questions as to any personal habits or other causes that might have contributed to longevity. The late railway magnate's answers to our queries were curiously negative, and, at the same time, quite as curiously suggestive of the man of a single purpose in life. We asked twelve questions. Sir Richard Moon answered nine of them by a simple "no." He had no fixed hours for meals or recreation; no particular diet; no personal habits likely to affect health; had no sort of hobby, no form of exercise. He could make no statement as to anything that might account for his attaining his great age, and did not believe that heredity had anything to do with the matter. He could not say even that he had any regular time for sleep, though, when it was possible, he was most regular in his time of going to bed and getting up. But the amount of sleep he required, he said, varied a good deal with his work. As to holidays, Sir Richard Moon's were very few, he said, and occasional, and what he did get were not free from business, which probably meant that when he was not inspecting his own railway he was picking up ideas from somebody else's. He never smoked, and, though he was not a teetotaler, his own rule of life seems to have been moderation in all things—except in work and in devotion to the London and North-Western, and then, by all accounts, he was usually altogether immoderate. In short, he was a railway man totally absorbed in his work, and all his habits, whether they tended to long life or short, were subservient to his railway engagements.

LONDON NOTES.

WEDNESDAY, DEC. 13.
Sir Thomas Sutherland, M.P., informed a meeting of the P. and O. shareholders yesterday that the Company's ships had conveyed 11,000 troops to South Africa. He was sorry that it had been impossible for the directors to offer their mail steamers to the Government. During a considerable portion of the Crimean War a part of the mail service of the Company had been suspended in order that the ships might be used by the Government, but nowadays that was, of course, impossible.

In an address to the Liberal Forward Club last night on the future of the Liberal party, Mr. Atterley Jones, M.P., held that any leader who would lead the party in demolition of the Church, the removal of the drink traffic, and Land Reform would do much to deliver the party from its present difficulties.

Yesterday the London County Council decided, on the recommendation of its Theatres Committee, and amid a scene of animation and confusion, that no action be taken with reference to Sunday concerts at Queen's Hall, the Paragon Theatre of Varieties, and the Montpelier Music Hall. Sir H. Poland, Mr. Burns, and others protested against the matter being dealt with at the end of the sitting, when time did not admit of an explanation of the Council's altered attitude. Probate of the will of the late Mr. John Grettton, a director of Bass, Ratcliff, and Grettton, brewers, of Burton-on-Trent, has been granted; the estate being valued at £28,834.60.

By a fire which occurred in Shadwell late on Monday night five children were burned to death. The other break occurred at an oil shop. Another family were, by the device of a car-man, rescued from the upper portion of the building.

Snow and frost were general throughout the United Kingdom yesterday.

THURSDAY, DEC. 14.

The first consignment of her Majesty's New Year's gift to her troops in South Africa will be dispatched on Saturday. The boxes bear a medallion portrait of the Queen, and the words, "I wish you a happy New Year, Victoria, R. L."

Amidst a scene of great enthusiasm the transport Majestic left Liverpool yesterday with troops for the Cape. Lord Rosebery, speaking at Epsom, last night, expressed the opinion that the present House of Commons was dull. There was, moreover, diminished public interest in the proceedings of Parliament, a change partly due to the possession of an overwhelming majority by one party, but partly also traceable to a more staple cause—the increased attractiveness of local bodies, such as the county and district councils.

Yesterday the General Committee of the National Liberal Federation met at Manchester. Mr. Birrell, M.P., moved a resolution recognising the necessity for the vigorous prosecution of the war, but deploring the manner in which the negotiations had been

conducted, and reserving full right of criticism. An amendment moved by Mr. Rowntree, of Scarborough, declaring that the war might have been avoided by wise statesmanship, was carried by 114 votes to 94. A second amendment was rejected by a large majority. Three resolutions on franchise questions were carried. Owing to the lateness of the hour the subject of the housing of the working classes was not discussed.

South Edinburgh Liberal Association last night adjourned their annual meeting out of respect for the memory of General Wainwright. Mr. Dewar, M.P., whose opponent General Wainwright was at the recent election in South Edinburgh, briefly referred to the sad event.

Cambridge won the University Rugby match, at the Queen's Club yesterday, by two goals and four tries to nothing. This is the highest score made by Cambridge against Oxford in the twenty seven years of the match. The record is now—ten wins each, with seven games drawn. Oxford, although much the weaker side, played very courageously, but were very poor at full back. There were 6,000 spectators despite the bitterly cold weather.
