Political

There is no parliamentary business to record. — Senator Baurd is once more said to be preparing a Report on the Budget. The Senators, we learn, will approve the original Budget last presented by the Executive, with the additions sanctioned by ulterior laws, and the more reasonable of the reforms introduced by the Representatives, in so far as they do not exceed \$40,000 or \$50,000. It is to be doubted if the sanction will be complete by the end of the year.

The revolutionary rumours have all evaporated for the present, and the reports of the appearance of armed bands in the interior have all proved mere moonshine, though they may crop up again any moment. Still, the situation is one of undisguised uneasiness and discontent, as well as of business depression. This is entirely due to the attitude of the Government with regard to the elections which commence next Sunday. No hope of any good result from them now remains, and it will be a relief to see them over without disturbance. As the "grand elector" President Borda is determined to promote some five or six of the present Jefe Políticos to the Chamber, there will be a corresponding number of vacant posts, and the Government House is already besieged with aspirants.

Further borings are being made in the Bay, partly on account of the Guerrero scheme, and partly for the information of the firms intending to present tenders for building the Port. The Guerrero plans have now been finally approved by the Port Studies Commission, so we imagine they will soon be sent to the Chambers.

The Government, prompted by the Directorate of the Bank of the Republic, has definitely notified the London & R. P. Bank to withdraw its notes in circulation, giving it a term of six months to do so. The London Bank is consulting its lawyers, and may very likely challenge the right of the Government to take such a step. The move has not made a good impression on the market, for it is very generally believed that from the securing unity of emission for the notes of the new Bank, which is the object of the Government to a forced paper currency, will be a short and easy step. Yesterday's "Siglo" inveighs furiously against the notion, and asserts that Sr. Borda desires to add banking dictatorship to the political financial and economical dictatorship that he already wields. The "Siglo" is strongly of the opinion that the Government has not the legal right to suppress the note issue of the London Bank.

According to the "Siglo," the new Senators will be Dr. C. de Castro, E. Lenzi, F. H. Lacueva, Duncan Stewart, Dr. E. Vigil, J. J. Segundo, Juan Maza, Dr. J. L. Terra. The probable nominations for the other Chamber are too numerous to repeat — and none of them hopeful.

The Entertainment.

We hope our readers are rushing to secure their tickets for the final performance of the Entertainment Society at the Colón Theatre next Wednesday. In the Concert which constitutes the first part of the programme, songs will be contributed by Mrs. G. Lloyd Davies, Miss Espinosa and Mr. R. Triche, a violin solo by Mr. E. Trimble, a piano solo by Sr. de Pablo, and a Quartette and a Septette (from Puccini's "Bohème") directed by Sr. Formentini. The second part of the programme consists of the farcical comedy "Peacock's Holiday" in two acts. The parts in this will be taken by Miss Creever, Miss Burmeister, Mrs. Stanham (whose reappearance on the amateur stage should be warmly welcomed), Mr. Atkinson, Mr. Kirkpatrick, Mr. Cutler, Mr. McAllister and Mr. Denstone. — Mr. Ashe is preparing some humorously illustrated programmes.

General

The printers' strike continues with hardly a sign of abatement; the men resisting all attempt at conciliation, and persisting in extreme demands to which the masters cannot submit. For this reason we must still claim our readers' indulgence for our irregularities and deficiencies. Next week we hope to reappear in proper printed form. Many of the strikers, especially the younger men, are willing and even anxious to return to work, but are deterred by the threats, and even criminal violence of their comrades. It is generally the case that the more unreasonable a strike is, the more violent are the means employed to sustain it.

We return sincere thanks for the many expressions of sympathy and offers of assistance that we have received during our present troubles. We hope they will soon be over.

2800 men from the Sola Workshops of the Great Southern Railway of Buenos Aires are on strike for an 8 hours' day.

Telegrams seem pretty well agreed that General Weyler has not got the best of it in his personally conducted campaign against the Cuban leader Miquel. The General has suddenly returned to Havana, and his recall is again spoken of.

The marriage of Dr. Isidor Rodriguez to Miss Magdalena Cortezaga, daughter of the Deputy, took place yesterday, with great display. Bishop Soler officiated.

It appears that some of the recently purchased Belgian rifles, which are costing the country so much, are given to bursting when fired. An officer and two men of the 4th Chasseurs were injured by this means during rifle practice last Thursday.

The police have issued the usual edict respecting bathing, also an edict calling on all persons possessing Mauser rifles to declare the same within 15 days.

Ex-president Julio Herrera has been seriously ill during the week and four medical men have been called in, but he has not yet decided whether his complaint is typhoid or electoral. — Sr. Segundo Flores has been dangerously ill, but is now recovering. — Dr. Alfredo Castellanos and Sr. M. Alvarez are also in the sick list.

Sr. Georges Church, Hammer Square, London, the scene of so many fashionable marriages, has been burnt down.

The Argentine Chambers have sanctioned the Sugar Bounty Bill. This has made a bad impression in London.

It is said an accord has at last been reached for European intervention in Turkey. We cannot give particulars.

General Kitchener leaves London for Cairo tomorrow, and will resume the Sudan campaign.

The definite accord between Italy and Brazil is signed by diplomats, and ready for presentation to Congress.

There will be races at Marinas this afternoon.

The Lawn Tennis Tournament opens today.

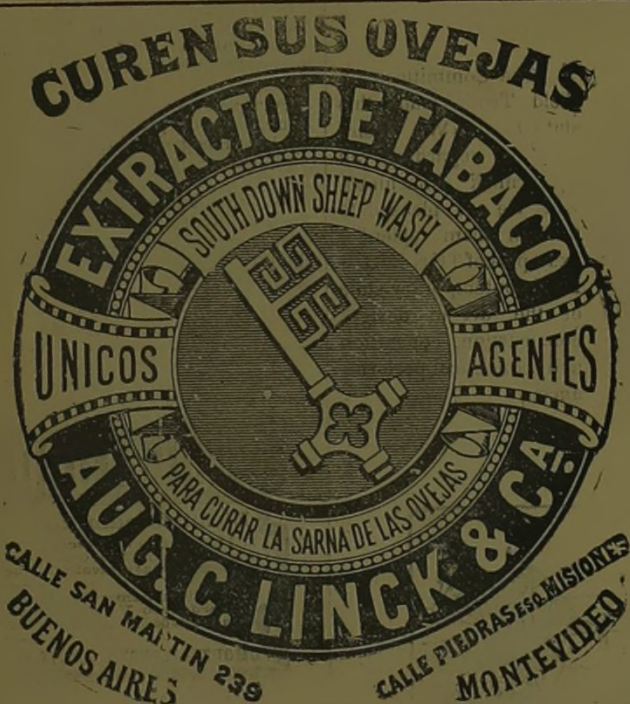
