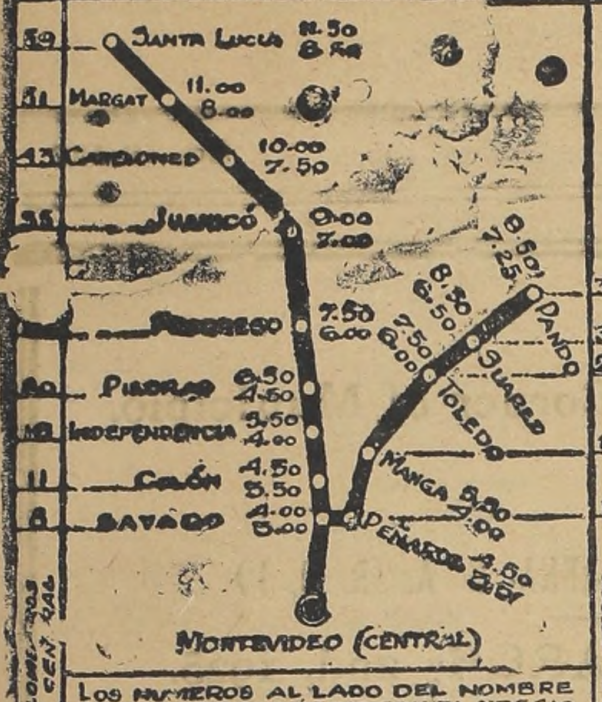

POLITICAL NOTES.

INTRIGUES.

The resignation of Dr. Aréchaga as Minister of the Interior, for the reasons we stated on Friday, a subsequent interview between President Serrato and ex-President Batlle, and certain other circumstances, have given rise to a host of political rumours of a rather disquieting character. The real basis of this, so far as it can be traced, is a series of intrigues on the part of the batllistas to recover the ground they are losing in the Government, and to revenge themselves on the vieristas, to whom they attribute the electoral defeat which they are not yet candid enough to admit.

The interview, it is believed, was brought about by the expression of a desire on the part of President Serrato to bring about a genuine colorado unification, and the offer of his services as mediator. Sr. Batlle's idea of unification was to propose the immediate dismissal of all vieristas from any Ministry or other high public post they may occupy. Sr. Serrato would not listen to this, and there the matter ended. Referring to this a contemporary, which is certainly no opponent to Sr. Serrato, recalls that his previous efforts at unification all proved futile, and advises him, if he wants to preserve his hands unsoiled, to keep them out of the mud.

Another phase of the intrigue is revealed in Sr. Sosa's paper «La Razon». This says bluntly that Col. Riveros, following the example of Dr. Aréchaga, should at once present his resignation as Minister of War. «He inspires no confidence either in the colorado party or in the army, because his political position has not been defined; he does not form part of any colorado group, and it is not even known if he belongs to the colorado party!» Similar insinuations are being made with regard to certain of the Ministers dependent on the Administrative Council.

From the above, then, it would seem that the batllista party still considers itself qualified to dictate who may or may not be Minister, and, arrogating to itself the voice of the entire colorado party, considers its disapproval a fatal bar to the retention by a Minister of his post. It is not sufficient for a Minister to enjoy the confidence of the country, and of the President or the Council; if he does not enjoy the confidence of the batllista caucus, out he must go!

This game, however, is being played once too often. Sr. Serrato has too fine a sense of the dignity of his position to allow himself to become a tool for batllista intrigues; and he has made a categorical declaration that he will not swerve from the course of impartiality proclaimed on assuming office, has no intention of modifying his programme of government, and will loyally accept the decision of the urns, whichever party gains the victory. Col. Riveros, likewise, has declared that, as he enjoys the confidence of the President and sees no reason why he should resign, he does not intend to resign; as Minister he has never meddled in political questions, and he has always held the opinion that military men should not be politicians.

So far, then, the batllistas may regard themselves as baffled, though this may not cause their diatribes to cease — quite possibly we may next hear of their insinuating that President Serrato should resign.

As regards the Council and the Ministers dependent thereon, nothing can be said for the moment. The Ministers have to present their resignations, as a matter of form, when the Council is renewed on March 1st, and what happens then will greatly depend on the definite result of the elections.

VARIOUS MATTERS.

With regard to the elections there is nothing new to say. The official scrutiny throughout the Republic only began on Friday afternoon, and there is no knowing how long it may take. The colorado organs still express themselves as confident that their party has gained the victory, though they have come down to admitting that their majority may be a very narrow one. The next step may be an admission that it is a minus quantity.

In the Administrative Council, on Friday, Sr. Sosa suggested the advisability of postponing Carnival. The fête, he said, coincided with the date when the definite result of the elections would be announced, and the political excitement ensuing might give rise to unpleasant incidents. Conflicting opinions were expressed, and it was resolved to consult the Minister of Public Instruction before adopting a definite decision tomorrow. — It may be pointed out that the only persons likely to employ or provoke violence are the batllistas, of whom Sr. Sosa is one. Moreover, everyone is not so wildly excited over the results of the elections as Sr. Sosa imagines. With rare exceptions the people here have had sufficient sense to keep politics out of the Carnival festivities.

The Prince's Visit.

LATEST VERSION.

A London telegram appeared yesterday to the following effect:—

In official circles it is said that although the Prince of Wales has «provisionally» (sic) accepted the invitation to visit Uruguay and Chile, it is not very likely that the duration of his voyage will be extended, and the Prince will probably return to England in the middle of September at the latest. Although the details of the voyage have not been fixed, it is expected that he will arrive at Montevideo at the end of June, making only a short visit to Uruguay, then going on to Buenos Aires, and after some days stay in that city, will visit other parts of Argentina, and then probably cross the Andes by train to Santiago, returning by the same route, to embark on the *Repulse* at Montevideo.

The above, we think, is mainly conjecture. However great the probabilities, there is no official intimation yet that the Prince has accepted even «provisionally» the invitation to visit Uruguay, and until that appears all is uncertainty.

It may be noted that as yet not one of our local contemporaries has made any comment regarding the Prince's visit. This may be because they still regard it as an uncertainty — or because they are too much preoccupied with the elections and local politics.

Back to the Gold Standard.

MR. CHURCHILL'S STATEMENT.

A London telegram states that, replying to a question in the House of Commons, Mr. Winston Churchill said that the Government fully agreed to a reversion to the gold standard at the earliest possible moment.

Replying to several questions, Mr. Churchill said:—«His Majesty's Government are in full agreement with the declared intention of previous Administrations to revert to the gold standard at the earliest possible moment, but I am not in a position to make a more definite statement at present.»

Being plied with further questions he still maintained his inability to give more precise information, and expressed the hope that members would not press him.

On being asked about the Italian debt, he said that while he was in Paris the Italian Minister of Finance had expressed to him a desire that conversations on the subject should be initiated within the next few months.

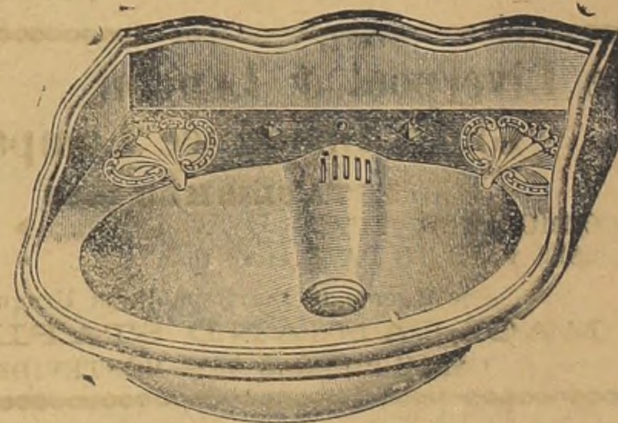

Girl Guides.

Duel Averted.

On account of some violent articles in the "Dia", Dr. Feiciano Viera, ex-President of the Republic and of the Administrative Council, and leader of the vierista or radical party, sent his seconds to Dr. Ghigliani, political editor of that paper. The Tribunal of Honour, however, decided that the attacks were not personal, and explicable by the

political heat of the moment, so there was no cause for a duel.

A challenge, arising out of a similar cause, is also on foot between Sr. Antonio Pan, and Sr. Cesar Batlle Pacheco.

War Debts.

ITALY CLAIMS SPECIAL TREATMENT.

A Rome telegram states that the Executive Committee of the Fascista Party has been considering the question of the inter-Allied debts. It complains that debts which were incurred for the victory of the common cause are being regarded as ordinary debts incurred by the country for its own needs, and protests against the separation of the debts from the reparations, maintaining that the vanquished ought to pay a real war indemnity.

It has been decided to initiate action in Italy, and among Italians abroad, to make clear the question of the debts and the economic and territorial results of the war. This will have the object of demonstrating the enormous war sacrifices of the soldiers and financiers of Italy as compared with those of other countries, the limited value of the territories obtained by Italy in comparison with other countries, Italy's successful effort to balance her Budget, and the remission of the reparations due to her by Austria, Hungary and Bulgaria. According to the Committee, these give Italy the right of special treatment as regard her debts.

Improving New York.

STARTLING TRAFFIC SCHEMES.

A New York telegram states that a city of sidewalk arcades, double-decked streets, subterranean garages,

and various other kinds of fantastic architectural designs was pictured at a meeting of the new Traffic Committee.

The suggestions included the prohibition of what is known as taxicab cruising, or moving along the streets when unoccupied, the provision of roof play-gardens in new building zones, and stricter walking in the streets. It was asserted that ten years hence New York City will probably have 3,150,000 motor vehicles, and that a comprehensive plan for their regulation must be adopted quickly with a view to avoiding traffic congestion.

Mr. Tuttle, Chief Engineer, declared, that the police had reached the limit of their ability to regulate the traffic, and that the Municipality would welcome suggestions from civic organisations to bring about the definite solution of a problem which was costing merchants millions of dollars every year, and which had grown into a menace to the residents of Manhattan.

The "Cat-Burglar".

The last few days (says a London contemporary) have revived almost as much speculation about the identity of a certain criminal as there was about another Great Unknown in the days when "Waverley" was new. He is still inspiring, we suspect with regret, more fear in the bosoms of a few than a yet greater Thief, who has been much longer in the profession but is still very skilful and enterprising.

In at the window, o'er the tiles, and up the drain-pipe the "cat burglar" has climbed, to unhoard not cash (of which there is none in these papery days to steal), but jewels. His daring, his cat-like silence, and his monkey-like agility have caught the public fancy; and a telling newspaper phrase has helped him to notorious mystery by giving him the distinction of a title. He has, perhaps, confederates; but he alone, he, the very "cat-burglar", does the monkey-like climbing, the cat-like entry; chooses his spoil like a connoisseur, and is gone like a shadow. All the glamour of Raffles hangs about him; could we meet him—at normal hours and in some house other than our own—we should find him, says fancy, as charming a fellow as Raffles himself. Whatever the police may know about him, the general public, excepting the owners of much jewelry, would be sorry to hear that he had been captured, or (if already captured) identified, and housed in a dwelling whose doors, and whose windows, too, are even more substantial than those of the houses which he has so elegantly despoiled. Even then there would be hope. Could stone walls make a prison and iron bars a cage for this mind which, if not innocent, is a master of quiet? Where Jack Sheppard, a mere man, succeeded, this burglar, who like the hero of a fairy-tale seems to be at once man and animal, will not fail.

Caught, identified, incarcerated, however, he needs must be, if the owners of jewels are to sleep quietly in their beds or even to sit quietly

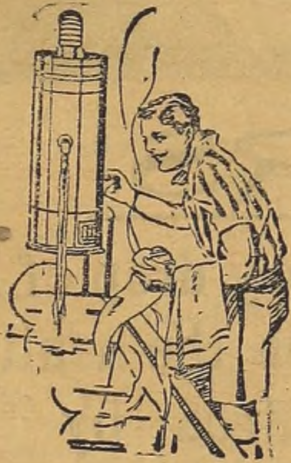

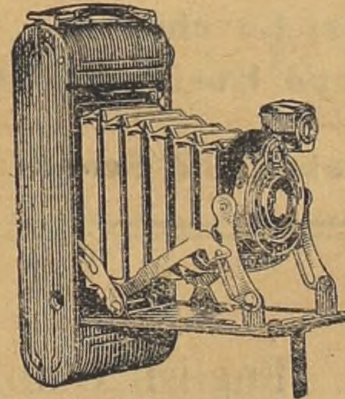

The other by a correspondent enlightened us some of the methods by which is quiet destroyer of quiet may be killed, and thus robbed of his magic and made subject to merely imma power. He may be baffled with thimbles and care and acorn crews, with forks and hope and inoline cat guards, with smiles and soap, or, at any rate, with engine other suitable grease. And should find him on our window-sills, or, with the other cats, upon our tiles, nothing makes so efficacious a threat as a railway-share. If each wealthy householder will but double the parts of the Bellman and the White Knight, cat-burglar's day is done. It is true that there are simpler remedies; at the popular imagination would, of unwarrantably, feel defrauded were the «cat-burglar» the hero of the moment, to fall by simple means. That is why we hesitate to suggest them; but in the interest of property, of law and of order, it is our duty to do so. One is the time-honoured device of tying a bell round the «cat-burglar's» neck: is should be a large bell, of a note easily audible, and not subject to confusion with those of the bell ribbon-hung about the necks of our other feline pets. The second means is not quite so simple, since it involves some small amount of moral fortitude. It is founded upon the old riddle, which asked what, in a carriage accident, was better than presence of mind, and answered, «Absence of body.» It owes something also to a familiar Latin line about the traveller who will sing in the very presence of the robber because he has nothing worth stealing. And it is merely this—to be content with possessing only a few of the gleaming trifles whose money-value is monstrously out of proportion to their decorative worth; to aim at beauty rather than at display in ornament; and thus to rid our households and our guardians of anxiety, and our favourite burglars of the opportunity for the misuse of talents which might earn them honour and good livelihood in other fields.

London Notes.

Saturday, January 17.
Mr. W. R. Davidge, vice-president of the Town Planning Institute, speaking last night, advocated the making of a south-side embankment from Westminster to London Bridge and the continuation of the Thames Embankment on the north side from Blackfriars to Tower Bridge.

The Rev. W. A. Spooner, D.D., who has just resigned the office of Warden of New College, has been elected an honorary fellow of the College.

Six famous paintings at Althorp have been sold by Lord Spencer and go to America.

A conference held in Glasgow yesterday between representatives of Messrs. G. and J. Weir and representatives of the building trades unions with regard to the conditions which will govern the erection of steel houses broke up without any decision being arrived at.

The deaths are announced of Sir Thomas Bennett, chief proprietor and for many years editor of the *Times of India*, and of Mr. H. W. Disney, the Metropolitan Police Magistrate.

Australia scored 275 for the loss of seven wickets in the third Test Match, which was begun at Adelaide yesterday.

Mr. S. B. Joel's XI, beat South Africa by ten wickets in their third unofficial Test Match at Cape Town yesterday.

The St. Paul's Cathedral Preservation Fund now amounts to

£115,270. The list of subscriptions acknowledged to day, which is headed by the Princess Royal, amounts to £12,034, and includes 980 contributors.

Mr. Blythe, the Minister for Finance in the Irish Free State Government, holds out no hope of lower taxation in the Free State for the present.

The authorities of the Royal Mint are engaged in an attempt to raise the standard of medallic art in this country with the view of enabling British firms to compete successfully with Continental producers.

A dinner of the Pitman Fellowship, to commemorate the 112th anniversary of the birth of Sir Isaac Pitman, was held at the Hotel Victoria on Saturday.

Evidence was taken on Saturday by the Royal Commission on Lunacy from Mr. Hugh Wilson Holman, an engineer, who declared that he had been wrongfully detained at Moorcroft and Ticehurst licensed houses.

The deaths are announced of Dr. Louis Casartelli, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Salford, of Mr. John McTaggart, the Hegelian philosopher, and of Professor Guido Biagi, the Dante Scholar.

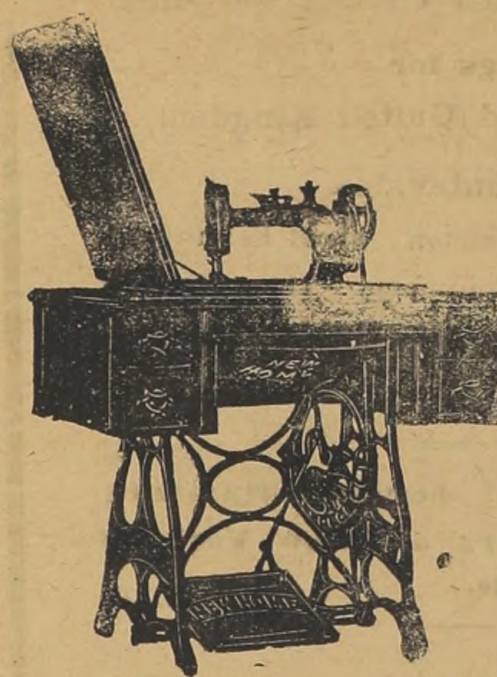

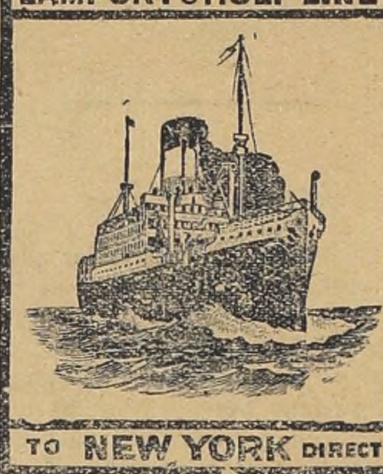
