## Germany's Dwindling Purchasing Power

### POSSIBLE SETTLEMENT BETWEEN THE POPE AND MUSOLINI

Rome, August 21st

The Pope and Mussolini will immediately start conversations to settle the Italian - Vatican dispute. From reliable sources it is learned that the Pope delegated the Jesuit priest, Venturi, to open unofficial relations with Mussolini and the conversations are the result of a secret meeting between the Pope and the Priest.

It was Venturi who prepared the Italo - Vatican conciliation, which culminated in the Lateran Treaty. The priest was secretly ushered into the Pope's private apartments and the attendants refused to name the visitor. However well informed members of the household recognised Venturi, who is a close friend of Mussolini. Venturi is therefore acting as a liaison officer between the Pope and Mussolini and owing to the recent lessening of the tension, it is believed that an agreement is imminent.

### THE FRANCO - SOVIET NON - AGGRESSION PACT

Berlin, August 21st

The "Tageblatt", commenting on the recent report of the Franco - Soviet non - aggression pact declares that although the final appreciation must be reserved until full details are known, it can be said that the pact is also important to Germany, relieving their relations with Poland, since it will strengthen Poland's position and eliminate the alleged danger of a joint Russian - German attack, which the Poles claim is continually threatening.

Both Soviet and French officials maintain the closest reserve in regard to the pact. The Soviet's

refuse to discuss the matter and the French declare that negotiations are proceeding, but refuse to admit that the pact has been signed.

London, August 21st

The Indo - China Navigation Company has advised that the s. s. "Kwongsang" was lost in a typhoon, and it is feared that all hands were drowned.

### AUSTRALIAN SAVING'S BANK BILL

Sydney, August 21st

Mr. Lang, the Australian Premier, has introduced a Government Savings Bank Bill in the Legislative Assembly, giving power to the Commissioners to issue debentures up to a maximum of ten million pounds sterling to facilitate the operation of the bank.

London, August 20th

In spite of the recent reports that his trip had been cancelled, the Prince of Wales has left by plane for Le Bourget and from there to Biarritz and is now at his Chateau de Matignon, where he will remain for several weeks.

The Sinclair Consolidated Prairie Company and the Prairie Pipeline Company, as also the Tide Water Associated are arranging to merge into a corporation which will be known as the Commonwealth Petroleum.

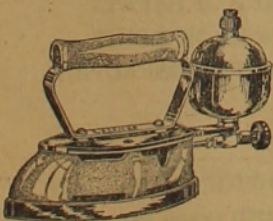

### MERCATOR AND HIS

#### WONDERFUL ATLAS

(Continued)

Sadly enough, he was destined never to see his great Atlas, which came into being as one unit only after his death. It appears that during his latter years he became involved in financial difficulties, which caused him to dispose of some of his best plates to one Jodocus Hondius, of Amsterdam, who availed himself of the opportunity to immortalize his own name by bringing the Atlas out thereunder, the first edition appearing under the date of September 4th., 1609. In the work of producing it, Hondius obtained the co-operation and active assistance of Mercator's sons, all of whom collaborated in it. It is, therefore, more than vicariously Mercator's own Atlas, although brought out under the name of a stranger and even containing the picture of the latter in the guise of a glorified geographer. In it appeared all of the copper plate engraved and water coloured maps produced by Mercator himself in their entirety, and signed by him in the lower left hand corner, as well as those turned out by his sons under their own various names on many of which their illustrious father had also worked.

The finished work contained considerably more than 150 such maps, many of them double page, all beautifully hand painted in water colours. They were embellished by figures of galleons under full sail, dolphins, whales, sea serpents, and so on. These fancifully embellished maps are undoubtedly the original source of what are now known as "sixteenth century style" maps, at present very popular among map-makers. One of these figures on the original Mercator maps is especially worthy of mention here. It appears on the map of Cathay (China) and consists of a very elaborate and clumsy looking four-wheeled car, in which is seated the figure of a Mandarin, being

borne along before the wind by means of sails.... On the return of Marco Polo to his native land, after his wonderful journeys in the Far East, he told of having seen such a car in Cathay, for which he was roundly denounced as a liar by the incredulous Venetians.... And who can say that it was not the true progenitor of the modern automobile?

There are naturally but very few genuine examples of this wonderful Atlas now existing in the world. The National Government of the United States is the fortunate possessor of two which are in the Congressional Library, at Washington; another is said to be owned by a famous University in Germany; and there are possibly a very few others in great collections or private hands, but their number is necessarily extremely limited. Books were not turned out by the thousand on paper presses in the early years of 1600.

One authentic example of the Atlas is known to exist in South America, its fortunate owner being Don Eduardo Sburati, of Montevideo, Uruguay, but originally of Turin, Italy. It came into the possession of his family about two hundred and fifty years ago, through marriage with the De Fel, a family of minor nobles of Turin, and since that time, until it took its recent journey to Washington, it has literally never been from under a Sburati roof, it having passed down as an heirloom in that family. It was brought by them to South America about thirty-five years ago, and there can scarcely be room for doubt that under the present regime in Italy it would not have been allowed to leave that country.

Some time ago it was sent to

the National Geographic Society, at Washington, United States of America, for examination and their official certification of its authenticity. They submitted it to the Library of Congress, for the opinion of their experts, who, after due microscopic examination and comparison with their own copies, unqualifiedly pronounced it a genuine authentic Mercator. Señor Sburati has this assurance in writing, over signature of the President of the National Geographic Society. Their pronouncement on such a subject is necessarily cathedra.

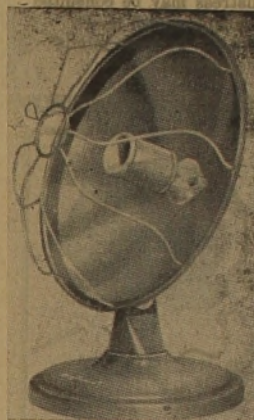
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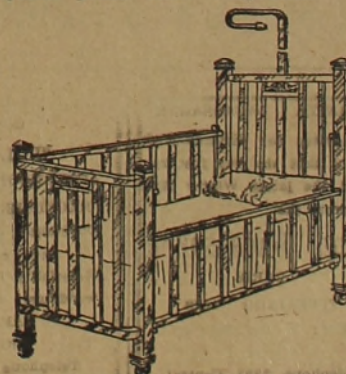

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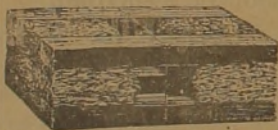


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## DAILYGRAMS.

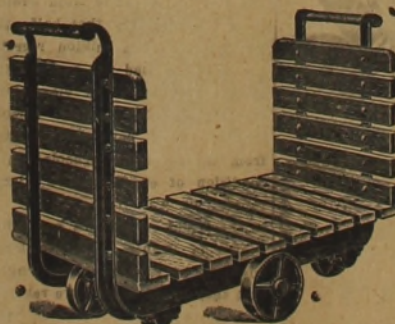
