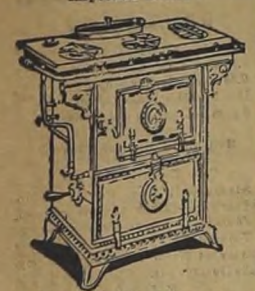

LONDON NOTES.

THURSDAY, JULY 17.
Members of the House of Commons spent their morning sitting yesterday in further consideration of the Education Bill. Clause 6 was verbally amended and added to the Bill. Interest centred in hints dropped by Mr. Balfour as to what Parish Councils might have to do in education and in an announcement that he would put on the paper certain amendments to Clause 7. At the evening sitting a batch of London Tabs or Railway Bills came up for second reading, a stage which they passed after opposition by the Hon. Claude Hay and a few other members.
Several of the Colonial Premiers attended a dinner given by the Canada Club at the Trocadero Restaurant last night. Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal presided. Amongst the principal speakers was Sir Wilfrid Laurier, who referred to Colonial policy and the need of Canada for population.
Lord Halibarton presided yesterday at Wimbledon House, Arlington-street, over a meeting of the Ladies' League, whose object is to oppose the progress of ritualism in the Church of England. The speakers included the Bishop of Sodor and Man, Lord Kelvin, and Lady Winborne.
A large and earnest meeting was held last night at the Hammersmith Town Hall to protest against the education Bill, and resolutions against the measure were carried unanimously. The Rev. A. R. Shrewsbury presided, and the Rev. Jos. Adams, the Rev. C. Silvester Horne, the Rev. F. G. Beeskin, and the Rev. Dr. Clifford were among the speakers.
Discussion yesterday at the Congress for the Welfare of Children was largely occupied with a proposal to extend the provisions of the Infant Life Protection Act, which proposal was carried, as was also one to admit cases up to eighteen years of age to reformatories, and in the other cases to extend the term of detention to twenty-one years of age.
The annual assembly of the United Methodist Free Churches at Leeds yesterday resumed the consideration of the resolution relating to East African missions. It was decided to appoint a general superintendent and to increase the staff of missionaries from three to six.
No less than £245 was paid in Wellington-street yesterday for a copy of "Robinson Crusoe" issued for a few shillings in 1719.
By a fire which broke out in Kenble-street, Drury-lane, last evening no fewer than twenty-seven people were rendered homeless.
Serious rioting took place on Leckhampton Hill, overlooking Cheltenham, late on Tuesday night in connection with a right of way dispute. Objections to fences and other obstructions erected by a quarry company a great crowd gathered, and a house and its furniture were burned, and damage to the amount of £1,000 is stated to have been done. Police were present, but dared not interfere.
Before Mr. Justice Darling, in the King's Bench Division yesterday, the hearing was concluded of the action for libel brought by M. Louis Porel D'Agout, an exhibition agent, against the "Daily Mail," in which newspaper a paragraph had appeared imputing that the plaintiff and others were concerned in a colossal swindle in regard to exhibition medals. On behalf of the newspaper, the defence was that the words complained of were true in substance and in fact. A verdict for the defendants was given.
There was a painful scene in the Divorce Court yesterday during the hearing of the petition of Mr. Thomas Henry Ashcroft, a Liverpool timber merchant, for a divorce. A daughter of the parties was giving evidence in support of the father's case, when the respondent fainted, and in consequence of her condition the further hearing of the case was adjourned until to-day.
Creditors and shareholders of Phos, Limited, proprietors of an acetylene omnibus lamp, held meetings yesterday in Carey-street. It was stated that the company had made contracts with several important omnibus companies for the supply of lamps, but these failed, and in consequence the journeys of the omnibuses were lost.
