CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES.

THE DUTIES ON HATS.

In the Deputies, on Thursday, Dr. Almada resumed his defence of the Bill increasing the duties on hats. He said that he had visited one or two of the factories and he found there was a true industry, while the articles made were even exported. It was therefore necessary to give the industry more protection, suppressing all competition of the foreign article. It was time, he added, that we learnt how to utilise our raw materials, and to free ourselves from the present vassalage to Europe! The country, he claimed, was eminently protectionist, and would applaud the Bill!

Dr. D. Terra said he also had visited the factories, and found them principally occupied in utilising imported material. The main effect of the Bill would be to encourage contraband. If the factories were able to export goods to Argentina and Paraguay, as alleged by Dr Almada, they could hardly be in need of more protection.

Dr. Rodriguez said the Bill was extravagant. It was not clearly proved that the factories required such a high margin of protection, or even that the industry was one worth protecting. He thought that a clause should be added to the Bill prohibiting the labelling of the national article with a foreign mark.

Dr. Rodriguez then proposed a series of reductions in the duties as fixed by

the Committee. These met with the support of several Deputies and were still under discussion when the Chamber adjourned.

MORE TAXES!

HORSES — CARDS — FIREARMS.

Yet another proposal for increased taxation has been made by the Executive, the objects on this occasion being horses, playing cards and "pocket" firearms, that is to say pistols and revolvers. The Bill is substantially as follows:—

Art. 1.—Imported race and draft horses shall pay an *ad valorem* import duty of 30 per cent. Horses imported as sires remain free. (Nothing is said about saddle horses.)

Art. 2.—Foreign playing cards shall pay a stamp tax of 20 cents per pack, and home made cards 10 cents.

Art. 3.—Pocket or short fire-arms shall pay a stamp tax of \$1, when the selling price including the tax is not over \$10; \$1.50 when it is not over \$15; \$2 when it is not over \$30; and \$5 when over \$30. Packets with cartridges of munition or shot shall pay 10 cents for each 25 cartridges or portion thereof.

Art. 4.—Cards, fire-arms and packets found without the corresponding stamp shall be confiscated, and the violators fined from \$10 to \$500.

Art. 5.—The right (i. e. of inspection) conceded to fiscal functionaries by Art. 12 of the Act of Jan. 11, 1896, shall be extended to the places where fire-arms, munition or playing cards are sold or deposited.

Art. 6.—The firearms referred to in this Act shall have affixed to them in the same form as the stamp a ticket stating the price including the tax. The absence of this shall be penalised in the same form as the absence of the stamp.

The accompanying Message states that the tax on horses had a protective object, to favor local breeding stables. The tax on pocket fire-arms falls on a superfluous article, and above all serves to compensate the duties that are evaded. "It is notorious that there is hardly a man in the country who does not carry or own a revolver. On the other hand the number of sportsmen is limited. Nevertheless while over 3000 guns and 300 rifles pay duties, there is no despatch of revolvers and pistols. And, as these are not made in the country, it follows that they are smuggled." The tax on cards is a tax on gambling. The high customs duties are largely evaded, but this tax will be a correction. From 57,600 to 72,000 packs pay duty, but for all that "well informed persons" calculate that 302,400 packs enter annually. 172,800 packs are made locally. The tax will produce respectively \$45,360 and \$17,280, and the application of a stamp will enable the tax to be fiscalised. — Here the Message ends, no estimate being given of the expected result of the other taxes.

COMMENTS.

This, it may be remarked, is the tenth or twelfth new series of taxes pro-

posed in as many weeks. Even if all these taxes were individually sound—and some of them certainly are not—their rapid creation at a time when everyone is feeling severely the pressure of heavy taxation, is unsound policy, and comes ill from a Government that, even under the present stress, shows no real sense of retrenchment in its high rate of expenditure. It is not by forcing up the rate of taxation in every direction that the economical problem will be solved, and the expedient is one that should not be abused. The Government seems to be showing as little moderation in this respect now as it did in the creation of fresh expenditure when it first came into office.

The tax on playing cards may be justified, but it is excessive in proportion to the value of the article, and should be reduced to one-half or one-fourth. Cards already pay a heavy duty, and it is not good economics to tax the same article twice over. The tax on horses is not a wise one, and in any case should be made less immoderate. Who ever heard of applying protectionist principles to horses? The tax on firearms should also be reduced—in fact the whole Bill shows that want of moderation which is so frequent a characteristic of the present Government. The confession that all the revolvers and two-thirds of the playing-cards sold in the country are smuggled is not a flattering one to the Customs authorities, and would have been better omitted in an official Message. Moreover if the internal or stamp tax is intended to "compensate" the duties which the Government fails to receive, then the proper course is either to repeal the duties, or else to take steps to impede smuggling.

Further Details of the Naval Combat.

Five Hours' Engagement.

"Nurnberg" also Sunk.

A despatch has been received from the British Admiralty announcing that the "Nurnberg" has also been sunk. It will be remembered Vice Admiral Sir Frederick Sturdee reported that, at the commencement of the engagement, the "Nurnberg" and the "Dresden" made off but were being pursued. The former has been overtaken and the British ocean greyhounds are hot on the trail of the latter. The official despatch is as follows:

"The Admiralty announce that a further telegram has been received from Vice Admiral Sturdee reporting that the "Nurnberg" was also sunk on December 8th and that the search for the "Dresden" is still proceeding. The action lasted for five hours with intervals. The "Scharnhorst" sank after three hours and the "Gneisenau" two hours later. The enemy's light cruisers scattered and were chased by our cruisers and light cruisers. No loss of any British vessel is reported.

In addition to the foregoing despatch, it may be stated that the Pacific liner "Oronsa," which was due from the west coast yesterday morning, has been delayed. This news gave rise to all sorts of rumours. It was stated that the "Oronsa" has been stopped in order to bring British wounded to this port to be placed in the British Hospital. This rumour was widely circulated, but we are in a position to state that the British Legation has not received any advice on the matter. Besides, it would be very improbable that any British injured would be landed in a neutral port unless absolutely unavoidable, as the men would have to be interned until the end of the war.

What appears to be more likely is that

Latest Items of Interest about the War.

OFFICIAL CABLE TO BRITISH LEGATION.

Royal Gold Coast.

The operations in the capture of Togoland and in the destruction of the wireless installation at Kamina cost about 10,000. The Council of the Gold Coast resolved to meet all the expenditure incurred in that connection as a proof of their loyal support and sympathy in the righteous war in which the British Empire is engaged. £80,000 will be contributed to His Majesty's Government in 1915 by the Gold Coast towards the expenses of the war.

What we have and to hold.

The German press report that the national liberal leader Bassermann, in a speech to the members of the Reichstag, made a definite admission that Germany intends to hold permanently the country which she occupies. "Let us hold fast," said, "to that which we have won over and above that acquire all that we need. By bloody war to splendid victory, that is the motto of this great war."

Scarcity of Guns.

It is reported that the weakening of German offensive is due to great scarcity of guns. The German military authorities have only got one rifle for every three reservists now being called to the colours.

The Persian Gulf.

The Indian Office announces that, in successful operations from December 5th to 9th, the British troops have captured a large area on the left bank of the Tigris and a small area where the late Governor of Iraq surrendered with all his troops. These operations have given Great Britain complete control of the country in the junction of the Tigris and the Euphrates to the sea.

Altan of Zanzibar.

The Sultan of Zanzibar has issued a loyal address to the Moslem community of the coast region of the East Africa Protectorate.

French Communiqué.

The following French official communiqué issued this afternoon. Yesterday in Belgium and in the region of the Yser. In the region of Quesnoy and Rochy we made progress varying between 200 and 600 metres. We have

maintained and consolidated these gains. In the region of Rheims our heavy artillery forced the Germans to evacuate some trenches when they came under the fire of our infantry. Near Perthes the enemy made two counter attacks against trenches captured on the 8th, but were repulsed. Our progress continued throughout Argonne, where we carried trenches and repulsed six counter attacks. On the heights of the Meuse we have gained marked advantage in the artillery duels. In Bois Le Pretres we have captured more trenches. Rest of the front no change.

British Trade.

The Board of Trade announces recorded value of exports of British produce in November £24.6 millions, excluding a very large value of commodities exported to France for the use of the army. The value of imports in November was £56 millions, or an increase of £4.4 millions on October. Over 7 million hundredweights of wheat imported into the United Kingdom in November at the average price of 42s. 10d. per imperial quarter. In Austria the price of wheat is nearly double, being 76s. 9d. per quarter in Vienna in November, maximum prices being fixed. Cocoa in Hamburg at the end of November was 142s. and 145s. a hundredweight for two standard descriptions, compared with 58s. and 65s. for the same descriptions in London.

Prisoners and Guns.

The India Office announces that on the capture of Kurnah reported on December 9th 1,100 prisoners and 9 guns were taken.

Aviators Busy.

French official communiqué states: our aviators again threw bombs successfully on the stations and aviation sheds at Freiburg in Breisgau. Sixteen bombs were dropped in spite of lively cannonade the aviators returned safely.

Russian Operations.

Russian Headquarters announce isolated attempts of enemy to take the offensive unfavourable. In the region of Vyszkow, during attacks on the Austrian fortified position, 4 guns, over 300 prisoners and many wagons were captured.

Summer Fêtes.

Program Outlined.

The Fêtes Committee has now outlined a general program for the summer season now commencing.

For Carnival (February 14, 15 and 16) there will be the usual illuminations and corso in Calle 18 de Julio, but not on quite such an expensive scale. Parque Urbano, and the usual popular items, with a somewhat reduced list of prices. It is also intended to hold the window-dressing competition which fell through on the previous occasion.

Other events, subject to modification, are roughly as follows:— Dec. 31, Illuminations, firework, music and midnight torchlight procession at Pocitos and Parque Urbano.—Jan. 6. International races at Maroñas.—Jan. 21, Illuminations and fireworks at Parque Urbano.—Jan. 9, 16 and 23, Sand-building competitions at Pocitos, Capurro and Ramirez respectively.—Jan. 10 and 17, "Carreras de cintas" at Parque Urbano and Pocitos.—Jan. 24 Regatta in the bay.—Jan. 31, Athletic sports and corso in the Prado.—Feb. 3, Battle of flowers and illuminations at Pocitos.—Feb. 18, Venetian fête in the bay.—Feb. 18, Tilting at the ring at Maroñas.—Fuller details will be made known in due time.

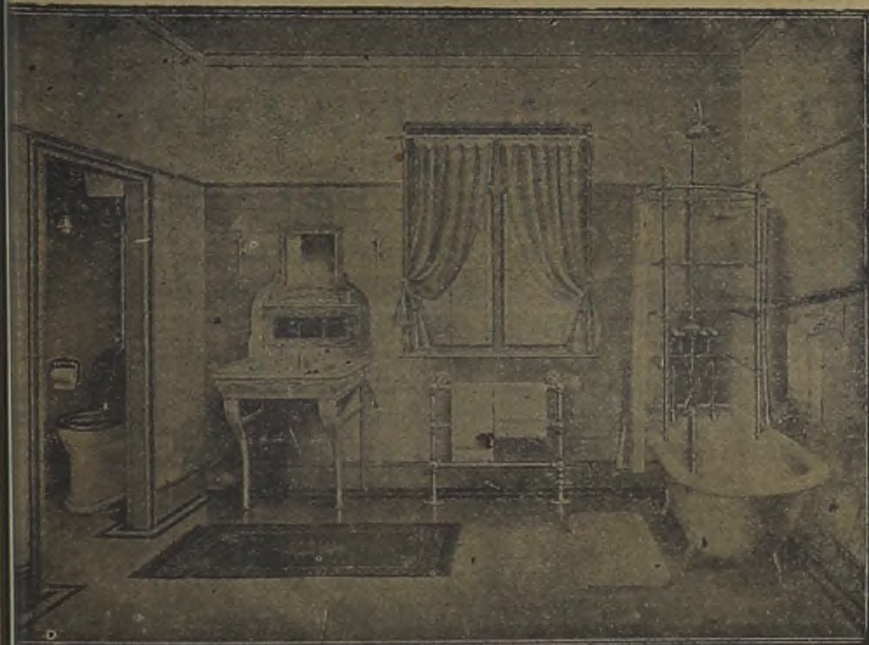
