

Mr. Frederic Impay and Colonel Wigram Long were nominated for the Evesham Division yesterday in the Liberal and Conservative interest respectively.

Sir George Trevelyan, addressing his constituents in Glasgow last night, advocated reform of the Parliamentary machinery, the payment of members, the abolition of plural voting, and the taxation of ground values. He then went on to show how the House of Lords, led by Lord Salisbury, opposed all reform, and declared that the Liberal party was determined to set itself and the House of Commons free from the contention that no Liberal Government was henceforth to pass Liberal measures.

We regret to state that while addressing a political meeting in Glasgow last night, the Duke of Argyll was suddenly seized with illness, and fainted on the platform. He was removed amid a scene of great excitement. His condition remained so serious that three medical men were summoned.

Down to a late hour last night the quantity of water in the flooded mine at Audley was still increasing. During the afternoon, after consultation, the engineers had reluctantly to withdraw the exploring parties, who had worked without intermission through the night. A report was circulated that tapping had been heard in the mine, but no confirmation of this could be obtained. It is feared that there are still a hundred men entombed, though hope is not yet abandoned that the majority of them may ultimately be rescued. Most distressing scenes have been witnessed at the pit head, where remarkable instances of narrow escape have also been narrated.

A series of meetings, commencing at nine in the morning, took place yesterday in celebration of the centenary of the London Missionary Society, or rather of the assembly on the 15th January, 1795, of the fifteen ministers who, at the Castle and Falcon Inn, Aldergate-street, resolved to form an unsectarian society to send to Christian religion to the heathen. Instead of fifteen, 150 met at breakfast yesterday at the Castle and Falcon, on the invitation of the treasurer of the Society, Mr. Albert Spicer, and a few London directors. The public meeting, which was held at the City Temple in the evening, was attended by a large and enthusiastic audience. The Rev. Dr. Berry, the Rev. Dr. Pentecost, and the Rev. James Chalmers were among the speakers. During the proceedings the Rev. A. N. Johnson announced that the centenary fund had reached nearly 45,000, and that the meeting of directors on the subject of the forward movement had been adjourned till this morning.

At the meeting of the London County Council yesterday an animated debate took place upon a recommendation to sanction the payment of a sum in excess of the original estimate for painting Hammersmith Bridge, a work that was carried out a year ago by the Works Committee. Mr. Beachcroft, having compared the amount with that previously paid to a contractor, and complained that the work had been done at a season when painting operations were especially expensive, Mr. Sidney Webb quoted from a recent election manifesto of the Metropolitan Union of Conservative Associations, which stated that the Moderate candidates were in favour of the payment of fair wages, and of the Council starting works in winter. Mr. Beachcroft thereupon denied that the document was the programme of the Moderate party. Sir John Lubbock, M. P., defended the policy of the Council in doing away with contractors. The recommendation was agreed to.

At a large and influential meeting of ship-owners and others, presided over by Sir Donald Currie at the Shipping Exchange last evening, a resolution was adopted urging the Board of Trade to withdraw the new rules of the road at sea in regard to side lights and sound signals.

The English cricketers at Adelaide were defeated yesterday by 382 runs. Stoddart carried off his bat for a well-played 34. Ford contributed 14 and Richardson 12, while Briggs failed to score and Lockwood only made a single.

A telegram from Massawah states that a battle has taken place between the Italian, commanded by General Baratieri and the Abyssinians, under Ras Mangascia. The Abyssinians, who numbered considerably more than 10,000, sustained heavy losses.

Yesterday the official journal at Berlin published the sentences passed recently upon the non-commissioned officers of the Gungnery School for insubordination. One hundred and thirty were condemned to six weeks and one day's imprisonment, and thirty-one to terms ranging from six weeks to nine months. Ten of the latter are to be degraded, as are two others sentenced to five years' imprisonment.

The trial of Madame Joniaux was continued yesterday at Antwerp. The proceedings opened with a scientific tournament between the medical experts for the prosecution and those for the defence, a direct conflict of opinion between them manifesting itself on important points. M. Depaire, chemist, and Dr. Stienen, who are called as witnesses for the defence, contradicted the statements of the experts on the other side, pointed out various discrepancies, and affirmed that the report made by the professors of medical jurisprudence and other experts presented many gaps in the chain of evidence. Dr. Stienen affirmed that Alfred Ably had died of heart disease just as cate-

gorically as Dr. Van Vyve, police surgeon, asserted the contrary, and he was supported in this by Dr. Dallemagne, who declared that typhoid fever and apoplexy were the causes of death in the cases of Léonie Ably and M. Van Den Karchove respectively. M. Gobert, an expert in handwriting connected with the Bank of France, declared that an anonymous letter demanding money which was received by M. Georges Ably at Lionel Ably's houses in 1890 was in the handwriting of the accused, while he was also of opinion that a letter sent to Mme. Joniaux and purporting to come from a M. Bauwens, a stockbroker, was an invention, the handwriting, he believed, being that of Mme. Joniaux disguised.

In the Divorce Division yesterday Sir Francis Jeune and a special jury commenced the hearing of a suit in which Mr. J. S. Hawtin, a hatter at Banbury, sought a divorce by reason of the alleged adultery of his wife with Mr. Llewellyn Wynne, Conservative candidate for the Banbury Division of Oxfordshire, against whom damages were claimed. Mr. Wynne not only denied the charge but alleged that it was brought with the object of extorting money from him. Some singular statements having been made, the proceedings were adjourned.

Mr. Plowden, at the Marylebone Police-court, decided, in the prosecution of Mr. Whiteley for an alleged infringement of the Merchandise Marks Act, that the use of the word "flannelette" was not intended to deceive, and did not deceive the public so as to make them believe that the material contained wool. He accordingly dismissed the case, with costs to the defendant. Notice of appeal was given.

Arthur Fasnacht, the music-hall singer, charged with the murder of his wife at Haggerston, was again brought before the magistrate at the North London Police-court, when the medical evidence went to show that death might as easily have occurred from the deceased falling about as from blows inflicted upon her by the prisoner. On this, Mr. Lane thought that no jury would convict, and ordered the discharge of the accused.

A remarkable case came before the Reading magistrates yesterday, when a man who described himself as an army captain, and who elected to be tried under the name of Montag, among other aliases, was charged with bigamy. In a letter to his second wife, he confessed that he had gone through a form of marriage with several women. He was committed for trial on this charge, and also on another of theft.

There were 2,922 births and 1,622 deaths in London last week, the births being 45 in excess, and the deaths 819 below the average for the same week of the last ten years. The death-rate per thousand, 17.4 in the preceding week, rose last week to 19.3. During the four weeks ending on Saturday, however, the death-rate averaged 17.8 per 1,000, or 8.2 per 1,000 less than the mean rate in the same period of the ten years 1885-94. There were only 12 deaths from scarlet fever, 34 from diphtheria, and 16 from enteric fever. Those from diseases of the respiratory organs rose to 389, but were still 454 below the average for the week. There were 18 deaths from influenza.

Between the 1st of April and the 12th January the receipts into the Exchequer amounted to 66,197,977, as compared with 63,235,496 in the corresponding period of the last financial year; and the expenditure to 74,900,268, as against 72,390,271. On Saturday last the Treasury balances stood at 980,640, and on the same day in the previous year at 1,190,551.

PROTESTANTISM IN SPAIN

MADRID, JAN. 14.

The subject of the consecration by the Archbishop of Dublin, Lord Plunket, of Señor Cabrera as Bishop of the Reformed Church in Spain came up again for discussion in the Chamber of Deputies to-day, when the Marquis del Vadillo interpellated the Government on the matter. He argued that the constitutional laws had been violated by the act of consecration on the part of a Protestant prelate. It was not a question of toleration. An attempt had been made to establish the principle of freedom of worship, and to afford a legal status to a Protestant hierarchy in Spain. Not indeed that the episcopal title conferred by Lord Plunket was of any value, but the intention remained the same. The speaker drew attention to the fact that the action of the Archbishop of Dublin had not been approved by the Anglican bishops, but in his opinion, this disapproval was only to be ascribed to sectarian rivalry. He (the Marquis del Vadillo) considered it shameful on the part of Lord Plunket, whom he called "the genius of evil," to select Spain as the arena for disputes on questions connected with Anglican propaganda. Señor Maura, the Minister of Justice, in reply, stated that in his opinion, there had been no violation of the laws of the land, inasmuch as the ceremony of consecration had taken place within the walls of a Protestant building which did not communicate with the public streets. The Government considered that the consecration conveyed to Señor Cabrera no political status, for he was no more a bishop after ceremony than before it. The debate was adjourned.

THE INSUBORDINATION OF GERMAN OFFICERS.
BERLIN, JAN. 15.
The official "Reichsanzeiger" this evening publishes the sentences passed by the Court-Martial recently held upon the non-commissioned

officers of the Gungnery School, who were arrested in Berlin at the end of September last on charges of insubordination and sent to the fortress of Magdeburg. One hundred and thirty-one of the accused were condemned to six weeks and one day's imprisonment for disobedience and thirty-one to terms of imprisonment varying from six weeks to nine months for disobedience, disrespect, individual and collective, to their superiors, and for threats, ten of these being at the same time degraded. One non-commissioned officer was sentenced to five years' imprisonment for inciting others to insubordination and for disrespect to his superiors, while another of the accused was sent to prison for five years and five months for disobedience, disrespect, and incitement. The two last mentioned were also degraded.

PRAYING FOR O'RELL

In his latest book, "John Bull & Co.," Max O'Rell tells this story about himself:—I had just returned to the hotel after having given a lecture on the Scotch at the town hall. I was half-dressed, when there came a knock at my bedroom door. It was a waiter bearing a card; the Presbyterian minister of the town wished to see me at once on a very urgent matter. I bid the waiter show the reverend gentleman up. A man of about fifty, in the usual black ecclesiastical coat and white cravat, and holding a soft felt hat, appeared in the doorway, wearing a sad face. I recognised him as one of my audience that evening.

"Excuse my costume," I began; "but you wished to speak to me on urgent business, and I thought best not to make you wait."

"There is nothing the matter with your dress," he broke in; "this is not an affair of the body, but of the soul. I have come to pray for you."

I was taken a little by surprise and felt a trifle disconcerted, but I quickly regained my composure. "Way, certainly," I said; "with the greatest pleasure, if it can make you happy."

He knelt, put his elbows on the bed, buried his head in his hands, and began: "Lord, this man whom thou seest near me is not a sinful man; he is suffering from the evil of the century; he has not been touched by Thy grace, he is a stranger, come from a country where religion is turned to ridicule. Grant that his travels through our godly land may bring him into the narrow way that leads to everlasting life."

The prayer, most of which I spare you, lasted at least ten minutes. When he had finished, my visitor rose and held out his hand. I shook it.

"And now," said I "allow me to pray for you."

He signified consent by a movement of the hand. I did not go on my knees, but with all the fervour that is in me. I cried: "Lord, this man whom thou seest beside me is not a sinful man. Have mercy upon him, for he is a Pharisee who doubts not for one moment, and that without knowing me, that he is better than I, Thou, who has sent in vain Thy Son on earth to cast out the Pharisees, let Thy grace descend upon this one; teach him that the foremost Christian virtue is charity, and that the greatest charity is that which teaches us that we are no better than our brethren. This man is blinded by pride; convince him, open his eyes, pity him. Amen."

I looked at my good Presbyterian. He was rooted to the floor, amazed, written no his face. I once more took his hand and shook it.

"And now," said I, "we are quits. Good-night." He went away somewhat abashed; pocketing the mild reproach.
