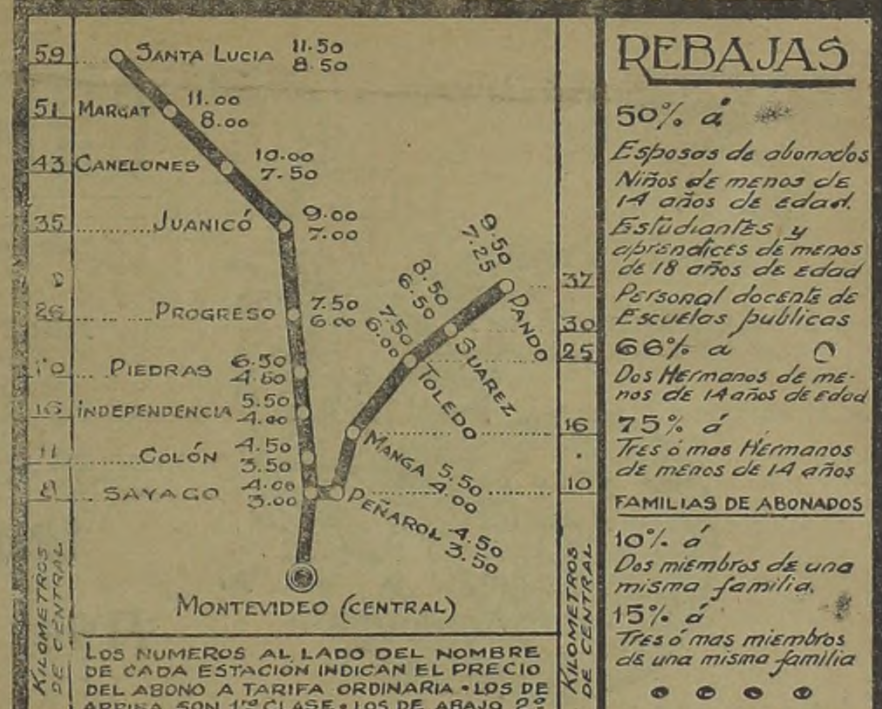

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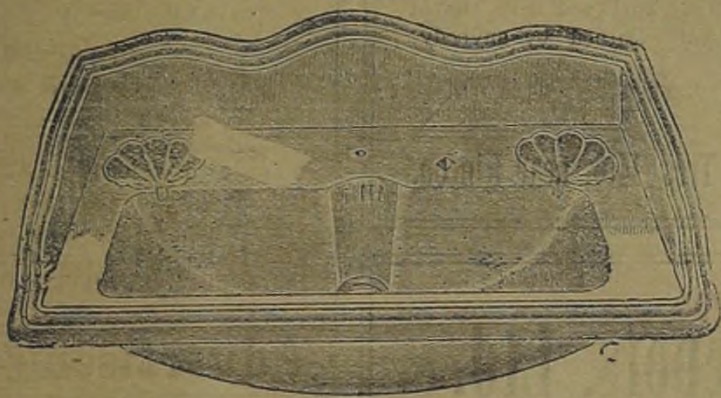

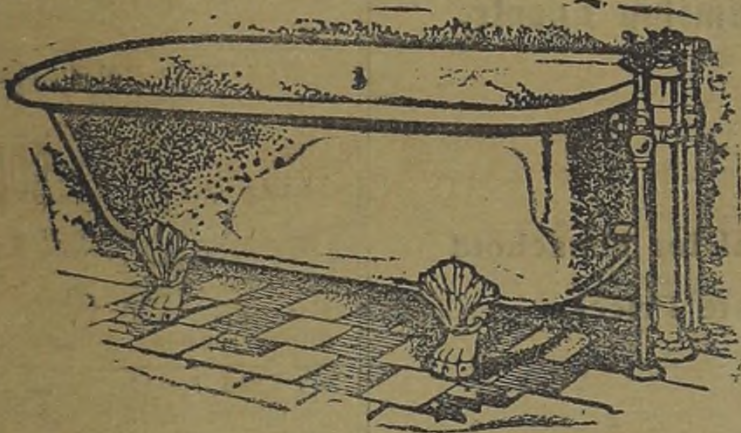

POLITICAL NOTES.

CHAMBER OF SENATORS.

The Senators held a short sitting on Friday. Approval was completed of the Convention of Agricultural Defence. There was no other business of general interest.

MORATORIUM PROLONGED.

The Executive has presented a Bill prolonging for another two months the moratorium accorded by the Act of August 8th, affecting judicial sales and pacts of resale (*retroventa*) which expires on the 8th instant. On this occasion, however, it is further established that the creditor is entitled to receive interests for the period, in those cases where interest is due. The chief object of the Bill, it is explained, is to prevent a violent fall in the value of real estate. The Bill will probably be treated summarily by the Chambers, as it must be sanctioned before the 8th instant to be of any avail.

TREASURY BILLS.

The public subscription opened for the first series of Treasury Bills closes tomorrow. From what is known so far of the result it is doubtful if the first amount of two million dollars will be covered.

THE WARRANTS BILL.

It is understood that the Finance Committee of the Senate will report favorably upon the Warrants Bill, in the form sent up from the lower Chamber; that is to say rejecting all amendments relative to any increase of note issue. The Bill will be discussed in the Senate this week.

Getting Ahead.

Here is something good from the pen of Dr. George Clarke Peck: Michelangelo wrote on the canvass of one of his pupils the word "Amplior". Bigger, bolder, better—it must be so always. In college, in business, in athletics, in the making of a soul, there is always this temptation—to as well as the average man. And the poison of that creed is as subtle and deadly as carbonic acid gas. Well enough for a bee to build his cell as well as his ancestors did. But the engineering triumphs of the age are due to the men who insist upon did. But the engineering triumphs of the age are due to the men who insist upon believing there is always a better way.

And even if they some day reach the perfection of mechanics, there will still be a realm open to the ambitions—the realm of personal growth. No limits there. Browning said it: Endeavour to be good, and better still, and best.

comrade just ahead of you, or the chap whose sharp breathing tells that he is just at your elbow, and trying to pass. Try to get ahead of yourself. The man who does that wins.

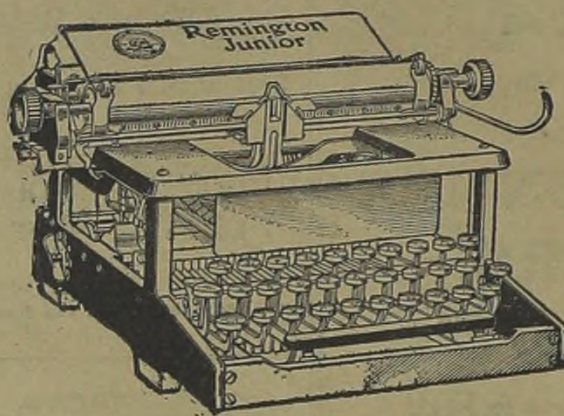

Foreign Office Despatches.

The following telegrams from the Foreign Office, London, have been received at the British Legation in this city:

London, Oct. 2nd.

French official communiqué dated October 1st states that in Roye region a violent engagement has fortunately turned in our favour. In Argonne we have made some fresh progress. General impression remains satisfactory.

London, Oct. 2nd.

Belgian official communiqué issued October 1st says there has been a fierce artillery duel all day. German batteries which ventured too close to the forts were demolished. Situation is the same as yesterday evening.

London, October 2nd, 6.30 p.m.

Russian official communiqué dated October 1st states that retreat of the German army from the confines of provinces of Suwalki and Lomza proceeded under the pressure of our troops. Particularly warm fighting occurred west of Simne. Forces which have been attacked at Osowiec are hurriedly departing northward.

London, October 2nd.

Russian official communiqué states that Russia has accomplished the first part of her programme, the destruction of the Austrian army. Henceforward Austria will be in the position of having lost all her war material and her best troops. The debris of her armies has sought refuge under Germany's protection. The expunging of Przemysl and Cracow has become a secondary consideration.

London, Oct. 3, 12.40 p.m.

A French Official Communiqué, dated October 2nd, states that on left wing one French detachment debouching from Arras has fallen back slightly to East and North of town. To the North of Somme, French have made progress before Albert. Between Roye and Lassigny enemy has delivered violent attacks which were shattered against French resistance. On remainder of front everything quiet. Reported that near Saint Mihiel none of the enemy remain any longer on left bank of Meuse.

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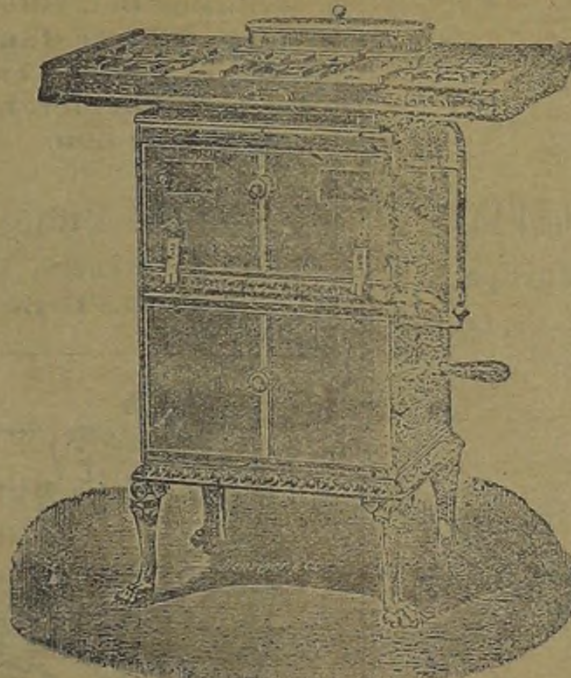
