Telegrams from various sources report and confirm an important victory of the Cubans under General Maceo, over the Spanish column of General Melguizo, in the north of Pinar del Rio province. The latter was entirely broken up, the Spaniards being unable to stand before the outlast charges of the Cubans. This is represented as one of the most important victories yet gained by the Cubans, and has broken up the new plan of campaign of General Weyler. The latter has taken characteristic vengeance by persecuting the Havana papers that published the news of the defeat, and tried to prevent its being communicated to Spain.

Five white and twenty colored soldiers have been killed and several others injured by the explosion of a powder magazine at Bulawayo.

It was reported in yesterday's telegrams that the Fenian Tyrann had been set at liberty by the French authorities. If this be so, it shows how little there was in the alleged conspiracy of which the telegrams made so much.

The English and German papers are abusing each other roundly over the Zanzibar question.

The Czar, Czarina and suite left Portsmouth (not Leith) for Cherbourg on Sunday night, and should now be in Paris. President Faure and his Ministers went to Cherbourg to meet them. The preparations and excitement in Paris over their arrival are said to be unparalleled, and all business is at a standstill.

The Turkish question seems to be simmering down and the only novelty to report is that the Italian ironclad Re Umberto of 13,290 tons has left Spezia for the Levant.

The latest news from illiberal Peru is that the English protestant college at Cuzco has been suppressed in obedience to clerical pressure. And this is the nineteenth century!

The tenor Aramburo, once the idol of the Montevideo public, promises to give a concert in the Solis Theatre next Thursday evening.

There was a serious stabbing affair in low life on Sunday night, in the Plaza Ramirez. The victim, named Cassani, is in the Hospital, and may not survive. His assailant, named Cambon, is in custody. Both were young men of bad and violent character.

BUENOS AIRES.

The wool clip this year will be abundant in quantity and better than the average in quality. Prices also promise to be good.

Kingsland and Cash are out with a circular offering to do business with estancieros on a profit sharing basis which they claim will be of advantage to the breeders of stock. Their salesmen in England, Messrs Pritchard, Moore and Cruik, are alive to the interests of the trade and occupy an enviable position among cattle men.

A young French woman in Rosario attempted to kill her lover by shooting him in the head and then she committed suicide, shooting herself twice, once in the temple and the second time through the heart. She had previously attempted to poison her little daughter, two years old, with laudanum. It was the old story: the young man, after living with this girl for some years, proposed to desert her and marry. He belongs to a well-known family in Rosario.

The strikers on the Railways are massing their forces against the Southern Railway, shrewdly reasoning that if this strongest of all our railways can be forced to surrender all others will follow without a struggle, but this Railway will not surrender either now or in the future and therefore the strike may proceed indefinitely.

Cap Castex, who murdered Lieut. Kruls at Curumalan, has been finally sentenced to life imprisonment, which is absolutely certain will not be carried out, and he may live in hope of being able to regain his liberty long enough to be so unfortunate as to kill two or three more men. However, even that sentence will have a salutary influence on strutting officers, who masquerade as soldiers. The true soldier is neither a bully nor an assassin, but gentle as well as brave.

LONDON NOTES.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 5.

Yesterday the seventeen Armenians who survived the attack on the Ottoman Bank at Constantinople arrived at Marseilles. No communication was allowed with them, and they were taken to the prison of St. Pierre. The Sultan has already demanded from the French Government their extradition.

The Christian Deputies in Crete have addressed a memorandum to the Consuls formally accepting the scheme of reforms. They had previously obtained the consent of the Revolutionary Assembly at Apokorona.

A New York Correspondent says that while there is no chance that the candidates returned by the Indianapolis Convention will be elected, their high character makes it probable that they will draw many votes from Mr. Bryan, and it is possible that they will poll as many as he.

On the resumption of the proceedings of the Sanitary Congress at Newcastle yesterday the President, Professor Corfield, delivered his inaugural address. In this he proclaimed himself an ardent vaccinationist, and quoted statistics to support his contention. Earl Percy, who afterwards spoke, deprecated cumulative penalties. He thought the proper course would be to fine au-

offender for the first offence and for the second to send him to prison, the only alternative being in his opinion to take the child and compulsorily vaccinate it.

Speaking at the annual meeting of the National Association of Colliery Managers at Wrexham yesterday, after being elected president, Major Clayton referred to the stagnation in the coal trade. He thought the facts relating to output should speak in a startling way to those responsible for the present state of things in the Midland district.

Play in the Hastings Festival had to be postponed yesterday till the afternoon, in consequence of rain. In reply to the overnight score of 222 by the Australians, the South of England ran up a total of 154 for nine wickets. At Scarborough the scores for the day were—Yorkshire 184 and M.C.C. 100 for five wickets.

In the course of a coroner's inquiry yesterday respecting the death of Sophia Holiday, wife of a bricklayer, at Battersea, some allegations were made against Mr. John Ferdinand, an American doctor, who, professing to be able to cure cancer, had taken money from the deceased. An officer was sent to the woman's house to take possession of any bottles and pills he might find, and an adjournment was ordered Mr. Ferdinand being held to bail in the sum of 50l.

Mr. Lushington had before him at Bowstreet, yesterday, a case in which Mrs. Mary Grace Walter was charged with wilfully and maliciously publishing a defamatory libel on Major Frederick Edward Walter, who had obtained a divorce from her and married again. It was said that the judges had spoken in the highest terms of his conduct towards her, and the complaint now was that she subjected him to continual annoyance. In the end she was committed for trial.

Two cases of stabbing were before Metropolitan magistrates yesterday. In one of them Walter H. Holland was sent for trial from the Marylebone Police-court on a charge of attempting to murder a girl in Kentish-town. In the other, Louis Ferrari, accused of unlawfully cutting and wounding a commercial traveller living in Soho, was remanded in custody at Marlborough street.

The charge against Mrs. Emma Aitken, the young woman originally accused of murdering her husband, a coffee-house keeper of Marylebone, has been reduced to one of manslaughter. In the resumed proceedings at the Marylebone Police-court yesterday, the magistrate, Mr. Curtis Bennett, said he was sure no jury would have convicted her of the graver charge. Evidence was given of the deceased man's unkindness to his wife, who was again remanded, bail being allowed.

A German steward and his wife, who had kept premises in Burdett-road, Limehouse, ostensibly as a club, were fined 428l., with eight guineas costs, at the Thames Police Court, for carrying on the place as an unlicensed public house. It was stated that since 1892 the defendants had been fined over 500l. for similar offences.

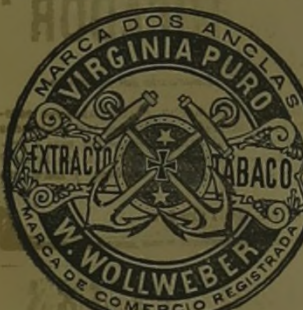
