Kent did badly at Lord's yesterday, and the M.C.C. were victorious by an innings and 21 runs.

Proceedings were commenced in the Chancery Division yesterday in the suit «Sutherland v. Sutherland.»

The Dowager Duchess of Sutherland claims possession of certain properties at Tittensor Chase, the principal mansion-house of the Duke.

Yesterday, in a case which came before Mr. Justice Jenne in the Divorce Court, and in which a decree nisi was granted by reason of the misconduct of a wife, there was originally a claim for 2,500l. damages.

At Bow-street Police Court yesterday, James White, described as a betting man, was charged on remand with being concerned in the robbery of the Countess of Flanders' jewels from the Royal Palace at Brussels.

George Cooke, the police-constable who is charged with the murder of the woman at Wormwood Scrubs, was brought before Mr. Curtis Bennett at the West London Police-court yesterday.

Batsmen continue to maintain their advantage on the present hard and true wickets. Notts, visiting Brighton yesterday, kept Sussex in the field the whole day, scoring 376 for the loss of two men only.

A telegram from Capetown states that the Zwaitland conference has been brought to a satisfactory end. Sir Henry Loch leaves to-day for Johannesburg.

Considerable sensation was occasioned at the House of Commons late last night when it became known that Mr. Sexton, M. P., had tendered his resignation as a member of the Irish Parliamentary party.

It is hoped that Mr. Sexton will be prevailed upon to withdraw his resignation.

In the cricket world we have had a week of sensations, Mr. Stoddart's wonderful batting at Lord's having been followed by a great display of hitting on the part of the Notts eleven at Brighton.

The batsmen have a peculiar affection for Sussex bowling, but they have never before manifested it in quite such a pronounced way.

Going in first on Thursday they did not finish their innings till half-past four yesterday afternoon, their score of 674 being, with a single exception, the highest total ever obtained in a first-class county match.

The most famous members of the team all did big things, Shrewsbury making 164, Gunn 156, and Barnes 102. Never surely did a county possess at one time three professional batsmen of such powers.

Barnes is the oldest of the three, being already on the wrong side of forty, but he is this season playing with much of the vigour of his younger days.

Gunn has been scoring heavily for a month past, and had previous to this week treated the Sussex bowlers to a couple of hundreds, but Shrewsbury had in several matches been curiously unsuccessful, and his long innings was therefore all the more welcome.

Under the «Sunday Observance Act» of 1790 heavy penalties are imposed on the opening of any place of public entertainment on Sundays if money is taken for admission, and such a place is declared to be a disorderly house.

It has been held that sacred concerts come within the provisions of this enactment, not to speak of the heavy penalties of the Act of 1877.

Sir George Sitwell's Bill now before Parliament proposes to legalise Sunday concerts of «sacred music», a term which is declared to include «all vocal and instrumental music, except dance music and comic or humorous songs or the accompaniments to such songs, and except the singing of songs not written or adapted to words of sacred or religious meaning.»

The building in this city known as Ford's Theatre, in which President Lincoln was assassinated, closed its career to-day in a frightful catastrophe, about a third of the structure collapsing without warning.

For several years the building has been used by the War Department for clerks employed in a branch of its service. There were about 600 of those in the building to-day, most of whom were veterans of the Civil War, and several of whom were too badly maimed or crippled to make their way about easily.

One of the latter, when he was dug out of the ruins to-day, covered with blood and powdered mortar, wounded in several places, and with one eye gone, was cheered by the crowd as the stretcher corps were bearing him to the ambulance.

All the old soldier in his composition came back to him as he heard the sound, and he contrived to raise his head a little, and faintly waved one hand in response.

As only about a third of the building fell, the lives of not more than 175 were imperilled. A great number of these are injured, and sixteen dead bodies have been recovered.

Many of the clerks are missing, and it is feared that the death list will prove to be much larger. The first man killed was a clerk, who, overcome by fright, rushed to the window and jumped out, although he was in a portion of the building which did not fall.

The dead were carried through the rear door into the alley made historic as the place through which John Wilkes Booth galloped away after assassinating Lincoln.

tered floor, beams and masonry were piled up in such a conglomerate mass that it was hard work to remove even the top layer.

Some bodies were crushed and mangled almost beyond recognition. General Schofield has ordered two troops of cavalry and two companies of infantry to assist in the work of rescue, and in controlling the crowds which have assembled on the scene of the disaster.

SERIOUS ACCIDENT TO MR GORDON BENNETT. PARIS, JUNE 9. An accident of the most serious kind befel Mr. James Gordon Bennett yesterday.

It came about in this way. Mr. Bennett and his friend Baron Gourgaud were returning on a mail coach from a drive in the country to the house in which Mr. Bennett resides, in the Champ-Elysées.

In passing under the archway on which the entrance opens, one of the four horses got frightened and began to rear. Baron Gourgaud jumped down unhurt, but his companion in trying to do so, fell forward against one of the steps of the mail coach.

When he was taken up and carried to his room he directed that Dr. Robin, his friend and medical attendant, and Surgeon Le Dentu should be fetched. When Dr. Robin came, he found there was a deep cut in the abdomen, and that an operation would be necessary.

Mr. Bennett asked the doctor what he thought of his state, and begged him to be frank. On hearing that it was very serious he added a codicil to his will, and then said he was ready to be operated upon.

Since the operation there has been no fever, and Dr. Robin takes a fairly hopeful view of the case.
