Mr. Maschen's «Werther» at the Solis on Saturday, did not please us much. Some of the music is very beautiful, but the opera is monotonous, a long series of solos and duets, without a single chorus, and the sickly ultra-sentimental plot is simply «impossible» It is a not unusual case of good composition wasted on an unworthy libretto. De Lucia, Sra. Ferrari and Sra. Berlandi distinguished themselves but the performance was coldly received. On the other hand «Tannhäuser» on Sunday was a great success, and Wagner's massive music was a welcome change after the sentimentality of «Werther» and «Bohème» Scott, the baritone was the hero of the evening, singing most superbly, as he always does Mariacher, Guerrini and Bonapata Bau also did very well, in fact the whole performance was good. Maschen's orchestra

was very grand, and had more than one ovation especially at the end of the colossal overture. This evening will be given Masson's "Manon," with De Lucia, Sammarco, Monchero, Rossi, Tisci-Rubini and the charming Ferreri.

We are very glad to say that the police have received instructions for the suppression and confiscation of the bogus bulletins to which we have several times called attention, and the circulation of which had become a public scandal. Even such important events as the murder of the late President being made an opportunity for swindling and deceiving the public. It is a very proper step, and we only regret it was not taken sooner.

We are requested to announce that a special Service of Song will be held in the Salvation Army Hall, Calle General Liniers 200a, at 8 p. m. tomorrow (Wednesday) evening, conducted by Major Pearce from Buenos Aires. Everybody invited.

The Nation put its columns into deep mourning on Friday last, being the only paper here, native or foreign, that did so. Malicious persons have since been asking whether the mourning was for the death of Sr. Borda or for the downfall of Porteria and Co.

Santa Rosa verified her reputation for dirty weather yesterday.

We are obliged to suspend a quantity of telegraphic items, but in truth there is nothing of particular importance or interest.

The performance at the Cibilis this evening will be for the benefit of the "United Italian Schools," a meritorious institution that educates a number of indigent children of all nationalities, though mainly Italian. The programme consists of Goldoni's comedy "Il Barbiere Benefico," a monologue and a farce.

Says the Buenos Aires Herald:—We learn with conventional regret, mingled with a very large quantum of sound, solid pleasure, that Mr. Samuel Johnstone has just resigned the presidency of the British Immigration Society, thereby rendering its amalgamation with the Benevolent Society a foregone conclusion. For years back the former association had really no *raison d'être*, its aim and object being to provide for new arrivals that unfortunately never do arrive, whilst constantly leaving England, Ireland and Scotland to seek their fortunes in far less favoured lands. Mr. Johnstone could never see this side of the question, and consequently kept the flag flying long after common sense might have told him the utter futility of his labours on behalf of his poorer fellow countrymen that know not of his existence, much less of his labours in their behalf.

BUENOS AIRES

The news received from Santa Fé regarding the work of destroying the locusts in very satisfactory. In some districts the locusts took occasion of the cold weather to turn out in force against the common enemy and destroyed thousands of quintals. The greatest number of locusts had settled down in the North of the province, but even there they were for the most part exterminated. Engineer Frommel and his assistants have done good work in giving general organization to the campaign.

The prefect of the port has sent a communication to the Minister of the Interior asking for instructions as to how he is to proceed with regard to the suspicious characters that occasionally arrive in this port. According to the present law and regulations he is powerless to do anything to prevent their landing. Many of them come of their own accord, like the anarchists from Spain, and others are actually sent to this country by other Governments, such as the bad characters shipped here by the Brazilian Government and who are no welcome addition to the population.

On Saturday evening the marriage of Mr. C. M. Manifold and Miss Shaw, daughter of Mr. John Shaw of calle Venezuela, was celebrated.

The Minister of Finance has issued a decree transferring the office of inspector of the port and live-stock from the Customs House to the General Revenue Office. The reason of this decree is that some sheep from New Zealand were landed from Montevideo, and the inspectors having at first failed to inspect them on board, afterwards ordered them to be re-shipped on the plea that they came from Australia. The Minister orders that hereafter all animals must be carefully inspected and the port whence they proceed must be clearly established before they are landed.

Contrary to the tobaccoists, the manufacturers of alcohol and the proprietors of deposits of alcohol are making every effort to have the bill of Dr. Pellegrini for a Government monopoly in the article passed. A few of them try to offer a feeble opposition to the measure, but the majority seem to be against them. It is looked upon as favourable to their interest by most distillers, and this ought to be evidence to the public that it would be disadvantageous to the Government, which would surely make a bad bargain in buying up the industry.

Petitions for leave to construct new railways are again the order of the day. Besides several new projects in the province of Buenos Aires there is a petition for a railway from Tuyu to Rosario, pass-

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ing through Las Flores, Bragado, Junin, etc. The Senate Committee will consider it in a few days.—B. A. Herald.

LONDON NOTES

MONDAY, AUGUST 2.

In the House of Lords on Saturday the Military Manoeuvres Bill, and several other measures were brought up from the Commons and read a first time. The consideration of the Commons' amendments to the Workmen's Compensation Bill was postponed until tomorrow.

In the House of Commons Sir W. Wedderburn expressed regret at having aided in giving publicity to the charges against British soldiers at Poona made by Professor Ghoklee and since unreservedly withdrawn by him. The Military Manoeuvres Bill having been read a third time the House went into Committee on the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Bill, which was passed through.

The King of Siam went to Harrow School on Saturday and witnessed a cricket match, inspected several of the buildings, and was present at a concert in the Speech Room. Yesterday he visited Kew Gardens and was shown over several of the houses by Mr. Thiselton Dyer. His Majesty evinced much interest in what he saw, and displayed considerable botanical knowledge.

The death is announced of General Sim, until recently one of the Moderate members of the London School Board.

A meeting, in support of the Zionist Congress to promote the return of the Jews to Palestine, which is to be held at the end of this month at Basle, took place last night at the Jewish Working Men's Club, in Whitechapel. Dr. Gaster, chief rabbi of the Spanish and Portuguese Jews in London, presided, and letters in favour of the movement were read from Dr. Herzl, its organiser, and from Father Ignatius.

At Oxford, on Saturday, the summer meeting of the Oxford University Extension Students was opened. The Bishop of Ripon gave the inaugural address, which was a vindication of the eighteenth century from the charge that it had unintelligent politicians, no noble art, and only a dead religion. Special sermons were preached in connection with the gathering yesterday.

As a preliminary to the proceedings of the Welsh National Eisteddfod, which will commence at Newport, Monmouth, to-day, Lord Tredegar on Saturday opened an art exhibition in that town. Sir William Harcourt will attend the gathering on Wednesday and Thursday next.

In their match, which concluded at the Oval on Saturday, Surrey broat the Philadelphians by 151 runs. Sussex playing against Essex at Brighton had to follow on, and managed to save the game and make a draw of it, mainly through the fine batting of Ranjitsinhji. At Harrogate Gloucestershire gained a victory over Yorkshire by 140 runs, and at Lord's the contest between the Haileybury and Cheltenham College teams ended in a win for the former by 238.

Gangadhar Tilak and his printer were brought up in the Bombay Police Court on Saturday, when formal evidence was given of the publication of the alleged seditious verses and leader in the "Kesaria" on June 15th of the present year, and also of the delivery of a copy of the paper to a Bombay subscriber. The case was then adjourned until Bombay, bail being again refused. The precincts of the Court and the road leading to it were densely crowded by natives, but few Europeans were present. Great interest is manifested in the case by the natives, and particularly by the Mahatras.

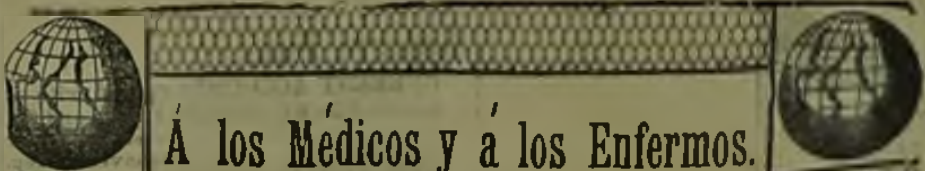

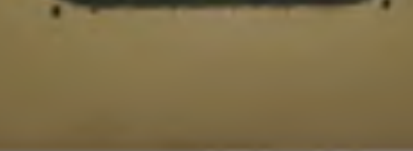
