The Argentine Senate, we learn by telegram, has approved the financial (or repudiation) Bills in general by a majority of two-thirds. Their approval in detail is regarded as equally certain.

After many conflicting reports, it is at last definitely announced that the Brazilian authorities at Porto Alegre have granted the extradition of «Punta Fina», the monster who assassinated the Ortiz family, and he is said to be now on his way to this capital for trial. It is to be hoped that the Tribunals will deal with him a little more energetically and promptly than they do with the majority of assassins.

We quote from the B. A. Standard:—A meeting was held to-day in one of the rooms of the Bolsa by a large number of the passengers of the «Wittekind» on her last voyage which terminated so disastrously, and it was unanimously resolved to send to the directors of the North German Lloyd Company, to which the steamer belongs, a petition which had been drawn up by H. H. Schlieper and which was signed by all who were present at the meeting, asking that Capt. Franke might be retained in command of the steamer. The signed petition will be sent to Europe by Mr. Henry Lahusen, by the mail of the 28th inst.

We quote again from the B. A. Standard:—There is a prodigious flare up in banking circles in Mendoza, the Legislature of which province is about to impose a monstrous tax of 5 1/2 per cent on the profits of private banks that charge more interest than the Bank of the Nation, and 2 1/2 per cent on those charging the same as the State concern. This is another barefaced attack on foreign capital that will create the very worst impression in Europe. The iniquitous and unconstitutional measure appears to be levelled chiefly at the branch of the London and River Plate Bank in the Capital of the province, which, it is said, will close its doors and leave the Mendocinos without the benefit of its capital, if the Bills become law. After all, how can any honest or sensible moneyed or financial legislation be expected from the provinces when the National Congress is about to repudiate 56 per cent of the Republic's debt to its note holders.

LATEST.

A late messages states that the London Daily Chronicle has received a telegram from Bloemfontein to the effect that President Steyn has officially informed Sir Alfred Milner that the Government of the Orange Free State has unanimously decided to aid the Transvaal Republic in case of war with Great Britain. The news has caused an unpleasant sensation in London, as Gt. Britain will now have two enemies to cope with instead of one.

LONDON NOTES.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 26.
When the trial of Captain Dreyfus was resumed yesterday morning at Rennes, a medical certificate was read accounting for Colonel Du Paty de Clam's continued absence. Among the witnesses heard was Mr. Strong, Paris correspondent of the «Observer», who said Esterhazy told him that Captain Dreyfus had transmitted the documents enumerated in the border-line to the German Government; M. Gobert, the handwriting expert, whose evidence was favourable to Captain Dreyfus; and M. Bertillon, who occupied several hours in demonstrating the prisoner's guilt by his famous geometric method. The audience appeared absolutely unable to follow the witness's elaborate reasoning. The officers of the Court appeared to be doing their best. Considerable hilarity was caused in Court when it was seen that M. Bertillon was attended by four soldiers and a corporal carrying portfolios, drawing boards, etc.

Deal Corporation and citizens yesterday extended a hearty welcome to Lord George Hamilton, who was accompanied by Lady George, on his appointment to Cinque Ports office as Captain of Deal Castle. In reply, Lord George Hamilton expressed the pleasure he felt in becoming connected with such a famous town as Deal, touched lightly upon Indian affairs, and concluded with some humorous remarks upon the local train service.

Lord George Loftus took the chair yesterday at the annual meeting of the limited company which took possession of Drury Lane Theatre rather more than two years ago. The proceedings were most harmonious, the exceedingly satisfactory result of the

company's first twelve months having been surpassed. A dividend, making twenty per cent for the year, was declared.

By mid-day yesterday the thermometer recorded 90deg. in the shade, the highest reading, by one degree, this season. The long-continued drought is having a serious effect, not only in manufacturing districts, but in the country, where the want of water is being severely felt in villages, and on pasture and other lands. Rain is, however, reported as having fallen in several parts of North Wales. Details of several cases of sunstroke are also to hand.

At the Oval yesterday Surrey finished their innings for 556, and Lancashire lost seven wickets for 178, at Taunton the Australians, going in against a total of 376 made by Somerset, scored 398 for five wickets, Laver making 143; at Clifton the Gloucestershire innings ended for 536, Townsend carrying out his bat for 224, and Essex afterwards lost eight wickets for 216; at Nottingham Middlesex raised their overnight score of 23 for two wickets to 475 for seven, C. M. Wells making 244; at Brighton Sussex completed their first innings against Yorkshire for 169, and following on scored 140 for three wickets at their second attempt; at Southampton, in the Hampshire and Worcestershire match, the latter county at the close of play required 204 to win with nine wickets to fall; and at Catford Warwickshire, in face of the Kent innings of 420, were dismissed for 120, but on following on scored 152 for the loss of only two wickets.

At the Westminster Police Court yesterday, as the result of a police raid upon a house in Brewer-street, Chelsea, four men were charged with the unlawful possession of a number of valuable dogs, sixty-two of which were found in the house and back yard. The accused were remanded.

A singular sequel to the apprehension of a couple of supposed thieves came to light at Westminster Police-court yesterday. A young Horse Artilleryman and two female friends, were instrumental in capturing two out of three men they saw leaving a shop in King's-road Chelsea, under suspicious circumstances. The accused were committed for trial, and the soldier was then arrested as a deserter from a battery at Woolwich. Mr. Shell, in ordering him to be handed over to the escort, hoped that his conduct in assisting the police would be taken into consideration by his commanding officer.

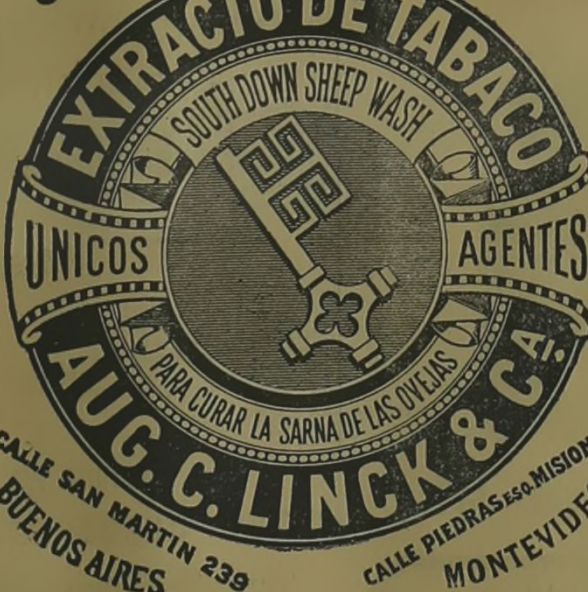
