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occupied and the local Commission hard at work preparing their extinction. In Moreno the salmons are beginning to show. At Quilmes the plague occupied a stretch of 50x25 squares and the salmons is also breaking out. In the Santa Teresa Colony in Santa Fé, the farmers lost 75% of the crops from the voladoras and are threatened with the loss of the remaining 25% from the salmons.

The talk of the market on Thursday was the mammoth sale of Dr. Julio Pueyrredon, the well known lawyer, estanciero and Chairman of the Sociedad Rural. Messrs. Wilken and Walker, the leading live-stock brokers, sold for his account to Messrs. Kingdland and Cash no fewer than 2700 steers for export to London, at the price of \$30 gold per head. Great as this sale is, few of our readers, perhaps, are aware of the fact that Don Julio Pueyrredon, to our knowledge, had at the beginning of this year on his famous estancia El Moro, Quequen, in the Partido Lobos, no fewer than 5000 steers ready for Deptford market, nearly all 4-year-olds and ranging in weight from 700 to 1000 kilos each. These animals were inspected along with Mr. Walker last March, and we doubt if there is another estanciero in South America, not to say the world, that can boast of such a number of fat, high-class animals ready for shipment at a moment's notice. The price paid, say 30½ gold, sounds cheap for the stock when we look back at the prices ruling in the market this time last year, when these 4 year old steers would have been considered cheap at 40½ gold per head. The lands of the Moro estancia are famous in the province of Buenos Ayres for their variety of grasses; the owner does not allow a blade of alfalfa to be grown on his estate, as the natural grasses of the estate are far superior, probably owing to the ozone of the sea, which gives the meat of animals a «pré-salé» flavour. Even in Deptford, the butchers distinguish between what they call South American beef—nearly all Argentine—and Pueyrredon beef. We congratulate Messrs. Wilken and Walker on their great sale.—B. A. Standard.

LONDON NOTES.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 10.

Lord Rosebery addressed a densely crowded meeting last night in the Empire Theatre, Edinburgh, and had an enthusiastic reception. Dealing first with the Armenian question, he welcomed the spirit which animated the British agitation against undeniable and fiendish atrocities, but said that public feeling on that subject required guidance rather than stimulus. The character and extent of these outrages raised the larger Eastern question. It could not be effectively dealt with by partial remedies, which would do little good and might do harm. Reviewing the various features of such remedies he argued that they were either futile, impracticable, or dangerous.

In proceeding to explain his reasons for differing from the recent suggestions of Mr. Gladstone, Lord Rosebery mentioned that he differed only as a friend of that illustrious statesman, whose intervention he did not regret. He had that morning received a long affectionate letter from Mr. Gladstone. This he would always cherish, and he must always regard it with affection and deep affection. He was prepared to fight tooth and nail against the isolated intervention of England in the Eastern question, which he had reason to believe would mean nothing less than a European war. The remedy he himself advocated was a concert of the Powers immediately interested. That alone could settle the Eastern question.

Lord Rosebery, in conclusion, explained that the absence of hearty, united support on an earlier occasion, as well as differences on the Eastern question, had led him to put into force a resignation which had been in the hands of his colleagues since the last General Election. He urged that whoever the Liberal party elected as its leader should be followed and supported. Mr. Asquith warmly endorsed a resolution which was carried, urging Lord Rosebery to reconsider his determination; but his lordship did not accede to this request.

At Châlons yesterday nearly ninety thousand French troops passed in review before the Czar and Czarina. The scene was an imposing and magnificent one. The regiments were cheered again and again as they marched past, and shared with the Czar the enthusiasm of the vast crowds assembled on the ground. It is calculated that half a million people left Paris for Châlons to be present at the review. The Czar and Czarina took their departure for Darmstadt last evening.

A Constantinople Correspondent sends details of the recent massacre at Egin which show it to have been the worst that has yet occurred in Asia Minor, save the Urfa slaughter. The massacre and plundering continued for three days. A number of houses belonging to Greek Christians were not touched.

The proceedings of the Church Congress were concluded yesterday. The Bishop of Newcastle presided over a gathering at the Music Hall, when the subject was «International Relations in the Light of the Gospel», and there was a good deal of reference to the Armenian question. The Bishop of Hereford made a vigorous protest against greed and Jewry, which had caused the Christian Powers of Europe to incur at Constantinople what Mr. Gladstone had so truly called «miserable disgrace». In the Congress Hall, extravagance and the tendencies of the modern novel were discussed, among the speakers being Canon Watson,

Canon Ainger, Dean Hole, and the Bishop of Wakefield.
Gonod's «Redemption» was given at the Norwich Musical Festival yesterday morning before a crowded audience. At a miscellaneous concert in the evening an Irish ballad for chorus and orchestra by Prof. Villiers Stanford found much favour. It is stated that the London Cab Drivers Trade Union intend to call out on strike a thousand of the street drivers on Monday, if what they consider to be illegal plying for hire by unlicensed carriages is not stopped. On the other hand, it is announced that the railway companies have come to an agreement to start their own services.

Further evidence associating Edward J. Ivory, better known under the name of Bell, with the dynamite plot was given at Bow-street Police-court yesterday. «Bell's» movements in Glasgow were described, and one witness spoke of his inquiring at a drug store in Penkham as to the charge for a carboy of vitriol. It was pointed out that vitriol was equivalent to sulphuric acid, one of the materials used in the manufacture of dynamite. The proceedings were again adjourned for a week.

Ernest Sly, a young workman, was committed for trial from the Clerkenwell Police-court on the charge of having murdered his wife on the 25th of last month at Islington.

Three persons, of whom one was a City solicitor, were charged at Marlborough-street Police-court with conspiring to defraud a money-lender of 1,400l. They were committed for trial.

Two stockbrokers, father and son, were again charged at Guildhall with converting to their own use shares and bonds that had been entrusted to them. They were remanded, bail in each case being fixed at 1,500l. Karl Sibil, a hairdresser, of 124, Commercial-road, was fined, at the Thames Police-court, 250l. for using his premises for betting purposes. The money was paid.

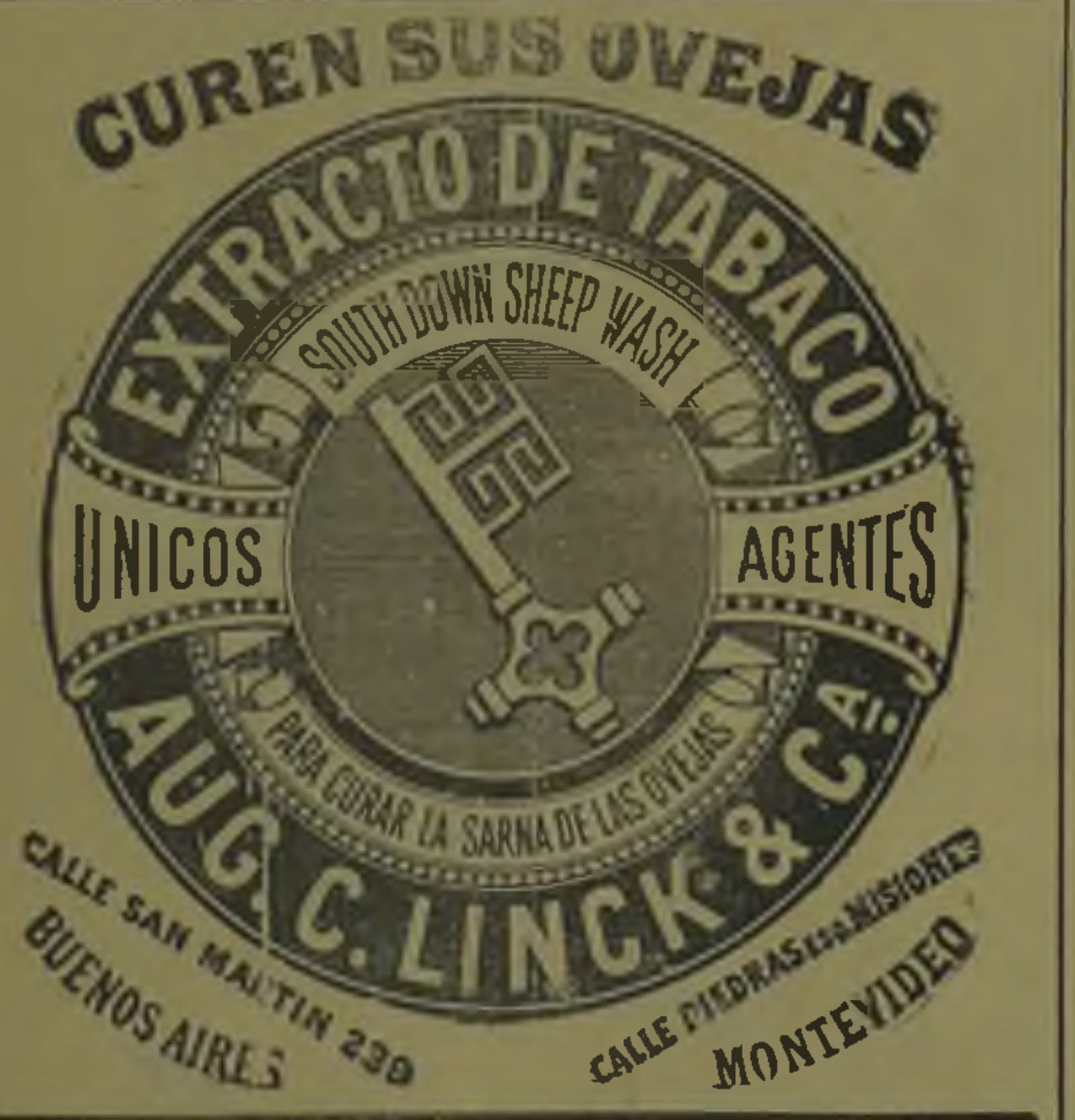

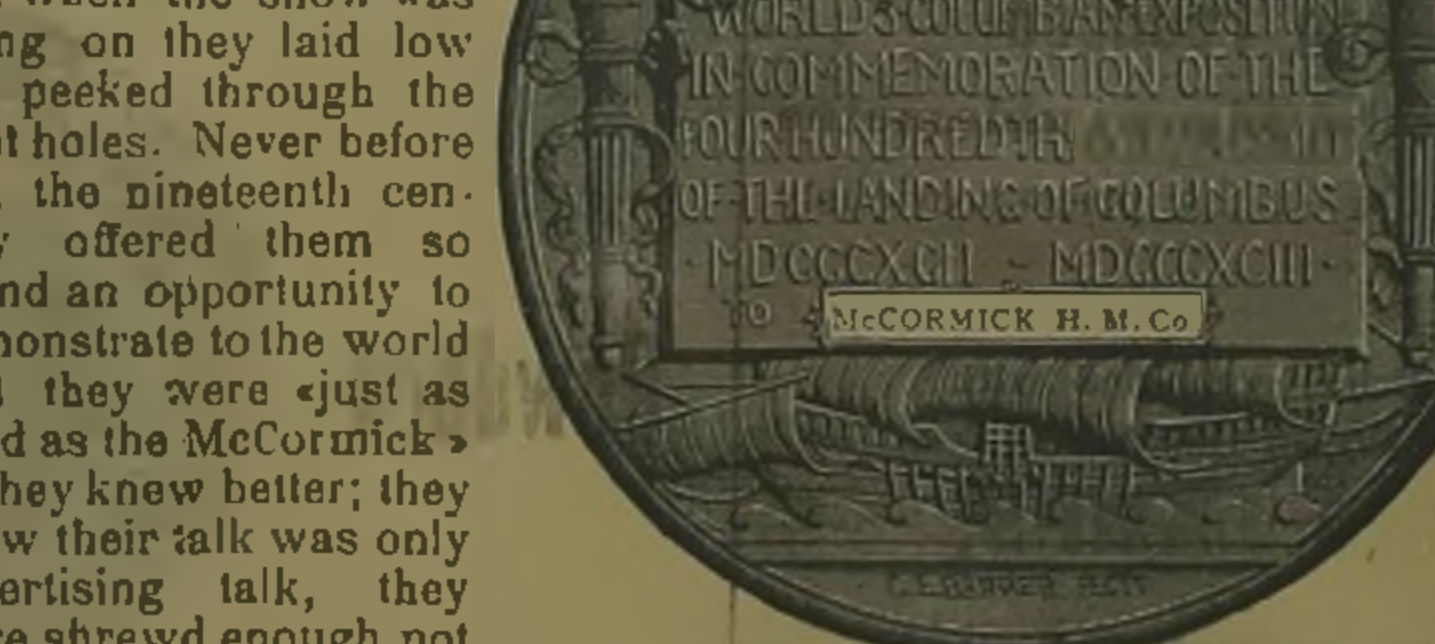
