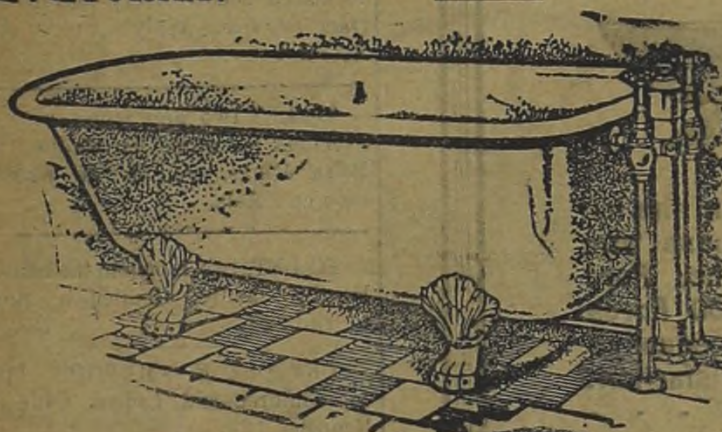

POLITICAL NOTES.

CHAMBER OF SENATORS.

The Senators, on Thursday, approved the Agricultural Defence Bill, which now passes to the Deputies. A somewhat lengthy discussion then ensued over the Moratorium (Extension) Bill. Dr. Varela Acevedo said that the Finance Committee was divided in opinion as to the amendments introduced by the Deputies, some thinking that the extension was excessive. Now that the first difficulties were over, the effort everywhere was to restore a normal situation as soon as possible, even in countries more directly affected by the war than was Uruguay. To prolong the moratorium was to prolong an unnatural situation of general paralysis. His opinion was that a Bill should be prepared providing for as rapid a return as possible to common right, and he proposed that the Minister of Finance should be invited to discuss the point with the Senate. Dr. Varela's ideas were supported by Dr. Manini, but he thought that there should be a brief respite to prepare the way and to avoid the shower of executions in suspense. The motion was then approved. There was no further business of interest.

CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES.

In the Deputies, on Thursday, Sr. Andreoli took the oath and his seat as Deputy for Montevideo. Discussion was then resumed of the asphalt question. Dr. Buero spoke at length in defence of the Government Resolution. The case, he he said, was not one for a call for tenders, for the work was a specialty.

The price of \$6.70 per square metre was a favorable one, and, for the purpose required, "Gilsonite" was superior to rock asphalt, which could not be employed in streets having a sharp gradient. He cited technical authorities and precedents in favor of "Gilsonite", and entered into an elaborate comparison of the proposals of the Asfaltadora and the Neuchatel Company with the object of showing that the former was really the more favorable. He contended that a contract for a million square metres was not excessive, and could be filled without any necessity of carrying the asphalt to small suburban streets. The discussion was still continuing when the Chamber adjourned.

FACILITATING PAYMENTS.

A Decree has been issued from the Ministry of Finance ordaining that from the 1st proximo registered Custom House agents (despachantes) may make their payments to the Custom House in cheques drawn upon the Bank of the Republic in favor of the Treasurer of Customs. The Decree also contains numerous dispositions of administrative character relative to the handling and distribution of the Customs Funds. Some of these are evidently prompted by recent revelations.

This step of permitting payment by cheque will be generally welcomed in commercial circles. In these days of advanced commercial methods, when the largest sums are paid over by the transfer of a slip of paper, the exaction of cash was antiquated, ridiculous and most inconvenient, besides involving a waste of labor to both payer and receiver. Now that the initiative has been taken, the step is one that should be generalized in the Government offices, and also made extensive to other Banks besides that of the Bank of the Republic. The latter has obviously been specified in pursuit of the Government's idea of creating a monopoly, as far as possible, in favor of its own institution, but it is not just in the present case, as it means practically compelling merchants doing business with the Custom House to keep an account with that Bank, though they may have reasons for preferring another.

SENATORIAL ELECTIONS.

Senatorial elections take place in six of the Departments tomorrow, but, judging from the little attention paid to them by our native contemporaries they are exciting a minimum of interest. There is some talk of opposition in Durazno and Florida, but no one expects it to be effectual, and the confirmation of the official nominees in all six Departments is regarded as a foregone conclusion. This means the breaking down of the independent majority in the Senate which has proved a safeguard of public interests on various occasions. Whether the elections have anything to do with it we cannot say, but it may be mentioned that just now there is a revival of rumors of the familiar uneasy character. No one seems to take them very seriously, nor would they have found mention were it not for certain precautionary movements in official circles.

THE LOTTERY TICKET TAX.

The Government has withdrawn its proposal to impose a tax upon the sale of lottery tickets, and has presented a substitute Bill creating a tax of 5 per cent. on all lottery prizes of \$500 and upwards, and of 7 1/2 per cent. on prizes over \$50,000. At the same time the 5 per cent. at present deducted from the first prize or *grande* to pay the "aproximations" will be abolished. It is calculated this will bring in \$120,679 yearly for the Treasury of Public Instruction. In this form the previous objections to the tax disappear.

Latest Items of Interest about the War.

Who Caused the War?

The Exchange Telegraph Company reports the receipt of a telegram from the Hague announcing that the Kaiser has ordered the Secretary for Foreign Affairs, Herr von Jagow, to notify all diplomatic agents who hitherto have been in the service of hostile nations and can be considered free, that they are to choose some other career. The German Press declares that this action would appear to indicate that German diplomacy is considered to be responsible for the war.

Grand Duke's Gift.

Grand Duke Michael has presented the French army with a million pair of boots, brought in the United States, where orders were received on a large scale for a supply of boots for the Russian army.

The Highland Ride Chased.

It is reported from Oruna that the British transatlantic, "Highland Pride," bound from the River Plate for London with a cargo of frozen beef, has anchored in that port. The captain reports that during the voyage he was pursued by German warships and had to keep his vessel travelling at forced speed to escape.

Barbarous Warfare.

The British Admiralty announces that on October 26 last, the French passenger steamer Amiral Ganteaume, while on the way from Calais to Havre with over 2000 unarmed refugees, mostly women and children, was sunk by a German submarine. The steamer Queen succeeded in saving almost all the passengers, only forty lives being lost. Subsequent examination of the vessel showed that she had been attacked by a German submarine which, in broad daylight, launched a torpedo at her, knowing that there were none but defenceless people on board. The Admiralty describes this as an illuminating illustration of the methods employed by the Germans.

Loss of Battleship.

The cable reports that the battleship "Bulwark" has been blown up in Sheerness harbour, the ship's powder magazine having exploded. It is reported that 700 men were killed in the disaster. The "Bulwark" was a pre-Dreadnought battleship, her principal armament comprising four 12-inch and

six 12-inch guns. She was launched in 1899 and commissioned in 1902.

Russian Successes.

The cables bring reports of decisive Russian victories against the Austrians and Germans. It is even stated that a whole German Army corps was surrounded and taken prisoner. In the House of Lords Lord Kitchener said that the recent Russian victory resulted in the heaviest losses suffered by the Germans since the commencement of the war. The details of this victory are so contradictory that it is better to await the official report.

Russia Helps Serbia.

It is reported that Russia has sent large contingents of troops up the "Danube" and has landed them in Serbia. The troops were conveyed in transports disguised as lumber carriers which got through safely. Probably the Rumanians did not make a very thorough inspection during transit.

Items of Interest.

A Public Nuisance.

Matters have reached such a pitch that just now a journey in a tramcar at almost any hour of the day is a positive penance, owing to the newsboys and other hawkers who are allowed to swarm in and out of the cars at every moment. They hang about the steps and block the gangways, and their incessant aggressive cries, intruding upon the ears, keep one's nerves in a state of perpetual irritation, effectually preventing conversation, reading, or consecutive attention to anything. Of late, we have noticed, not merely boys, but hulking youths and even full-grown men are boarding the cars for purposes of hawking. In these hard times it may seem unkind to impede anyone from an endeavour to earn a living by any honest means, but this is a thing that is passing the bounds of the tolerable, and some steps are required to check it. The management of the Tramway Companies should look to the matter, for they are certainly not justified in allowing their passengers to be exposed to such irritating annoyance when riding in the cars.

Bank Dividend.

The London and River Plate Bank has received advice that the Board has declared a dividend of 7 per cent. for the half year, making a total distribution of 15 per cent. for the year. The sum of £275,159 is carried forward.

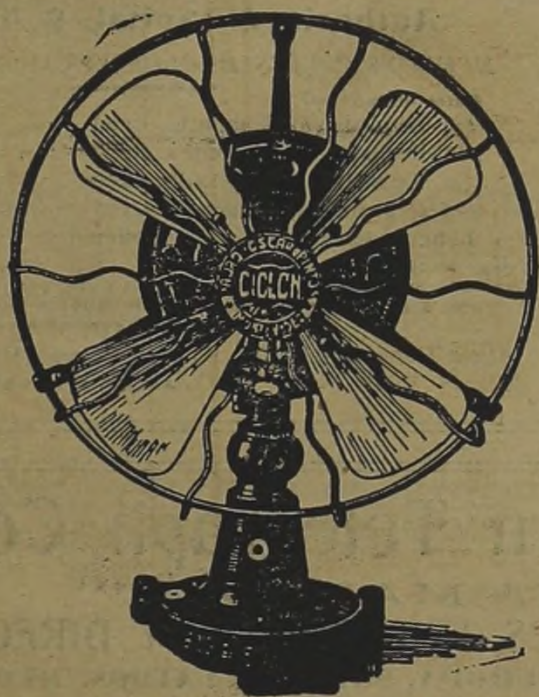

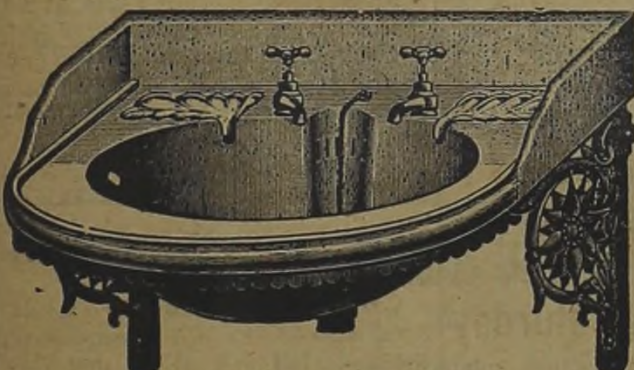

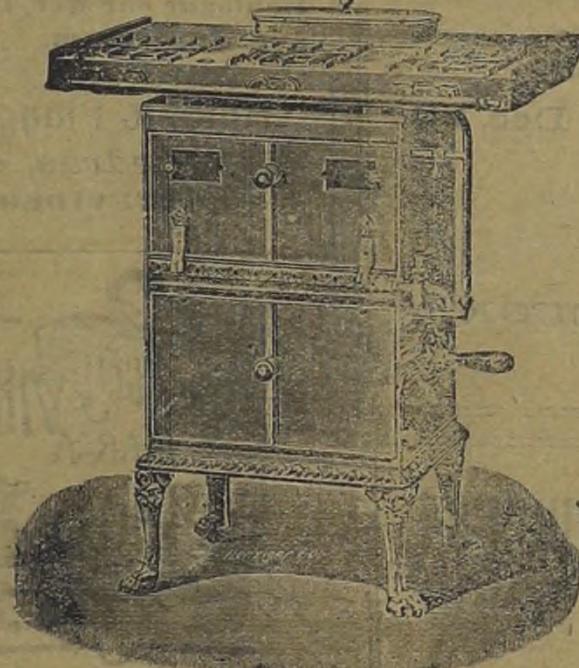
