Cabled News.

IBÁÑEZ RESIGNS.

Santiago de Chile 30th. The Minister of War, Colonel Ibáñez has resigned. He says that the return to normality that all Chileans desire, cannot be achieved by good wishes alone but by great sacrifices.

SERIOUS DEVELOPMENTS IN SIRIA. BRIAND SAID TO HAVE ASKED FOR THE WITHDRAWAL OF SARRAIL.

Paris 29th. It is asserted, and has not been denied, that the Minister of Foreign Affairs, M. Briand, asked Premier Painlevé to remove General Sarrail from the post of Governor General of Siria. 30th. Though silence is kept, it is felt certain that Serrail will be withdrawn. It is believed that the Socialist Deputy Paul Bonceur will be sent on a special mission to Damascus, to investigate.

London 30th. British Government functionaries have received with attention protests made by North Americans against the French with regard to events at Damascus. The British Minister of Foreign Affairs has not been authorized to act in the matter though the report sent by the British Consul at Damascus is an ample basis for a request for explanations from France. The British Government is anxious not to create complications that might upset negotiations for the definite signature of the Locarno Pact.

Parliamentary Elections.

The last General election in the country resulted, as our readers knew, in the political party, which has been 'out in the desert' for most of sixty years, casting the majority of votes for President of the Council of State, and obtaining most of the vacancies in the Senate with quite a number of the positions in the Departmental Administration.

The predominance of the Colorado party was for the first time in the memory of most living voters challenged; and their candidates were defeated, in some cases, owing to that party being divided into three frac-

tions, each supporting their own list of candidates.

In political history there is nothing new in this procedure. It has happened time and again in Europe, and it cost the Republican party the Presidential office in Washington in 1912, when Roosevelt and Taft did not agree as to the re-election of the last named. But for the defeated Batllista section of the Colorado party in Uruguay, after so many decades of unquestioned (at least by peaceful measures) superiority, to thus find themselves losing their stranglehold on all that enjoyment of office has meant, it can be understood there was a bitter resentment not only with their opponents, but most of all with those independents of their own political color, who, by refusing to fall in with the Batllista views, had made the defeat possible.

Ever since November this same group have been devising methods of nullifying the effective vote of these minorities of their colleagues. They have done their best to argue that the Nationalist party had no right anyway to a majority representation in the Senate, inasmuch as the gross plurality of all Colorado votes in the country being a few hundred more than the Nationalist figures, therefore the Senatorial benches should be occupied in that relation. They say nothing about the election of the President of the Council for that was effected on a direct personal vote throughout the country; but they find a tremendous injustice in their having a majority of sundry thousand votes in Montevideo which could not be carried over, say, to Flores, and there be allowed to swamp a smaller majority of their opponents!

The outcome of the discussion, at times accompanied with threats of physical force if not adjusted to the liking of the Batllista politicians, has been an Electoral Law which is to apply in the coming struggle next month, and which even now gives most of the parties misgivings as to what may work out.

In few words, the independence of minorities, such as the Catholics, the Socialists, the Riveristas, and the Radicales or Vieristas is comfortably legislated out of existence. Just where their votes will be counted is not altogether clear, but in the final results there will be Colorados and Nationalists, and all will be considered as the former who vote on a Red paper, whether they wish to support the majority fraction of same or not. If their idea is not to allow their vote to be counted in favour of that group, the alternative will be to stop away from the polls altogether, and thus contribute to a system of co-efficient distribution of the seats in the Chambers which may possibly result in the defeat of their irreconcilable adversaries in the family fold, but at the same time would imply a relegation of their traditional party to that same 'desert' which none of those at present holding office can remember having had to put up with.

The situation is interesting; the developments of the next few weeks will be more so with an understanding of same.

A Mistake.

In a previous issue we reported the speech of the President of the National Administrative Council, in which he eloquently inveighed against the system of dispatching, without warning, workmen who have served a Company well for ten years, paying them simply a month's wages in place of notice. Dr. de Herrera has now informed the Council that he was mistaken in referring, as he did, to the Artigas Frigorific Company, for they have not dismissed any of their men.

The Company he should have mentioned was the Frigorifico Uruguayo, which, as we reported at the time, had reduced its staff very considerably for economy. The cases are very different, for while the Artigas has been making profits the other had either to economise or close down. Of two evils they chose the one that is better for many of the workmen, they decided to continue on a reduced scale. No blame can be attached to them for this policy, they should rather be praised for their wisdom. At the same time we applaud the suggestion of Counsellor Fleurquin that a clause be added to the Bill for the establishment of the National Frigorifico, recommending the employment of the experienced men who have been dismissed from the Uruguayo without bad conduct on their part. But we rather expect they will have found some other employment before the National Frigorifico will require them.

English Club.

A large attendance of Members gathered in the English Club on Thursday evening to transact the business of the Annual Meeting, under the presidency of Mr. John Christie.

The report was not as favorable as some of its predecessors, showing a falling off in revenue due to various causes, and in a working deficit, which the Chairman observed was not satisfactory to the Committee, and the remedies for which they were carefully investigating.

Mr. C. W. Drever was elected President; with Messrs. Christie, Lanza, O'Neill, Hallett, Linn, McDonald, Cook, & Ritchie as members of the Committee.

A suggestion that members leaving the country instead of being exonerated from all contributions might be required to pay a reduced subscription during extended absence, was discussed, and left in the hands of the Committee to adopt the solution found convenient. Last year

Rotary Club Meeting.

A customary luncheon took place today at the Alhambra Hotel, in the presidency of Sr. Eduardo, and with a goodly attendance of members. Sr. Jaureguiberry, who is an acknowledged authority on the question of Rural Development, was the speaker of the day, and gave an informative account of his work on behalf of the movement. He was most interested in helping about 96 per cent of the national life. Uruguay is due to the Campesinos, said the speaker, and are relegated to any happy way of prospering it very fully follows that the other 4 per cent, by all the rest of the business of the Republic, soon feels the effect of the Campesinos accordingly. Uruguay has no industries of any kind, and has not much prospect at present, and therefore any increase in national wealth must center in camp development.

Hence the importance of the subject on which Sr. Jaureguiberry spoke at length. Dr. Burnett reported having visited the Buenos Aires Club, where he was accorded a warm fraternal reception; and the visit of the ex-President of the Habana, Cuba, Club was mentioned as received during the current week.

The Turf abroad and at home.

—The Argentine sportsman Sr. Martinez de Hoz has purchased in France the filly Etoile d'Argent

for 175,000 francs. The filly is served by Swynford.

—In Montevideo, at the sale of stud products by Victorica and Muñoz last Thursday, \$15,250 was realized, the average prices being for colts \$1,600 and for fillies \$565.

Carelessness of the Police.

Two men, Machado and Boscio, on Wednesday, were arrested by the police, the former having attacked the latter. While in the hands of the police, on their way to the nearest Police station, Machado took out a knife and stabbed Boscio seriously.

Exportation of products of the country.

The National Inspector of Animal Sanitary Police authorized yesterday the exportation of several lots of meat and subproducts, as follows: For Belgium 600 quarters of frozen beef of 1,500 steers. For Italy 8,500 dry cow hides and 27 bales of unwashed wool. For France 936 sacks of shin bones. For the United States 150 cases of preserved meat, 60 of preserved ox tongues 15 bales lamb skins, 2,000 salt cow hides, 37 bales tendons, 6,090 dry calf skins and 1,483 sacks of guano. For Honduras 200 cases of preserved meat. For Puerto Rico, 100 bales jerked beef. For Argentine 2 horses, 3 monkeys and 16 dogs.

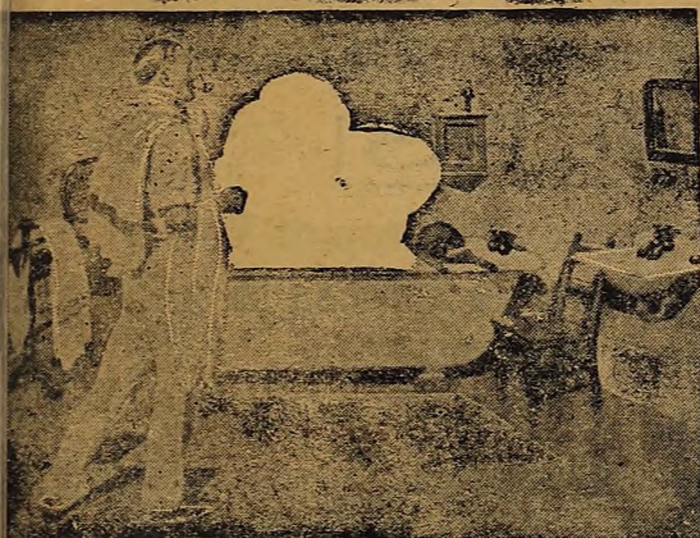
Big Lottery Prize.

Construction of rocks in the Uruguay.

Fishing off Peru.

It is asserted that the "Tonsberg Fishing Co." has obtained from the Government of Peru, the exclusive permission for the fishing of whales along the coast of that country. The boats of Peru are 2,000 kilometres length, from 50° to 200° south, and they are frequented by enormous whales.

A cable from Rome says that it is considered certain that Archbishop Connolly of Armagh, Ireland, will receive the red hat of the Cardinal of the Cisterciens in December.

Attilio Pelossi.

At the cemetery where the remains of Attilio Pelossi lie a quiet ceremony will take place in memory of this intrepid youth who perished in his gallant effort to save the life of a young woman he did not know, when the fire in the Fox (cinema) premises where both were present to death. The ceremony will consist of the placing of a plaque recording the facts, on the urn that guards his remains. The cost has been defrayed by admirers of the heroic self sacrifice of Pelossi.

S. "Highland Glen".

The s/s "Highland Glen" is due to arrive to-day, Saturday October 31st at noon. She has on board for Montevideo First Class passengers 6 latermediate and 7 Third. Total 19 passengers, also 100 tons of cargo. In addition to the above she brings for Mr. Z. 1 Chimpanzee, 2 Monkeys, 2 Tortoises, 6 Cranes, 10 Bats and 6 swans.

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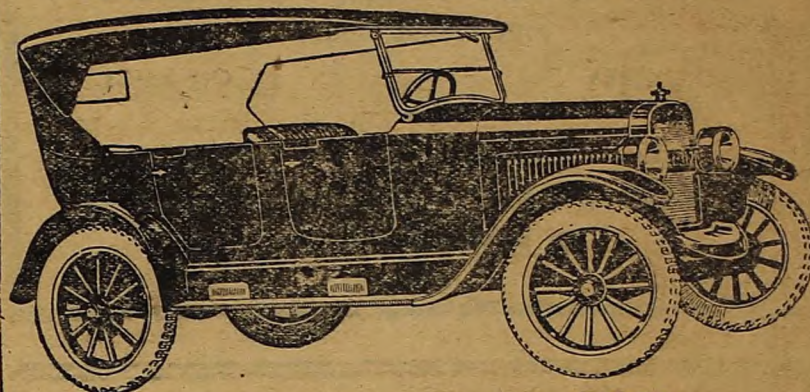
