Local Government Bill would be taken on Monday the 14th inst. Lord Edmond Fitzmaurice took the oath and his seat for the Cricklade Division. The Light Dues Bill was introduced by Mr. Ritchie and read a first time, and Mr. J. Collings brought in a measure to make a slight amendment in the Metropolitan Police Courts Act of last Session. In Committee of Supply further discussion took place on the constitution of the Army.

A telegram from Yokohama states that it is reported there that Deer Island, off the treaty port of Fusan, has been leased to Russia by the Korean Government.

A Correspondent in the Sudan telegraphs that the British brigade is now within twenty-four miles of Berber. The rumours of an impending Dervish advance on the Atbara post gain in weight, but he believes that nothing more serious than extensive raiding is contemplated.

Yesterday one of the two men who attempted to assassinate King George on Saturday gave himself up to the Athens police, after his identity and whereabouts had become known. He is employed at the Town Hall, and is known as a man of violent passions and of Anarchist tendencies. He refuses to name his confederate, and expresses regret that the attempt was not successful. The police have also discovered a dynamite bomb near the scene of the attack on the King, and it is believed that the man captured is a member of a secret society formed with the object of murdering the monarch.

Lord Salisbury is laid up at Hatfield with a mild attack of influenza. Yesterday he was reported to be "doing very well."

Addressing a meeting held in Brighton last evening in connection with the annual meeting of the Home Counties Liberal Association, Lord Herschell said he was a Home Ruler and was not ashamed of it, but he did not think the present state of things in Ireland would convince the British public that the Irish were anxious for it. Two reforms would have to be pressed: one man one vote and the reform of the House of Lords. There never was such a preposterous House of Lords in the Constitution. It would pass to-day at the instance of one statesman a measure it would reject from another tomorrow. He was hopeful as to the leadership of the Liberal Party.

Speaking at Bermondsey Town Hall last night on the position of the London County Council, Mr. Ritchie said he would not attempt to depreciate the Council that was the authority for carrying out local affairs in London. It was, in his opinion, the right body to control all central matters, and it had done since its institution a great deal of good work. But the procedure of one section required change; and he was convinced that the policy pursued by the Progressive party would end in smashing local government. The object of the Government in their new Bill was not to diminish the prestige or power of the Council, but to increase the dignity and importance of municipal life.

The inaugural gathering of what promises to be a very popular annual festival was held at the City Temple last evening, when that place of worship was crowded with residents of London Welshmen, in celebration of St. David's Eve. For some years past St. Paul's Cathedral has been placed at the disposal of the Episcopal section of London Welshmen for a similar purpose, and the popularity of those gatherings induced some of the leading Welsh Nonconformists of London to attempt something on the same lines, but appealing more directly to the Free Church communities. Hundreds of persons had to be refused admission owing to the crush inside the building.

Sir H. Fletcher, M. P., presiding at the winter assembly of the National Rifle Association held yesterday at the Royal United Service Institution, announced that the annual meeting of the Association at Bisley would commence on the 11th of July.

Yesterday afternoon a meeting of the members of the Marylebone Cricket Club was held at Queen's Hall, Langham place, at which Mr. F. E. Lacey was unanimously elected Secretary of the Club, in succession to Mr. Henry Perkins, resigned.

The final test match between England and Australia was resumed yesterday at Sydney. The English innings closed for 335, Druce made 64. The Australians

In the Divorce Court, yesterday, Sir Francis Jeune had before him a case which he described as painful and revolting. Mrs. Margaret Jones sought a divorce from her husband, stated to be a Baptist minister, and to be now living with another woman. The petitioner declared that she was systematically starved by her husband, who also sold her clothes, and suggested that she should gain a living by immorality. There was no defence, and a decree nisi with costs and the custody of the child was pronounced.

Annie Northover was yesterday committed for trial by the magistrate at the Marlborough-street Police-court on a charge of bigamy. Her solicitor read a statement made by her in which she alleged that her wrong doing was due to her husband's cruelty, and she hoped that with the gentleman, said to be an officer in the army, whom she had in the second instance married she would have a chance of leading a happy life.

The annual meeting of the Grosvenor Hotel Company was held yesterday at the hotel. Mr. E. J. Newitt, who presided, proposed the adoption of the report, and intimated that he wished to retire from the board of directors and from the company. With regard to the recent verdict he looked to a new trial for the opportunity of vindicating his character. Mr. Kimber, M. P., proposed an amendment calling upon the directors to resign and appointing a committee of management. The chairman declined to accept the amendment. The resolution for the adoption of the report was lost, only four persons voting in its favour. Ultimately, after the chairman had retired, a motion by Mr. Kimber for the appointment of a committee of management was agreed to.
