At West Ham, Thomas Lewis, a West Ham relieving officer, pleaded guilty to stealing the money of the West Ham guardians, and was sentenced to three months' hard labour.

An inquest was held yesterday at Haslar Hospital on the body of William Newman, first-class petty officer on board the destroyer Tiger, which was sunk last Thursday night in the Channel in collision with the cruiser Berwick. Newman was rescued, but died before he could be landed. Captain Nicholson, of the Berwick, said the cruiser was going at a speed of about ten knots when he saw the Tiger running across her bows. From the moment that witness sighted the Tiger, he knew that a collision was inevitable. He gave orders to go astern. Bots were put out from different vessels, and a number of men were picked up. Lieutenant A. C. Strutt, navigating officer of the Berwick, confirmed the evidence of Captain Nicholson, who afterwards added that for destroyers to pass between ships of the fleet was a highly dangerous thing to do. Engineer-Lieutenant Vining, of the Tiger, gave evidence as to the circumstances of the collision. The jury found that Newman lost his life by drowning, but were unable to express an opinion as to the cause of the accident.

Mr. Justice Jelf and a jury attended a special performance of a sketch and cinematograph performance at the Oxford Music Hall to enable them to come to a decision in the action by a comedian. Rotherhithe Tunnel is to be opened by the Prince of Wales in June.

A meeting of literary men was held in London in support of the proposed Shakespeare National Theatre.
