



night ago, to be able to move about with the assistance of a stick.

Rejoicings continue over the Rio Grande pacification, and later telegrams seem a little less contradictory as to the terms. According to one given on the authority of President Moraes, the federals have definitely laid down their arms. The trouble now will be to keep the castilians in order. We would not advise the federals to repose too much faith in them.

The latest addition to serial literature is the "Badminton Magazine of Sports and Pastimes," a specimen copy of the first number of which has been sent us by the publishers, Longmans, Green and Co. The editor is Mr. E. T. Watson, a name well known in sporting circles. It is pleasantly illustrated, and full of bright matter of interest to the special but but numerous class of readers to which it appeals, and doubtless in time will be as popular as the "Badminton" library after which it is named. The price is one shilling monthly.

A Shanghai telegram reports that four of the ringleaders in the recent outrages on European missionaries have been executed. France, England and the United States have agreed to act in concert in the repression of the outrages, and Germany is expected to join. A later telegram states that two Spanish missionaries have been murdered at Hagan (?), and also that the mahomedan residents of Kausu have rebelled against the mandarins, and some bloody conflicts with the imperial troops have taken place.

The Custom House paid \$21,690 into the London Bank yesterday on account of the foreign debt service.

#### BUENOS AIRES.

The political pot is being kept boiling. Rear-Admiral Solier, Chief of the Naval Staff, has been summarily dismissed from his post, General Winter, Chief of the Military Staff will either resign or be dismissed. Colonel Bales, Minister of War and Marine has presented his resignation but the President of the Republic has not as yet accepted it. Meanwhile, about thirty Deputies held a private conference and appointed Deputies Demaria, Avellaneda and Godoy to visit the President in the name of the majority of the Chamber of Deputies, to inform him that the Committee of War would present a bill early in the week, with the consent of said majority, to the effect that the National Guard throughout the Republic is to enter into active service for not less than forty days. The candidates to replace Colonel Bales, are: Drs. Daniel Donovan and Miguel Cané, Señor G. Villanueva having declined to accept the portfolio. General Capdevilla will probably supersede General Winter and Captain Garcia Mansilla, Rear Admiral Solier.

The trial trip of the Steamer Carings, to test her new engines brought out by the s.s. Waterloo, was appointed to take place Saturday morning at 8 o'clock. Shortly after that hour the steamer Endeavour, entering Dock, collided with the Carings and damaged some of her bow plates. The damage was not however such as to prevent her proceeding on her trial-trip; but on entering the channel she was so unfortunate as to ground on buoy No. 2, where she was hard and fast at sunset.—Times of A.

#### LONDON NOTES.

MONDAY, JULY 29.

All the remaining polls, with four exceptions, were declared on Saturday. They showed that the Liberals had lost four seats—the Newmarket and Devizes Divisions to the Tories, and South-East Durham and the Skipton Division of Yorkshire to the Dissenters. Sir George Newnes was among the old members defeated, while Mr. Haldane and Mr. Aroch were among those re-elected. The four returns yet to come in are for North-East Derbyshire and Orkney and Shetland, both represented in the last Parliament by Liberals; and East Donegal and South Londonderry, which sent a Nationalist and Dissident Liberal respectively to the last Parliament.

In reply to correspondent who asked what line of policy Liberals should now pursue, Mr. Gladstone says that after his retirement his position does not allow him to enter on so wide a field. He adds, however, that he already given his advice in favour of dealing seriously with the grave question raised by the conduct of the House of Lords, and of restoring the honour of England and increasing the strength of the Empire by granting to Ireland what she has deliberately and constitutionally claimed.

A funeral service was held yesterday in St. John's in honour of two Bulgarian officers who were recently killed while fighting on the side of the Macedonian insurgents. The proceedings gave rise to a remarkable demonstration of sympathy with the Macedonians.

Dr. Farrar was installed Dean of Canterbury in Canterbury Cathedral on Saturday, the ceremony being of an extremely simple character. A large congregation was present.

At Plymouth, on Saturday, the pastoral sessions of the Wesleyan Conference were suspended that the Stationary Committee might complete the revision of the stations. A large number of changes were made. Sir Henry Irving brought his season at the Lyceum to a brilliant close on Saturday evening. In making his customary speech, he announced that he intended on his return to produce Shakespeare's "Coriolanus" and an English version of "Madame Sans-Gêne," in which Sardou's heroine would be impersonated by Miss Ellen Terry.

A railway disaster occurred in

Japan on Saturday by which over a hundred invalided soldiers lost their lives. A train which was taking four hundred soldiers from Hiroshima to Kobe was passing along a sea wall when, owing to a violent gale, the front portion got off the line and fell into the sea.

Early on Saturday morning the English steamships Cleveland and Duffield came into collision, in foggy weather, off Dover. The Cleveland sunk in a few minutes. Five of the crew were rescued by a passing vessel, and taken into Gravesend, while the Duffield arrived in the Tyne yesterday with five more of the crew of the foundered ship. The captain of the Cleveland was picked up by a French fishing boat and landed yesterday at Nieu Dieppe, but several of the crew remain unaccounted for.

Gloucestershire defeated Notts on the Trent Bridge Ground on Saturday by 135 runs. At Southampton, Hampshire scored a victory over Essex by 171 runs.

Messrs. Cook and Son, the well-known tourist agents, obtained judgment against Mrs. Jackson in the Queen's Bench Division on Saturday for 43s. 7d., a sum which, through a mistake on the part of a cashier, they had failed to take from her in exchange for a French draft. The cashier had taken 115s. 10s. 4d. instead of 158s. 17s. 9d.

In the Divorce Division on Saturday, a consultation between counsel for the parties in the suit of Bastard v. Bastard and Brunton, in which the Queen's Proctor had intervened to prevent the decree previously obtained by Mr. Bastard from being made absolute, led to the termination of the case. The charge made against Mr. Bastard of conniving at the misconduct of his wife was withdrawn; but that of conduct conducive to the offence was held to be proved, and on that he consented to judgment being entered against him. Consequently the Queen's Proctor was successful in his intervention, and the decree nisi was rescinded.

At the Thames Police-court on Saturday Mr. James Lawson Silver, editor and manager of the "Eastern Post," was fined £10 for libelling Mr. J. W. Benn, who unsuccessfully contested St. George-in-the-East at the recent Parliamentary election.

TUESDAY, JULY 30.

The result of the poll taken in North-east Derbyshire on Saturday was declared yesterday. Mr. T. D. Bolton, Liberal, was re-elected by a majority of 527. Only three members have now to be returned in order to complete the new Parliament—for East Donegal and South Londonderry, where the polling took place yesterday, and Orkney and Shetland, where the poll is to be held on August 8 and 7.

The Congress of the British Medical Association will meet in London to-day, the engagements extending to the end of the week. Twenty-two years have passed since the last gathering in London, and it is anticipated that this week members and the ladies accompanying them will number six thousand, as compared with about two thousand present at the meeting of 1873.

The proceedings of the International Geographical Congress at the Imperial Institute yesterday were of an extremely interesting character. The papers and discussions related to Arctic and Antarctic exploration. On the latter subject Dr. John Murray expressed a strong view that the South Polar region is not a chain of volcanic islands, but a great Antarctic continent, and a demand was made for international action with a view to further exploration. Herr Andree, of Stockholm, propounded a plan for reaching the North Pole by means of a balloon.

Representative Sessions of the Wesleyan Conference were commenced yesterday morning in King-street Chapel, Plymouth, under the chairmanship of Dr. Waller, President, who, in the course of his address of welcome, referred to the subject of elementary education, and expressed the opinion that no additional aid could be given from national sources unless there was adequate popular representation. Dr. John Cropper, of Manchester, was chosen to accompany the President as a representative to the Irish Conference to be held next year.

A Skibbereen Correspondent gives particulars of a boating disaster, two miles off Baltimore. A party of twenty-one pleasure seekers were on a fishing lugger, manned by a crew of six, when a fire broke out in the hold, and a panic ensued. Nine of the occupants are missing, and it seems certain that they have been drowned.

After the heavy rain of Sunday batsmen yesterday found run getting difficult, not only in London, but in the matches played in different parts of the country. As a consequence the aggregate scores were as a rule small, the most striking exception being at Birmingham, where Lancashire put together 340 for the loss of nine men. Yorkshire, at Bradford, left off with a distinct advantage in their contest with Gloucestershire, after having been themselves disposed of for 76, whilst Surrey rendered a much better account of themselves against Derbyshire than they did in the match played a few days ago.

In the Court of Bankruptcy yesterday there was a public examination of Mr. William O'Brien, formerly M. P. for Cork city, against whom a receiving order was made on the petition of Mr. Chance, solicitor, who claimed in respect of the costs of the unsuccessful action for libel against the Marquis of Salisbury.

Mr. C. O. Lewis resumed the inquest at Canning Town, yesterday, on the body of Elizabeth Harrison Coombes, who is said to have been murdered at Plaistow by one of her sons, a lad of fourteen. A second son, aged twelve, gave evidence as to the circumstances of the murder, and as

to what he and his brother did after the crime had been committed. The inquiry was then further adjourned. Police-constable Eaton appeared yesterday before the Highgate Bench to answer an adjourned summons, charging him with assaulting Mrs. Wackerbarth, a lady cyclist, whose case lately attracted some notice. He had endeavoured to stop her in order to serve a summons in connection with an assault she was charged with committing during the previous week. The Bench had already decided that if the constable had legal authority to stop her he used no more violence than was necessary. They now held that he had technically committed an assault, and he was accordingly ordered to pay a nominal fine of one shilling. It was agreed to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
