—It is told of Horace Greeley that he once said: "I have made plenty of mistakes in my life, but they were always new mistakes." Everybody blunders; it is the wise person that does not blunder in the same way twice.

—A small boy had taken the prize for an exceptionally well-drawn map. After the examination the teacher, a little doubtful, asked the lad: "Who helped you with this map, James?" "Nobody, sir." "Come, now, tell me the truth. Didn't your brother help you?" "No, sir; he did it all."

—The new Japanese opera by Mascagni, composed of "Cavalleria Rusticana," has been accepted at La Scala, the great opera house of Milan, where it will be produced in the early spring.

—Mr. Allan Darton, manager of the Northern Uruguay (Santa Rosa) Railway, is in town for a few days.

—We acknowledge with thanks a courteous invitation to the vocal and instrumental concert to be given by Sr. and Sra. Giucci at the Liceo Institute on Monday evening next.

—One of the correspondents at Bulawayo who has been seeing much of the fighting throws some interesting light on Mr. Rhodes's readiness to expose himself to fire. "Of physical pluck," says the correspondent, "he has plenty. I for one will testify to that. At Tlobas Imamba I more than once trembled for his safety as bullet after bullet struck perilously near him, and his own words spoken to me after the fight showed how hard the taunt of personal cowardice, so often hurled at him, had hit. Speaking of a certain hot corner, he said, 'I couldn't see anything to be gained by going there, but then if I don't go, someone might say you didn't want to.' That 'didn't want to' meant volumes."

—The phenomenal heat of Monday culminated in the evening in a storm of rain and thunder, which lasted with varying intensity until after midnight yesterday. It then cleared up for awhile, but about sunset again became rather threatening, heavy rain clouds still circulating. The rainfall in the 24 hours was considerable and must have gladdened the hearts of the farmers, being worth a gold mine just now. The Almanac announces to-day as the first of Spring, and for once the weather does not belie the statement.

—There are, it is said, to be no grand festivities at the marriage of the Prince of Naples in Rome, where the army is still in mourning for the disasters in Africa. The civil marriage is to be performed in the throne room at the Quirinal, in the presence of the members of Parliament and the State dignitaries, as in the case of the nuptials of the Duke of Aosta. On the day of the arrival at the Royal couple, the troops of the Roman garrison will be drawn up on the route to the Quirinal. The Prince and Princess will take up their residence in Naples. The Royal Palace there will be renovated for their reception. His Royal Highness will be promoted to the rank of commander of the army corps of Naples, and assume his post in the autumn.

—From a Paris telegram we gather that the Powers have sent another joint ultimatum to the Czar, in reference to allowing the war vessels to pass the Dardanelles, but it does not say that any time limit is fixed. Another telegram says that the passage would be the signal for a general massacre by the fanatic Turks of the Christians in Constantinople, as the Sultan is incapable of maintaining order, and the Turkish troops, even those selected to guard his palace, are notoriously disaffected. All the foreign legations in Constantinople are now closely guarded by marines from the various war vessels. The Italian Government has resolved to call up 6000 navy reserve men and equip more vessels for the East as quickly as possible, sending the entire Mediterranean squadron there. The British Government, we understand, will also send 14 more vessels. News has transpired of another massacre of the Armenians, and indignation in England and in Italy runs very high. The Russian Government has sent 4 large iron-clads and other war vessels from Sebastopol to the Bosphorus. A Washington telegram says that the U. S. Government has decided to maintain a reserved attitude. The Czar and Czarina should have arrived in England yesterday and much is expected from his interview with the Queen. According to one telegram England will not object to the interference of Russia in Turkey provided the Sultan is deposed and Christians are protected.

—The suicide mania in Buenos Aires is assuming terrible proportions. Yesterday's telegrams record three cases, one of a girl of only 15. —Mr. H. M. Stanley, the African explorer, is again seriously ill. —A telegram briefly states that the British troops have entered and occupied Dongola, but the news is not very definite and requires confirmation. —Dr. Jaime Estrázulas, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, is still unwell, and it is said that his indisposition is taking a rather serious turn.

—A change has been made in the route of the Union tramcars. Instead of descending by Calle Zabala and ascending by Calle Colon, as hitherto, in future they will descend by Calle Colon and ascend Calle Zabala. We cannot state the object of the change.

LONDON NOTES.

TUESDAY, AUGUST 25
Earl Grey has sent an official telegram to the Chartered Company confirming the news of the great capitulation of Matabele chiefs to Mr. Rhodes. The surrender is believed to be unconditional. The parley took place at a spot 30 miles east of Bulawayo.

There is no definite news of a settlement of the Orlean difficulty, but the prospect seems to be more hopeful. The Orlean are not unwilling to accept the terms suggested by the Powers, but ask what guarantees will be given them. A Correspondent at Canea telegraphs that a Christian woman was murdered there by Bash Bazouks yesterday. At Salino Kastelli, in the south of the island, a body of insurgents is besieging a force of Turkish soldiers, and the Consuls at Canea have written to the Christians asking them to liberate the besieged.

A despatch from Melbourne says that the directors and auditors of the City of Melbourne Bank have been committed to trial on a charge of publishing false balance sheets. M. André has reached Tromsø, having definitely abandoned his attempt to reach the North Pole by balloon this year. The persistent adverse winds delayed his start till it was too late to make the experiment.

The Duke of Connaught yesterday, at Aldershot, presented the Ashanti decoration, which had been awarded by the Queen to officers and men serving in his command. The death of Lord de Mauley, at the age of 81, is announced. Whitehead, the discharged treason-felony prisoner, was welcomed last evening in his native place, Skibbereen, with great enthusiasm.

An exhibition of foreign goods sent from the Colonies as specimens of articles successfully competing with British manufactures, was opened yesterday at the offices of the London Chamber of Commerce, Eastcheap. The present collection has been furnished by the West Indies.

The fourth annual Laundry Exhibition at the Agricultural Hall, was commenced yesterday. Several cricket matches were more or less curtailed yesterday, owing to rain and the condition of the ground. At Lord's, in the return match between Middlesex and Sussex, play was in progress for only about fifty minutes, Sussex making 60 runs in that time for two wickets. At Tannou, the match between Somerset and the Australians was restricted to about two hours ten minutes, during which time Somerset scored 166 for five wickets. At Southampton, where Hampshire played Essex, the latter part of the afternoon was lost; Hampshire's first innings, however, was finished for 296 runs. The match between Lancashire and Nottingham, at Manchester, could not be begun before one o'clock owing to the state of the ground; Lancashire made a first innings' score of 284. At Tonbridge, Yorkshire made 184 in their first innings, and Kent 98. The match between Gloucestershire and Surrey, at Clifton, could not be started yesterday, and that between Warwickshire and Derbyshire, at Birmingham, was not begun until late in the afternoon.

An inquest was held at Aldershot yesterday on Squadron Sergeant-Major Murrant, or the 9th Lancers, who had shot himself, and a verdict of "Suicide while temporarily insane," was returned. The deceased had left a letter stating that he had gone wrong in his accounts, and could not meet Captain Finnes. The captain said there was a deficiency of 115/1, but the accounts were muddled, and he believed the deficit had arisen from carelessness, and not from dishonesty. The officers would have paid the amount, so that Murrant would not have lost his pension. The deceased was buried with full military honours.

The poor woman who a few days ago found 125/1 in Bank notes, and was not rewarded by the owner, was informed by Mr. Haunay yesterday, at Marlborough-street Police-court, that he had received 9/1 for her from a number of sympathisers.

An Italian who has been referred to as Leon, in connection with the mysterious Lambeth tragedy, was identified early on Sunday morning in Clerkenwell, and was taken into custody by the police, but was not detained. He gave the name of Eramani Marco. He was taken before the Coroner, and bound over to appear at the adjourned inquest on Thursday.

—The Custom House paid into the London Bank yesterday \$11,326 on account of the Consolidated Debt and Railway guarantee service, and \$1,384 on account of the 5 % Loan service.

—Gold opened in B. Aires yesterday at 278.50 and closed at 277.50. —Exchange upon London was quoted in Rio Janeiro yesterday at 89/16 to 5/8 d. per milreis. —The "Montevideo" brought from Salto yesterday \$500 to A. Molinari. —The "Eolo" brought from B. Aires \$13,970 to the Italian Bank. —Messrs. Williams and Co. have chartered the U.S. schooner Nimbus, 840 tons, to load dried hides for N. York at reserved rates.

—The "Obile" took yesterday \$5000 for Rio Janeiro, and 115,000 francs in gold for Paris. —Wheat continues to improve, and sellers now stipulate for \$2.20 and 2.25, 3000 bags maize for Brazil at \$0.86 with bag. —The quinta-house formerly belonging to Sr. Mateo Victoria, in the Agraciada, was sold to-day at auction on account of the National Bank Liquidation, being knocked down to R. Gurmendez, for A. Seré, for \$20,100. It has an area of 13,298.96 sq. metres and was valued at \$30,000, the upshot being 2/3.

—Sres. Azevedo, Mattos and Co., concessionaires for the fresh meat supply of Rio Janeiro, have contracted with Gutmann and Hermann for 3000 head of cattle monthly, to be bought by preference in Uruguay and shipped at Montevideo by all steamers taking live stock. Some 300 animals have already been bought on account of this important contract, and the first lots will go forward in the Norwegian steamers "Bratsberg" and "Olaf" which sail for Rio Janeiro this week.
