ITALIAN OPINION

Rome, September 19th

Political circles in Rome express their astonishment that the League of Nations cannot realize that the Italian-Abyssinian conflict is purely a colonial affair which is absorbing all its attention. Whilst they obstinately refuse to see the menace of a general conflagration in Europe. The opinion is freely expressed that Hitler's speech in Nuremberg plainly shows in the first place that Germany has definitely decided on her course of action and has already formulated her plans for operations on a large scale.

Secondly, attention is drawn to the serious differences between Germany and Lithuania, while the present tension existing between Germany and Russia may be the cause of further complications in Eastern Europe.

Rome expresses the opinion that the Polish Minister's sharp reply to Mr. Litvinoff the Russian Delegate, very clearly indicates an understanding between Berlin and Warsaw. Attention is also drawn to the fact that Turkey has again raised the Dardanelle question, while Hungary is openly agitating for the re-adjustment of her Roumanian and Checo Frontiers, Austria also is restless. They further express the opinion that the guarantees requested from Great Britain by France, will in sure the problem of mutual security, but will without doubt cause annoyance to Germany. It is considered here that France is afraid of a prolonged war between Italy and Abyssinia, because of the extreme probability of unrest arising in other countries who are desirous of expanding their frontiers, or are hopeful of acquiring colonies of their own.

It is believed that a part of Portuguese territory in Africa will be offered to Germany in order to make Great Britain's proposals acceptable to Germany.—On the other hand it is believed that Mr. Laval is obliged to yield to British pressure and is probably astonished that Great Britain has failed to realize the actual danger, which may easily mean the remaking of the Map of Europe. The telegrams from Geneva comment on the proposals made by the Italian and Abyssinian Governments, but as the Italian Government is not yet on possession of the official text of these proposals, it is not known how these will be received. It is however, known in official circles that the proposals are in no way considered satisfactory, and ignore the special rights enjoyed by Italy under the Treaties of 1906 and 1925, and do not take into account the many acts of aggression on the part of Abyssinia, nor the financial sacrifices entailed by Italy.

BRITISH ARMY MANOEUVRES

Four infantry divisions, four tank battalions, two cavalry brigades, and eight air squadrons are engaged in the army manoeuvres which began last night, and which began last night, and which are the first manoeuvres on a large scale since 1925.

The area of the operations, which lies between Aldershot, Salisbury, and Southampton, is about fifty miles long by thirty broad.

At the start fairly evenly balanced armies of "Eastland" and "Westland" faced each other across a neutral zone some twenty miles broad, assumed to contain a valuable mineral area.

MARCHING TO WAR

Bradford, September 19th

In a speech, delivered at a peace meeting in Bradford, Mr. Lloyd George stated that within a week, or perhaps fifteen days, the war will break out, which will be a war of aggression on a par with the German attack on Belgium in 1914.—He added: "I am frankly alarmed, and it appears to me that the world is marching towards a complete catastrophe".

Lloyd George strongly criticised the delay of the Geneva statement in trying to solve the Abyssinian affairs while Mussolini was going on with his war-like preparations for the conquest of that country.

BRITISH NAVAL MOVEMENTS

London, September 19th

The recent concentration of naval units of the British Navy in the Mediterranean undertaken for the purpose of reinforcing the squadrons there, has caused great preoccupation in the minds of the public, it is realized that the defence of the country has been reduced to a dangerous limit. The cruiser "AJAX" has arrived at Gibraltar from Barbados and the "Australia" left to rejoin the fleet. It is also reported that the Queen Elizabeth will be ready to leave Portsmouth next week.



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LORD PONSONBY RESIGNS

London, September 18th

The front rank of the Labour Party has been shaken by a disagreement on the Abyssinian issue.

Following Mr. Lansbury's statement of a disagreement with the official policy, especially in regard to the question of sanctions, Lord Ponsonby to-day resigned the leadership of the party in the House of Lords. He declared that serious differences with the party on important points of foreign policy and its decision regarding the present international crisis prevented him from continuing the leadership in the Upper House and added that he had unceasingly maintained that peace could not be secured by force of arms.

An emergency meeting of the Executive has been called for to-morrow, which it is understood will deal with the differences among the leaders.

LIBERALS SUPPORT CABINET

London, September 18th

The Executive Committee of the National Liberal Federation has passed a resolution supporting the foreign policy of the Government and laying down three main points as necessary to assure peace, namely:

First, the removal of all barriers to trade; Secondly, the resumption of pre-War emigration; Thirdly, "the resources of all colonial territories, now controlled by a few countries which are tempted to monopolise them for their own advantage, must be made available on equal terms for the whole world".

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MUSSOLINI SENDS FOR BARON ALOISI

Geneva, September 19th

Official circles attach great importance to the fact that Mr. Mussolini has not recalled Baron Aloisi to Rome for the purpose of presenting a detailed statement of the activities of the Council of Five. It is considered that Mussolini is not inclined to modify his demands even though this may result in a united action by the other nations against Italy. It is realized that the danger of the Italian war machine may possibly have an important repercussion in Europe and for this reason every effort is being made to confine all danger of war to Africa.

AMERICANS TO GUARD ATLANTIC

Washington, September 18th

Mr. Swanson, the Secretary of the Navy, stated today that in the event of a war between Italy and Abyssinia the American Naval authorities would be prepared to move warships from the Pacific to the Atlantic for the protection of American shipping.

WATCHFUL WAITING

Tokyo, September 18th

The Foreign Office announces that it will adhere to a policy of "watchful waiting" in regard to the Italo-Ethiopian crisis, considering developments as they arise. No declaration of neutrality is contemplated at present. Meanwhile an Ethiopian delegate has arrived here and been cordially entertained by business men in Osaka. The object of his mission is supposed to be the purchase of munitions.

HEAVY BUYING ON TOKYO EXCHANGE

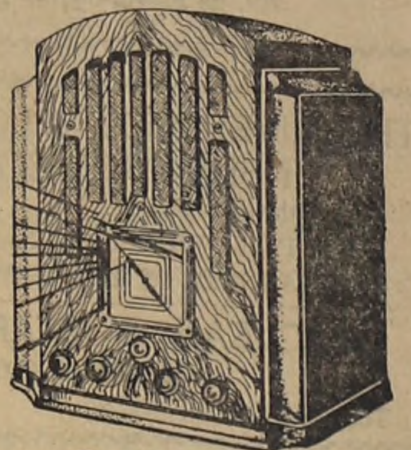
Tokyo, September 18th

The utmost activity accompanied by heavy buying, on the Stock Exchange is ascribed to the increased tension in the Italo-Ethiopian situation. Artificial silk, cotton yarn, rice steel works, shipbuildings, and transport shares have all risen one to four points higher while marine insurance rates on cargoes for Europe via the Suez Canal, and for ports in Italian Somaliland and Eritrea, have been heavily increased.

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CIVILIZATION'S DEBT TO SIGNOR MUSSOLINI

The object of this series of articles was to show that utter disaster to modern civilization could only be avoided by making radical alterations in the cumbersome, ineffective and worn out system by which the cultured nations of the earth are hoodwinked into the belief that they are governing themselves.

The Ethiopian imbraglio was mentioned merely because it had prematurely brought matters to a head, before, in the name of patriotism, and largely to provide work for the unemployed, who still vote, the inhabitants of the over populated countries had been

hypnotised into full preparation to destroy each other.

But since the appearance of the first article in the MONTEVIDEO TIMES affairs have been so mismanaged by the men who are acting on behalf of the nations they represent, and the desires of whose citizens they are supposed to carry out, that in all probability the sacrifice of the unfortunate Abyssinians will not give civilization the necessary breathing space to save itself from itself.

The British are hopelessly involved, and cannot possibly retire with honour, and they have been shepherded into a worse position than that of guarantors of Belgian independence in 1914.

In 1932, nine years after Abyssinia was admitted to the League of Nations, she was granted the obvious right to import arms for the defence of her territory against aggression, and then, relying upon the covenant, she only purchased sufficient modern equipment for the police and the bodyguard of the Emperor.

Now, in her urgent need, with overwhelming forces, armed with everything filthy that represents war between civilized (sic.) nations, being massed against her in a most deliberate and cold-blooded manner, she has been refused by the cultured statesmen of the nations in whom she put her trust, the material necessary to give her a fighting chance for existence, against all the rules of fairness and sport so dear to the Englishman.

Were the embargo lifted tomorrow it would be too late to prevent the unhappy natives being slaughtered like sheep, and England now has no honourable alternative but to inform Signor Mussolini that for his troops to cross the Abyssinian border will cause the immediate bombardment of his war deposits on the African coast.

A cheerful prospect for a nation who have no desire whatsoever to kill and mutilate Italians, and to be killed and mutilated by them.

It is absurd to imagine that the Abyssinians, armed almost exclusively with nothing more modern than rifles used in the Franco-Prussian war of 1870, can hold up the Italian advance until the application of peaceful sanctions may save them, and equally absurd to quote the resistance of the Boers to the might of the British Empire.

The Boers had better rifles and artillery than the British, and were infinitely superior marks-

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men, but even so the possession of twenty aeroplanes for observation alone would have made a continuance of the war an impossibility after the first six months, whilst the Italians can count on five hundred planes fitted with every modern appliance to rain death, torture, suffocation and destruction from the air.

Leaving out Signor Mussolini, who is only a cog in a defective machine, as are all the other statesmen who are running about Europe to meet each other and commit their fellow countrymen to secret pacts which are not disclosed until it is too late to repudiate them, it is absolutely impossible for the Italians to gain anything whatsoever by the conquest of Abyssinia, with all that it may bring in its train, that could not be gained much better by other methods which would result in bringing happiness instead of misery to the world.

Abyssinia is supposed to be rich in oil and other minerals, but why exploit all nature's deposits when one of the biggest problems of the world is already that of super production?

Why bore for oil in Ethiopia when productive wells have to be guarded by militia in America to prevent exploitation?

Why plant cereals and cotton in a new country when in others grain is burnt and cotton plowed in?

Why is it necessary to invoke bloodshed and every other horror, in order that room may be found for the surplus man power of a country of a class which should be welcomed with open arms in others far too thinly populated?

Had these questions been put to each other by the ex-combatants who recently met in England, France, Italy and Germany, with the power behind them to make a settlement, and always provided that none amongst them possessed the silvery voice, facility of speech, and personal magnetism indispensable to the successful politician, the inhabitants of Europe would not now be sitting on a powder mine which may explode beneath them at any moment.

And were but a tithe of the money provided by the burdened taxpayer, and now spent by the machine in the invention and manufacture of means by which ignorant and misled peoples can destroy each other when forced to do so, invested in making it possible for them to visit, learn to understand, and appreciate each other, no such questions could arise.

COAL WILL COME BACK PROPHECY

Given time, Welsh coal is certain to re-establish its former hold on world markets, according to Sir J. F. Beale, chairman of Guest, Keen and Nettlefolds, Ltd., the steel combine.

Speaking at the company's annual meeting, Sir John said that prospects in the steel trade were definitely bright. Direct wages paid in the trade in 1934 were 30 per cent., higher than in the previous year.

In the coal industry they were getting ready for progress by modern methods of crushing, blending, sizing and handling.

Another report states that the new £2,000,000 steel plant of Guest, Keen, Baldwinsat Cardiff is well on the way to completion. Two thousand men will be employed next year and the new works will consume 9,000 tons of coal weekly.

NICKEL WORKS EXTENSIONS

Extensions and modernisations of plant estimated to cost £150,000 are to be undertaken by the Mond Nickel Co., Ltd., at Clydach, West Wales.

It is also announced that a simultaneous development will take place at the company's collieries at Pontardawe, where it is proposed to open up the lower anthracite seams.

A year ago the firm had to give up the manufacture of copper sulphate in the area owing to a restricted market abroad, and a number of men were rendered idle.

The demand for nickel pellets has now increased to such an extent, however, that it has been found possible to re-engage practically all these men, and others will also be absorbed shortly.

Mond Nickel Co. have spent hundreds of thousands of pounds in recent years on research with a view to improving production methods and extending the uses of metallic nickel for general industrial requirements.

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CHIEF OF POLICE RESIGNS

Colonel Marcelino Elgue, Chief of the Montevideo Police Force has tendered his resignation to the Authorities. In view of the recent attacks of the Police methods in dealing with persons under detention, Colonel Marcelino Elgue considers that he can better refute these attacks, and be of

greater assistance to the Authorities if he is not longer connected with the Police Force.

WHEAT PRICES

Wheat prices are steadily rising, and there is promise of good crops for the season now approaching, a very large area having been sown.

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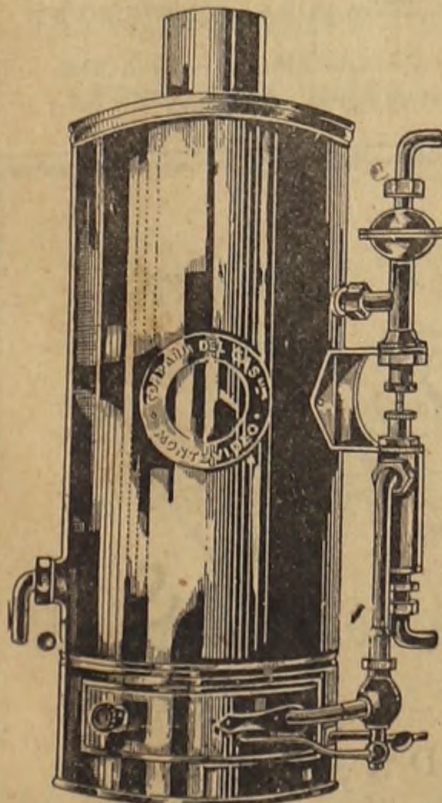

RECIPES

OLD - FASHINED STRAWBERRY ICE CREAM

WASH 1 quart ripe strawberries. Press through potato ricer or fruit press. Add 1 cup sugar and let stand in warm place about 1/2 hour "to ripen". Sweeten 1 quart cream with 1 cup sugar, add a few grains salt and 1/2 tables- spoon vanilla (omit if you like) and combine with the strawberry pulp. Freeze as usual. The cream is sometimes beaten before, combining with the strawberry pulp.

STRAWBERRY

DUMPLINGS.

MIX 1 quart ripe strawberries (strained strawberry pulp may be used if desired), 1 1/2 cups water and 2 cups sugar and cook until of sauce-like consistency. Add 1/2 tablespoon butter. Mix and sift 2 cups flour, 4 teaspoons baking powder and 1 teaspoon salt. Work in 2 tablespoons lard or butter. Add 3/4 cup milk and water in equal parts. Turn out on lightly floured board, pat and roll to 1/2 inch thick. Shape with a biscuit cutter. Have the strawberry sauce boiling hot and put the dumplings on the sauce. Cover closely and cook, without removing the cover, for 12 minutes. Serve hot with cream.

A 30 m.p.h. BICYCLE

What is claimed to be the world's fastest pedal cycle, capable of 30 miles an hour on a level road, is to be manufactured in Birmingham.

The machine departs from all accepted designs of cycle construction; the front wheel is considerably smaller than the rear; the pedals are above the front wheel, the rider having his legs parallel to the ground, while the handle-bars are practically level with the rider's face.

The new machine is a French invention, and is being produced in this country by the Cyclo Gear Co., of Aston, Birmingham.

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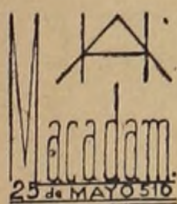
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WHAT THE GREAT PYRAMID HAS TO TELL US?

PART II

A FEW NECESSARY DETAILS

(Continued from "The Montevideo Times")

What Mr. John Taylor did in making the statement as already recorded, was to say that the great mathematical formula known as The Pi Ratio, was not only embedded in the pyramid's construction, but that the construction itself was actually based on this most important formula, which fact opened a large field for research. In the first place it is well to remember that, the measuring and surveying instruments in the early nineteenth century were far from being sufficiently

delicate and accurate for the fine work necessary in discovering the original dimensions, both outside and inside, after standing for more than 4500 years, withstanding earth tremors and shocks at it has done, and after the destruction it has met with, so that its true character might be determined.

For this reason Professor Piazzi Smyth and his wife went to the Pyramids, where they lived for three months checking up every detail stated in the works of John Taylor, to whom his book "Our Inheritance in the Great Pyramid" is dedicated, and was published in September 1877, because academic archaeology refused to accept his work or recognize Mr. Taylor as having achieved anything worthy of recognition, as well as for his contribution to the truth.

It was Anatole France, I believe, who is responsible for this cynical remark: "One should never ask a savant the secrets of the universe which are not in his particular showcase. He takes no interest in them. This is a specially true remark relative to the Egyptologist specialist to the problem of the Great Pyramid".

The Great Pyramid enshrines an exposition of the secrets of the universe.

To the Egyptological and Archaeological savants the Great Pyramid is an Egyptian memorial, built as a tomb for one of the kings, & at the expense of common sense the experience of engineers and mechanics cannot alter this

stubborn and illogical attitude in men whose word is otherwise of the highest value and credence.

This explains to some extent why it is that the subject of the Great Pyramid has not been made more general, in fact it could, with great advantage to all, have been made a subject of general knowledge.

The Great Pyramid is the chief and by far the most important of the three largest pyramids among a group of nine which stand on the rocky plateau on the western, or desert side of the Nile, about nine miles from Cairo. This plateau, barely a mile wide may well claim to be the most remarkable plot of ground to be found anywhere. "There may be seen the very beginning of architecture, the enormous piles of building ever raised, the most accurate constructions known, the finest masonry, and the employment of the most ingenious tools; whilst among the sculpture that we know, the largest figure — the Sphinx — and also the finest example of technical skill with artistic expression — the Statue of Khafra — both belong to Gizeh. We look in vain for a more wonderful assemblage than the vast masses of the pyramids, the duddy walls and pillars of the granite temple, the titanic head of the Sphinx, the hundredsof tombs, and the shattered outlines of causeways, pavements, and walls, that cover this earliest field of man's labours" (Sir Flinders Petrie).

THE EARLY PURPOSE OF THE GREAT PYRAMID

It may seem, to the uninitiated, a long stride from the Great Pyramid to Stonehenge, yet there is more than one association that unites them, and for explanation I will quote from the work of Mr. Basil Stewart, an Engineer, "The Mystery of the Great Pyramid", who quotes Mr. David Davidson as follows: "So universally widespread are the traditions relating to Pyramid Messianism in the ancient East, that the writer (author of 'The Great Pyramid: Its Divine Message') has become convinced that Pyramid Apocalyptic literature existed even before the Great Pyramid was built. This would account for the high regard in which the pyramid type of construction was held, even before the fourth Egyptian Dynasty — when the Great Pyramid was built. The association of the ideal pyramid science, in pre-pyramid days, with the mystery of death and the promise of resurrection, would satisfactorily account for the origin of burial mounds of pyramidal form, and would also explain the origin of embalming".

That such a belief in Messianism existed as a definite prophecy in all the literary systems of the ancient East has, during the last few years, been corroborated by Professor Waddell in his "Phoenician Origin of Britons, Scots, and Anglo-Saxons", (which appeared in 1924, one month after Mr Davidson's work, who was surprised to find it corroborating his own work from a totally different approach to the subject). He shows that such an allegory existed as far back as 3000 B. C. or before the era of the Great Pyramid, and also that this prophecy refers to a nation of "builders" whose symbol was the 'year-circle', which — as explained in our

"Witness of the Great Pyramid" — is the basis of the system of metrology used in the construction of the Great Pyramid. The architect thereof must therefore have been a member of the same race, the symbol of which was borrowed by the Egyptians in the form of the 'solar-disc' of Aten worship, and which again appears in our own Stonehenge, for this ancient astronomical circle (B. C. 1650 circ.) is set out on precisely the same year-circle, proving that its erectors were also descendants of this nation of "builders", and used the same system of metrology as the architect of the Great Pyramid.

NOTE: — The standard year-circle whose circumference in Pyramid inches, on a scale of 10 inches to a day, defined the number of days in the solar year. This circle (1162.6 P. inches, or 1163 British inches diameter) falls precisely internal to the outer ring of stones forming Stonehenge. Moreover, archaeology, folklore, and tradition, all confirm the fact of the Eastern origin of Stonehenge. This has also been established by the researches of Prof Waddell, who has inferred the same mathematical symbolism from the texts of ancient Asia & ancient Britain as have been derived from the geometrical symbolism of the Great Pyramid.

These megalithic circles, of which Stonehenge is the best existing example have been traced through Spain into Britain, following both shores of the Mediterranean from Palestine, and have all been constructed on the same scientific principle. Their alignment was such that the rising sun shone directly over a carefully placed stone on to another in the form of an altar at certain seasons, altering its position according to the time of year observed by the shadows.

The General's car was completely overturned, and he is said to have suffered severe injuries which necessitated his immediate removal to the Italian Hospital.

WORLD MEAT MARKET

A telegram from Rio de Janeiro announces that Brazil has decided to make a very strong bid for the important meat trade which exists between the River Plate and Europe, and although the quality of Brazilian beef does not at present come up to the very high standard of the more southern countries of South America, the recent contract for the large supplies to Italy, has been a great incentive to make every effort to improve the quality of the Brazilian live-stock, particularly in the southern states of that country.

ECHOES OF RECENT SUBVERSIVE MOVEMENT

The Chamber of Deputies has authorized the extension of the period allowed to all persons who have claims against the Government for damage to property and land or for supplies and material commandeered by the Government Troops during the recent subversive movement. These outstanding claims must be presented to the Minister of National Defence before the expiration of twenty days from the publication of the official notice.



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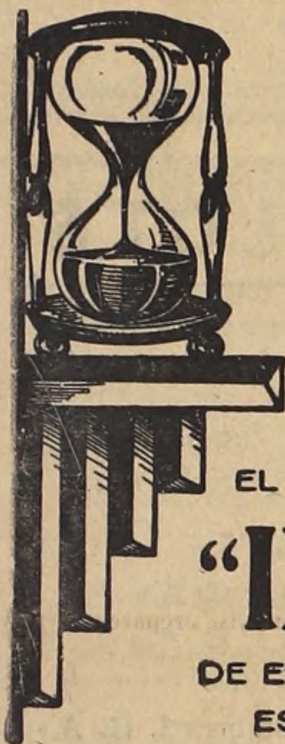
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ARMY PROMOTIONS

The President has sent a message to the Senate asking for the necessary permission for the promotion of General de Brigada Don Roberto Riveros to the rank of General de Division, and Colonel Alfredo Baldomir to the rank of General de Brigada. The first named was at one time Minister of National Defence, and Colonel Baldomir is the present Minister of that Department.

AVIATION

By a resolution of the Ministry of National Defence, and in accordance with a proposal of the Director of Military Aviation, Aeronautical Engineer Don Luis Felipe Marqu   has been Designated to take temporary charge of the post of Director of Civil Aviation. An additional resolution was passed approving the provisional rules for civilian flying.

The Executive Power has presented to Parliament a project under which all Aviation Companies which establish airports or improve their present installations shall be exempt from Custom House duties for all materials necessary for the construction or improvement of such establishments.

In an interview with one of our Uruguayan colleagues, the Postmaster General expressed the opinion that the special issue of postage stamp for the purpose of raising the necessary money to enable Uruguay to acquire Military aeroplanes was quite within the Postal Regulations, and was therefore not derogatory to the nation. He further said that he had been informed by an important stamp dealer that such an issue would probably be very acceptable to stamp collectors.
