

—Mr. Reinhardt, the well known engineer and machinist of Santa Fé, was killed while boarding a train at Esperanza, by falling under the car wheels. Mr. Reinhardt took an active part in the disturbances in Humboldt arising out of the tax on cereals.

—The Hospital is undergoing extensive improvements. Two large wards are being constructed with ample accommodation for 20 patients in each, which number might in cases of emergency be increased to thirty. The Hospital is located on a high and healthy site and when the addition and improvements are completed it will be equipped with every modern convenience which medical science has devised. The capacity will be from 450 to 500 patients of all kinds of diseases except for those of a contagious character.

—The Minister of Finance has sent a note to the Public Works Department that the expenses of the Port Works are not to exceed, this year, the sum of \$1,000,000.

—The Commissions appointed to consider and report on the system of pensions and the revision of the tariff of values have been suppressed. The latter work is to be executed by the Board of Revenue.

—The family of Lucidoro Durante, the cashier of Señores DellaCia and Cohat the corner of Snipacha and Cangallo, are convinced that Señor Durante's tragic death was caused by the hand of an assassin and have asked to police to investigate the matter. Mr. Durante's good health and jovial and communicative disposition, and his financial prosperity remove every plausible reason for his taking his own life. At the time of his death he was engaged in making improvements upon his house in the city as well as at his beautiful quinta. Only 110 dollars was found on his person, while he was accustomed to carry large sums of money in his pockets. This fact would suggest a robbery.

—Bishop Fitzgerald, of the American Methodist Episcopal Church, is expected to arrive here in a few days to preside at the second session of the South American Conference of that Church. This distinguished Bishop will be accompanied by his family. The above mentioned Conference will be held in this City.

—A new proof of the friendly relations between Brazil and Argentina is now manifested by the attitude of the Brazilian Government in removing the duty on live stock. Minister Abbott has demonstrated to his Government the injustice of imposing a tax duty on cattle when so much risk attends their shipment, occasioned principally by the strict quarantine regulations.

—The maize crop along the line of the Southern Railway promises to be unusually large. In Las Flores alone, there will be more than a million fanegas. The Southern Railway will be taxed to its utmost capacity to bring the crop to market. —B. A. Herald.

LONDON NOTES.

THURSDAY, JAN. 10.

Mr. Edmund Robertson, Civil Lord of the Admiralty, addressed his constituents at Dundee last night on the subject of the Navy. He said that the scheme sanctioned last year by the House of Commons was only part of a complete programme to extend over several years, and that Earl Spencer and the present Board of Admiralty were fully alive to the naval needs of the country. The rapidity with which the magnificent, the majestic, and other vessels had been pressed forward showed that in the speed with which ships could now be turned out this country had a resource of immense value. With the increase of ships there had been a great increase in men and in the expenditure on works, such as docks for accommodation. While there was a determination to maintain our naval supremacy he yet felt that any arrangement with foreign naval powers for stopping further increase all round would be welcomed. On this point he viewed with satisfaction our improved relations with Russia.

Mr. Pickard, M. P., presided over the second day's proceedings of the annual conference of the Miners' Federation of Great Britain, in Birmingham. Resolutions were passed protesting against public bodies permitting the nonfulfilment of contracts by masters on account of any stoppage consequent upon an attempt to reduce wages, declaring against compulsory boards of arbitration, and emphatically endorsing a new draft Eight Hours Bill. Mr. Woods suggested that in the coming session all members in favour of the measure should be requested to ballot for it.

At a mass meeting of several thousands of working people at the Lambeth Baths last evening the massacres in Armenia were denounced, and resolutions were adopted expressing indignation at the Porte's continued violation of the principles of humanity and defiance of international obligations, urging vigorous action by the Powers to secure permanent improvement in Armenia, and demanding that consular reports should be published giving details of the atrocities. Speeches were delivered by Mr. E. H. Bayley, M. P., chairman; Professor Agar Beet, Mr. E. Aikin, Mr. F. S. Stevenson, M. P., Mr. Hagopian, and others. A telegram was read from Armenians in Paris thanking them for holding the meeting.

The trial of Madame Joniaux was continued at Antwerp yesterday. The prisoner was further interrogated at great length by the President of the Court, the interrogatory turning chiefly upon the insurance policies which Madame Joniaux took out on the life of her sister Léonie, and upon the circumstances of the latter's death on February 25th last year. The prisoner warmly protested against the suggestion that she had speculated upon the death of her sister. She also repudiated indignantly the charge of poisoning Léonie with morphine. At the afternoon sitting the examination was directed principally to the circumstances under which M. Van den Kerchove, the prisoner's uncle, died suddenly on the 18th of March, 1893, having dined with M. and Mme. Joniaux on the previous evening. The accused denied all previous knowledge of M. Van den Kerchove's will and repudiated the charge of having administered poison, stating that her uncle, on the occasion of the dinner in question, was served with wine and coffee only by the maid who waited at table. She accounted for the fact that she had had quantities of atropine in her possession by stating that it had been purchased by the doctor's orders for an affection of the eyes from which both she and her husband had suffered. The case was adjourned till Friday.

Yesterday, at the Central Criminal Court Frederick Glencross was convicted of having obtained money from several women whom he had promised to marry, under circumstances which the Common Serjeant characterised as the most flagrant that had ever come before him. He was sentenced to ten years' penal servitude. At the same Sessions a young shoemaker was ordered to undergo twelve months' imprisonment and receive fifteen lashes for highway robbery with violence.

A woman of sixty-five, named Mary Melville, said to be well connected and of good education, was convicted at the County of London Sessions of shiplifting. Sir Peter Edlin sentenced her to sixteen months' hard labour, to pay the costs of the prosecution, and to be under police supervision for three years.

FRIDAY, JAN. 11.

With the exception of Mr. John Morley and Mr. Campbell-Bannerman, all the Ministers were present at the Cabinet Council held yesterday in Downing-street.

Sir F. Lockwood, Solicitor-General, was the principal speaker at a great demonstration of Heywood Liberals last night. At the outset he declared that the Liberals had taken up Home Rule because they believed that it was the only possible form of government for the sister island. He next made light of rumours respecting Ministerial resignations, and paid high tribute to the work which Lord Rosebery and Sir William Harcourt had accomplished. He could understand Mr. Chamberlain's demand for a dissolution, as next session some awkward questions for him would be raised, especially in relation to Welsh Disestablishment. Sir Frank concluded with an argument against the present position of the House of Lords, declaring that the will of the people, as expressed by their representative House, must prevail.

The Court of Common Council held a special meeting at the Guildhall yesterday to consider the report of their Special Committee on the Unification proposals. Mr. Alderman Faudel Phillips, in moving the adoption of this report, said that the advantages of upholding the Corporation and its views, with the form of government that it suggested might be, in his opinion, thus enumerated: (1) The attainment of a reduction in the amount of rates. (2) The wider development of local interest in local affairs. (3) A barrier to the autocracy of paid officials. (4) The prompt and effective adjustment of local difficulties by those immediately interested. In the discussion which followed, Mr. R. Stapley said it was feared by those who opposed Unification that if the old Corporation and the new County Council were put in the melting pot, the new Council that would come out would be more like the new body than the old. The report was unanimously adopted.

The annual meeting of the Headmasters' Association took place at Grocers' Hall yesterday, the Rev. Dr. Poole, of Bedford, in the chair. Established in 1890, with only forty members, the Association has now 288, about half the headmasters in England. During the day it was formally dissolved and then reformed as an incorporated body. The members were entertained at lunch by the Grocers' Company, whose master (Mr. Emanuel Goodhard) presided.

Major Cardew, on behalf of the Board of Trade, held an inquiry yesterday, at the St. Pancras Vestry Hall, with regard to the recent explosion in the Easton-road. Evidence was given in support of the opinion that it was occasioned by a spark igniting coal gas that had escaped into the main-boiler, but statements were made in opposition to this on behalf of the Gas Light and Coke Company.

A telegram from Calcutta states that the Mehtar of Chitral has been murdered by his brother, who has established himself in power. The murdered ruler was placed on the throne by the British. Six of the Mehtar's brothers have met their deaths at the hands of assassins.

The French Chamber yesterday rejected the motion of M. Millerand in favour of the liberation of M. Géraud-Richard, the newly-elected deputy for Paris, by 309 votes to 218.

A Vienna Correspondent reports that a snowstorm of exceptional severity has stopped railway traffic over extensive districts in Austria. Many trains remain on the lines, snowed up. In the capital the snow fell during Wednesday night to a great depth, and rendered locomotion difficult yesterday.

In spite of the severe winter couple of good football matches were played yesterday. Midland Counties beat Kent in the Rugby championship by two tries to one while Berks and Bucks Association defeated Sussex by three goals to one.

Shareholders in the South Eastern Railway Company met specially at the Cannon-street Hotel yesterday, when Sir George Russell, M. P., on behalf of the committee who recently conducted the negotiations with the board of the London, Chatham, and Dover Company, explained the policy of the directors. He congratulated the shareholders on the fact that for the first time in thirty years they had established friendly relations with the Chatham and Dover Company, with the most beneficial results to both lines. The directors believed that the true policy of the board was to serve the public well, and that was the policy they intended to pursue. Ultimately a resolution declaring confidence in the board, and expressing satisfaction with the peaceful relations between the two companies, was carried.
