The British bark Queen of the Bay which arrived here on Monday, from Rio Janeiro, and is consigned to Messrs. Erford and Bugge, has two sick men among the crew, and another died on board from yellow fever while the ship was at Rio. The ship has therefore been placed in strict quarantine.

A decree has been issued for suspending the works on the Madero port for two years from the end of March next. The Government will have to pay Messrs Madero the compensation fixed by the agreement of 31st May last; that is to say, the expenses of preservation of the works and interest on the capital invested in materials. During the three months the contractors will have to finish the warehouse of the dock N. 1, the railways in No. 4, the earthworks, hydraulic machinery, dredging the Riachuelo and removal of the rubbish of the North wall of the entrance Canal and the excavation of the North Basin.—B.A. Herald.

LONDON NOTES

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 26.

Last night's report was that Prince George of Wales had passed a good day, and that his strength was well maintained.

The Marquis of Salisbury and Mr. Chamberlain were entertained at luncheon yesterday by the Conservatives of Birmingham in the Town Hall. The Premier, referring to the action of the Dissenters, said the Government had received a measure of unstinted support from that body that was new to Parliamentary history, and augured well for the action of parties in the country in the future. Mr. Chamberlain, in proposing the toast of the "Unionist Cause," said that when the Liberal party were first divided he had looked forward to a speedy reunion. Since that time the gulf between them had deepened and widened, and he now neither looked for nor desired reunion.

Mr. Labouchere, M. P., in a speech at Dorchester last night, referred to the division of the Unionists at Birmingham, and in answer to criticisms of the manner in which the Newcastle programme was being supported. Was the publican, he asked, voting Tory out of regard for the Church? Was the person voting Tory out of regard for the potherhouse? And were they both voting Tory because they disapproved of Home Rule? Mr. Labouchere went on to refer to the House of Lords as the home of hereditary angels, and remarking that these angels were to reverse the verdict of the country, predicted for them the doom which Milton said awaited rebellious angels. After allusions to Mr. Chamberlain's old age pension scheme and doctrine of ransom, Mr. Labouchere advocated drastic measures next Session to ensure a dissolution during the year.

A Correspondent at Bridgwater gives an account of the great and representative meeting held yesterday in reference to the Somersetshire floods. The Earl of Cork, as Lord-Lieutenant of the county, presided, and it was made abundantly clear that a considerable sum will be needed to relieve the distress which has been caused.

The Bishop of Carlisle, Dr. Goodwin, died yesterday afternoon from heart disease in the Palace, Bishops-thorpe, the official residence of the Archbishop of York.

The Rev. G. S. Barrett, of Norwich, has been appointed secretary of the Congregational Union of England and Wales.

Mr. Wilson, of the Seamen's and Firemen's Union, was again called before the Labour Commission yesterday, and was under examination during the whole of the sitting.

On the closing day of the Warwick Meeting the Selling Hurdle Race was won by Gules, the Castle Hurdle Handicap by Quack, the Avon Nursery Handicap by Miss Halle, the Hunters' Flat Selling Plate by Stourside, the Midland Counties Handicap by Greenwich, the Leamington Walter Plate by Mamosa, and the Mile Maiden Plate by Zao.

Dealing yesterday with the remarkable paternity case of the Queen v. Rourke, the Court of Appeal announced their intention in effect to support the decision of the Divisional Court giving Rourke the custody of the children. Final judgment, however, would stand over for a week to afford Rourke an opportunity for making arrangements for the education and proper care of the children.

Charles Grande, the Dane described as the King of Blackmailers, who had been found guilty of sending a threatening letter to Mrs. Baldock, and of being in possession of forged cheques, was again brought up at the Central Criminal Court. He was allowed to make a long statement. When he had finished, Mr. Justice Hawkins passed sentence—twenty years' penal servitude for sending the letter, and seven years for being in possession of the forged documents the terms to run concurrently. There was a violent scene before the removal of the prisoner.

Jonadab Finch, secretary to the Orphan Working School at Haverstock-hill, and the Alexandra Grpbanage for Infants at Hornsey-rose, was committed to custody at the Mansion House on a charge of stealing about 900l. belonging to the boards of governors of these charities. The prisoner had written admitting misapplying about 592l., and imploring consideration on the ground of long service and mental anxiety caused by illness and death in his family.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 27.

Mr. A. J. Balfour delivered his Rectorial address at the Glasgow University yesterday, taking "Progress" as his subject. In the evening he was entertained at a banquet given in his honour by the University Council.

Addressing a crowded meeting of Liberals at Ramsbottom, Lancashire, last night, Lord Spencer argued at length upon the importance and feasibility of the Newcastle Programme, and denied the Tory insinuation that Home Rule for Ireland as desired by the Liberal party meant the separation of that country from England.

Mr. Lockwood, Q.C., M.P., presided over the forty-sixth anniversary dinner in aid of the Royal General Theatrical Fund, held last evening at the Hotel Metropole. Mr. Bancroft, Mr. John Hare, Mr. Lionel Brough, Mr. Pope, Q.C., and Mr. J. C. Parkinson were among those who spoke to the several toasts.

The London School Board election was held yesterday. In none of the eleven divisions, however, did the polling arouse any great enthusiasm, and in some the voting is reported to have been light. The counting takes place this morning.

In further evidence before the Labour Commission yesterday, Mr. J. H. Wilson declared that the Seamen's and Firemen's Union would be prepared to adopt tactics to bring shipowners and seamen into greater harmony.

A statement is published by a Berlin newspaper that General von Caprivi, the German Chancellor, will shortly hand in his resignation, being tired of public life. A Correspondent states that the assertion, made as it is by a Conservative organ, signifies nothing but the disappointment of that party upon finding that Prince Bismarck's retirement has had no effect in increasing their influence.

Racing was begun at Manchester yesterday, in wintry weather. Rain, hail, and snow fell in the morning, and showers alternated with sunshine while the programme was being carried out. The Lancaster Nursery Handicap was secured by The Pix, the Thursday Plate by Craignish, the County Welter Walter Handicap by Detective, the De Trafford Plate by Yorkshirman, and the Rothschild Plate by The Rejected. There were two dead-heats, Day Dawn and Clever Alice coming in together for the Flying Welter Handicap, and Dulverton and Capucin for the Cuedon Plate. In both cases the stakes were divided.

Probate duty has been paid on 1,440,889l. 3s. 11d. as the value of the personal estate of the late Duke of Cleveland.

In the Queen's Bench Division, Mr. Thurgood, the father of a boy of seven who had been severely bitten by three mastiffs, obtained judgment for 15l. with costs on the higher scale, as compensation from the Rev. Father Drew, a Roman Catholic priest, and schoolmaster at Millwall, the owner of the dogs.

An application arising out of the recent jewellery case brought by Mrs. Hargreave against Messrs. Spink and Sons, a City firm, was made in the Queen's Bench Division yesterday. An action for slander had been commenced against Mrs. Hargreave by a lady who was said to have been referred to at the trial, and a motion for a writ of attachment was now made against Mr. Ames, the publisher of a paper, for contempt of court in respect to certain paragraphs. The matter, however, was allowed to drop on Mr. Ames undertaking to publish an apology and pay Mrs. Hargreave's costs.

The singular case of Phillips v. Williamson, in which there was on the one hand a claim by a lady against her sister and the sister's husband for money and goods and their alleged wrongful detention, and on the other a counter claim for money alleged to be due from the plaintiff, resulted yesterday, after a trial of three days in the Queen's Bench Division, in the withdrawal of the serious charge against the defendants and agreement upon a verdict.

THE MESMERIC SLEEP.

Dr. Calderwood, of Edinburgh, Professor of Moral Philosophy, lecturing the other day on hypnotism, said that it was merely a new name for mesmerism. The condition is one of artificially induced sleep, which is, however, a lucid sleep. As regards the mode of producing the sleep, it is nothing in the nature of electricity or magnetism, and no influence emanated from the body of the operator. The result, he contended, was brought about by the wearing of a single organ or line of nerve. Many people—he thought probably all people—were liable to it, but not against their will. The condition during the mesmeric sleep was torpor, the cataleptic state, or the state of the somnambulist. He warned his audience against being mesmerised at all.

A TRULY WONDERFUL STORY OF SURGERY.

A truly wonderful case has just been placed on record by a surgeon. A boy was shot with a revolver, the bullet entering the forehead, just above the left eye, and he was believed to have been killed. However, the surgeon on being summoned probed the wound and detected plainly the presence of the bullet. As soon as the latter was touched it could be felt to move backwards. This was followed by a twitching of the limbs, respiration and signs generally of returning life. The third day afterwards the boy became conscious, but he had no recollection of what had happened. Within three months he was able to be up, and some paralitic

symptoms which had resulted from the accident had to a large extent disappeared. Before the injury he had been able to read, write, and do ordinary sums in arithmetic, but on recovery he had lost all recollection of the alphabet, and had to learn it over again. Remarkable, however, as it may seem, his capacity for calculation had increased tenfold. Ultimately he made a perfect recovery, his health being completely restored. He lived for nine years and a half with the bullet thus lodged in his brain, and then died in consequence of a blow received on the opposite side of his head to that of the original accident. On examination after death the bullet was found embedded in his brain.—Manchester Guardian.
