—On Saturday afternoon, a young lady named Antonia Berio, aged 23, living in San Ramon 30, was waiting in the Central Station, when she was seized with a fainting fit which proved fatal in a few minutes, notwithstanding the prompt attention of Dr. Edey who happened to be on the spot. She was about to proceed to Bella Vista, to the dance being given at the Centro Artesano that evening.

—London telegrams give the Anglo Russian conflict over the Chinese railways as entirely terminated—until next time.

—Her Majesty has arrived safely at Nice, where she will remain some four or five weeks.

—To day being the birthday of the King of Italy, there will be a reception in the Italian Legation, festivities in several of the Italian societies, and the Italian residents will be allowed to fly their national flag.

—The golf season at Punta Carretas was opened on Sunday—in unpleasantly warm weather for the game—by a match between Captain's and Secretary's sides. The latter won by 32 holes to 13; Fraser beat Frederick by 12; Reid beat Calder by 13; Crocker beat N. Jones by 7. On the other side Capt. Gamble beat Richards by 3; Dunbar beat Dr. Chambers by 8; Lane beat Bowles by 2. Next Sunday there will be a sealed handicap, commencing at 2 p. m., entries to be taken on the ground.

LONDON NOTES

MONDAY, FEB. 13.
The Duke of Connaught laid the foundation stone of the great dam across the Nile, near Assuan, yesterday. Messages were sent to the Queen and the Khedive.

Herr von Bulow, Minister of Foreign Affairs at Berlin, in a speech delivered in the Reichstag on Saturday, emphasised the continued existence of cordial relations between Germany and the United States notwithstanding the mischievous attempts made by the Yellow Press to misrepresent the attitude of the Imperial Government.

On opening new technical schools at Kingston on Saturday the Lord Chief Justice spoke of these schools as supplying the place of the old system of apprenticeship which had been superseded by modern subdivision of labour. On the subject of honest trading, referred to an address which was presented to him. Lord Russell expressed his intention to introduce a Bill into Parliament for checking the evil of illicit commission.

On Saturday evening Dr. Conan Doyle gave readings from his books at Toynbee Hall. Most of his selections were from "The Exploits of Brigadier Gerard."

Four persons were injured in an alarming railway collision which occurred on Saturday night near Glasgow, between a Glasgow and South Western express and a Caledonian mineral train were proceeding in the same direction on the same set of rails, and the express ran with such violence into the rear of the goods train as to knock three vans, one of them the guard's van, over an embankment into what is known as the Hag's Road. The guard was cut about the head, but was only slightly injured. Three of the passengers in the express were also injured, but were able to proceed to their homes.

Severe gales were experienced in most parts of the Kingdom on Saturday, and again at intervals throughout yesterday, the strong gust being accompanied at times by heavy driving rain. In the

mes valley and other low-lying inland parts floods were increasing. At some of the seaports the effects of the gale was serious. In the Bristol Channel a tidal wave of 40 feet was experienced, which rushed with great force over the sea wall near Swansea, flooding houses and surmounting great tracts of country. The permanent way of the Great Western Railway near was considerably damaged. Terrible weather in the Atlantic was reported by incoming steamers.

The weather in America continues to be of extraordinary severity. Thousands of persons are reported to be starving in New York.

Another round of the competition for the Football Association Cup was run through on Saturday. The matches aroused widespread interest, and huge crowds assembled at the various grounds. Notts Forest, the holders, managed to beat Everton, but Notts County lost to Southampton, and this result was the great surprise of the afternoon. Tottenham Hotspur beat Sunderland, Derby County beat Wolverhampton, and West Bromwich and Liverpool also won their games. Two matches were drawn. It leaked out after the match at Tottenham that Sunderland had lodged a protest against Tottenham for some breach of the by-laws of the competition. In the Amateur Cup ties there were no drawn games, and the winners included the Old Malvernians and the Casuals, Corinthians v. Aston Villa, at the Queen's Club, ended in a draw.

Matters were quiet in Rugby football. In the far North there was a county championship match won by Northumberland against Cumberland, while near home there were one or two club games of some interest. London Scottish beat the Richmond Club, Cambridge University lost to Blackheath, and Oxford University beat Croydon.

The country is, as he states, fast being driven mad by all kinds of absurd taxation and the license tax is only a sample, though a very bad one. Mr. Bonati points out that if a house sends out agents and place its wares in the interior it would have to pay license to a value of 7 or 3 thousand dollars. Naturally this is a terrific wet-blanket on business, and the abuse is so vigorously alive that a principal cannot visit his camp agents without being asked to take out a patent or in lieu thereof to visit the local Justice. It is high time that the abuse be cut off root and branch, and those who have interest in bastening on the correction, every business man in Buenos Aires we presume, would do well to communicate with Mr. Bonati at 25 Calle 25 de Mayo.»

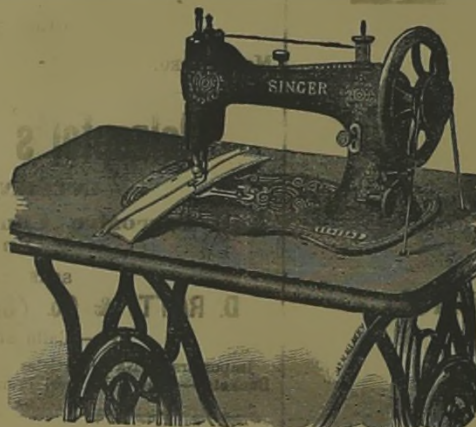
