WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 12. A telegram from Constantinople states that the reply of the Porte to the Ultimatum of the Powers has been delivered at the several Embassies. It concedes the demands of the Powers with regard to the withdrawal of the Turkish troops from Crete, with some modifications in detail.
