—Sr. Marcos Paz has resigned the Prefecture General of the ports.—B. A. Herald.

LONDON NOTES.

FRIDAY, MAY 15.

In the House of Commons yesterday Lord George Hamilton said he hoped to be able to day to make a statement with regard to the despatch of Indian troops to Suakin, and those already sent to Mombasa. The sitting was devoted to the Agricultural Land Rating Bill in Committee. Three amendments to Clause 1 were disposed of. At one point Mr. Chaplin moved the closure, but the Chairman did not put it. As the Government made no sufficient answer to a proposal by Mr. Chamberlain for securing an equal division of the rates between owner and occupier, Sir H. Fowler moved to report progress. This was agreed to.

Colonel Plumer arrived at Mombasa on Tuesday at the head of the first column advancing to the relief of Balawayo. The second was expected there yesterday. Further fighting has taken place outside Gwelo. Fifty of the natives were killed and a kraal was burnt, without casualty on the side of the colonists.

At the fourth session of the congressional Union yesterday, resolutions against the education bill now before Parliament, and in favour of International Arbitration, were passed with acclamation. The speakers being Mr. J. Carroll Williams, M. P., the Rev. Dr. Berry, Hirst, Hollwell, Dr. Guinness Rogers, and Mr. Haley Stewart. Dr. Berry defined their future suggested policy as to the 27th clause of the Bill, and their attitude as to the Home Rule question, declaring that by their vote on the Education Bill the Irish party had violated the principle which underlay Home Rule, and had postponed it to a day which could not be guessed. He would never again, he said, amid loud and continued cheers, consent to put Home Rule first. Mr. Hirst, Hollwell was also applauded when he said that under certain conditions they would not pay the Education Rate.

Sir Donald Currie, M. P., presided at the City Temple yesterday over the annual meeting of the Colonial Missionary Society, when it was shown that the revenue had doubled during the year. At a meeting in Exeter Hall on behalf of the London Missionary Society, Mr. John Wilson M. P., presiding, the subjects of native agency and women's work were discussed, the speakers including the Rev. J. G. Hawker (India), the Rev. C. G. Sparham (China), and Mrs. Armitage.

The Duke of Marlborough presided last evening at the festival dinner of the National Orthopaedic Hospital, at which the Duchess of Marlborough, who accompanied him, made her first appearance at a charitable function in this country.

The Australians opened their first match with an English county yesterday, when they met Essex, at Leyton. The home team batted first, scoring 166, to which the visitors responded with 78 for four wickets. At Lord's, the bowlers holding the upper hand, great progress was made with the match between the M. C. C. and Leicestershire. The county left off 112 runs on with two wickets to fall in their second innings. At Derby, the home county scored 349 for eight wickets against Surrey. Sussex played an innings of 267 at Manchester, against Lancashire, who responded with 124 for four wickets. Yorkshire dismissed Gloucestershire for 131, and put on 172 for five wickets. Mr. Webb's team ran up a total of 410 for nine wickets against Cambridge University, and at Oxford a match was commenced between the Twelve and Next Sixteen.

Mr. Justice Hawkins and a special jury yesterday continued the hearing of the case in which Mr. E. F. Briggs sought to recover from the Emir Hafiz 3,500l., which he alleged had been lent to the defendant under romantic circumstances. The plaintiff and his wife both emphatically denied that the money had been given. A witness was called, however who not only declared that the money had been given to the defendant, but that the plaintiff had more than once refused it when offers to return it had been made. This witness was under cross-examination when the Court rose.

Damages to the amount of 500l. were awarded in the Queen's Bench Division yesterday to Miss Ethel Holmes, in her action for breach of promise of marriage against Mr. Stewart Preston.

In the Divorce Division yesterday the evidence on Mrs. Hugh Watt's petition for a divorce from her husband, formerly M. P. for one of the divisions of Glasgow, was concluded. Mr. Watt went into the witness box and gave a denial to the allegations against him, and the proceedings were further adjourned.

Even men, all of whom received bad characters from the police, were convicted at the County of London Sessions yesterday of having robbed a woman named Elizabeth Bartholomew of 100l. worth of jewellery while she was at a house in Stamford-street, into which she had been inveigled. The prisoners were sent to

penal servitude—one for five years, a second for four and a half years, a third for four years, and the other two for three years, all to undergo three years' police supervision on their release.

SATURDAY, MAY 16.

In the House of Lords, yesterday, the Land Charges Bill, the Stamp Duties Bill, and the Short Titles Bill were advanced. Debate on the Chimney Sweepers Bill was adjourned.

In the Commons Mr. Ritchie replying to Sir H. Vincent, could hold out no hope that an Alien Immigration Bill would be introduced this session. Questioned by Mr. T. Bayley, Mr. Chamberlain said that Mr. Beit had tendered his resignation as a director of the Chartered Company, but he could not say whether it had been accepted. Lord G. Hamilton informed Mr. Buchanan that no charge would be made upon the revenues of India with respect to the employment of Indian troops at Mombasa, and said it would not be necessary, therefore, to submit a resolution on the subject to the House of Commons. But the ordinary pay of the Indian native troops under order for Surkim, would continue to be borne by the revenues of India, and a resolution would accordingly be moved shortly. The sitting was devoted to discussion of the Navy Estimates in Committee of Supply.

A telegram from Bulawayo states that the force of mounted men numbering 160, which left Colonel Napier's column yesterday morning to establish a heliograph station, came up with the Matabele in the neighbourhood of Teaba Induna. In the fighting which followed 80 of the enemy were killed.

A Commission of Inquiry is to go to Birlidji, by order of the Sultan, to supervise measures to enable the forced converts to Islamism to declare freely their religion and to perform Christian worship in security. Several hundreds of Armenians have been arrested in Constantinople during the past week, and the arrests continue in such numbers that another panic is feared.

Lord Rosebery addressed a public meeting at Newton Abbot last night, and in criticising the Education Bill said it was a measure which settled nothing and unsettled everything. The majority for the second reading was obtained under peculiar circumstances which left a deep and painful impression on his mind. The Agricultural Rating Bill conferred no benefits in proportion to the enormous tax which it made on the Imperial Exchequer. The Government had not touched the fringe of the subject, and agriculturists must look for relief, not to extravagant assistance to rates, but to the reduction of rent.

Speaking of colonial and foreign affairs he trusted that the policy to be pursued with regard to the Transvaal would be leisurely and not hurried. Nothing could be gained but much could be compromised by precipitation. With regard to the inquiry to be held, however, his view was exactly the reverse. In that matter promptitude was of the very essence. We owed the promptest, most searching, and most impartial inquiry, not merely to South Africa, Europe, and ourselves, but to the persons who were accused. As to Armenia, he claimed that the late Government had by securing the appointment of a special inquiry, left a good weapon to Lord Salisbury to insist upon justice being done. With regard to the future the greatest enemy which the Liberal Party had to overcome was that of apathy.

The Prince of Wales visited Cambridge yesterday, for the purpose of inspecting the University Volunteer Corps, of which he is honorary colonel. The ceremony took place after lunch in Caius College. In his speech to the regiment, the Prince paid a high compliment to the efficiency of the men, and dwelt on the pleasure he felt at being connected with them.

After considerable argument as to the admission of evidence tendered for the defendant on commission, at the hearing of the case of Briggs v. the Emir Hafiz yesterday, the Emir entered the witness-box and gave his version of the circumstances under which money had passed from Mr. Briggs to himself. He asserted that gifts had been made to him out of pure love and affection, and that he on his part had given Mrs. Briggs jewels and clothes, and had dressed her boy when he was going to school. After retreating for five minutes the jury returned a verdict for the plaintiff for the full amount claimed, 3,500l., with interest, which it was agreed should be 400l.
