—The St. Petersburg correspondent of a London contemporary remarks that the Russians decorate their houses not as the Parisians do, but as the Lillois and the Belgians. They hang out at windows, and arrange on panoplies between them, all the nice stuff they can lay hands upon. They are very fond of mock ermine. It is made with any white stuff—woolen or cotton, not excluding muslin—by the application of long strips of black fur, imitation bearskin. The yellow flag with the double-headed eagle only appears on palaces, but the arms of Russia are repre-

sented on shields, to which the ermine is attached. This mock ermine is set on red cotton. It has a strange effect, and should be seen at a distance. There is not anything like the richness noticed in the facade decorations at Lille when President Carnot last went there. The taste for magnificence that Froissart talks of still survives in French as well as in Belgian Flanders. Russian palaces and everything Imperial are magnificent, but little else is. They tell me that mock ermine has a symbolic meaning. It shows that all Russia is under the shelter of the Imperial mantle, which is like that of the peer's mantle in England of crimson velvet and real ermine.

The climate of Montevideo does not seem to agree with "Stand-by O'Gorman," the telegraphic correspondent of the *B. A. Standard*. Of late his messages have been of an unmistakable dyspeptic and discontented tone, and nothing here seems to please him. He even takes a pessimistic view of the new Government. The old situation seems to have satisfied him much more than the new. Perhaps if the country could return to it, he would recover his former good spirits.

BUENOS AIRES

—On Friday night a banquet was given to Mr. Essex Reade, the representative of Baring Brothers, in the rooms of the Café de Paris. The British Minister was invited as well as nearly all the bankers in the city, among them being Messrs. S. H. Pearson, A. V. Lopez, Heriot, Ennor, J. Pearson, and Hogg. Mr. Reade leaves for England on business and may not return to this city.

—The Public Works Committee of the Chamber has resolved to report favourably on the proposal to authorize the Executive to spend 100,000 dollars in having surveys made in the Neuquen and Chubut for constructing a network of railways.

—The locusts have ceased causing much alarm for the present. It is owing to the cold which reigned for some time and also to the fact that the insects have in many instances begun breeding and therefore remain quiet.

—The news received from different parts of the country continues to show that the damages caused by the locusts have been greatly overrated. Their ravages, so far, have been almost imperceptible, and even at their worst, should they come later on in greater number, they would not cause more than 5 per cent loss in the crops according to the most reliable calculations.

—Complaints are now being heard on all sides against the proposed increase of the tax on alcohol 60 per cent on the previous rates. A great many distillers have sold their alcohol by special contract till the 31st of December, and in these contracts the tax is stipulated to be paid by the distiller. As none of them had calculated on any increase in the tax it follows that they would incur tremendous loss. Some of them even claim that they will lose more than \$100,000 and become bankrupt to boot.

—On Saturday two sub-commissions started in the Villarino for the South to resume the demarcation labour of the Chilian boundary. One of the commissions is to make surveys along the dividing line in Chubut and the other is to land at Rio Gallegos to survey the line along the Santa Cruz territory. They took with them special boats in order to be able to navigate the shallow rivers. It is expected that some difficult questions will have to be settled this year and the commissions have started a month earlier in order to have more time than usual. —*B. A. Herald.*

LONDON NOTES

Monday, August 30.

Further fighting has taken place on the Indian frontier in the neighbourhood of Kohat. The enemy were forced to withdraw at all the several points of their advance, but three British officers were wounded. The Khyber Rifles at Jamrud have been disbanded.

On Saturday the Duke and Duchess of York left Dublin and started on their tour through the country districts of Ireland. Their Royal Highnesses, in the course of their drive to Kingsbridge railway station, were loudly cheered, and their reception at the wayside stations on the journey to Killarney was most cordial. After the Royal party had started for the south the Lord Lieutenant delivered a speech, in the course of which he stated that the Duke had informed him that he had visited many large towns in England and Scotland, but in no town had he received so warm a welcome as he had in Dublin.

In support of the engineers in their struggle for an eight hours' day, a demonstration of Trade Unionists of the metropolis was held yesterday in Hyde Park. There was a large attendance. Addresses were delivered from eight platforms, the principal speakers being Mr. J. Burns M.P., and Mr. Maddison, M.P. A resolution, put from such platform, was carried unanimously, expressing sympathy with the engineers, condemning the Northern Employers' Federation for interfering in a question which concerned the metropolis only, and denouncing their evident desire to crush the men's organization. Workers throughout the country were urged to assist the men financially and in other ways.

A Court-martial was held on the cruiser *Blenheim*, at Devonport, on Saturday, for the trial of Captain Kirby and Lieutenant Graham, of the cruiser *Phaeton* on a charge of having negligently or by default hazarded, or suffered to be hazarded, her Majesty's ships *Phaeton* and *Thrasher*. The Court adjudged both officers to be reprimanded, and admonished them to be more careful in future.

The Sussex Army Manoeuvres commenced on Saturday. Though there were reports of rain from various directions at Arundel, there was none in the neighbourhood of headquarters, and the troops marched in from Aldershot, Woolwich, and Shorncliffe during the day under favourable conditions.

Early on Friday morning three masked burglars appeared at the bedside of Miss Creighton, an aged lady living at the Mardens, a house standing in its own grounds on the hillside about a mile and a half from Caterham Station. Under threats they made her disclose the place where her valuables were, and having also visited her brother's bedside they left with rings, watches, and plate valued at 80l. or more. There is no clue to the identity of the burglars, who are believed to be experienced London thieves. Daring burglaries were committed during Saturday night at two hotels in the City, from one of which 200l. worth of jewellery was stolen.

Surrey's chance of the championship was finally disposed of on Saturday, when, after an eventful game on a treacherous wicket, the metropolitan county suffered defeat at Taunton, Somerset winning by 66 runs. Lancashire now heads the list of first-class counties, and cannot be dispossessed. Middlesex, at Lord's, beat Kent by 33 runs, whilst at Scarborough Yorkshire were left with a victory over the M.C.C. by 89 runs. Leicestershire lost the match with Hampshire, at Southampton, by six wickets.

At the Bow street Police Court, on Saturday, Edward Morgan, of South Hampstead, and Francis Moore, of Green Lanes, who were said to be concerned in a money-lending business in Craven-street, Charing-cross, were charged with conspiring to obtain a valuable security by false pretences. Prosecutor, a grocer living in Camberwell, wished to borrow 100l., and applying to an address he saw advertised in one of the London papers, became known to the prisoners. Debiture bonds he had deposited at the Birkbeck Bank as security for an overdraft were redeemed, and it was alleged that a cheque he had received from the prisoners for 80l. was dishonoured although a prospectus was handed him to the effect that they had 10,000l. to lend. Prisoners were remanded.

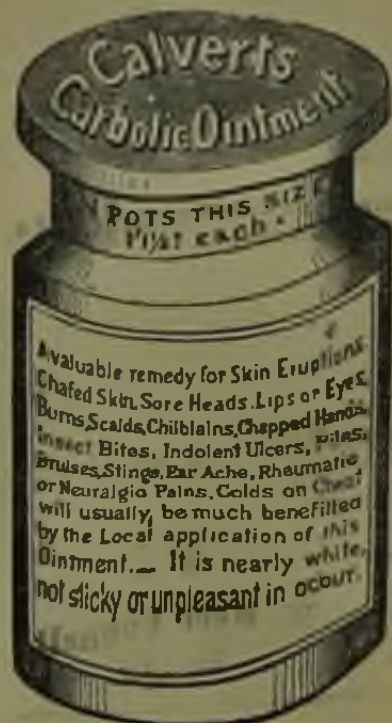

The acknowledged representative of English interests in the Republic. The only independent and reliable English paper ever published here.

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
