

The Anglo-Venezuelan Arbitration

New York, Jan. 5.—Sir Julian Pauncefote and General Andrade, respectively the British Ambassador and Venezuelan Minister in Washington, signed yesterday in the presence of Mr. Secretary Olney the treaty by which is submitted to the arbitration of a mixed court the question of limits between British Guiana and the Venezuelan Republic. The two arbitrators representing England will be Lord Russell of Killowen, Lord Chief Justice of the United Kingdom and another Judge of high standing; the representative of the United States, Mr. Fuller, President of the Supreme Court of Justice and of Venezuela Judge Brewer of the same court who was president of the commission appointed by the North American Government to study the same question of limits in order to ascertain which side had more reason. According to the terms of the treaty the litigants are conceded a term of eight months to count from yesterday, for the presentation of their arguments. The court is to be held in Paris. The document was signed with an eagle quill-pen ornamented by a gold heart and diamonds. The arbitration will extend over a year and a half.

SUNDRIES.

—We are requested to announce that Bishop J. H. Vincent will preach in the American Methodist Church at 11 a. m. to-morrow, and the Rev. W. F. Rice of Lomas at 7.15 p. m. The Annual South American Conference opens on Monday and will continue throughout the week. In our next we will give the programme. We also call attention to the announcement of Bishop Vincent's Lecture in the Lafone Memorial Hall next Wednesday evening.

—The phrase «Diamond Jubilee» as applied to the celebration of the Queen's 60th Anniversary, has received the sanction of the Prince of Wales, and should become popular. As the date June 20 falls on a Sunday, the official celebration will take place on Tuesday, June 22, at her Majesty's express wish. We presume the same date will be chosen here, if any local celebration is eventually organized.

—We much regret to hear that Mr. B. Lorenzo Hill of the «Standard Life» is laid up with a severe attack of influenza.

—There was a pleasant dance on board the U. S. S. «Lancaster» yesterday afternoon, the officers having invited many lady friends from shore.

—U. S. Minister Buchanan and Mr. Macnelly of Buenos Aires arrived here yesterday morning and left in the afternoon for the latter's estancia at Colonia.

—The Govan shipping yard near Glasgow was destroyed by fire on Thursday. Damages £50,000.

—A London telegram says that the Liberals are gaining important advantages in the bye-elections.

—Those miserable locusts are again appearing over the city.

—Stand by O. Gorman interviewed us yesterday—pacificaly but remonstrantly. He protests that if we begin throwing «business men of high standing» at each other's heads—well, it is rather warm work for this weather, business men are apt to be heavy, sometimes even corpulent—besides, they might object to being employed as missiles. So we agreed to drop it—not them—and adjourned to a convenient establishment unnecessary to specify further. We are not like the *Standard* and have no cellar on the premises.

LONDON NOTES.

THURSDAY, JAN. 7.

An important speech was made by Mr. Rhodes at the farewell banquet given in his honour at Capetown on Tuesday night. The ex-Premier traced his activity during the last fourteen years, during which his paramount idea had been the extension of the Colony to the north, and the retention of the hinterland to the exclusion of other Powers. As he received no support from the Imperial Government or from the Cape, he had been constrained to fall back upon the Chartered Company. Mr. Rhodes sailed yesterday for England on board the Dunvegan Castle.

A Correspondent at Hawarden describes some interesting proceedings which took place yesterday. It was Mrs. Gladstone's eighty-fifth birthday, and the opportunity was taken by the Anglo-Armenian Association to present her with a portrait in oils of the Arcturian Patriarch, his Holiness Mhigrichid I. Mr. F. S. Stevenson, M. P., Prof. Beet, and Mr. C. E. Schwann, M. P., each spoke a few words. Mr. Gladstone, in acknowledging the gift, admitted that in their efforts for Armenia they appeared to have failed but said that the heart of the people of England had been stirred as the heart of one man, and that with him there remained an inexhaustible hope. The weight of disgrace was, he thought, too great to be borne, and the human conscience would revolt against it.

The career of the Sultan, whom he could call nothing but the greatest assassin in the world, had been triumphant. But those triumphs of wickedness and iniquity were doomed to be short-lived; Providence retained the means and the

faculty of judging when an end should be put to them. A service in the church followed, the congregation, in addition to those named, including the Duke and Duchess of Westminster. Here a window, given by M. Zudoroff in memory of the Armenian martyrs, was unveiled by Mrs. Gladstone and dedicated by the Bishop of St. Asaph.

Addressing his constituents yesterday afternoon, Mr. Courtney discussed the relations existing between Liberal Unionists and Tories, and declared himself hostile to nominal fusion. In the evening he dealt with the financial relations of Ireland and Great Britain, and expressed his dissent from the conclusions of the Royal Commissioners. Observing that we obtained more money from Ireland than we otherwise should because people in that country drank whisky, he suggested that the excess of the whisky duty might be given back to the towns and villages to secure improved water supplies. He held that no injustice was involved in the present financial relations.

Lord Ashbourne said at Lancaster last night that the Government would, in the coming Session, propose relief for the Voluntary schools and introduce an Employers' Liability Bill. Their ambition would be to develop the peace of the whole world.

The Miners' Conference at Leicester, yesterday, discussed privately, the best means of assisting districts where wages are below the 30 per cent. obtained by Federated districts. A resolution was passed expressing sympathy with the demand of the Fife and East Lothian miners for an advance of wages, and promising such support as might be necessary in the event of a strike.

Nearly two thousand destitute children were treated last evening to a free supper and an entertainment at Dr. Barnardo's Homes for Orphan Waifs, Stepney, and each of them was presented with sixpence.

At the resumed trial of the Scott libel case at the Central Criminal Court yesterday, Mr. Lawson Walton occupied the greater part of the sitting with a very able and at times touching, address on behalf of Lady Scott. The formal evidence of a detective was taken, and Mr. Marshall Hall began his address for the male defendants. During the half hour that he was speaking another scene occurred between him and the judge.
