LONDON NOTES

TUESDAY, JUNE 28.
News from the front in Cuba shows that the Americans will have a difficult task to capture Santiago. The city is surrounded by entrenchments, and every hill-lock is fortified. Lines of barbed wire are placed in front of the trenches. The roads leading to Santiago have been pronounced impracticable for heavy siege artillery. The vanguard of the American army is encamped four miles from the city, and in view of the Spanish forces.

M. Brisson has succeeded in forming a Cabinet. A Paris correspondent says it may be called a Ministry of Republican Conservation, and that its chief object will be to combat the influence of the Ralliés and the tendency towards the Right. M. Delcassé succeeds M. Hanotaux as Minister of Foreign Affairs.

A short sitting of the House of Lords was held yesterday, when several measures, including the Poisons Bill, which passed through Committee, were advanced a stage.

In the House of Commons the East India Loan Bill was read a third time. The House afterwards went into Committee to consider the question of authorising the remission of a sum advanced to the Government of Egypt for the prosecution of the campaign in the Sudan. An important statement was made by the Chancellor of the Exchequer. He did not at all anticipate that it would be necessary to maintain the large British force to be employed in the assault on Khartoum for any length of time in that province, but that the Nile would be easily kept open by the gunboat flotilla. If the British Government remitted the loan of 898,000, made in the early part of 1897, Egypt would be able to bear all the contingent cost. He accordingly moved the remission of that amount. Sir William Harcourt protested against the proposal on the ground that it was absolutely ungrounded finance. It was, however, carried by a majority of 74. A motion to send the Evidence in Criminal Cases Bill to a Select Committee was defeated.

As representing the men on strike in the South Wales Colliery districts the Miners' Provisional Committee, met at Cardiff yesterday, and resolved to send a deputation to Mr. Ritchie appealing to him to appoint a Conciliator under the Act of 1896. A conference was also held of delegates from the collieries belonging to non-associated owners, when it was stated that 49 collieries had conceded the second ten per cent advance in wages, leaving 24 which had not done so; though some of these were expected to agree this week.

Owing to the workmen's Compensation Act coming into operation on the 1st of July, it is stated that old colliers, and those suffering from slight personal defects, are being discharged by some masters as peculiarly liable to accident or injury. Yorkshire trade unions are passing resolutions condemning the action of these employers. Last evening the Royal Opera Company visited Windsor Castle, and gave a performance of "Roméo et Juliette," under the conductorship of Signor Mancinelli. Madame Emma Eames took the part of Juliette, and M. Saleza that of Roméo.

yesterday. In the match between Yorkshire and Essex at Bradford not a run was scored, and a start was not possible either at Lord's or the Oval until late in the afternoon, Surrey hitting up 56 for the loss of one man against Somerset at the latter ground. Kent completed an innings at Nottingham for the small total of 136, and afterwards disposed of one of the home eleven for 35. At Derby the local men scored 161 for the loss of five wickets, whilst against Middlesex, at Manchester, Lancashire ran up 202, and had still seven wickets in hand.

Mr. Justice Grantham, sitting in the Central Criminal Court, yesterday commenced the trial of Dr. W. M. Collins for the wilful murder of Mrs. Uzielli, by the performance of an unlawful operation. The prosecution was conducted by the Attorney-General, whose speech for the Crown occupied an hour in delivery. Evidence was given by Mr. Uzielli and Mrs. Adrian Hope. The hearing was adjourned.

Alfred J. Monson, whose name was prominently before the public some years ago in connection with the case known as the Ardnamont Mystery, appeared at Bow-street Police court yesterday, with Victor Honour, a money lender and properly agent, and two other persons, charged with conspiracy to defraud the Norwich Union Life Assurance Society. A second charge of forgery was also preferred against two of the prisoners. After formal evidence of arrest had been given by the police the accused were remanded, one of them being admitted to bail.

Mr. Wynne E. Baxter, Coroner for East London, yesterday concluded his inquiry regarding the death of Amelia Gardner, one of the victims of the disaster that followed the launching of her Majesty's ship Albion at Blackwall. The jury returned a verdict of Accidental death adding an expression of their opinion that the visitors to the yard acted contrary to instructions in going the footbridge which collapsed, but that the bridge was of a very unsubstantial character, and that sufficient precautions were not taken to prevent visitors using it. There was, they added, great lack of judgment in allowing such large numbers of people admission to the works. Finally, they recommended that on all future occasions the police should have entire control of the safety of the public.

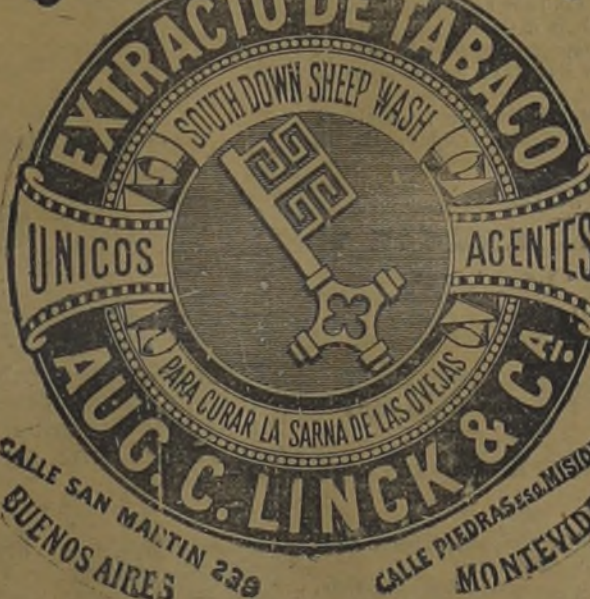
