THE SESSION OF THE COUNCIL

Geneva, September 6th

The Council of the League was cited for a session this afternoon at 17.00 o'clock during which a further discussion of the African dispute was carried out. Although no official statements have been issued, it is believed that the Council designated a sub-Committee to study the possible manner of solving the conflict. The attitude of Dr. Ruiz Guinazu in refusing to attend the request formulated by Baron Aloisi that the session yesterday should be suspended, has caused a great deal of comment among the Delegates, it being believed that the attitude of the President of the Council is a victory for those who support the idea that any Delegation has a right to clearly and freely express its ideas. Baron Aloisi has presented an official protest to Mr. Avenol against the "in-sults" contained in the Ethiopian statements yesterday.

There is a general agreement among the Delegates that neither Italy or Ethiopia should have any part in the activities of the sub-Committee, which is composed of France, England, Spain, Poland and Turkey.

THE ATTITUDE OF ITALY

Geneva, September 6th

The Italian Government has officially advised the League that she refuses to attend any session in which Ethiopia takes part. As a result of this declaration, Baron Aloisi was called into conference with Mr. Avenol. Ethiopia on her side, has invoked the article of the Pact which requires that the disputing nations, although not members of the Council, as in the present case, take part in the deliberations concerning the dispute, this appeal explaining the indecision of the Council concerning the Italian demand that the Ethiopian delegation be excluded from the session, which would establish a precedent not in accordance with the spirit of the Pact.

ITALIAN ANTI-BRITISH

PROPAGANDA IN EGYPT

London, September 6th

In circles closely connected with the Government is affirmed that the rumours published this morning in the British press according to which a severe campaign of anti-British propaganda is being carried out in Egypt by Italian organizations have been confirmed. Although there has been no official comment upon these rumours, it is considered in political circles here that it is possible that the British Government may present a protest to the Italian Government and insist that these activities cease immediately.

HARROW STRUCK BY LIGHTNING

London, September 5th

During severe thunderstorms last evening a considerable amount of material damage was caused by lightning, while and several rendered unconscious.

ITALIAN PURCHASES IN THE STATES

New York, September 6th

Italy is known to have been making large purchases of material in the United States to be used in the expected war with Ethiopia. During the last six months her purchases of scrap iron have amounted to nearly one hundred and fifty thousand tons, and she has also bought large quantities of other supplies such as petrol, oil, special steel for the manufacture of shells, copper, iron, etc. The greater part of the orders in question have been made through the foreign branches of American and paid for in specie in New York.

CAMPBELL'S RECORD

London, September 5th

The view is widely expressed that it will be some time before the world land speed record set up by Sir Malcolm Campbell with the "Bluebird" is beaten.

The production of a car which can stand up to the prodigious strain of travel on land at the enormous speed of 304.311 miles per hour attained in the first run is the subject of general comment as a remarkable engineering achievement.

Sir Malcolm himself is convinced that the limit of land speed has not been achieved by his performance, and says that what he has done can be done and improved upon by another man. He has no immediate plans for further attempts to raise the limit.

RUMOURED BRITISH NAVAL MOBILIZATION

London, September 6th

According to rumours circulating this morning the Government is discussing the advisability of mobilizing the Naval Reserves in case circumstances make such action necessary. These reserves are composed of men employed in the arsenals, ports, and dry docks, who are given an annual period of fifteen days training on a warship. However, there has been no official confirmation of the rumour.

SAPPHIRE FROM KASHMIR

London, September 5th

The Duke of Gloucester, who returned to London today bought an engagement ring for Lady Douglas-Montagu-Scott, selecting a fine solitaire sapphire from the Kashmir mines which will be mounted in a platinum ring with a diamond setting on either side.

The Duke returned to Scotland to-night, and will spend the weekend at the home of his fiancée's parents at Selkirk.

BALDWIN CONFERS WITH SIR JOHN SIMON

London, September 6th

The Prime Minister, Mr. Stanley Baldwin, held a lengthy interview with Sir John Simon today concerning the present discussions in Geneva and the dispute between Italy and Ethiopia. The Home Secretary, who was away from London yesterday, did not participate in the Cabinet session held in the afternoon. No details of the interview have been published.

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CALM IN GENEVA

Geneva, September 6th

Official circles in Geneva remain calm after the expected decision of Italy to withdraw her Delegation from the sessions of the Council of the League when the Ethiopian Delegation presented the thesis of that Nation. It is known that Mr. Laval had a private conversation with Mr. Eden, Mr. Ruiz Guinazu, Mr. Beck, and Mr. López Olvan, afterwards going to the headquarters of the League where he interviewed the Secretary General of the League, Mr. Avenol. A short time after noon the Italian Representative, Baron Aloisi, held a conversation with Mr. Avenol, who urged him to support the conciliatory efforts of the League.

AGRICULTURAL DISTURBANCES IN LITHUANIA

Kovno, September 6th

The strike of the agricultural elements has assumed alarming proportions and has already extended to several districts in Lithuania. As a result of the official decree which threatened to submit any persons attempting to prevent the farmers from reaching their markets to a Court Martial, the farmers, instead of attempting to stop the carts filled with produce, began to burn the farms of those persons who refused to join their movement.

FINANCIAL AFFAIR IN THE STATES

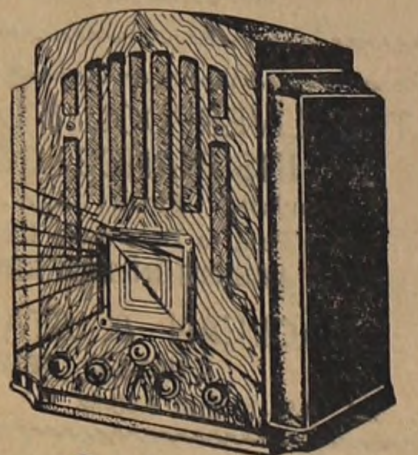
Washington, September 6th

Acting as the intermediate between the Armaments Investigating Committee of the Senate and the French and British Governments, the American Department of State has taken possession of the archives of the famous J. P. Morgan Bank. The documents seized cover all transactions carried out between 1914 and 1917 for the accounts of both Government. The Investigating Committee is examining the account of the British Treasury and the Commercial Agency of the French Government.

WHEN A PLAGUE OF GREEN PARROTS SWEEP OVER AUSTRALIA

Australia, the "Land Down Under" is no stranger to the curious and the unusual. It is the home of the leaping kangaroo, the living Teddy Bear and the duck-billed Platypus, a furbearing animal that lays eggs. It has modern cities, as civilized as those of America and the European continent—and in its hinterlands it has aboriginal savages as wild and untamed as the most primitive members of the human race to be found on earth today.

But there are times when even the natives of Australia are surprised at what goes on in their quarter of the globe, a plague of green parrots recently and unexpectedly swept over South Australia.

Reproduced in black and white a picture, taken by a cameraman, who was almost knocked down by the noisy armada, does not show that the air literally was green with the birds. When the sheep-

raising farmers was green with the birds. When the sheep-raising farmers on the border of South and Western Australia first saw the pestilence approaching from the distance some of them thought that Nature had gone daffy and was filling the air with a new kind of cloud, as green as jade. But as the cloud, sped nearer, with the ear-splitting din of a thousand radio loud speakers all squawking at once, they knew that it was no accumulation of vapor but a fear-in-spiring squadron made up of millions of parrots.

There wasn't much that the farmers could do about the phenomenon. It was no good firing shot-guns into the cloud, although they tried that.

Building smudges to fill the air with pungent smoke was equally ineffective because the fires would have to cover acres to do much good. The best that the vic-

tims of the onslaught could do was to stand at the water holes where their herds of sheep drink and try to keep the parrots from polluting the precious supply, which is none too plentiful in that section of Australia.

Men, women and children labored day and night to drive the unwelcome visitors away. They had to cover their faces with heavy thicknesses of cloth and with netting, much like that used by beekeepers, to protect themselves from the fast-moving bodies of the birds. But the parrots were on a rampage and, in their aerial maneuvers, inflicted several casualties.

Just what sent the parrots out of the forests into the open country is not known, but it is supposed that weather conditions cut down their normal supply of food and that they had bred so prolifically that there was an over-population of the prettily feathered creatures.

Government agents rushed to the area on which the parrots descended and began to plan a war against the birds in case they didn't go back to their habitat. Their greatest fear was that the millions of birds would sweep across the open plains in their mad migration and get into the farming sections where they would destroy millions of dollars worth of fruit and garden crops.

Some months before the avalanche of parrots, certain sections of South and Western Australia were hit by a plague of grasshoppers which just about impoverished farmers. The Government is trying to find out whether there is any connection between the two pestilential mass movements.

APARTMENTS FOR CACTUS

To many people who have no more than casual interest in things botanical, there is something ridiculous in coddling a cactus. Yet that is exactly what William Hertrich, is doing with a big and ugly chunk of vegetation Mr. Hertrich is superintendent of the Huntington Botanical Gardens, where there are 15 acres of cacti.

In this plot, which is rapidly becoming famous all over the world, there are many varieties of what one scientist with a flair for putting botanical names into popular language calls "vegetable hedgehogs". His phrase is an apt one because most kinds of cacti are covered with needle-like spikes.

The giant cactus, is one of the hardest plants to be found anywhere in the world. It can thrive on a surprisingly small quantity of water and keep green under conditions which would spell the doom of any tree or shrub not adapted to life in the arid, sun-scorched desert.

In some way the needle-like spikes around the base of the cactus were worn, or broken off, and it seemed to Gardener Hertrich that small animals might attack these exposed places and eat away part of the thick green stem. That's why he ordered an apartment built for the cactus until it grows protective spikes all around its base and completely adjusts itself to its new home.

The cacti are found only in hot, dry places where little rain falls and where animal life is scarce. To adapt themselves to such surroundings the cacti have developed peculiar forms enabling them to collect and conserve such moisture as there is and have grown bristling spikes to discourage animals hungering for anything in the shape of green food.

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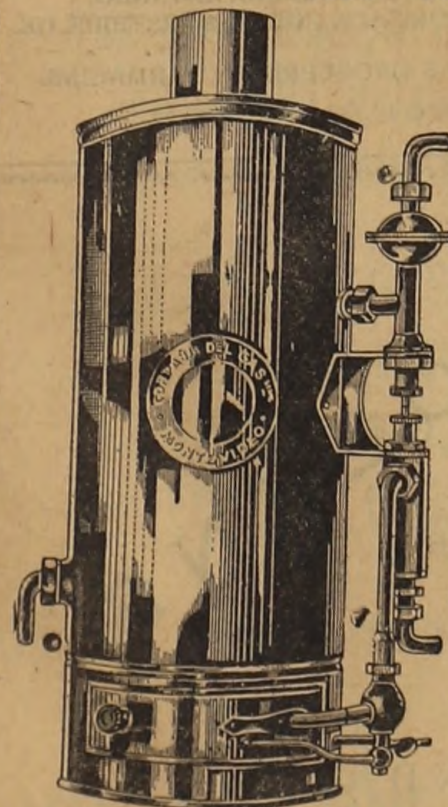

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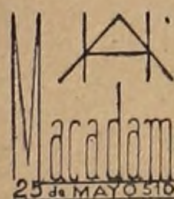
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URUGUAY AND THE AFRICAN CONFLICT

What we suppose may be considered as a semi-official indication of the attitude of the Government of Uruguay towards the dispute between Italy and Ethiopia and the participation in the matter of the League of Nations, was published in "El Pueblo" yesterday as an editorial. In this article, after affirming that Uruguay is essentially opposed to conquest by force and strongly supports the freedom of each nation, it is declared that ignorance of the origin and development of the conflict make it impossible for her to judge the matter. It is stressed that distance and differences in customs distort matters, and that all we know here is that Italy has just accused Ethiopia of repeatedly violating her old and new international agreements, and of not fulfilling important financial obligations. Added to this, various and complicated economic machinations have occasionally appeared on the surface, the evident work of powerful economic and industrial interests not belonging to either of the two nations in conflict, and it is added that no one can deny the unhappy results of such financial intrigue in a country whose cultural and political levels are very low. The article praises President Roosevelt for having public vetoed these dangerous intrigues as far as they affect American capital, and declares that if this attitude was adopted by the Governments of other large

powers, the present dispute would be more easily solved. As regards Uruguay and the League, it was said:

"Uruguay does not belong to the section off the League of Nations which must decide the dispute. And we congratulate ourselves that this is so. We are not and cannot be impartial judges in the matter. While our relations with Abyssinia are practically non-existent, we are united with Italy by extraordinarily strong bonds".

"Italy is in our history, in our customs, in our culture, and in the migratory formation of our people. Her men have fought besides our warriors to obtain our independence and to strengthen and support our progress. Her contributions to our social life and the cristalization of our thoughts are permanent and considerable. And in every Uruguayan home there are Italian influences, for here they have always found a bit of our soil upon which to erect the four walls or a common house".

"All this vast feeling of grateful affection cannot be forgotten without pain. Our Latinism is above all the inheritance from Spain and Italy, and in thinking, we must do so with them and like them, because our hearts and our brains force us to do so".

"Everything we have said does not prevent that if some day we are called upon to cooperate as an element of mediation, we shall

attempt by every means in our power to find a humane and conciliatory solution which will close this anxious chapter in present international relations".

We must admit that we are rather surprised that such definitely pro-Italian statements should be made by an organ which is known to be directly controlled by the President of the Republic, especially in view of the fact that the League of Nations has not yet reached any decision concerning the causes of the dispute and the guilt of either of the litigants. Uruguay, as a Member of the League of Nations, is morally obliged to support the decisions of that Body, and in case sanctions are applied against Italy—as appears very probable—she must either resign from the League or apply her part of these sanctions. To so definitely declare sympathy for one of the antagonists is not only unwise but also, in view of the uncertainty of the situation, in bad taste.

CLAIM FOR REFUND OF PENSION COLLECTED

A curious case is presented by a request made from the Ministry of National Defence for fulfillment of a resolution of the Executive Power regarding a lady employed in the Secretarial offices in the Chamber of Deputies who should refund to the State the sum of \$ 4,479.41 which she had unduly been paid up to the month of January 1934 for pension monies. The Ministry referred to therefore asks that the sum of \$ 5.00 be deducted monthly from the salary that she is at present receiving from the Chamber. The pension she had been receiving was a military one as widow of a Major in the Army.

ASOCIACION DE FOMENTO DE INTERCAMBIO ANGLO-URUGUAYO

This newly formed Association announces that it has taken offices at Calle Rincón No. 424 and that on 12th inst it will hold a General Meeting to approve its statutes and elect its permanent Committee of management. The meeting referred to will be held at the premises of Camara Nacional de Comercio.

AMUSEMENT PARK AT PARQUE RODO

It has been agreed by the Municipal authorities to call for proposals relating to the establishment of the above. In awarding the concession accorded, the novelty and importance of the mechanical games will be taken into account, as well as the attraction which these may offer to the public. The proposer must deposit \$ 1,000 as a guarantee of the seriousness of his proposal and when accepted he must deposit \$ 10,000 in cash or bonds.

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THE "EXTRAORDINARY MEASURES" REMOVED

"El Pueblo" announced yesterday that in an agreement reached between the President of the Republic and the Minister of Interior, Doctor Augusto Bado, the following Decree would be signed thus restoring the liberty of speech. The Decree is as follows: "Considering the Decree of November 28, 1934 which, among other measures of an extraordinary character, created a special regimen of restriction on free speech, and Considering that the Executive Power esteems it now opportune to remove this restriction leaving the matter entirely in the hands of the ordinary Laws based upon the Constitution which relate to the expression of ideas, verbally or in writing. Therefore, in accordance with the contents of Article 158, Paragraph 18, of the Constitution, the President of the Republic decrees: Article 1. Consider without effect the Decree of November 28, 1934 in everything referring to the establishment of administrative restrictions on the free expression of thoughts in written or oral form. Article 2. Advise the General Assembly of this Decree. Article 3. Publish, etc."

STOCKS OF GLASS

In spite of the facilities accorded for the importation of this material and the time that has passed since the hail storm destroyed so much glass in the City, there does not appear to be much desire on the part of the importers to place supplies on the market, and there are still hundreds of buildings where not one single pane of glass has been replaced. What has called our attention specially to this is the fact that the Administración de Puertos is now issuing a second call for tenders for a supply of glass for their different departments.

SCIENCE NOTES

A London railway as constructed a turntable that is revolved by a single wheel compressed air tractor operated by air from the brake lines of locomotives.

World absorption of crude rubber in the first four months this year decreased to 332,000 long tons, compared with last year's figure of 337,000 long tons.

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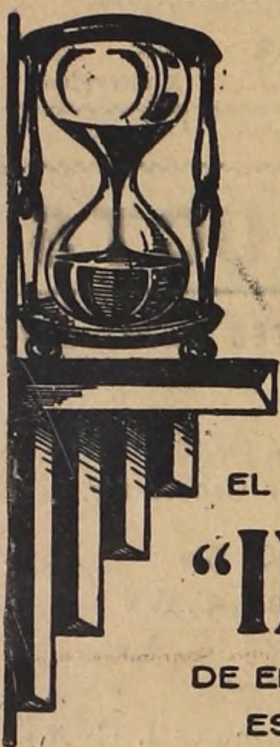
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LOCAL STEVEDORES ON STRIKE

An unexpected strike of dock labourers took place yesterday, apparently resulting from puerile reasons of a unionistic nature. The incident which caused the trouble arose from the recent order prohibiting the placing of proclamations, etc., on the Board situated in the stevedore's kiosk, by the union representatives. Yesterday morning the Secretary of the Stevedore's Union attempted to break this regulation by placing a notice, drawn up in violent terms. The police intervened and arrested him. When this was known, the entire union of Stevedores went on strike in protest against the arrest and demanding that he be liberated. It is believed that the incident is only a definite result of many relatively minor disputes which have taken place recently between the dock labourers and the representatives of various shipping companies. Personal quarrels are also intervening, but in spite of all this, it is believed that the dispute will be settled immediately. However, authorized persons declare that the conflict is due to the activities of professional agitators and that unless it is thoroughly investigated, further trouble may occur in the near future. Among the vessels affected by the strike were the "Highland Monarch", which carried several thousand bags of sugar, and the "Almada Star", which was forced to leave for Buenos Aires still carrying a part of the cargo destined for Montevideo.

RECIPES

CREAMED CHICKEN

MELT 2 tablespoons butter, add 2 tablespoons flour, 1/4 teaspoon salt and a few grains pepper and blend well. Add 1 cup milk or thin cream and stir constantly until smooth and creamy. Add 1 1/4 cups diced or sliced cold cooked chicken and reheat over hot water. Serve on toast or on corn fritters.

CREAMED CODFISH

SOAK 1 cup of codfish flakes in cold water overnight. Heat gradually in the same water. When done drain off water. Melt 2 tablespoons butter, add 1 1/2 table-spoons flour, and blend well. Add 3/4 cup rich milk and stir constantly until smooth and creamy. Add 1 slightly beaten egg mixed with a little of the sauce and heat over hot water until egg is cooked, stirring constantly. Add the drained codfish flakes and let stand over hot water until hot.

EGGS POACHED IN CREAM

BUTTER a small double boiler or saucepan. Pour 1/2 cup thin cream into the saucepan. Heat over hot water. Break an egg into the hot cream and sprinkle with salt and paprika and, if you like the flavor, grated cheese. Cook over hot water until egg white is set. With a perforated spoon remove to a piece of hot buttered toast. Reheat the cream over hot water and cook another egg in it. Remove to second piece of toast. Pour the hot cream over toast and eggs and serve immediately.

ST. PATRICK'S DAY CHEESE

BEAT 1/4 pound cottage cheese until smooth and creamy, season to taste with salt and pepper and add thick sweet cream to moisten. Beat with rotary beater or with electric beater until smooth. Line a shamrock mold with wet cheese cloth. Lightly pack the cheese into the mold. Chill for several hours.
