less slovenly house—I'm not. It worries me dreadfully if my own house isn't spick and span. But I'm only saying what is definitely everlastingly true — that the average man does not care at all deeply for these things. It's we women who care — it's we who insist in lavishing all this domestic stuff over them. They don't want it — ask them!

Then, after giving them what they don't want — we have the nerve to wander over the earth li-

ke injured angels talking loudly about the injustice and insensibility of men!

It's frightfully old-fashioned of us not to realize that the slogan "Feed the brute and he's yours!" holds good no longer. I don't really believe "holding" a man was ever as childishly easy as feeding him.

What a man wants most in life is a good companion. Someone to laugh with, as well as eat with; someone to play with, as well as worry with; someone to make love to; someone who isn't too weary and worn to be interested in his doings. CONCERNING THE "U.T.E."

In a very apt editorial last night, "El Diario" drew attention to the dictatorial cum badly-organized actions of the U.T.E., stating that the collection service is rotten and that something should be done about it. At the present the collectors of the Company come at times and at others do not, so that it often happens that a client receives no bill for several months and then is surprised with a sudden notification that unless he pays his account in full within twelve hours his telephone and electrical current will be cut off. It is notorious that the U.T.E. works on the system that "We are always right and damned be the client who protests", and inasmuch as they exercise the complete power to cut off one of the most necessary elements of modern life without warning or without reason, they usually get away with it. "El Diario" says the collection service should be reorganized — but we believe that what is necessary is a bit more consideration for the consumer and a bit less bureaucratic insensateness.

THE FILM - GOING PUBLIC

The American motion picture public is beginning to turn away from talky drawing room film dramas and to demand once more movies that really move, according to T. R. Thompson, prominent filmman from the Midwest and now manager of RKO Radio's branch in Kansas City, Mo.

Two types of pictures are meeting with an increasingly warm welcome says Thompson, in the great midwestern states. One is simple farm romance as typified in the stories of the late Gene Stratton-Porter; the other is the well-produced, well-acted outdoor action drama which Hollywood once allowed to degenerate into poorly made "horse-opera".

"Big-city dwellers little realize what a warm welcome such pictures as 'Laddie' find among small-town and rural residents", says Thompson. "Such a picture often outdraws, in such locations, the elaborate productions which are so popular in the larger towns. We in our part of the country are eagerly awaiting 'Freckles', another Gene Stratton-Porter picture."

"Outdoor action - films are growing increasingly popular every day, provided they are well-acted and have a real story. We performed an interesting experiment in Kansas City by showing Richard Dix's latest picture 'The Arizonian', at the Mainstreet Theatre, the first time an action melodrama has played the house since 'Cimarron' four years ago. It delighted huge audiences for a week."

THE QUESTION OF "SUCESSIONES"

An editorial in "El Pueblo" yesterday declared that the Senate should discuss in one of its early sessions a proposed law, already presented, which would exempt the heirs of small estates from all the present legal costs in case each portion did not amount to over five hundred pesos, drew attention to several anomalies in the present laws which often cause ridiculous situations. According to the proposed Law, the heirs would be completely exempt from all costs, such as stamped paper, Civil certificates, etc., but in order to prevent abuses, several definite clauses cover the question of disputes over paternity, etc.

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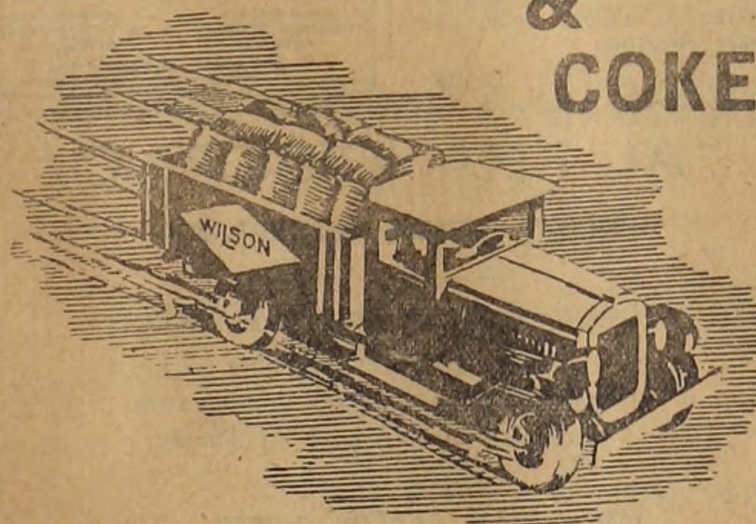
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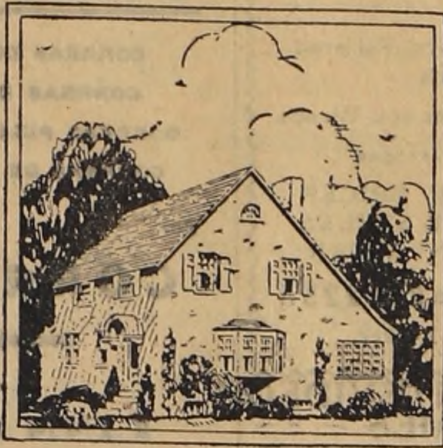
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GIANT CIGAR

For half a century Tampa, Fla. has been making cigars and good ones, but never before did its skilful workers turn out a perfect to compare with one shown recently. This real cigar, which would be big enough for some story book giant, is nine feet long and contains 75 pounds of prime tobacco. In labor and material it represents an investment of about \$400.

The oversized smoke was presented to Frank Traynor, president of the Tampa Chamber of Commerce, by three comely young women arrayed in the most fetching of modish bathing suits. The girls thought it quite an honor to be allowed to play the role of modern Greeks bearing gifts and the population of the Florida city, native and visiting, paid as much attention to the charms of the young women as to the extraordinary objects they carried.

The giant cigar was not manufactured as a whimsical publicity stunt. It was made to help Tampa cigarmakers celebrate their "golden jubilee", their fiftieth year in the business of providing the delights of the "weed" to men all over the world.

The artisans who fashioned the 75-pound after-dinner smoke did their work well.
