

The Customs Committee of the French Chamber yesterday decided, by fifteen against nine votes, that the duty on foreign corn should be reduced for one year to three francs, and that on flour to six francs.

The report of the Grand Jury at New Orleans, on the recent lynching in that city, is now published. The document states that no doubt exists that the verdict given in the Hennessy trial was obtained by agents employed for the special purpose of defeating the ends of justice.

It is stated from St. Petersburg that the expulsion of Jews from Moscow has been suspended.

As the result of the negotiations which have been going forward between Russia, through M. de Nelidoff, and the Porte, vessels of the Russian volunteer fleet flying the commercial ensign will be allowed to pass through the Bosphorus.

Mr. Justice Lawrence, sitting without a jury, in the Queen's Bench Division, had yesterday before him the breach of promise suit, Harper v. Henderson.

The St. Luke's murder case was disposed of at the Central Criminal Court yesterday, the prisoner, Arthur John Baste, who was of unsound mind, being ordered to be detained during her Majesty's pleasure.

Yesterday, at the Central Criminal Court, before Mr. Justice A. L. Smith, Captain Edmund Howe Vernoy pleaded guilty to an indictment charging him with offences under the Criminal Law Amendment Act, and was sentenced to 12 months imprisonment.

Edward Taplen, of Cheetham, was brought up at Bow-street Police-court, yesterday, charged with having committed perjury in connection with recent divorce proceedings in which he was petitioner. Evidence of the arrest having been given, the accused was remanded.

MUSIC AS A REMEDY. Most of us have at one time or another been convinced by personal experience of the fact that perception of pain and of grief depend in great measure on our mental attitude for the time being.

It is generally thought that this improvement will continue next week.

REMARKABLE HYPNOTISING. The New York Sunday Sun publishes the following extraordinary story, dated from Mier, Mexico, a town of 1,600 inhabitants on the Rio Grande, 150 miles from its mouth.

During the afternoon of the same day one of the guests presented Perez with a magnificent watch, while a barman gave him a revolver. The next day presents began to pour in upon Perez, among them being a

handsome bouquet with the name of a lady attached to it. She explained to her friends that the man in passing her had asked her to send him the flowers. Other persons who had made presents to Perez also stated that they had been asked by him for the articles given, and that they had found it impossible to resist the request.
