Mr. M. J. Dunn, K. C., a well-known member of the Irish Bar, and his nephew, Mr. F. J. Dunn, were drowned on Wednesday afternoon while yachting in Dublin Bay.

The Scottish Memorial to Sir Hector Macdonald—a tower erected on a hill overlooking the town of Dingwall—was yesterday opened by Lord Tullibardine in presence of a great assemblage of people.

A Conference of the Association of Teachers in Technical Institutions was opened at Leeds University yesterday.

At Lord's, yesterday, Gloucestershire were all out for 85 against Middlesex who replied with 118. In their second innings, the Westerners could only make 74. At Leyton, Essex fared badly against the South Africans, and were dismissed for 88. The Colonials put on 188 for six wickets. Sussex scored 328, including 104 by Vine, at Chichester against Hampshire, who lost one wicket for 19 runs. Lancashire, obtained 108 on a wet pitch at Manchester against Kent, who made 21 at the cost of three wickets. At Oxford the University made 120 against Worcestershire, who lost half their wickets for 86. No play was possible at Sheffield between Yorkshire and Derbyshire, at Birmingham between Warwickshire and Surrey, and at Leicester, between Leicestershire and Nottingham.

A memorandum issued by the Emigrants' Information Office shows that in 1905 and 1906 the number of emigrants from the United Kingdom to Canada for the first time exceeded those who went to the United States.

A novel wedding spectacle was witnessed at Teddington, where some fifty guests sat down to the wedding breakfast on a vessel moored in the river.

But I must leave you, and see to his supper. The wenchers are all very well, but for a person of quality the mistress must see to the last touches. He shall have some of the old French wine—there's but seven bottles left."
