THE GERMAN COLONIES IN AFRICA

London, May 10th

Sir Abe Bailey, a well known South African political leader and business man, has announced that he strongly opposes the idea of returning to Germany her former colonies in East Africa, Baily declares that: "there will be no peace in Africa or in the world if the power which transformed Europe into a battlefield is again given possessions in the Continent from which she was expelled at the sacrifice of the lives of British and South African soldiers". He added: "Any statesman who supports these intrigues and threats is an enemy of peace". Sir Abe Bailey, who is a veteran of the Boer War in which he served as an officer, expresses the opinion that the delivery of these territories to the Reich will constitute a threat against the rich gold fields of South Africa and serve as an incentive for Germany to seek further territorial expansion, and adds that the South Africa, as well as the British and that Dutch, oppose by a great majority the idea that the region be returned to Germany. Bailey is one of the major shareholders in the mining properties of the Transvaal.

GREAT BRITAIN AND AIR ARMAMENTS

London, May 10th

A number of definite impressions were secured in official circles this morning concerning the attitude of Great Britain concerning the question of aerial armaments, as will be expressed in the House of Commons during the debate on the 22nd of this month. According to these reports, the British Government will continue to sustain the spirit of the "Memorandum" issued in January of 1934. This document contained a warning that in case the Permanent Disarmament Commission had not decided, without a period of two years, upon the abolition of all air forces, each nation would be authorized to form any force she desires and that the base of limitation would be fixed for each individual nation. This base would be reached within a period of eight years. While in 1934 these principles would have permitted Germany to reach a parity of air power with the other nations within eight years, the same formula today has the double value of containing the development of the German aircraft production and permitting England sufficient time to completely reorganize her air forces and make them the strongest in Europe. This plan would naturally necessitate a severe control over aerial production in order to prevent transgressions of the clauses contained, and it is certain that Britain would not allow it to interfere with the measures of aerial defense and reorganization she is taking immediately. These measures can only be modified by bases, which would have to be accompanied by an Aerial Pact of mutual aid suggested in the Memorandum issued on February 3rd of this year.

MINE DISASTER IN BELGIUM

Liege, May 10th

A serious accident occurred today in the mine Sainte Barbe, Etsden. Forty miners occupied a cable cage with the intention of descending seven hundred metres to the gallery where they were working. However, due to a mechanical defect, the cable supporting the cage left the wheels and made it impossible to use the brakes, falling to be bottom of the pit. All of the forty miners were injured as a result of the crash, seventeen of them seriously. The victims were rushed to hospitals in the district.

THE JOURNEY OF LAVAL

Warsaw, May 10th

The Minister of Foreign relations of France, Mr. Laval, arrived here at 18.00 o'clock. The train bringing the French representative remained in Berlin for twenty minutes, but Laval did not descend. He was greeted in his compartment by the Russian Ambassador in Berlin and high German officials. Great expectation is shown in diplomatic circles concerning the possible results of the visit of Laval to Warsaw, where it is expected he will make great attempts to reconcile Poland to the Franco-Soviet Pact recently initiated.

THE CHACO CONFLICT

Asuncin, May 10th

The following official communique was issued today by the Ministry of Defence: "A company of the Bolivian Regiment, "General Montes", was completely destroyed by our forces yesterday in the sector of Parapiti. A hundred prisoners and large quantities of supplies were captured. The enemy left a large number of dead on the field. No events have been reported from the other sectors".

THE ITALIAN - ABYSSINIAN CRISIS

Addis Abeba, May 10th

In referring to the present situation, an official of the Government has declared that the moment the Italian troops advance from Somaliland or Eritrea, the Emperor will immediately mobilize his troops. However, the Emperor does not desire to do so at present as he fears that a premature mobilization would make a war between Ethiopia and Italy inevitable. This official declared that once mobilized, the Ethiopian warriors cannot remain inactive, and would seek a fight without awaiting any hostile actions by the Italians, adding that they ignore the fact that a mobilization may be used as a method of securing diplomatic results, and will accuse their officers of cowardice if they refuse to lead them to battle. Many Tribal Chiefs, especially those on the frontier with the Italian Colonies, are already expressing impatience at the present situation, but the Government has warned them that any aggression on their part will be severely punished. This official concludes by declaring that the Emperor, by abstaining from mobilizing his followers, has proven to the world that he is in complete control over his Tribes, thus refuting the statements of the Italians.

Rome, May 10th

The "Giornale d'Italia" declares that in spite of the denials issued by the Emperor of Ethiopia, it is known that he is personally supervising the rapid mobilization of thousands of the tribesmen upon the frontiers of the Italian Colonies. The Emperor, they affirm, is supplied with large quantities of war materials, especially by Germany, and that he has just finished an inspection trip over the district of Harrar, which is one of the concentration centres of troops. It is declared that the mobilization in Ethiopia is of a purely offensive character, as the troops are being concentrated in the region most suitable for an invasion of the Italian Colonies. It is also known that deposits of arms and ammunitions, as well as dumps of supplies and gasoline, are being established through the country, and that radio and telegraphic methods of communication are being hurriedly installed.

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COMPLACENCY IN BLACK AND WHITE

At the first sign of spring thaw, a new trail appeared in the wet snow — a chain of slender, close-set tracks like intricate stitches — the paw-prints of the unassuming skunk. "Don't hurry others will", is his motto.

All night he had wandered sedately about a circle not over two hundred yards in diameter; but in spite of this preoccupied manner, not much that was edible had been overlooked, now, at sunrise, his bed time, he was on his way home. The rising sun blazoned the details of his personality — his huge, resplendent tail, waving like a black and white banner over his back. At the very tip was a tuft like the white plume of Henry of Navarre. When it stands straight up, wise wild-folk remove themselves with exceeding swiftness. As for the simple — they wish they had.

Ambling homewards, the skunk had such an air of innocence that a young fox decided the decorative stranger must be some unusual kind of rabbit, and dashed to catch it. Unfortunately for him, the skunk acted first. His ancestors had learned the secret of gas-attack a million years ago. As the fox rushed upon him, the skunk brought into action a breech-loading, repeating weapon against which neither man nor beast can stand.

A fox is not squeamish about smells. Many odors revolting to human nostrils arouse in him only pleasure. What sent him rolling backwards in choking spasms was the acrid gas itself. It strangled him as chlorine fumes will choke a man. Only one thought remained in that fox's mind — air, preferably miles away! He departed to find it,

while his adversary lowered his plumed tail, and with leisurely steps started back to his home.

This burrow had once been the property of an old woodchuck. One day, however, the woodchuck had come back, only to find himself dispossessed. The woodchuck is a fighter, fully able to protect his rights. Yet a single sniff made this one abandon his lands and tenements with all easements of ingress and egress. Thenceforth, to the skunk belonged the tunnels, storehouses, the two public entrances and the third concealed in a thicket. To him the cozy nest, and the sun-warmed sand piles; he occupied them all in undisturbed possession.

All that day the skunk slept, but before sunset he was out again, zig-zagging through the bushes in an absent-minded way. Suddenly he stopped, and poked his nose into a little hummock in the snow. It burst like a bomb, and out started a magnificent grouse. During the storm he had plunged into the drift for shelter; safe from cold and hunger, but not from the fine nose of the skunk. As the partridge broke forth, his blackgreen ruff standing out around his neck, the skunk, with a lightning pounce, caught the bird back of the ruff and snapped his neck; a minute later he was feeding full on the most delicious meat in the world. The spring days that followed were days of feasting. There were Junebugs, crickets, grouse, field-mice, snakes — so many delicacies that the skunk's walk was becoming a waddle.

On one of those spring days the Artist and the Skunk had their first and last meeting. As said artist was

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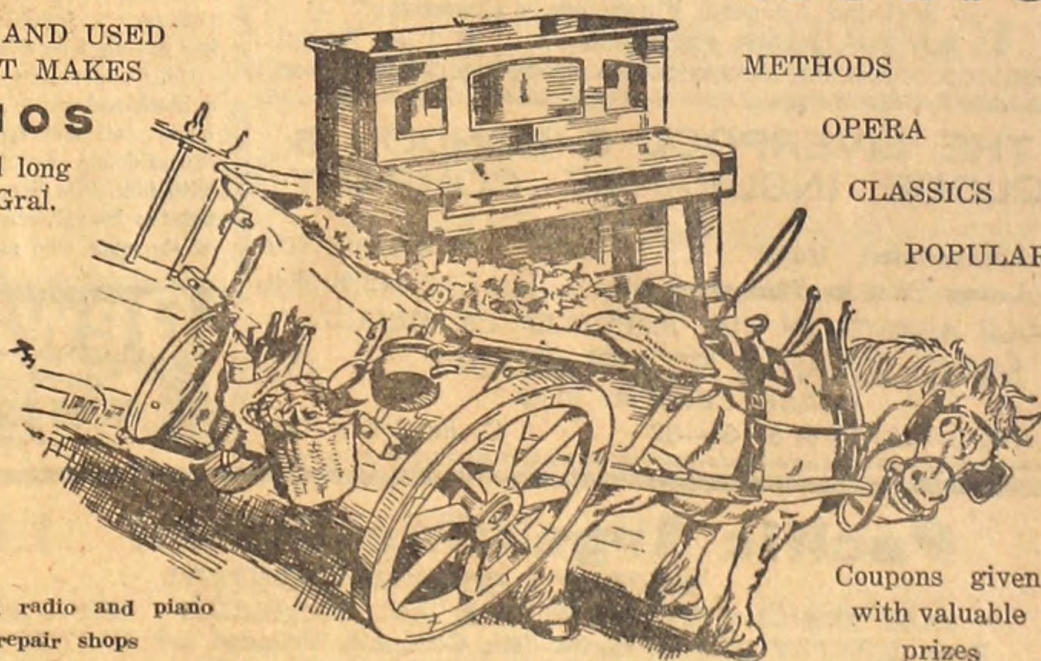

going home from sketching, he saw a strange black-and-white animal and stood still lest he frighten it. The stranger moved toward him, imperturbable and assured. The artist was impressed with its color scheme—the snowy stripe down the black nose, the mass of white back of the black head, the resplendent pompon of a tail.

As the artist took a step forward the stranger stopped and stamped with its forepaws. This seemed to the artist playful and attractive; had he but known it, it was signal number one of the three which a well-bred skunk always gives, even to his bitterest enemies. The artist, moving forward, was interested to see the animal hoist aloft the gorgeous black-and-white banner of its clan—the second danger signal. Approaching still nearer, he noticed that the white tip of the tail suddenly stiffened and waved erect. That is the skunk's ultimate warning.

Had the artist even then stood stony still, there might have been repentance, for the skunk is long-suffering; but even as the artist stepped forward, his fate overtook him. A puff, like vapor as the skunk brought its batteries into action, and the unfortunate artist had a new experience in atmospheric values; a second later he was anathema to the whole world, including himself. Gaping, strangling, racked by nausea, his motto was "Anywhere but here" (Back of the smokehouse an expensive suit of clothes reposes in a lonely grave even to this day).

Actually, the skunk is one of the best friends of the farmer. Given a fair chance, every week he will eat several times his weight in mice and insects. Moreover, he contributes to the market furs whose high-sounding names disguise their lowly origin. During the coldest part of the winter, he retires to his burrow and sleeps—the last of the sleepers to go bed—and the first to get up.

The armament of this sleeper is simple but effective—two scent glands near the base of the tail, which empty into a movable duct which can be protruded some distance. Through this, contractile muscles can propel a stream of liquid musk with incredible accuracy, with a range of from six to ten feet. Moreover, each gland, besides the hole for long-range purposes, has a circle of smaller holes through which the deadly gas can be sprayed for work at close quarters.

The musk itself is a golden-yellow fluid full of bubbles of the devastating gas. As to its odor, it is described feelingly as a mixture of sulphur, sewer-gas, and essence of garlic, raised to the thousandth power. Its effect is like that of the mustard-gas of modern warfare; it may cause blindness, convulsions, and such congestion of the breathing passages as even to cause death.

So, if you meet in your wanderings a black-and-white animal wearing a bushy tail and an air of justified confidence, avoid any altercation with him. "Be brave, be brave, but not too brave", should be the motto of the man who meets the skunk.

IS DEMOCRACY STILL "SAVED"

One of the most commonly used slogans during the World War was that appeal to the public concerning the hope that it would "make the World safe for democracy". Has it endangered the vaunted institution of the English-speaking peoples? According to Mr. Stanley Baldwin, "The greatest mistake was to say that it made the world safe for democracy. The world has never been so unsafe for democracy as it is today".

A modern map of Europe proves Mr. Baldwin to be right. Nations which won the war and nations which lost it are turning their backs on democracy. Or they are building armies, navies and air fleets to fight democracy.

Therefore many close observers of the international situation are very pleased at seeing Great Britain and the United States leave off their search for illusions and decide to defend democracy by old-fashioned methods — and applaud their decision that a larger fleet, a better army, and a lot of fighting planes will serve warning on the world that England has faith enough in democracy to fight for it.

There have been many protest against the recent decision of the British Government to strengthen her defensive forces. Nearly two million men and women signed their names to a protest against these preparations for war — or rather [these protectionary measures against an open threat of war. However, sane realists, although listening politely to the pacifists, have calmly gone on with their business of defending democracy against its enemies.

A resume of the events of the past year certainly proves them justified in following the adage anent prevention being better than a cure. Hitlerized Germany certainly does not show any indications that it desires to see the world governed "by the people and for the people". And the fact that this same Nazi Government has openly flaunted her intention of doing as she sees fit to the nations who "made the world safe for democracy" causes the logical conclusion to be reached that her ideas of the meaning of the word are not similar to those of her former opponents.

Italy, although it must be recognized that she has progressed wonderfully since 1914 tends more and more to become a supporter of the idea of personalistic government in the shape of one all-powerful dictator — who naturally as a human man, has his personal ambitions and hopes. There is absolutely no denial of the fact that although Germany had a Kaiser before the war — an "all highest" — she has a leader now who represents more of a demi-god to his people than the Kaiser ever did. Italy in 1914 had a King — and still has a King in 1935 — but she also has a Mussolini who is idol and guide of the Italian people. Russia before the war was an absolute monarchy — but the People's Commissioners today exercise more of a control over the life and death of the mass of inhabitants than any Czar ever did since the time of Peter the Terrible.

There is, when one stops to consider the matter closely, very little "safety" for democracy in this year of 1935. The world has been in a period of transition since the beginning of history, and from King Arthur to Hitler is a long step. Beginning with the divine right of kings arising from the power over life and death exercised by tribal chieftains, the peoples of the earth have progressed through the following stages of semi-monarchies, democratic monarchies, republics and now a form of despotic dictatorship. The change is still not completed — and it promises to become more "interesting" as it progresses.

Someone has said: "It will cost a vast amount of money to make effective the world's programmes of reform and recovery. And those which will not work may cost even more". So it may be perhaps better in the end if the nations arm to the teeth — and stop attempting to carry out idealistic plans which will not work in actual practice.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE SOCIETY

"ADAM AND FALLEN MAN" is the subject of the Lesson-Sermon which will be read in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday May the 12th.

The Golden Text is from John 3:14, 15. "As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life". The Lesson-Sermon includes the following passage from page 524 of "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy. "Genesis 11:7. And the Lord God (Jehovah) formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul."

Did the divine and infinite Principle become a finite deity, that He should now be called Jehovah? With a single command, Mind had made man, both male and female. 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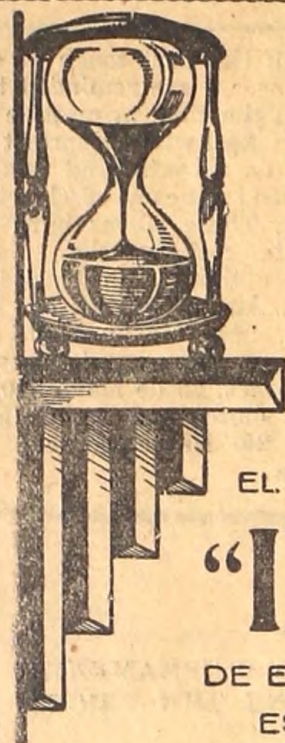

LOCAL NEWS

IT IS ANNOUNCED by the Lottery authorities that in the coming month a new system of "coupons" will be added to the present lottery tickets, with the result that there will be "tickets cum coupons cu manother coupon". This initiative has been taken for the benemerito purpose of permitting the poorer members of the community to take a chance on winning the elusive "grande". In actual practice, the authorities are evidently intending to do everything possible to eliminate the general practice of gambling small sums on the quiniela, and by adding a coupon which will cost \$ 0.26 to the more expensive tickets hope to attract the custom of the poorer classes who cannot afford to spend more than a few cents on their gambling. The initiative is very praiseworthy — but we are afraid that the habit of placing "un real al 29" is too deeply ingrained to be substituted by any kind of coupon, no matter how nicely printed it may be.

IN SPITE OF THE fact that it is continually announced that very low prices are being paid at the Tablada the entry of cattle remains consistently steady. A total of 2061 head were brought in yesterday, the Frigorifico Swift purchasing 1132 of these. Prices remained more or less in accordance with those in effect for months past, bullocks bringing from 35 to 48, steers from 40 to 75, cows from 30 to 45 and calves from 35 to 43, with the exception of a small lot of high quality bought by the Frigorifico Nacional at

from 95 to 100.

THE QUESTION OF

exactly what effect the imposition of the new regulations concerning the payment of gold customs duties upon imports will have on local commerce is still a mystery — in spite of all the polemics in the press. It appears that no authorized person will give a definite opinion upon the matter, and we have been told by well informed persons that even the Customs authorities are still uncertain as to just exactly what is to issue a definite and unexpected of them. It would be advisable for the authorities create notice as to the exact scope of the new regulations.

CONCERNING THE SALE

of wool, "El Diario", under the heading: "The Wool Sales Appear Favourable", said yesterday: "For the last three days the wool business has offered the most favourable prospects that the product of the past season will be rapidly liquidated. This has been confirmed the operations carried out and by the quantity and volume of the fact that in spite of the large quantities sold, the demand remains firm. The buyers are now not merely those from one determined country carrying out purchases in accordance with agreements, but now represent the most diverse centres of consumption. The demand is increasing and as a result prices of all grades of wool continue high and there is an indication of greater stability and firmness in the market".
