

The views of the Legislature on the Congress are given in a speech which he made at a luncheon at the Cathedral hall on Sunday, in which he spoke of the deep gratification which he was sure the people would feel at the incomparable demonstration of the past week. The Archbishop of Westminster has also made a statement in which he expresses his perfect satisfaction with the work and results of the Congress, and also with the attitude of the public towards it, apart from the somewhat undignified action of the Prime Minister. Still, there remains a bitter feeling of resentment among the Roman Catholic community generally against the Government, the belatedness of whose intervention, it is held, added injury to insult.

Lord Curzon of Kedleston's motor-car on Sunday evening came into violent collision with another car near Sunningdale Station while on the way from London to Basingstoke. Though his driver escaped, Lord Curzon was badly cut about the head, and was attended by a physician. He was able, however, to continue his journey to Basingstoke by train, and yesterday was making satisfactory progress.

The first international exhibition of rubber which has been held in Europe was opened at Olympia yesterday by Sir Henry Blake.

In the annual match between the champion county and the Rest of England, which was begun at the Oval yesterday, Yorkshire were in the field all day. Their opponents made 413 for five wickets, Mr. Bosanquet being 189 not out.
