AN ABUSE.

We have to call attention to what certainly seems a monstrous abuse on the part of the maritime authorities of the port. Which of them is exactly responsible we do not know, therefore we use the general term.

The Pacific Steam Navigation Company's R. M. S. «John Elder» arrived here from Europe and the Brazils on Wednesday, the 15th instant, and as usual anchored in the outer roads, awaiting the medical visit before she could land or receive passengers or send her mails on shore. But the weather was rather rough, and the Port Doctor would not go off to her. The rough weather continued on Thursday, and the Doctor still refused to give her the visit. But strange to say, on Thursday the Royal Mail Steamer «Magdalena» came up from Buenos Aires, thereby being exempted from health visit, was met by the Company's agent in a steam tug, several passengers, including ladies, sent on board of her, and she was duly despatched on her homeward voyage without losing an hour. These two steamers were anchored within a pistol shot of one another, yet the «John Elder» had to wait until yesterday morning, a delay of some 60 hours, before she was visited and could transact her business. Now it stands to reason that if the weather was not too rough for the Company's agent and lady passengers to go off to the «Magdalena» it must have been fine enough for the Port Doctor, a man paid to make some sacrifices, to visit the «John Elder» moored almost alongside. Yet the fact remains that he would not do so, and on account of this laziness, caprice, favoritism or whatever it may be, the Pacific Company is put to a severe loss, and the passengers and mails to a most unjustifiable delay.

Such a thing as this is a really serious matter, affecting directly and indirectly the interests of many hundreds of persons, in all parts, and yet it is not a solitary example. As already said, we do not know exactly who is responsible, probably, according to the loose manner in which business is conducted here, the responsibility will be shifted from one person to another until it finally devolves upon the office cat. But in any case it is time public attention was called to it, and perhaps some day the complaint will reach the proper ear, and an enquiry be instituted.

The English Opera Company.

The long expected day for the debut of the English Opera Company has at length arrived, and this evening we hope to see the Solis Theatre crowded with an audience representing the entire English speaking colony, man, woman and child, without exception. Mr. Edwin Cleary, the impresario has done a very plucky thing in bringing so expensive and complete a company such a distance, and still more in such troublous times. The least we can do then is to turn out in our fullest numbers and give to him and his hardworking artists a thoroughly English welcome. It is now some six years since an English Company has visited this city, and never before have we had an English Opera Company of recognised artists, playing the best pieces of the English repertoire in a style equal to that of a first class London Theatre.

The opening piece is Gilbert and Sullivan's charming fantastical operetta «The Mikado», originally produced at the Savoy Theatre, London, in 1885, since when it has travelled round the world, even to Japan itself, with the most unequivocal success. Under such circumstances neither plot nor music need recommendation or explanation at our hands. Miss Leonora Braham will appear as Yum-Yum, the part she created so successfully at the Savoy, whilst other parts will be taken by Messrs. J. Wilkinson (who succeeded Grossmith), G. W. Marnock, L. Cadwalader, W. Brown and other artists, all of Savoy reputation. Two ballets will be given by the Misses Vivian, Lupino, Holland and Sismondi. The scenery of this opera, by Mr. W. Durant, and the dresses by Samuel May, are something to dream about.

—The long delayed mails by the «John Elder» should be delivered this morning.

—The Tribuna says that it is intended to reform the police service, giving them a military organisation and arming them with remingtons. We hope our contemporary is misinformed. This would indeed be another step backwards, and an imitation of one of the worst features of the fateful reign of Celman.

—The Senate was again in secret session yesterday. There is an old prejudice which confounds secrecy with shame. Old prejudices are sometimes right.

—Elvira Martínez de Dastres, the widow of the man who was murdered in calle Liniers in May 1889, died yesterday in the prison ward of the Caridad Hospital, from cancer. As will be remembered, she was accused of complicity in the murder, and the Public Prosecutor asked for a sentence of 25 years imprisonment upon her.

—Fourteen persons belonging to the family of Christalbal Irisirri, a humble gardener living in the Cerro of Victoria, had a narrow escape from poisoning on Thursday through eating *pachero* made from «tired» meat. Fortunately, prompt medical assistance soon put them out of danger. The police are now looking for the butcher who sold the meat, which was bought in the Central Market.

Argentine Republic

Finance.

On Tuesday the Executive sent a message to Congress with the following bill:—

Art. 1. In case any province should be unable to meet the service of its foreign

debt, the Executive Power is hereby authorized to take charge of the same after an agreement with the provincial Government.

Art. 2. All the banks, public works, national bonds, or other securities arising from these foreign loans shall belong to the nation.

Art. 3. In case the nation should take over the foreign loan of any province, the National Government shall negotiate with the holders of the provincial bonds for their conversion into National bonds of 4 1/2 per cent interest and one per cent accumulative amortization at par. The National Government is hereby authorized to issue the necessary amount of such bonds for the purposes of the conversion.

Art. 4. Henceforward no province nor municipality shall have power to contract loans abroad. Should, however, any such foreign loans be contracted they shall not have the responsibility of the nation, nor shall any negotiations in that respect be entertained by the National Government.

Art. 5. The National Executive shall inform Congress next session of the use it has made of this law.

The message accompanying the bill declares that the question of the provincial loans is a serious and urgent one, and that, although the Nation is not legally or morally responsible for the loans, it is necessary for the sake of maintaining Argentine credit abroad that the Nation should take upon itself the service of the loans, but that, as transactions of this kind compromise the credit of the country and might lead to a serious disaster, it is necessary to declare positively and publicly that the Nation will not again sanction any foreign loans to the provinces or the municipalities.

—The performance at the Politeama this evening consists of the operetta «La Fiesta de Piedrogita», produced on a grand scale, for the first time here.

—Nothing official has yet transpired about the secret sessions of the Chambers which were held in such a hurry earlier in the week, and yesterday's papers were ominously silent with regard to them, but not with regard to the proposed increase in export and import duties. The *Razon* of yesterday morning has a noteworthy article which commences as follows:—«Insensiblemente, impelled by events from day to day, we have to come to place ourselves in the field of opposition, without preconceived propositions to impose difficulties in the way of the Government, without responding to partisan plans, foreign to all personal ambition or interest, but rather delaying the act to considerations of a superior order which move us to fight against a government candidate of which we sustained, independent of all passion, as a pledge of reparation for former disorders and the re-establishment of healthy republicanism.» We regret we cannot give more of this article, which is serious and well considered. Unless things take a decided turn for the better, the *Razon* will not long stand alone in its attitude.

—The Chamber of Deputies has passed the bill relating to the penal interest to be charged by the Hypothecary Bank; also a resolution asking the E. P. to annul the decree prohibiting the public employees from taking part in electoral operations, and the bill restoring to the budget the item for the maintenance of the old gaol guard, now added to the police.

The Senate sanctioned the bills relating to the register of foreigners and the electoral register.

The E. P. has issued a decree, making regulations for the preparation of the new Electoral Register.

TRUTH AND FALSEHOOD.

It is an economical habit of traveling Japs to get a large amount of washing thus accomplished by a steamboat excursion, and has given rise to the story that once a year they travel to wash. They have no instinct for laundry work like the Chinese, and think it is complete when the soap is on the garment, and will not wring it out.
