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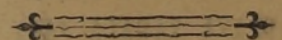

POLITICAL NOTES.

THE SUNDAY REST BILL.

Discussion of the Sunday Rest Bill was resumed by the Deputies on Monday. There was considerable debate over the 1st Article, several Deputies contending that the compulsory closing should not be extended to camp stores. An amendment to this effect was defeated, and eventually the Article was approved in the following form: "Hereby is declared obligatory the cessation of activities on Sundays in all the industrial and commercial establishments of the country, and for the workers specified in the law of Nov. 17, 1915" (viz., the Eight Hours Law). — Article 2, — establishing the Saturday half-holiday — was opposed by Señor Bazet, who said that workpeople would not work nine hours on five days in order to gain four hours on the sixth. They would stick to their 8 hours, and this would lead to a 44 hour week. After a short debate the Article was put to the vote and rejected almost unanimously. With reference to Article 3, which establishes certain exceptions, Señor Cabrera claimed that these should be extended to all farm establishments, as, from the nature of the work, these could not even comply with the 8 Hours Law. The point was under discussion when the Chamber adjourned.

OTHER BUSINESS.

At the opening of the sitting the Secretary reported that a note had been received from the Centre of Transatlantic Shipping Agents, but as it contained expressions lacking in respect to the Deputies, it had been returned.

Approval was given to the Bill conferring powers of expropriation of lands or buildings required for the installation of State Electric Power Houses and their dependencies. This now passes to the Senate.

IMPORTATION OF WHEAT.

Dr. J. de Aréchaga has presented to the Deputies a Bill establishing that the temporary admission of wheat creates the obligation to export, within four months, 70 kilograms of flour for every 100 kilograms of wheat imported, and the right to destine the sub-products to internal consumption. — Dr. Aréchaga explains that the present conditions for the importation of wheat have proved illusory, and there is danger of losing the Brazilian market for flour, as the class consumed there is no longer exported. The local sale of the subproducts (bran and pollard) should be authorised, as these were in great demand by cattle farmers, and their present prices were abnormally high. The current wheat crop, he said, would not yield half that of last year, and unless measures of relief were adopted, this would create a serious situation for farmers and the country generally. —

THE DEPARTMENTAL ASSEMBLY.

Another disorderly sitting of the Departmental Assembly was held on Monday evening, lasting until midnight. Proceedings commenced with a proposal to appoint provisionally the Municipal Fêtes Committee, as Carnival was fast approaching. This was opposed for various reasons, by both the "Batllistas" and the socialists, some claiming that the money should be applied to other purposes, some advocating the downright abolition of Carnival. Señor Otero said the proposal was out of order, and moved that its consideration be deferred to the ordinary sessions. After some debate this motion was put to the vote, receiving 40 votes in favour and 42 against. Señor Russo then discovered that the Colorado Unionist members, whose powers had not yet been approved, had voted against. After some commotion, their votes (five in number) were declared void, and Sr. Otero's motion was accordingly declared carried. — Discussion of the Colorado Union question was then resumed, with the usual result of a disorderly scene, in which the "bar" took part, this continuing until the hour of adjournment. At the close the packed gang of "Batllistas" continued the disorder in the streets, with cries of "Viva Batlle!" and insulting epithets for the nationalists and other non-Batllista members of the Assembly. The police who were present made no effort to preserve order but, on the contrary, seemed to lend encouragement and protection to the disorderly elements.

The British Society.

FORMATION OF ARCHIVES.

One of the objects of the British Society in Uruguay, according to its Statutes, is "To form and keep an archive of records of the British community and its institutions."

In this connection it was suggested by Mrs. E. B. Cooper at the informal meeting of the Society held some weeks ago — and approved by the meeting — that the Society should endeavour to gather in and preserve the records of the Red Cross and other Associations that were formed during the war to help in war work. The mission of these — with the exception of the British Patriotic Fund — is now ended, and the associations are already dissolved or about to be so. All these associations have records in the shape of minute books, letters of authorization and acknowledgement, badges, insignia, emblems, and so forth. These records are of undoubted historic interest as showing the activities of the British community in Uruguay during the great period of trial of the world-war, but they are in danger of being lost or destroyed, as there is no one definitely authorised to collect or preserve them. The British Society, as the representative organization of the community generally, is therefore most obviously indicated to undertake this task.

An appeal is therefore now made to the Presidents or Secretaries of such associations or to any others in possession of such records, not of an essentially personal character, to hand them over to the British Society for arrangement and permanent preservation. To this effect, it is requested that any communications be addressed to the Hon. Secretary of the British Society, Calle 25 de Agosto 410, who will then make the necessary arrangements.

A similar appeal applies to those in the possession of any records of former activities of the community, the preservation of which would be of general interest.

The Day's Cable News.

Resuming Relations.

Diplomatic relations between Britain and Germany will be resumed at once, now that peace has been ratified. Lord Kilmarnock has already left for Berlin where he will be British Chargé d'Affaires, and Germany will appoint a similar official to London. These may be raised to the rank of Ministers later on, but it is not proposed to restore the former Embassies as yet. Both countries will also shortly appoint their consuls-general.

More Treachery Contemplated?

The Berlin newspaper "Die Freiheit" is credited with the assertion that the Chiefs of the "Left" Socialist party and German naval officers are concocting a scheme to sink those German war vessels that have not yet been handed over to the Allies.

Shipwrecks.

The large cargo steamer *Treval*, on her way to Dundee from Calcutta, was sunk during a violent storm in the English Channel on Saturday night. Of the 42 persons on board, 35, including the captain, were drowned. The vessel broke in two and sank.

During the same storm, the French str. *Afrique*, from Bordeaux for Dakar, struck a rock in the Bay of Biscay, and sank after a few hours. Two boat loads of passengers were picked up by the *Ceylan* which stood by, but it is feared many lives have been lost.

Various other shipwrecks have been reported. The storm lasted through Sunday, abating on Monday. Both in England and France the storm did considerable damage on land.

The Return to No mality.

The Berlin "Mittag Zeitung" says, "Let us restore internal order, and then we shall be able to support the hard conditions of peace."

The "Berliner Tageblatt" says, "It is a duty of honour for Germany to comply with the stipulations of the peace treaty, and the sooner that internal order is restored, the sooner may we hope for a pacific revision of the treaty."

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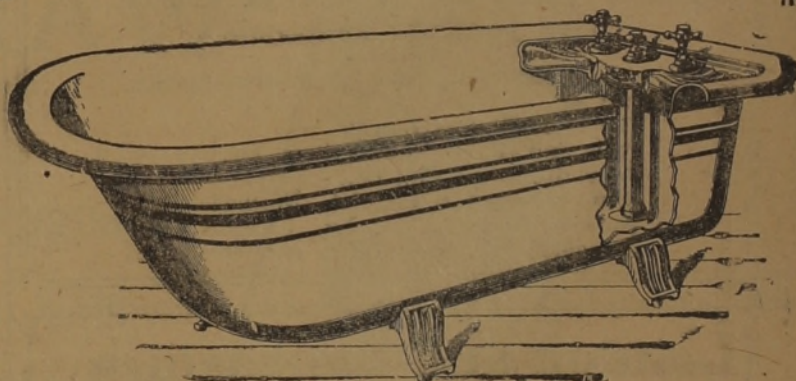

Sir Frederick Mott said that before the war we were mainly concerned with individual and social psychology. But the war developed an acute form of racial psychology which was more particularly manifested in the German "Hymn of Hate." He did not think it would have been possible for the British to have made the same kind of display of their feelings, any more than it would have been possible to have paralleled the practice of German school children pleading for God to "strafe" England. Another psychological development was due to trench warfare. It was a form of so-called shell-shock, in which the shock was not caused by commotion or explosion, but by the prolonged emotional strain. Such cases were contagious. They were functional, and should be treated as such. In his own experiences he had, by the power of suggestion, induced men who had long been dumb from "gassing" to speak. Similarly, he had been successful in getting men to walk who had not been able to use their legs for long periods. Another form which war neurosthenia took was that of dream. He had known soldiers suffering from this neurosthenic affliction walk in their sleep, talk in their sleep, throw bombs in their sleep, and conduct themselves as though engaged in actual warfare, and yet remember absolutely nothing of it all after awakening. All these forms of suffering were amenable to the treatment of the neurologist. In fact, there was not a single form of nervous disease which could not be so treated, but the victims should be impressed with the conviction that their cure was certain. Unfortunately, they were often so influenced by their treatment and environment that they were tempted to despair of recovery.

Items of Interest

What Becomes of Carnival?

That wonderful body the Departmental Assembly has decided to defer consideration of the appointment of a Fetes Committee until — after Carnival. The Chambers, as usual, have voted a substantial sum for illuminations, decorations, prizes, and so forth, but there is no Committee to control its application or to make any of the necessary arrangements. This is something without precedent. On various occasions the celebration of Carnival has been more or less botched through dilatoriness in voting the funds or naming the Committee, but the idea of leaving the naming of the Committee until after the date is something quite new — one scarcely knows how to qualify it. Unless some way is found out of the muddle, it looks as if there will be no Carnival. If this is the way the Departmental Assembly is going to look after municipal interests, the sooner we go back to the old state of affairs, the better.

Visitors on their Way.

According to a telegram from Ottawa, the Canadian Prime Minister, Sir Henry Borden, and Admiral Jellicoe have left Cuba on their way to Montevideo and Buenos Aires.

The Chauffeurs' Strike.

The strike of taximetre chauffeurs continued yesterday, and they are endeavouring to induce the private chauffeurs to join them. So far as can be made out, they demand complete impunity for their own misdeeds of overcharging and excessive speed, and punishment for the public who resist them. It is to be hoped they will not get it. The taximetre service in this city is one of the dearest in the world, the complaints of accidents from reckless driving are constant, and it is more than

time that the chauffeurs were reduced to reason, even if the city has to do without taximetres for six months.

Elderly Murderer.

On Monday evening, at Villa del Cerro, a labourer named Jose Acevedo, aged about 72, stabbed to death the woman Bibiana Paula, aged 60, and afterwards made an unsuccessful attempt to cut his own throat. The two had been living together as man and wife for several years, but lately Acevedo has developed idle and drunken habits, on which account Paula abandoned him to live with a married daughter, and this so enraged him that he killed her. This tragedy in low life has several sordid details which we will not inflict on our readers.

"Why Not Work?"

WISE WORDS FROM HENRY FORD.

Mr Henry Ford, the famous Motor Car maker, conducts a column in his own paper, "The Dearborn Independent." In a recent issue he states his views with regard to the after-war problem of industrial unrest. Although an employer he has set a very high standard of labour conditions in his works and, with many of our business men in Canada, holds that high wages, together with increased production, will carry the war-weary nations safely through their economic difficulties.

"Americans have a very important lesson to learn from the disappointment which the English people felt upon hearing Lloyd George's reconstruction speech," says Mr. Ford.

"This man had so marvellously led them through all the emergencies of war, had met with such conquering initiative all the sudden and fatal problems which were thrust upon him, that when it came to the great task of reconstructing the life of the nation the people expected that he would open a magic box and announce a new formula of progress.

"Of course he could not do that. No man could. All that Lloyd George had to tell the British people, and all that any sound leader can tell his people, is simply this: the only magic we can rely upon in these times is Work. The only reconstruction force is Work. The only cure for the troubles that are vexing the United States to day is Work.

SOME REMEDY OUTSIDE OURSELVES.

"We of the United States are in very much the same position as the people of Great Britain, at least in our 'expectancy' of some remedy outside of our individual responsibility

may be found for the high cost of living, the scarcity of houses, the decreased supply of raw materials, and all the other hindrances to a full and free development of our energies and industries.

"Some people have advised a wholesale reduction of wages. But that will not do it either—unless you mean by 'prices' a criminal profiteering in the necessities of life. All high prices are not profiteering. Indeed, good prices is one of the signs and proofs of good times all round. Some people have advised the utter destruction of our present methods and the adoption of strange schemes which have never worked and never will, at least as long as human nature remains what it is.

"Indeed, the air is full of counsel to-day, inconsistent, confusing, impracticable; and every doctrine which in ordinary times would be thrust aside as preposterous is nowadays seriously considered as if it were a neglected pearl of wisdom.

"Now, the whole trouble to-day is just a lack of things to use: A shortage of food to eat; a shortage of houses to live in; a scarcity of coal; a shortage of materials which may be worked up into articles of use and commerce; a scarcity of almost anything you care to name. And what is the remedy for any shortage of articles that can be made by the hands of man? Why, the answer is so simple that it seems frivolous even to make it. And yet in that answer lies all that the United States and the world needs to know for reconstruction. The answer is this: The labour of man can fill up any lack of those things which the labour of man produces.

believe that Work is a patriotic duty, now as it was during the war. There is no scarcity of labour. There is only a slump in the productiveness of labour. Even for the higher wages, which it has a right to receive, labour is not producing as much as it did for lower wages. It would be easy just at this point to steer this discussion off into side issues. Any number of matters may be brought up, principally questions of past industrial dispute.

"We used to say, 'Work will win the war.' Well, it is true now that Work will save the country. Wages must be kept as high as possible. In many branches of industry wages ought to be increased forthwith. It is utterly foolish to think that a reduction of wages would be followed by a reduction of prices, because only an increase in production can bring a decrease in prices, and a reduction of wages is one of the surest methods of preventing an increase in production.

PAY MEN TO WORK.

"Men must be paid to work, they must be stimulated to work, and more than that they must be shown that to-day the country's whole welfare rests on their working. Men will not work with a will if they believe that all their effort is merely going to increase the dividends of idle stockholders or the private fortunes of men already too rich for the good of society. But would they not work with a will if they knew that the country depended on their production?"

"This appeal to patriotism cuts both ways. The employer who puts a damper on production by talking as if his employees and never himself should bear the burden of cuts in prices is not a patriot. His duty is to stimulate production, and the one way this can be done is to make it well worth while for the producer.

IDLENESS BRINGS BURDENS.

"The working man himself must get rid of some very dangerous notions — dangerous, that is, to the welfare of the country. It is sometimes said that the less a worker does the more jobs he creates for other men. The fallacy is that it assumes that idleness is creative. Idleness never created a job. It always creates burdens and only burdens. The industrious man never runs his fellow-worker out of a job; indeed, it is the industrious man who is partner of the industrious manager who creates more and more business and therefore more and more jobs.

"We cannot play fast and loose with economic laws, because if we do they mishandle us in very hard ways. It is a fact in the United States at this time that, man for man, we are not producing what we did for several years previous to the war, not to mention the speed-up of production that occurred during the war. This may be partly accounted for by the natural relaxation which follows a long period of strain.

But the relaxation has lasted pretty long now, so long that the United States is more pinched regarding supplies and prices to-day than it was at the height of the war scarcity.

THE CAUSE AND THE CURE.

"Why should we be suffering more now than we did then? Simply because we are not making enough of the articles of livelihood, that is why. And the remedy for scarcity is equally simple; it may be given in one word — Production. And production itself may be reduced to a still simpler word — Work. And there you have the cause and the cure of a situation which has startled every man by its acuteness."
