The above figures confirm the statement made at the outset that the falling off in the exportation in 1889 was due to the bad seasons, the harvests being spoiled by rain, and the live stock produce being depreciated by the poor state of the camp, as well as from actual losses from disease and floods.

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Parliament.

In the Chamber of Senators, on Wednesday, Sr. Carlos Castro made a speech referring to the loss sustained by the death of their colleague Dr. Manuel Herrera y Obes. He said "To make a proper eulogy to the memory of this meritorious citizen would be impossible in a short space or a few words; it would be necessary to write volumes, reviewing the history of the country for 50 years, noting year by year the great and important services he lent the country, in legislation, in politics, in education, and in everything concerning the national activity..... In any people of the universe the title of Father of the Country would be decreed to such a man as Dr. Herrera and a monument would be raised to perpetuate his memory in a visible form and to express the National gratitude. As in our extraordinary sessions we cannot take other resolutions than those mentioned in the programme, I will confine myself to the following propositions:—To authorise the President of this Chamber to pass a note of condolence to the widow and sons of Dr. Herrera; for the Senators to attend the funeral in body, and to deposit a funeral wreath upon the tomb, and lastly to express the wish, as soon as the ordinary sessions recommence, to continue the pension Dr. Herrera enjoyed by the law of 1881 to his widow."

Sr. Torres proposed that the President of the Chamber should pronounce an oration at the funeral.

Sr. Freire pointed out that the motion of Sr. Castro had partly been anticipated by the Permanent Commission. After some few further remarks the propositions above named were voted unanimously. The sitting then concluded.

The Permanent Commission also held a sitting on Wednesday afternoon, when it was resolved to accord to the late Dr. Manuel Herrera y Obes the funeral honours due to a Minister of State, to pass a letter of condolence to his family, and to ask the Executive to include in the subjects of the extraordinary sessions a bill granting a pension to his widow.
