

The B. A. Herald of Saturday last publishes an interesting history of the Buenos Aires Great Southern Railway from its initiation in 1865 to the present day, when it fairly ranks as the colossus of South American railways. The account, which fills over five columns, is too long for us to reproduce, but we can recommend it as of great interest to all concerned in railway enterprise in this part of the world.

On September 19th Messrs Cair and Co., Greenock, launched a twin screw steamer of 2,800 tons register for the Pacific Steam Navigation Company. She is intended for the Company's passenger, cargo and cable trade between Valparaiso and Paitan. She was named Peru, and is a sister ship to the Company's Chili.

We quote the following from the B. A. Herald and leave our readers to guess to whom it may refer. A young bank clerk in this city will shortly wed one of Montevideo's sweetest and prettiest girls, and the English Church and choir of our sister city will mourn their loss, but will show how much they love the departing bride. Buenos Aires, as usual, will profit by Montevideo's loss. We cannot be more definite just yet.

Telegrams concerning the presidential contest in the United States are colored according to the place of their origin and the views of the sender. The following is from Chicago and probably from a partisan of Bryan. A Washington or New York telegram would probably express an opposite view.—Chicago 24.—The Bryan managers throughout the West claim that the recent advance in the price of wheat is due to a gigantic combination of the money kings in the east in order to show the farmers of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa and Michigan, the four states claimed by both sides, that they can get a high price for their grain without free silver. Bryan now claims 324 votes, or 100 more than are necessary to elect him and McKinley claims 248, 25 more that are needed. Both sides are doing their best work in the doubtful States above mentioned. The Silverites are sending able men to canvass the Trade Unions in the so-called pivotal states. The third-party ticket headed by Palmer and Buckner will not draw as many votes as at first thought and the campaign is narrowing down to Bryan and free silver or McKinley and gold monometallism. The odds in the pool rooms on McKinley are not so great as a few days ago.

After writing the above, we find the following telegram, which confirms our remarks.—New York, 25. To day's Herald predicts the triumph of McKinley by a large majority, after a careful study of the electoral forces of all the States of the Union. It calculates that Connecticut, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Kentucky, Rhode Island, Vermont, West Virginia and Wisconsin will give Mr. McKinley 258 votes, whilst Alabama, Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah and Virginia will give Mr. Bryan 134 votes. The doubtful States are California, Kansas, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Carolina, North and South Dakota, Oregon, Washington and Wyoming, representing 65 votes, between all these should cast for Bryan, McKinley would still have a large majority. The Herald further predicts a gold majority in the coming Congress, which, it says, will contain 224 Republicans against 124 Democrats and 9 Populists, giving 215 gold votes and 142 free-silver votes. The new Senate, it calculates, will have a majority of 43 gold votes out of a total of 70 members. So mote it be.

In the B. A. Standard of Saturday, Mr. J. Adams, the well-known constructor salutes forth to the defence of the Póitos Hotel, about which «Dr. Syntax» had made some very depreciating and erroneous remarks. Mr. Adams, than whom there is no one better qualified to speak on the subject, for he superintended the building, says as follows:—«The statement that the hotel or restaurant is a wooden structure is entirely incorrect, and is a mistake which it is difficult to believe would be incurred by other than a wall-eyed person. It is in reality built of iron and brick, and on solid stone and concrete to foundations four metres in depth. The builders were mindful of the parable of the man who did not build on the rock I think it somewhat unkind of him to qualify the promise as a «mere attempt at an Esplanade», as it is twenty metres wide by forty five metres long, and the pier leading from it eight metres by one hundred long. The hotel or restaurant accommodation now, with covered in promenade facing the sea, consists of thirty-two bedrooms, fitted with electric light and bells. Its furniture is superior to any hotel in South America. A dining saloon with excellent kitchen, scullery and store rooms is on the ground floor, with cellars below. I may observe that since 1871 \$30,000 gold have been spent in buildings alone, and improvements are now in hand costing \$10,000 more. These expenses have been borne entirely by the Tramway Co.»

Some interesting reading will be found in the report we give to-day of the annual meeting of the shareholders of the Central Uruguay Railway Company. The announcement that Mr. Drabble intends to retire from the active chairmanship of the Company will be received with general regret. Mr. Drabble has been a valuable friend to the Company, as he has to many other River Plate enterprises.

The Paolena Company, having postponed its visit to Brasil, will give a few farewell performances at the Solis Theatre, commencing this evening with the comedy «Da Napoli & Napoli» and other attractions. The other theatres are all closed except the San Felipe where zarzuelas, acrobatic performances and the Cinematograph attract large audiences at popular prices.

It is said that the police have discovered an important falsification of tickets of the Caridad Lottery, emanating from the School of Arts and Offices itself, where the tickets are printed. Genuine tickets are used and winning numbers printed on them after the extract has been published. They are then taken to some lottery agent to be cashed and only when he presents them at the administration does he discover that he has been swindled. Two or three agents have been «snob» this way for several hundred dollars.

There is sorrow in sporting circles over the defeat of Imperio in the Grand International at Buenos Aires on Sunday. For some time Imperio looked like winning, but was headed by Porteno in a terrific rush at the close. The other favorite impossible came in third. Cartouche did not run. Porteno was fifth or sixth in the betting, though it had also beaten Imperio in the Grand National at Buenos Aires last year. The 2500 metres was done in 3 min. 12 1/4, new, beating the record.

Mr. Richard Wilson has resumed his post as British Vice-consul at Colonias and Mr. G. T. Wilson, who acted during his absence, has returned to Montevideo.

At Rivera on Friday night a man named Felix Roca, who kept a «pulperia», was murdered by his illegitimate son Pedro, after an altercation on politics, the son objecting to the part his father had taken in the reception of the President.

Dr. T. Tempu, Bishop of London, has been appointed Archbishop of Canterbury, in place of the late Dr. Benson.

General Weyler has suspended a Havana paper and banished the editor for not being sufficiently ardent in defence of the Spanish cause, and for hinting that the Spanish-American Republics might take on themselves the task of arbitration or intervention. This is going rather far.

BUENOS AIRES.
The squabble between the Intendant and the Municipal Council has been hushed up, but the Intendant's prestige has been irretrievably damaged and he ought to resign.

The storm which passed over Rosario on Friday was one of the worst yet seen in that city. A dense cloud of dust changed day into night—then followed wind and rain. Roots were blown off, carriages upset and a great deal of damage done everywhere about the city.

The National Chamber of Deputies has approved of an extradition treaty which has been entered into with Portugal, but properly rejected an article inserted in it for suppressing capital punishment for murder committed in either of the contracting countries, when the murderer succeeds in escaping to the other country. This is another instance of the sickly sentimentality which prevails here in reference to capital punishment, and yet there are few countries in which merciless severity is more needed for restraining homicidal tendencies. This is proved every day by some tragic occurrence.

The latest is the killing of an officer of the fire brigade by another officer of the corps. They had a quarrel and a struggle, the weaker pulled out a revolver and shot the other through the heart.—B. A. Herald.

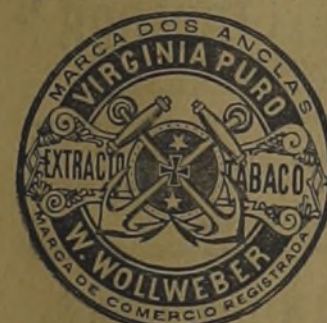

My father professed to be pained

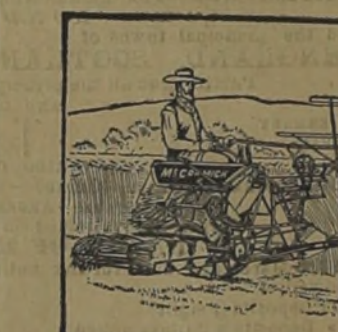

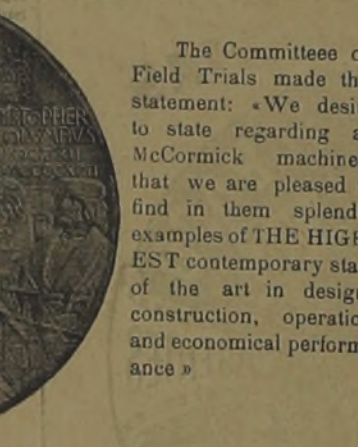


NOW THAT IT'S ALL OVER
