—The latest number of the *Crunch* has a most interesting account of the wreck of the "John Elder," the result of an interview with various members of the Cleary Company.

—The B. A. Herald says: "We have carefully examined all the principal English newspapers to discover the origin of the remarkable and unfeeling telegram, dated London, January 15th, which stated that a marriage had been arranged between Prince George of Wales and the Princess Victoria of Teck and we have not found even a suggestion of the kind in any paper. This is another proof of the necessity of caution in appreciating the value of telegrams, which are often concocted merely to create a sensation and sometimes with base objects."

—There is a very unjust proverb about the difficulty of getting a joke into the head of a Scotchman; if it had been applied to a Spaniard it would have been much more appropriate. Our article of last Saturday, "Wanted, a Public Whitewasher," in which we attempted to be mildly humorous, has been taken *au grand sérieux* by the *Nacion*, which applauds the idea, and thinks it highly desirable that public functionaries charged by the press should be cleared at once. If our article was not amusing, this certainly is. Still, it is evidently dangerous to attempt to be funny when foreign readers are in question, and therefore we will not try the experiment too often.

—Government has contributed \$500 to the agricultural and livestock show to be held in the department of Soriano, initiated by the Jefe Politico, Colonel Camp.

—The Municipality has decided in favour of changing the name of Calle Antigua Maldonado to that of Calle Coronel Brandzen, and the new plates will be placed on the street corners as soon as they are ready. Fortunately, the street is chiefly one of private residences, so the change will cause less inconvenience than if it were occupied by places of business.

—The scare of Saturday was not without its comic incidents. The performance at the Politeama was suspended and in the confusion and alarm within, Zombo the elephant escaped into the street, and took a walk on his own account. The "vigilante" at the corner tried to arrest him to no avail, but he finally yielded to the soft persuasions of his keeper and returned after giving an expressive snort of disdain at the proceedings around him. Zombo would have made a fine target for artillery practice. He will be on view at the Politeama this evening and tomorrow for the last time, the circus season then coming to an end. The Water Pavilion will be repeated each evening.

—With great regret we saw published in the usually respectable *Razon*, yesterday afternoon, a letter full of the grossest and most insulting personalities towards members of the staff of *La Epoca*, mentioning them by name. This is a transgression of all rules of decent journalism in any civilised country and cannot be excused by any difference of politics or opinions. We are really sorry to see a journal of the standing of the *Razon* descend to this level, and trust it was an accidental slip which it will not allow to occur again, unless it desires to forfeit the respect and good opinion of its readers. There are quite enough scurrilous journals here, without it being added to the number.

—General Roca, the Argentine statesman and ex-president, perhaps future president as well, arrived here in the "Eolo" on Sunday morning. He landed in the long-boat of the Marine Commandancy, and was met by the Argentine Minister Dr. Moreno, who took him to the Legation. We believe he paid his respects to President Herrera yesterday afternoon. We understand he will remain here, with his family, until the end of next week.

—Dr. Sarachaga, Judge of Commerce, has been suspended by the Superior Tribunal, pending the enquiry into serious charges of corruption made against him in the correspondence in the *Jefferies-Requena* case, which has lately occupied our contemporaries. Dr. José L. Vila is temporarily appointed in his place.

—We hear that Col. Martinez and Mayor Debali were released from arrest yesterday afternoon!

—The national and foreign men of war in port yesterday flew their bunting to mark the anniversary of George Washington's birthday.

—The promised regatta at Pocitos on Sunday afternoon were spoilt by the rough sea, and the concert in the evening was suspended on account of the rain.

BUENOS AIRES

—The directors' report of the Catalinas Dock Company has been published for the year 1891. The total receipts amounted to \$247,140 and the expenses to \$160,101. The interest on the loan and the interest and fines of the debt to the Hypothecary Bank represent \$1,007,804, but there was a balance in hand of profits from the previous year of \$563,728, and the deficit has been taken from Reserve Fund, which is reduced to \$922,904.

—The Argentine cruiser 25 de Mayo has returned to port from the South Coast where she surprised three vessels loading guano, etc., one of which loaded with guano and skins arrived in port yesterday under the command of Lieutenant Diego Garcia, the other two were in charge of Lieutenants Thorne and Macarelo, the value of the prizes is calculated at \$8000. In Montevideo there are other two vessels detained by orders of the Argentine Legation

which had loaded guano on the coast.

—Don Pedro Labague, one of the most prominent of our merchants, has died. Sr. Labague, in addition to being a merchant, was a considerable carpenter, at Blanca Grande, department of Olavaria.

—The Bank of the Nation is issuing notes of less than a dollar, without the intervention of the "Conversion Office," the directors of which contend that the Bank's action is illegal and claims the right to intervene in all the issues of bank notes made in the country.

—Sr. Lecano, the owner of the National Theatre, is building at the corner of Calle Rivadavia and Lima a pretty theatre, to be called the *Savoy*, capable of seating about 1200 people, or half the size of the National Theatre. It is designed for comic opera, and is a cosy, pretty, moderate-sized theatre. It will be opened in September of this year with a first-class English Opera Company.

—Advices from Entre Rios say that Mr. Adolfo Roth representative of Baron Hirsch has purchased recently over 20 leagues of camp in various departments of the province on the Uruguay Coast, paying from \$5 to \$7000 per league, he is in treaty for 40 leagues more and is authorized to purchase up to 100 leagues, 2000 colonists are expected daily. The land purchased by Mr. Roth for \$70000 per league, which we mentioned yesterday is situated in the department of Colon and belonging to Don Antonio Garcia, the extent is 5 leagues; the cattle were also purchased at \$35 m/n per head.—B. A. Herald.

—An awful crime was perpetrated a few days since in the church at Tucuman. While a woman was kneeling in prayer near the altar a man sprang at her from behind the pulpit with a knife and cut her fatally about the throat; he then plunged the knife into her side, leaving it in the wound, and fled, but was caught a few yards from the church.

—Letters from London by the last mail announce a decidedly favourable impression in that market in regard to the River Plate, and state that a strong effort will be made by a powerful syndicate to take up many valuable concessions which the crisis had almost steeped in oblivion. This is very comforting. We gather, however, from the same sources of information that, until the finances of Argentina be put on a sound footing—a consummation devoutly to be wished—no new concessions, however sure or enticing, will be even looked at.

—The Tomba company of the Politeama and that of the Comedia Theatre will take part in a grand performance for the benefit of Mr. Edwin Cleary, at the National Theatre, on Wednesday next. The programme will be of an international character, and very attractive.—B. A. Standard.

According to the agreement with the River Plate Trust, Loan, and Agency Company, Limited, referred to in the prospectus, that company undertook the administration and management of the trust, the expenses incident thereto, and the remuneration to the trustees, for the annual payment of 1/2 per cent. on the capital employed, which (except as to actual disbursements) is only payable out of the surplus profits after payment of a dividend of 5 per cent. on the deferred stock. As the profit for the year will not admit of such a dividend, the River Plate Trust, Loan, and Agency Company, Limited, will only receive their actual disbursements, viz., £75. 9s. 10d., which thus constitute the whole expenses of the year. The sum of £4,879 18s. 1d., being profit on realisation of securities and commission earned, has been placed to reserve fund, raising it to £16,513. 4s. 4d. The investments stand in the company's books at cost price, but their realisable value has been seriously affected by the recent general depreciation in all classes of securities, especially those connected with South America. The trustees are not in a position at present to estimate to what extent this depreciation is permanent, and consequently they do not recommend that the question of adjustment of capital should be now dealt with. It is a distinguishing feature of this company that it has no debenture debt. A list of the company's investments is open to the inspection of shareholders on application at the office of the company."

—Yesterday the B. Aires branch of the English Bank of the R. P., in liquidation, commenced paying a third dividend of 10 % to its depositors, making 30 % in all. We believe that the indebtedness of the branch is now reduced to some \$400,000 gold. The liquidation there is proceeding much faster and more satisfactorily than that here, where the depositors have not received any dividend at all as yet, though it is now five months since the notes were converted.

—We regret to note the death, which occurred on Sunday, of the well-known *barraquero* Sr. Santiago Queirolo, of this market.

—Exchange upon London was quoted in Rio Janeiro yesterday at 11 3/4-7/8 d. per milreis.

—Gold opened in B. Aires yesterday at 349.61 and closed at 354.53.

—The "Eolo" brought on Tuesday from B. Aires \$2000 to B. Tejada, \$5000 to London Bank.—The "Labrador" brought from Fray Bentos \$24.30 to E. Julia.
