POLITICAL NOTES.

Neither of the Chambers sat on Saturday. Notwithstanding the important matters awaiting decision, from the Budget downwards, they seem in no hurry to settle down to work. Even in the worst periods of "collectivism," we doubt if there were Chambers so neglectful of business as the present.

The taking of office by the new Minister of Finance Dr. Duart has been deferred until this afternoon. Something strange has happened with Col. Buist. It will be remembered that some eight or ten days ago, on account of serious charges of irregularities and abuses, Col. Buist was suspended in his post as Chief of the 1st Cavalry, and an investigation ordered. One of the papers stated that Col. Buist was not so much to blame as the officers under him, who had continued former malpractices, such as mulcting the men's pay, treating them cruelly, and so forth. Col. Buist was ordered to present himself in the capital. As he failed to appear, an order was sent for his arrest. The Frontier Commandant now reports that he has been unable to carry out the order, as Col. Buist has fled to Entre Rios (Argentina) after having transferred all his property to his mother (who owns an estancia near Salto). According to the *Nacion*, his responsibilities not only embrace serious administrative irregularities, but he is also concerned in "very suspicious political manoeuvres" which have been denounced to the Government in a letter from officers of his regiment. From what we know of Col. Buist personally, we are more inclined to think that he has been the victim of some intrigue, than that he has deliberately misbehaved himself. Col. Buist was born in Uruguay of Scotch parents of good position, but was educated entirely in England and when he came to this country some twelve years ago could hardly speak a word of Spanish. Having had some experience in an artillery corps at home, he entered the Uruguayan army. He made himself very useful in the Artillery here, being almost the first officer to keep the guns in good condition. He enjoyed the confidence of successive Governments, and his promotion was steady, until Sr. Cuestas gave him the command of a regiment. Until the present charge, no aspersion was ever cast upon his character, though we know that in certain military circles he was always regarded as a "foreigner" and an interloper and this, coupled with the obviously biased remarks of some of our contemporaries, lead us to think he has been the victim of an intrigue. We may add that Col. Buist, although he has not been seen much in the capital of late, is well-known and much liked in English-speaking circles, where his bearing has always been that of an upright English gentleman.

The trial has taken place before the Permanent Council of War, of Com. Leonardo Biquet, whose conduct gave some trouble last November, when he was 2nd Chief of the Arsenal, leading to his suspension and that of his superior Col. de Gress. The Council has issued an inconclusive sentence, attributing faults to both sides, and has declared Com. Biquet's faults purged with the period of arrest already suffered. We understand that the Military Fiscal will appeal against the sentence.

The Director of the Nationalist party has issued a lengthy circular to its partisans, containing instructions as to the procedure to be followed on recovery of the liberty of men illegally pressed into military service. The Director takes the view, which we have always argued, that jurisdiction in such cases belongs completely to the civil authorities, and that it is not merely the right but the positive duty of the latter to intervene when necessary for the protection of the liberty of citizens. The circular will probably cause some commotion in military circles, as it disputes military authority over civilians, and attacks other military abuses in a determined manner. We congratulate the Director on the idea.

On reaching the Plaza Artola a certain Dr. Ferrand made a violent speech in which he repeated many of the falsehoods that have recently been circulated against the Waterworks Company, praised the "meritorious propaganda" of the *Tribuna*, and openly advocated the despoliation of the rights and property of the Company. Of course he was vigorously cheered by the unthinking crowd. The manifestation, which had been fairly orderly, then dissolved.

Summing up, as an expression of public opinion the manifestation was unimportant both in numbers and composition; while as an outcome of the violent propaganda of the native press it was ludicrous, though it showed that the majority had sufficient sense not to be deceived by a campaign based on falsehood, calumny and malicious exaggeration.

Summing up, as an expression of public opinion the manifestation was unimportant both in numbers and composition; while as an outcome of the violent propaganda of the native press it was ludicrous, though it showed that the majority had sufficient sense not to be deceived by a campaign based on falsehood, calumny and malicious exaggeration.

The *Tribuna*, with its usual reckless disregard for the truth, estimates the number of manifestants at sixteen thousand—it might just as easily have said sixteen million. The *Dia* is content with estimating them at 3500. The *Razon* says 3000. The *Siglo* discreetly refrains from mentioning numbers. Our own estimate, not counting mere spectators, is 1000. We confess, however, that we did not accompany the manifestation to the end.

Whilst upon this topic, we may mention that in the *Siglo* of Sunday there appears perhaps the first article in a native paper in which a moderate tone is employed and there is any show of desire to render the Company justice. It recalls the time when the city was depenent on wells for its water supply, and recognises the substantial services the Company has lent, and also the fact that it has not enjoyed large profits. It advocates the reduction of the rent of water metres to a nominal figure (which is what the Manager has offered) and points out that the metres are defective and occasionally give rise to abusive charges. Finally it advocates a decided reduction in the present tariff, and expresses the opinion that the matter may safely be left in the hands of the Government to arrange.

We understand that the Government will integrate the present Commission with various technical and legal authorities, with the object of obtaining a report on the question from all points of view, as also on the feasibility of establishing a competitive Company, which many seem to think will be a panacea for the present complaints.

It is also stated that initiative has been taken to raise a popular loan of \$1,000,000 in shares of \$20 each, payable 50 cents monthly, with the object of establishing a rival Company. This is more practical than abusing and calumniating the present

Company, but we doubt if it will come to anything, and in any case it will be some three or four years before the new concern could be in operation, whilst such abuses as there are require immediate remedy.

A Racing Warship.

Some weeks ago English and American navy officers witnessed the trial of the fastest man-of-war afloat, the British torpedo boat destroyer Viper. The Viper is a vessel of 320 tons, with the following dimensions: Length, 215 feet; beam, 21 feet; depth, 12 feet; horse power, 10,000; guaranteed speed, 30 knots; revolutions of screws, about a thousand a minute. She has four shafts with two screws to each shaft. Her turbine engines are so arranged that she can go backward at the rate of 15 knots with her four screws working.

Mr. Parsons of the Steam Turbine Engine Company, who designed her engines and machinery, intends to decrease the diameter of the screws and vary the pitch. By doing this he believes additional speed can be secured. Since this is the first British war vessel fitted with the new system of steam turbine engines great interest was attached to her performance.

At her first trial she ran at the rate of 37 knots in a rough sea. The officers aboard of her say that if the sea had been calm she would have made fifty miles an hour. The trials were made from Hawthorn, Leslie & Co.'s yard at Newcastle, and the run was over a measured mile. In her second trial she encountered such rough weather that she made but thirty-two miles, with her engines going under three quarters power. Opened out at full speed in smooth water she achieved 40 knots. This is the top speed record for warships.

THE WAR.

The messages since our last are mostly of the unofficial order, and deal with minor movements. It is evident that there is great activity in the Kimberley districts, but the incoherence of the telegrams as regards both time and place renders it impossible to follow the operations with any degree of accuracy. So far as we can judge, the projected invasion of Orange territory is being carried out energetically, though the anticipated great battle between Roberts and Cronje has not yet taken place, nor, indeed, is further mention made of it. The rapid disappearance of the main force of the Boers from the neighbourhood of Kimberley, with their heavy guns and most of their impedimenta, is remarkable, and leads us to suspect that they are preparing another cunning trap.

The War Office has received a message from Lord Roberts reporting that the Boers have occupied Magersfontein without resistance, it being supposed that the Boer troops have retired so as not to have their retreat cut off by Gen. French. Gen. Macdonald's Highland Brigade has joined the divisions of Gen. French and Kelly Kenney in the pursuit of Cronje's forces. A later message from Lord Roberts (Sunday night) announces that his troops have occupied Magersfontein (this is a considerable way into Orange territory, in fact half way from the frontier to Bloemfontein). Again there was no resistance, the Boers making a hasty evacuation on the approach of the British troops. A large quantity of guns and provisions was found in the city, but no artillery. The place was powerfully fortified, and its abandonment, says the message, indicates moral decay on the part of the Orange army (we do not suppose Lord Roberts wrote this. It may also indicate a trap).

A belated telegram from Jacobsdal, dated Friday, states that in the relief of Kimberley Gen. French only lost 50 men, killed or wounded. The 2nd, 00th Infantry (!) made a splendid forced march under a burning sun and in the midst of a dust storm, crossing a dry and sandy yield. There were some 50 or 60 cases of sunstroke sent to hospital. No heavy Boer guns were found either around Kimberley or at Magersfontein and Jacobsdal.

A tale has appeared that the Boers had captured a convoy of 200 provisions carts in the rear of Gen. French's division, but this has been contradicted or doubted by later messages. On the other hand, Gen. Kelly Kenney has captured 78 carts of provisions and munitions from Gen. Cronje, and other minor captures are also reported.

Brigade General French has been promoted to the rank of Major General, and Brevet Col. Kekewich, who defended Kimberley, has been made full Colonel. A telegram has been posted on the doors of the Mansion House in London, congratulating the City on the valiant behaviour of the Imperial City Volunteers, who played an important part in the relief of Kimberley. Telegraphic communication with Kimberley has been restored from all parts. Military engineers are engaged in the rapid repair of the railway and telegraph lines.

Gen. French left Kimberley on Saturday morning, in pursuit of Cronje's forces, and Generals Kelly Kenney and Macdonald are engaged in the same task. There is supposed to have been

a combat at Dreipont on Sunday, but no results are known. The Boers are said to be retreating in the direction of Emmaus and Potrusberg (Emmaus is north east of Jacobsdal and Potrusberg further east). Gen. Tacker occupies Jacobsdal. Lord Methuen remains at Magersfontein. It is not known if the Boers have evacuated Spytfontein.

Less favorable news comes from the Rensburg and Culesburg district, though it is undecided and not very reliable. Last Tuesday, it is said, the Boers made a determined attack on Col. Clement's division at Rensburg, compelling them to retreat. The Worcestershire regiment forced a passage with their bayonets, losing 16 killed and 30 wounded. The Inniskilling regiment passed without loss, but the New South Wales company had a determined fight in which it was wiped out. Col. Cunningham was killed at the beginning of the action. The Boer losses were also heavy. The Boers are also said to be making a determined attack, with heavy guns, on Gen. Gatacre's position at Molveno, but of this there are no further details. All the references to fighting in this district are scant and confused, and we only know that there is considerable activity. A Boer version is that Gatacre has been completely defeated, with loss of 6 guns and 400 prisoners, and he himself severely wounded. This was published in Brussels on Saturday, but as no confirmation has appeared it may safely be doubted.

From the Tagela there is hardly any news, and it is hinted that the censorship is at work. Skirmishing continues at Chioleyo and Culesburg, and it is asserted that Sir R. Buller is preparing or has actually commenced a fresh advance, this time taking a different direction to the northwest. A correspondent escaped from Ladysmith reports provisions very short there. The garrison live on flesh of horses and mules, vegetables are very scarce, an egg costs 3s, a fowl 19s, and a pound of tobacco 24. Dr. Jameson, in Ladysmith, is said to be ill with fever.

Lord Rosebery has published a letter in the *Times*, extolling the proofs of sincere and frank friendship given to Great Britain by Italy in the present crisis.

We quote the following from a late London paper:—

London, Jan. 22.
"I think we are making substantial progress." That is the hopeful word with which Sir Redvers Buller closes his latest dispatch, telegraphed from Spearman's Camp at nine o'clock last night. It comes after two days of the most strenuous warfare, in which our whole force north of the Tagela has been engaged. Victory evidently is far from being won, but it does look as if we were beginning to win it.

Fighting began shortly after daybreak on Saturday, when General Cery with part of Sir Charles Warren's Division engaged the enemy in the direction of Acton Homes. For some hours a very heavy cannonade was maintained upon the enemy's position without inducing him to do much his guns. When finally he was induced to do so the whole of our artillery fire was concentrated, until the Boer cannonade slackened, and our infantry were given the order to advance. The Boers fought well as usual. Driven back from one ridge, they retired to a second, only to be once more compelled to retreat under a crushing gun fire, before the advance of the bayonets. Position after position was thus taken, extending over a distance of three miles, and when night fell the troops bivouacked on the ground won.

While the Western Division was thus steadily making headway, in order to keep the enemy at Potgieter's occupied and to ascertain his strength there General Lyttelton made a reconnaissance in force. After the Boer trenches had been shelled by naval guns and howitzers from both sides of the river, the infantry moved out about two miles to the north, their advance being greeted by a heavy rifle fire from the enemy. The movement was successful in keeping the Boers in force on the spot throughout the day.

Our losses during the day's fighting included eleven officers wounded, one of whom has since died, while the total casualties among the non-commissioned officers and men numbered 279.

We regret to announce the death at Ladysmith of Mr. G. W. Stevens, the well-known and brilliant War Correspondent of "The Daily Mail." Mr. Stevens fell a victim to enteric fever on the 15th inst.

Potgieter's Drift, Saturday.
(Via Spearman's Camp, 7.15 p. m.)
I learn that Sir Charles Warren engaged the enemy this morning with artillery and rifle fire in his advance from Treichardt's Drift on the Tagela, towards the Acton Homes district. No particulars at the hour of telegraphing have as yet been received.

Boer trenches. Having kept the enemy's attention, our men then retired.

I have received further details of the engagement on Thursday. It appears that a force of three hundred Boers approached a kopje held by a hundred and sixty of Lord Dandonald's mounted men, who lay concealed at the top. As the Boers approached to take possession of the kopje, our men opened fire at short range, killing six of the enemy instantly, and wounding fifteen. The number of prisoners taken was twenty-three, four of whom were wounded. The Boers were taken completely by surprise. They came along with their rifles slung on their shoulders, so little did they suspect the presence of our troops.

It is reported that the Boers flew the white flag when Lord Dandonald's men opened fire on them on Thursday, and then fired back on the British.

General Buller's Camp, Sunday.

(Via Spearman's Camp, 6.15 p. m.)
Sir Charles Warren and General Lyttelton, are still engaged in clearing the enemy from behind Spion's Kop. The artillery are lending powerful support, taking the enemy's trenches, and concentrating a terrific fire whenever the Boer guns can be located.

General Hart and his brigade were engaged yesterday from daylight till dark.

The men behaved in the most gallant manner, advancing determinedly up the long glen between the two ranges, driving the stubborn enemy from point to point, little by little gaining the ground over a considerable distance.

By dusk, however, our troops had not succeeded in gaining a sufficiently commanding position to remain the night, and they returned to the last hill taken.

General Hildyard was similarly engaged still further to the left near Acton Homes, with Lord Dandonald and his mounted force operating between.

A very large tract of country is thus being dealt with by our troops, and the Boers see themselves in the position of having to divide and weaken their forces considerably to cope with us.

SUNDRIES.

—After delaying as long as they could, the sanitary authorities have declared Brazilian ports clean as regards bubonic plague, and have removed the quarantine on that account. Like most of the quarantines here, it was quite absurd and superfluous, and public health would have been none the worse, but commerce and shipping much the better, if it had never been imposed. There still remains, however, 24 hours' sanitary observation on vessels from Brazil on account of yellow fever. This is another case of the imbecility of the sanitary authorities. Yellow fever is enormously more dangerous than the bubonic disease, and at this very moment there are over twenty cases of yellow fever in Buenos Aires port, which is far more than all the cases of bubonic that have occurred in the Argentine Republic, yet the health authorities are satisfied with 24 hours' observation on this account. They take absurdly exaggerated precautions against the minor danger, and very few against the major. But then "yellow Jack" is an old acquaintance, and the bubonic plague is a comparatively stranger.

—Carnival will be with us next Sunday. Judging from the notices in our contemporaries, there will be an effort this year to impart a little more liveliness and organisation to it. The central streets will be illuminated in the usual fashion by the Gas and Electric Light Companies, the Government and the Municipality sharing the expense.

—Having nothing else to growl about, some of our contemporaries attack the police authorities for having prohibited the use of bomb-rockets at Sunday's manifestation. In our opinion the police did perfectly right. The custom of firing off these rockets on every imaginable occasion is semi-barbarous and offensive, and the police would do well to restrict it much further than they do, reserving it for exceptional occasions.

—It is only savages and children who delight in nameless noises.

—A disgraceful affair took place yesterday morning in the café opposite the Cordón tramway station. Captain Otero, unattached, and Sr. Octavio Marlos, of the National Accountants' Office, had a quarrel and came to blows. Mastos used a stick, and the captain took out a large and sharp dagger, with which he stabbed his assailant, inflicting a highly dangerous wound. He has been arrested, and his victim sent to the Hospital. What kind of military officers are those, we may ask, which carry and use daggers? Certainly no such weapon is recognised by the regulations, nor is it the usual part of the dress of a civilised man, whether military or otherwise. The carrying of such a weapon ought to be treated as evidence of criminal intention.

—The long tottering "Montevideo Tramway Company" has finally collapsed. On Saturday the Manager Sr. Mandrocho notified the Civil Judge that he was unable to carry on the concern any longer, and consequently seals were placed on all

the Company's property and stables. The horses, some 80 in number, were given out to keep. Sres. E. Gianelli and Dr. B. Ayala have been appointed syndics of the liquidation. This end has surprised no one, for the Company has been in a bad way for a long time past, and neither able to pay its men nor feed its horses. This tramway never was a pecuniary success from the first, which is not surprising when its mad route is taken into consideration.

—According to a London telegram, the Admiralty has ordered the vessel reserve at Devonport to go at once to Portland, to complete their crews and equipment, and be ready for sailing at immediate orders.

—On Saturday a young woman named Elvira Gras, unmarried, aged 23, committed suicide by hanging herself, in the house Constituyente 85. An unhappy love affair is said to have been the motive.

—On Sunday the Trion Theatre in Paris was destroyed by fire. Our old favorite Fregoli, who was performing there, lost all his scenery, costumes and other property, valued at 75,000 francs.

—Last Thursday there was held in London the banquet of the British shipowners, at which over 200 persons were present. Mr. Donald Currie, Manager of the Castle line, made a speech in which he said he was proud, as a shipowner, that British steamers had been able to carry, in a season which is not very favourable to navigation, over 200,000 men to South Africa without the loss of a man. Lord Abercorn said the aristocracy has given the nation an example of patriotism as 30 peers were at the front.

—An amusing story is told about Puccini's new opera "Tosca." Puccini happened to be in Paris, and Sardou courteously invited him to dinner, begging him after coffee to afford him some idea of the musical treatment of his drama. Sardou does not know a note of music, and Puccini shares with an eminent British composer the capability of forgetting his own compositions. So he sat down at the piano and extemporized. Sardou nodded with delight and courteously declared the music exactly fitted each situation. But that particular version of the opera was entirely improvised, and can never by any possibility be reproduced.

—This is what a young lady is reported to have said apropos of marriage: "Well, no, I don't know whether I would marry for money alone; but if a man had plenty of money, allied to a sweet disposition, and a moustache that curled at the ends, and nice blue eyes, and a social position; if he had a distinguished status in a profession, or even as a merchant, and his father and mother were aristocratic, and he wanted to marry me, and he would promise to let me have my own way in everything, and keep me liberally supplied with money, and have a splendidly furnished town house, and have a handsome country residence, was liberal about diamonds, also about military, never grumbling, and I really and truly loved him, I shouldn't consider marriage a drawback."

MONDAY, JANUARY 22.

Lord Salisbury and Mr. Balfour have addressed letters to their supporters inviting their attendance at the opening of Parliament.

Lord Walsley has written to an Edinburgh correspondent denying that the War Office is in possession of a letter from the late General Wauchop complaining of Lord Methuen's plans at the battle of Magersfontein, and expressing his belief that he would not return from the attack he was directed to make.

Large crowds witnessed the march of the 800 officers and men of the Lord Mayor's Own from Wellington Barracks early on Saturday morning to Nine Elms Station, a distance of about two miles. It was conducted with the greatest good order and regularity, and was accomplished in the exact time prescribed. The Duke of Connaught was at the railway station to see the regiment off. The Lord Mayor and Sheriff went down to
